#### Nick Smart would love your support ...

We were really pleased to hear from local resident Mel Smart, who's husband Nick is running the **London Marathon later this month to raise support** and awareness for the local charity Brain Tumour Support (previously Hammer Out).

Having lived in Bradley Stoke for 18 years, Nick and his wife Mel are well known across the Stokes. Their two girls went to Wheatfield Primary and are now both at the Bradley Stoke Community School. His story is an inspiring one and we are very pleased to be able to share it

On Christmas Day 2011, completely out of the blue, Nick suffered a seizure in front

of the family. He later came away from hospital advised not to drive for a year. Two weeks later he was called in for an MRI scan and subsequently diagnosed with a type of Brain Tumour called a Meningioma.

with our readers...

This was a hugely traumatic time for the family with no idea what the outcome would be. Contact was made with the Thornbury-based charity **Brain Tumour Support on** 

the day the diagnosis was received - "They were fantastic" Melanie told me "we had a two hour conversation over the phone and they sent us out lots of information that day." Nick had to go on steroids for a period of time before having an operation to remove the tumour on 13 March 2012. "The charity was a lifeline to our family at this time, providing support to us all. They provided a counsellor - Kate who was just fantastic. We still use some of her ideas today!"

Nick has always been a keen runner, having competed cross-country for England in his younger days. Melanie told us that on diagnosis Nick was less worried about dying than he was about being left unable to run after the operation! Fortunately Nick's operation was a success and, once he had regained his balance and confidence, he made steady progress.

In Nick's own words "Starting from the horizontal position, I worked through the phases from standing, shuffling, walking and finally, a gentle jog." Melanie told me Nick achieved this in just 6 weeks!

Nick and his family were invited to a coffee morning at the Brain Tumour Support group to meet with other survivors, which was a humbling experience.



At this point, I decided to set my own personal physical challenge of completing the Marathon distance. achieved this in Bournemouth in 2013 and luckily my time was good enough to gain me an automatic entry into the London Marathon in

Nick entered the Riverbank Rollick n Thornbury and came 3rd out of 500 entrants. he came 5th in the Sodbury Slog and 18 months after his surgery in October 2013 he completed the Bournmouth marathon.

Following the operation Nick was initally closely monitored, has now been put back on annual MRI scans, which is great news for him and his family.

His previous runs have been for himself and his personal recovery, but for the London Marathon he is aiming to fundraise as much as possible for Brain Tumour Support. "This time I want to give back to the charity who supported me and my family at a very stressful and upsetting time in our lives."

To fill the gap between Bournemouth and the London marathon this year Nick also successfully completed a Half Iron Man triathlon distance in 2014. He is aiming for a time of under 3 hours this April.

#### Child Soldiers

Dear Bradley Stoke Matters,

I am writing to ask you to publish an article on the use of child soldiers to help me raise awareness. My name is Aaron Mildren and I am in year 11 at Bradley Stoke Community School.

In my citizenship lessons we were told to choose a topic which goes against human rights and campaign against it. I chose to campaign against child soldiers. All over the world there are countries that use children in their armed forces. Child soldiers are used as fighters, cooks, suicide bombers, human shields, messengers, spies, or for sexual purposes. These soldiers are anyone who is under the age of 18. The child soldiers that are used violate many human rights, such as the right to freedom and the right to education, this is wrong for a person under the age of 18.

During the last 15 years child soldiers have been used in almost every region of the world and every armed conflict in the world. There are so many of these children serving in armed conflict that the exact number of them being used is impossible to define. Many of the young people being used are between 10 and 18 however some are younger than that, when they are forced to serve. Two-thirds of countries say that the enrolment of people under the age of 18 should be prohibited from entering the armed forces.

#### How do you feel about our local nature reserves?

In Bradley Stoke, we are lucky to be surrounded by great nature areas and reserves. Unfortunately, in



places such as Savages Wood and Bradley Brook there is often a lot of litter. As part of our Citizenship GCSE, we are campaigning for a cleaner Bradley Stoke. We would like to urge you to take care of what we have and enjoy the local nature reserves whilst taking care of them.

Our main focus is the small pond on The Common East. It was once a lovely place for parents to take their children in the summer as it was filled with



frogspawn and other pond life. It was a nice, safe, interesting place to go and members of our groups have fond memories of doing so.

However, the pond is currently covered with overgrown plants and litter. It is no longer a nice place to go and many people aren't even aware of its existence because it is mostly covered. As a group, we would love to clear this area up and make it a nice family friendly place once again.

As well as focussing on this area we would love to tackle the bins, or lack thereof, along Bradley Brook and Stoke Brook. Whilst the Three Brooks Nature Conservation has done a wonderful job looking after and caring for Bradley Brook (commonly referred to as the Duck pond) there is often litter found on the footpaths that follow Stoke Brook due to the lack of bins. This litter, that people have dropped or that has fallen out of overflowing bins, often ends up in the Brook and is washed into the larger, 'duck pond' area. Therefore, we would like our local council to take notice and put in more bins along these footpaths and also empty the existing bins more often.

We would like to thank all of those who have written to us or supported our campaign with special thanks to Councillor Ben Walker who has tweeted us many times and has offered support and funding and Jaci from Bradley Stoke Matters who has allowed us to write this article.

We hope that now you will join our campaign by remembering how important these areas are and doing your part to look after them.

#### Raise the Minimum Wage for 16-18

#### What is Our Campaign About?

We think that £3.79 is not enough money to boost a youth's life. For example if we wanted to go to university, we would have to work, and at the moment it is hard to find a job. It also isn't enough to pay for our aspirations. Many people are finding these difficulties and we think that it needs to change.

We have talked to MPs such an Ian Boulton and Iack Lopresti and they agree with our campaign. At the moment the minimum wage for 16-18 year olds is £3.79, we would like to increase it to £4.25.

#### The Statistics...

We have been researching the statistics into minimum wage for 16-18 year olds. It has come back very positive towards our campaign. 80% of students constantly worry about money. We believe that if we increase it this percentage will lower.

We also found out that the average student spends £10,000 a year while they're at university. If they do not earn enough money they will not be able to do this. They might not be able to apply for the university because of the fees. They also might not have enough money to survive to pay for food and other needed items.

#### People Who Agree...

Throughout our campaigning we found out that even adults (21+) agree that this is a problem. Some of them also had a job at the age of 16-18 and they wish they had the chance to earn more money.

We have talked to MP's such as Ian Boulton and Jack Lopresti and they both have discussed this issue with us, and both agree with our campaign. We have also set up petitions and have got over 75 signatures. We also have given out questionnaires and over 90% of them have come back positive towards our campaign.

We would like to see a change in the minimum wage, and hopefully published in your magazine.



**Bradley Stoke & Little Stoke Gifford Matters was** extremely excited to be invited over the bridge to sample a fine lunch at the New Inn, Pwllmeyric in Chepstow this month.

This early 18th Century Inn has appeared in many historical travels books as being the place to stop and revive, with one edition stating it as being precisely 136½ miles from Hyde Park Corner, London - fortunately it's only about a 20 minute drive from the Stokes!

The lovely Grade II listed property has recently been brought back to life by its new owner, whose vision is to put the New Inn back on the traveller's map - a place to enjoy fantastic hostlery, offering excellent, locally sourced food and fine wines and a revolving selection of real ales. Head chef Aidan Fisher has created a mouthwatering menu, having previously spent four years at the 3 AAA rosette restaurant, Terry M, at the Celtic Manor working alongside some of Wales' top chefs.

My family and I visited on a Saturday lunchtime, just two weeks after the official opening. From bar snacks, sharing platters, traditional pub food to a creative a la carte menu (not forgetting

Ethos at the New Inn:

a children's menu!) there is plenty to choose from. We selected from the lunchtime menu, £16 for three courses. I chose the Pant ys gawn goats cheese, roasted beetroot walnut and pear salad (which was gorgeous) and Tim had the duck liver and cognac parfait with red onion marmalade and toasted brioche (delicious). For main course I selected the Salt Pollack fishcakes, braised lentils with chorizo, salsa verde (photo top left). If I'm honest, not a selection I would have chosen at home or eaten previously. However, my meal was amazing - a real taste sensation that I would definitely go back for! Tim chose the slow cooked blade of beef, celeriac, red wine and bone marrow (photo top right) - the meat was beautiful, simply falling apart.

On to the desserts and I had been particularly looking forward to the fabulous sounding 'melting chocolate pudding with malt ice cream and caramelised banana'. I wasn't disappointed, worth going back for on its own! Not a sweet tooth person, Tim chose the selection of local cheeses and was mightily impressed - with cheeses either made in-house or sourced locally. The crackers were amazing, again made in-house along with the chutney. The children selected from the children's menu. Hannah thoroughly enjoyed her fish, chips (triple cooked) and peas followed by chocolate brownie and ice cream and asked when we could come back again! Even my exceptionally fussy 8 year old son was accommodated, with something cooked especially for him.

With friendly and efficient staff, large comfy sofas in front of wood-burning fires, the pub is certainly very welcoming, offering quality food in a comfortable, casual dining environment.

We can certainly recommend this lovely pub, it has definitely been put on our travel map for a repeat visit! To entice you over the bridge, The New Inn is offering a fabulous 10% discount - why not give it a try!

#### **Gardening Matters**

### April Sunshine and showers

Spring is finally in evidence as daffodils and flowering trees start to bloom.

Expect the inevitable April showers this month but with sunny days too, when you can turn your attention to the lawn. It's an exciting month, with indoor-sown seeds well into growth, and it's also time to start sowing outdoors. Just watch out for frosts...

#### Top 10 jobs this month

- Keep weeds under control
- 2 Protect fruit blossom from late frosts
- 3 Tie in climbing and rambling roses
- 4 Sow hardy annuals and herb seeds
- 5 Start to feed citrus plants
- Increase the water given to houseplants
- 7 Feed hungry shrubs and roses
- 8 Sow new lawns or repair bare patches
- 9 Prune fig trees
- 10 Divide bamboos

Mow lawns when necessary - whenever the grass is growing - the aim is to maintain a constant height throughout the year.

Add the clippings to the compost heap in thin layers (too much grass all at once is likely to be very wet and poorly aerated, resulting in smelly slime rather than compost).

Use a half-moon edging iron or spade to create a 7.5cm (3in) 'gutter' around the lawn edge. This will prevent grass creeping from the lawn into borders.

Sowing new lawns or over-seeding dead patches can be carried out from mid-April to early May. If the soil is very wet or cold, germination will be poor, so delay until the



weather improves. Prepare the ground for sowing, by cultivating, levelling and lightly firming beforehand.

Do not walk over or mow newly sown grass until it has reached a height of 5-7.5cm (2-3in), and then only give it a light trim at the highest setting.

Apply a high nitrogen spring lawn fertiliser at the beginning of the month to encourage good, strong growth. If moss is a problem choose a combined fertiliser and mosskiller.

April is also the best month to apply lawn weedkiller.



A fantastic 19 teams took part in the event held on Saturday 14th March, with up to 7 swimming in relay for a 55 minute period.

1st Bradley Stoke Scouts entered 5 teams, Bradley Stoke Youth Rugby @ St Mary's Old Boys RFC entered 4 teams, 1st Wick Girl Guides & Marlin Swimming Club entered 2 teams each.

Others swam on behalf of Equipo (raising funds for an expedition to Nicaragua in 2016), Paul's Place (Coalpit Heath

Meadowbrook joined the Olympus Academy Trust in January 2015, a family of schools led by Executive Headteacher, Dave Baker, that also includes Abbeywood, Bradley Stoke and Charborough Road schools.

#### Teachers get on the Bike for Red Nose Day



John recalls answering a call late at night and hearing a perhaps worse-for-wear client shouting "I am an innocent man" repeatedly down the phone. Being a duty solicitor was clearly not the recipe for a good night's sleep.

Working in family law inevitably exposes you to some of the worst aspects of family life. John recalls advising a client whose family home had been stripped by his wife whilst he unsuspectingly continued his day at work.

Practising as a **Deputy District** Judge enabled John to see litigation from the 'other side'. the judge's perspective. He feels this experience was invaluable in helping him to approach Court



proceedings in a balanced and reasonable way, in the light of his understanding of the judge's likely point of view.

Despite his work commitments, John enjoys a busy social life, including singing in two local choirs. Clearly the work-life balance is another lesson John has learned over the course of his long career.

#### Help give Hope to Morgan

The face of local resident Morgan Walker has rapidly become a familiar one across the Stokes. His hand print is the logo of the 'Hope for Morgan' appeal, created in his favourite colours of black and red. The fundraising is now well under way with over £30k raised so far towards the target of the £70k needed to cover an SDR operation in the USA, as well as rehabilitation for Morgan afterwards.

Morgan was born 8 weeks premature, weighing just 3lb 10oz and spent the first traumatic month of his life in the neo-nato unit. At two months old he returned to hospital (on his due date) for an MRI brain scan. The results of this scan were devastating for the family, who were advised Morgan had cerebral palsy and it was unlikely he would ever walk or talk.

Thankfully Morgan proved everyone wrong and walked at 17 months and can talk, he even attends a mainstream school - Wheatfield Primary.

Having endured 19 operations and procedures in his eleven years, taking medication daily and sleeping with an oxygen heart monitor, Morgan suffers from additional complications as well as the daily effects of cerebral palsy. His mum, Zoe, states "His





determination to succeed

in life in everything he does is a testament to him and his will to be just like his peers".

Selective Dorsal Rhizotomy aims to improve mobility and increase independence through a neurosurgical procedure. As for other local children Toby and Abigail before him, (Help Toby Walk and Footsteps for Abigail), this surgery is a chance to significantly improve Morgan's quality of life and reduce the pain he constantly endures.

"There is no cure for Morgan, but there is hope and, like any parent, we would do anything for our child. Our aim is to give him the best possible chance in

now stepped in to assist with Morgan's appeal. Scott set up this local Bristol-based charity Darren wright having been inspired by his big brother Darren, who has



struggled in life since being diagnosed with severe Cerebal Palsy at 12 weeks old. Scott's aim is to assist other families in a similar situation to his own by providing grants and advice to families of children with disabilities and life-limiting illnesses.

"My brother has the heart of a lion and the bravery of a thousand warriors. This charity is something I have promised to dedicate my life to. Darren is not only my brother but he is also my hero and my inspiration." Darren, now in his 40s, is relatively settled and no money from the charity goes towards him or his care.


