

# **Bradley Stoke's First Triathlon!**

Swimmers, runners and cyclists are being invited to take part in the first community-based triathlon event to be staged in Bradley Stoke.

The Active Triathlon is taking place on Sunday 30th of

August 2015 and is expected to attract participants from all over South Gloucestershire. Held in partnership with South Gloucestershire Council and Triathlon England, the Sprint Triathlon event will cater for all abilities who want to be part of this fast growing sport.

It consists of a 400 metre pool swim at Bradley Stoke Leisure Centre, 18 km cycle and 5 km run. The cycle ride and run will be held on closed roads along Bradley Stoke Way to ensure the event is safe as well as fun. The Triathlon is being organised by Active Leisure Centres and is the idea of triathlete Akhil Viz, who has been living and training in Bradley Stoke since October 2011. Akhil has competed in Sprint distance triathlon, Olympic distance triathlon, Ironmans and has represented Great Britain and Gibraltar at the European and World Long Distance Triathlon Championships. He said: "Triathlon is an increasingly popular sport and the sprint distance makes it really accessible to anyone who wants to increase their fitness or improve in a new discipline. We are really pleased at the response we've had so far and are expecting it to be a 'sellout' event."

The Triathlon is one of the highlights of Active Leisure's tenth anniversary celebrations this year. It is being organised purely on a voluntary basis and any profits earned as a result will be reinvested into future events and other sport development projects within the community. To help people get in shape for the challenge, Active Leisure is holding special training sessions at its leisure centres in the run up to the event.

The first wave of places has been taken up by existing Active Total members and the second wave is now open to other members of the public. There are 150 places in total open to over 18s. There will be prizes for the 1st, 2nd and 3rd place male and female finishers and a free bike fit by Bike Science Bristol for the competitor with the fastest bike split.

# **Bradley Stoke Matters:** Celebrating 10 years in the Community!

10 years, Wow! I can still remember turning 10 years old. As a July birthday I was

always one of the youngest in my year at school and the voungest of my friends set. It seemed to take forever therefore to reach the magic milestone of double figures, but how sweet it felt when I got there!

I'm not quite sure where the last decade has gone but I am very proud that this is now the 10th anniversary of the very first Bradley Stoke Matters community magazine landing on your doorstep. Our first edition was still the same high quality gloss but black and white throughout and just 32 pages. It was also delivered

to just 2000 houses. I remember our first mock up of what it might look like and showing that to potential advertisers. Our very first call resulted in a year's booking! This was a shocker at the time - we had yet to produce one edition and now we were committed to doing 12! It was a steep learning curve. A qualified accountant I did sometimes wonder how I came to be selling advertising space! I'm pleased to say that that very first advertiser is still advertising with us today! BIG SHOUT OUT to Lois Coulson of Medway Design. Other current advertisers who were in our very first edition include mechanic Ashley Thouless and Noah's Ark Farm Zoo.

I moved to Bradley Stoke in 1994 (can't quite believe that that was 21 years ago). We bought our house off-plan, scrimped, saved, and per the mortgage request sold our car (!). Our 4bed detached in Saxon Way cost £90,000. An amazing first house, we'd stretched ourselves fully and we moved in with not one bit of furniture! Just a pile of clothes and an inflatable mattress. Happy days!. I remember when I used to get lost going between various house builders as we were deciding where to buy. In the end I liked Saxon Way as I could find it from the motorway without getting lost!

# How it all began

10 years on and I was at home with my first child, I was lucky enough not to have to go back to work, which, after 18m was

giving me plenty of spare time (and there's only so many cakes you can bake!). When I first gave up work I realised that, although I had lived in Bradlev Stoke for 10 years. I only actually knew my immediate neighbours and friends made at Holy Trinity church and through my horse riding. Travelling into the centre to work each day, I knew little about what went on in Bradley Stoke. I also found it extremely difficult that information was not available on all the local toddler groups and different activities that went on each week - hence the idea of the magazine was born. It transpired that many other local people felt the same, especially local traders and small businesses who worked from home across the town and had no previous way to promote themselves in the area.

The magazine proved very popular very quickly and grew into something that we had never really envisaged, a full time activity!

I recall when that first edition went out at the end of July 2005 we were really excited - what feedback would we get ....? My first call later that day was an eye opener - "is that Bradley Stoke Matters? Yes it is! Fabulous - I was wondering. please could you help me fill out my passport application?" Of course I was happy to oblige but I never realised just how much we were putting ourselves out there in the community and how many different ways we would be called upon to help. Eventually to save our sanity I did move the phones away from the homeline, just so that we weren't constantly being interrupted at all hours and days (9pm on a Sunday evening was the most popular time it appeared!)

# Extending to meet to demand

The magazine originally went out to 2000 homes each month, and we received many requests to extend the coverage. As soon as we had



the revenue covered to do so, we therefore extended distribution to accommodate these homes too. There is such a fine line between **Bradley Stoke** and areas of Little Stoke and




Stoke Gifford website launched in May 2007 in some instances just the other side of the road - that we were also regularly asked in our first year why they could not have their own copy of the magazine too. Therefore exactly one year later Little Stoke Gifford Matters was born

Always reacting to the feedback we received, as we grew we were getting told that people didn't have time to fully read each magazine before the next one arrived so we reduced to printing two BSMs and one LSGM per quarter, which eventually changed to one BSM and one LSGM which also kept costs down for our advertisers. Our feedback was that one edition per quarter through the door was perfect, and have regularly been told that each edition is kept until the next arrives. In fact last year I met a lady who told me she had a copy of every back edition as she loved to keep them for the articles! Moving to full gloss colour a couple of years later was a huge step in cost of production, but we have not looked back! We now produce 8 editions per year, 4 of each title. Every single edition is still edited and produced by ourselves, personally, in-house before being sent to the printers.

# Happy memories

I have some great memories of things we have been a part of over the last 10 years. Highlights include being involved in the BBC Radio Bristol breakfast show at the site of the old Tesco in 2007. The focus was on community and how



Bradley Stoke had developed thus far, about the lack of town centre and the new plans envisaged with the new Tesco store and WillowBrook Centre in the planning. We had to be available from something like 6am and were around pretty much all morning. The most requested services that residents we spoke to that day wanted from the new town centre was a coffee shop and a dentist! Costa was not exactly the welcoming local coffee shop with home made cakes that was envisaged, but it has certainly proved a big hit and is always very busy.

Bradler Stoke Matters is distributed FREE to 6,000 ho

It was also great to be involved in the birthday celebrations at the leisure centre for the 20th Anniversary of Bradley Stoke. The



displays of 80s memorabilia and the old articles and information about the development of the town were great to read. BBC Radio Bristol were also in attendance that day and we were called upon again to be interviewed with our thoughts on how much the town had developed as a community.

We've also been nominated for and won awards along the way for the community and







for business. Having found it difficult that there was so many small businesses in the town but no way of knowing who they were and how to contact them - and experiencing first hand how difficult it was for ourselves setting up a new business - we initiated the Bradley Stoke Business Forum at the start of 2007. Jointly with another local business owner, we put together an article in the magazine arranging a date and venue and waited to see who turned up! From this first evening of interested parties a group of founding members was formed and the business forum progressed into a regular monthly meeting.

We love it that people in the community have been brought together through the information we share with you in the magazine. It's even better when whole new community groups are formed through a resident's initial seed of an idea being promoted within the pages of this magazine. Two of many such groups over the last 10 years have been The Stokes Art Group and the Bradley Stoke Reading Groups.

We have received much lovely feedback in 10 years but I think the most memorable was a lady who approached us at the Outstanding Women's Awards one year. She came up and told us "I had to come over and say hello, I am so pleased to meet you and just want to thank you as your magazine literally saved my life." I won't share the story that followed but I have never forgotten it and am just so pleased that by doing something small and sharing the amazing stories about our community with people through this magazine, that hearts are touched and

# Ready for Business -Bradlev Stoke Community School

The construction of the brand new Bradley Stoke mmunity School (BSCS) has been completed on

Dave Baker, Headteacher said 'the school will be unrivalled in terms of being suited to education in the 21st

century with specialist facilities throughout and those who are a part of the school from the beginning will be pioneers. It is a fascinating process considering all aspects of developing a school from scratch, with interesting tensions between adhering to tried and tested ways and

The vision is for a school which will be both in the community and for the community; its aim is to establish strong relationships with the town council, local schools, clubs and churches, the leisure centre, local businesses and other agencies but especially with the

The school boasts two sprung floor halls; one with tiered, retractable seating, stage and an acoustic sound system the other is big enough to hold four badminton courts. It also offers fully equipped classrooms, ICT suite, modern science and technology laboratories and under floor heating. The school is currently proposing a bid for specialist status in performing arts and language in 2006 and devising its school travel plan.

The 5th of September 2005 will bring 182 year 7 students through the doors, with a further 180 places available in four subsequent academic years. Prospective students have taken an active part in recruiting new staff and have already formed a school council to help plan for september. The development of the student voice will be a key aspect of the school's life.

We were delighted to hear from Mike Mundy, President of the Bradley Stoke Cricket Club regarding the Club's impending 25th anniversary in 2016.




Mike was the founding member of the Cricket Club. Nine months on from his original idea to form a local club for the newly established town, Mike was officially notified on 12th June 1991 that "Bradley Stoke Cricket Club" had been selected by North Avon District Council to be the Cricket Club to use the superb new facilities at the Bailey's Court site.

This was obviously very exciting news and over the winter of 1991/early 92, the Club arranged some social fund-raising initiatives including some successful live band extravaganzas. They also decided to invite local England and Gloucestershire wicket keeper Jack Russell to officially open the premises.

The date for the grand opening was set for Saturday 11th April 1992. Jack came along and met with people, signed autographs and 'officially opened' the Cricket Club. Not just a cricketer but a renowned painter too, one of Jack's limited edition paintings was offered as the first prize in the day's raffle. The print in question was called "Moment of Victory" depicting the winning run scored by England against the West Indies on the 1st March 1990. It was signed by all the England players taking part in the match.





Entry for the raffle was by programme only and each one was individually numbered. We have included some scans of that original programme (above and right). We love looking back at such things - it makes interesting reading when Bradley Stoke was just in its infancy!


BSCC has grown into a popular, friendly and well utilised cricket club with over 60 adult members and also a vibrant youth section with over 80 youth members playing in 5 youth teams. It is currently looking to fund a new project for outdoor practice nets, with plans drawn up in February this year.

As a reflection of the opening nearly 25 years ago, the plan for 2016 is very similar.



# **Sloping Gardens**

Speaking to Sharon Clark, a local resident of Bradley Stoke and new Head Teacher of BSCS Primary phase, there is much excitement as the summer term draws to an end and she prepares to open the doors to 30 pupils commencing the primary phase of Bradley Stoke Secondary School in September.

Having worked as a Deputy Head in a growing school, Sharon has been in post and worked on site at BSCS since April. She has successfully recruited an Early Years Teacher in Geraldine Rogers and the role of Teaching Assistant has been advertised as we go to print. Sharon spoke highly of the support received by the Olympus Trust and especially existing Heads Jon Barr at Meadowbrook Primary and Nicola Bailey at Charborough Road School. Sharon tells us they "meet regularly and have been a great support network to date!" Sharon has also been drawing on the expertise of one of the Higher Level Teaching Assistant in BSCS with forest schools experience.

Regular newsletters have been sent to the parental body and a parents forum already exists. Sharon has been working with the school council to discuss class names and will be working with existing BSCS students during enrichment week to fill the new build with artwork. She is very keen for the new building to feel and look like a learning environment that's lived in from the outset and not feel sterile and new. There will also be links with post 16

students, working within their community service programme and volunteering for a number of hours per week in the primary setting.

Family days are already in the diary for July when children will be invited along to their new setting for a tour, story and lunch as well as further dates in August. Local relationships are already forming and BSYFC have already agreed to come in and give coaching to the 4 year olds - we look forward to seeing

them at future Football Festivals! The new build has lots of open space as well as a planned hockey pitch. Pupils will also have access to the grounds of the main school as well as Scholars Wood which can be accessed through a back gate of the school.

The new building, which is eco compliant with solar assist roofing has resulted in only positives for the main school - cricket nets have been relocated with a new high jump and the long jump re-installed. The footprint of the building has only taken away existing car parking and with the travel plan implemented, it is hoped most pupils and staff within reason will walk to school. The primary phase is a building within its own right with independent security utilising swipe cards and buzzers on the gates. Between 20-50+ staff have worked for or on behalf of Midas at any one time, with the build commencing last October and it is due to be handed over on 6th July. The latest technology has been installed from interactive wipe boards to wifi outside, scooter pods and bike racks.

Midas will also be fitting out the school with furniture. We look forward to our next visit to see tarmac and carpets and a furnished new building!

It was a delight to catch up with the Musical Director of Bradley Stoke Community Singers last month to find out how the local choir has developed over the past three years.

Ange Kewley has scores of enthusiasm and passionately recounts how she got involved with the group. "A number of the local community attended a Come & Sing Day at the local Bradley Stoke Community School in September 2012. The singing workshop, run by the renowned choirmaster Granville Jones and Head of Music at BSCS Emma Rogers, culminated in an evening concert. The event was such a huge success that Granville suggested we set up our own community choir". (You might remember reading about this fantastic day at the time in your Bradley Stoke & Little Stoke Gifford Matters!).

As a singer and teacher who worked at Clifton College and loves music, Ange always wanted to work in the community as her own children grew up and so, on speaking with Emma Rogers, formed a musical team with Robin Fry and recruited a committee. On the 6th November 2012, the choir held their first rehearsal.

"Open to everyone to have fun and build on our community spirit" the choir now has 50 members registered. They are always happy to welcome new members who "don't have to be great singers, just enthusiastic and want to join in". Meeting at BSCS weekly on Tuesday evenings (term time only) the group are generously offered the facilities free of charge. However, funds are raised through concert ticket sales. CD sales and bucket collections and the group, which is FREE to members, have donated £500 back to the school to date! There is no pressure for singers to perform in any of the concerts and members are welcome to pop along to rehearsals as and when available (a few of the singers work shifts which makes a weekly commitment impossible).

Both Ange and Robin (the official accompianist is a full time piano teacher who is gigging at weekends in his own rock and roll band - the Alligators), give their time freely to the choir, purchase music and most importantly encourage the choir to "always believe" and to be "part of the big team".



Bradley Stoke Community Singers have now performed local Summer and Christmas concerts, have sang at the Willow Brook Centre, entertained at the Christmas lights turn on event and attended a few of the local school fetes. More recently you may have seen them at this year's Festival (photo below).

They have also now released tickets for their annual summer concert at Bradley Stoke Community School on 14th July where children from Wheatfield Primary School have also been invited to sing.

Members live locally across the Stokes - the youngest is just 12 years old and eldest are in their 70s. Some read music and others can't, but the words are always printed to learn. The choir aim to be fully inclusive and are asked for suggestions of songs. It's realised that "if someone is singing a favourite they'll sing with more enthusiasm!"

All are welcome, regardless of age and ability. Ange is proud that a student in her gap year, having asked for more experience, will be conducting two of the songs in the summer concert and hopes this will encourage others to become musical directors and develop music within more communities. Ange also wanted to acknowledge the recent grant received from Bradley Stoke Town Council for which they are very grateful. This will assist in their marketing materials and music costs. (Of course promotion in Bradley Stoke & Little Stoke Gifford Matters for the community group is entirely free!)

# RFU Lead Up & Legacy -**Transforming Social Spaces**

Local rugby received a major boost this month when St Mary's Old Boys RFC was chosen by the Rugby Football Union to be a recipient of one of their 'Transforming Social Spaces' grants for the 2015 Rugby World Cup which is being staged in England and Wales.

St Mary's and their Junior Rugby partners Bradley Stoke Youth has been chosen as a recipient of the grant, strengthening the partnership between the RFU and Club to be 'Fit for 15'. The grant will enhance the club's social facilities and also provide a resource to be used by the local community. Whilst they have often funded pitches, posts, changing rooms etc, the RFU has traditionally never funded bars. The World Cup being hosted here this year is seen as an opportunity for amateur clubs to increase local interest in being part of the game - and what better way to encourage participation than by tranforming the social space into a great venue to go and watch the World Cup games later this year!.

To qualify for the grant, the Club had to attend a workshop where there were presentations on design, and information on capitalising on commercial opportunities. After this clubs were invited to apply for funding. The project had to cost at least £20k of which the club had to find £10k

"The new social space will improve the quality of the rugby experience for everyone using the site and provide more playing opportunities, especially for local people in the 14-24 age-group." said RFU Area Facilities Manager Jon Bendle. "This investment will also support the club's financial sustainability leading into the Rugby World Cup and will create a focus for England 2015 and a lasting rugby union legacy for rugby in the community. The bar refurbishment will help the club raise its profile and encourage more players, volunteers and spectators to share the special values that distinguish the sport."

The Club Chairman Peter Phelps told us - "We are delighted that our project has been chosen as a recipient for this grant. We will now have some of the best facilities in the area that local people from Bradley Stoke can use. The 2015 Rugby World Cup will inspire a new wave of people of all ages to become involved in rugby and this RFU investment will help our club to be even better equipped to welcome newcomers. St Mary's and Bradley Stoke Youth has an enthusiastic group of hard-working volunteers and this funding will enable them to do even more for young people in our community in the future."

Works were well underway when we visited the club and we look forward to seeing the end results!

Staff at Ambourne House are once again busy preparing for their forthcoming annual Family Fun Day and it was great to meet up with Nursery Manager, Liz, for a catch up and to discuss plans for this year's event. This popular, free family day aimed at preschoolers, is now in its 6th year. Everyone is welcome to join in this happy event, which will run from 2pm-5pm and offers bouncy castles, children's entertainment, face painting, refreshments and activites.

Liz told me that last year's Family Fun Day had been a terrific success with more families than ever having a great time, on what turned out to be the hottest day of the year! Children were able to have their faces painted, explore the bouncy castle and enjoy an amazing magical show. With ice lollies and cold drinks on hand to cool everyone down whilst also enjoying the BBQ, it was a great opportunity for families at Ambourne House to get together and enjoy the wonderful gardens that the nursery is so lucky to have!

In fact Liz told me that people can often not believe quite how large the gardens are at Ambourne House and how fortunate they are to have such a wonderful outdoor space, enjoyed by many children now over the last 24 years! The gardens have evolved over this time, with many wooden structures being added and natural resources being introduced to promote learning for children of all ages. These ongoing developments have enabled the nursery to support their philosophy that 'children learn best when outdoors'. More recently the staff at Ambourne have been trialling Forest School sessions, which Liz feels has reinforced this belief.

She explained that whilst engaging in these activities children have been able to be independent, set their own challenges and take risks, whilst also working collaboratively in groups to share ideas, all of which has boosted their confidence and self-esteem. "Their developing physical skills have been apparent when, for example, building shelters/structures, balancing, climbing and swinging, whist also cutting up fruit and making friendship bracelets." Liz told me.

Generally Liz felt that Forest School activities were a great way of extending all of the learning that happens inside, outside, as the children can use a variety of natural materials in a creative way and let their unique imaginations run wild. They can also learn about the natural world through planting and growing, whilst continuing to develop mathematical and literacy skills through their exploration of measurements, problem solving and mark-making.

Following on from these successful trials, Liz is now planning to implement the Forest School approach in all aspects of the outdoor learning at Ambourne

The Nursery, which has now been open for 24 years, continues to thrive and flourish and Liz, who has been at the nursery since the very beginning said "I

have always felt a great sense of pride in the way that Ambourne House has grown and developed". Key to the nursery's success is its dedicated team of staff, many of whom have been at the nursery for over 10 years and two have even been with Liz for over 20!! "It is this type of loyalty and commitment that provides the continuity that is so vital for children in their early years" said Liz.

"The building of relationships is so important and I guess that's why the Fun Day has become so important to us. We hope that lots of families will be able to join us again this year and look forward to seeing you all on Saturday 25th!!"



# I would walk 60,000 miles: Meadowbrook Primary School joins 100,000 kids walking for road safety

On 10th June pupils from Meadowbrook Primary joined over 100,000 children across the UK taking part in Brake's Giant Walk, the road safety charity's initiative sponsored by Brantano to get children walking and to highlight the importance of road safety to children leading active, healthy lives.

Over 100,000 children walked a combined total of over 60,000 miles, learning about road safety and calling on drivers to 'GO 20' in communities to make streets safer for kids to walk and cycle.

Mrs Kerry Trotman, Class teacher and Travel Ambassador at Meadowbrook Primary School, told us: "We're delighted to take part in Brake's Giant Walk. It's a fantastic opportunity for kids to make their voices heard and promote road safety to children, parents and local drivers."

The children took part in Brake's Giant Walk to encourage the local community to slow down to 20mph and to ask them where possible to park at the Willowbrook Shopping Centre Car Park when dropping off for school.

"This is our community and we all need to be considerate to local residents and the safety of our children." added Mrs Trotman. "Congestion is incredibly heavy during the school run and there have been many near misses. We all need to work together on this."

The morning started with the Travel Crew pictured above (George Trotman, Vicky the Vixen, Charlie Prewett, Alex Clutterbuck, Tom Shadbolt, Beth Owen and Mackenzie Marsh, pictured with Head Teacher Jon Barr and the local police team) handing out leaflets to parents at the preschool and the school gates asking them to park away from the school entrance.

In addition to the Giant Walk the Travel Crew are also running Sustrans SuperHeros Challenge. Research has shown that the more active the children become the higher their attainment at school is. Children at Meadowbrook have a booklet where they receive rewards for walking to school, scooting to school, having bike training etc details on the Sustrans website.

There will be a Road Safety Stall at the school's Summer Fete on 4th July 1-4pm where children and parents can take part in fun activities and share



### their concerns about parking.

To coincide with the Giant Walk event, Brake has revealed survey results showing tha the biggest factors stopping parents letting kids walk and cycle to school are not time or inconvenience, but the dangers of fast traffic and a lack of safe routes.

Almost half (46%) of UK primary school children are driven to school, impacting on children's health and contributing to congestion and traffic danger. This lack of physical activity is a factor in rising childhood obesity, with three in 10 children in England aged two to 15 now overweight or obese. The World Health Organisation recently warned of a looming obesity epidemic if lifestyles do not change, with three-quarters of men and two-thirds of women in the UK projected to be overweight in 15 years' time.

Our kids have expressed their wish to get out and about more on foot and bike, with three quarters (76%) of participants in last year's Giant Walk saying they want to walk and cycle more, to get to school, go to the park, or to see friends. However, more than half (56%) said they are scared of being run over by traffic when walking or cycling on roads.

Brake is campaigning for drivers and government to take action to make streets safer for kids and help them enjoy a healthy, active, happy childhood, by backing Brake's GO 20 campaign. For drivers, this means slowing down to 20mph or less wherever there may be people on foot or bike, and always keeping a look out for vulnerable road users. For government, this means implementing widespread 20mph speed limits in towns, cities and villages – one of the most effective measures identified by the World Health Organisation to reduce pedestrian casualties.

All of the children we spoke to on the day told us they would have liked to have walked further!



# Green Science Week at Meadowbrook

To celebrate Bristol being crowned the Green Capital, Meadowbrook Primary School organised a 'Green Science Week' starting Monday 8th June.

It was a pleasure to be invited along to witness the array of activities organised by Mrs Asima Quereshi, Science Leader and year 4 Teacher. Themes for the week included Energy, Transport, Fair trade and Waste.

Children worked as engineers designing and making a product within their chosen theme. The week began with a science assembly and even a science show for parents and their children after school.

Year 6 children carried out a practical action challenge designing and making floating gardens. They learnt that, as a result of climate change, there is more rain in Bangladesh than ever before. Land where farmers used to grow their crops is now flooded on a regular basis resulting in families going hungry. The challenge set for the children was to design and build a model structure that will enable farmers to grow crops even in an area that may become flooded. We were impressed with their knowledge of knots as they tied twigs together with string to make the rafts! Designs were tested within filled paddling pools in the school playground; children were keen to share their results and it seems most did float!

In Year 5 pupils had a workshop by students from UWE (University of the West of England) and designed and made their own wind turbines. It was interesting to see pupils testing their models and coming up with improvements before the final test!

Year 4 will be entering the 'My Green city' design competition for schools designing and making their own Eco buildings. The My Green City competition challenges primary and secondary students in Bristol to respond to a design brief on the theme of sustainable cities and food, by creating 2D design





drawings, 3D models and a City Charter. Winners

will be selected by a panel of industry experts, and prizes awarded. Winning designs will be exhibited in the Architecture Centre's city centre public gallery during the summer holidays.

The children were keen to show and explain their models and why they'd chosen to add wind turbines, vertical farming and allotments to their cities. One pupil told me the week was the "best ever; we haven't even done literacy or numeracy". He was quickly corrected by his class teacher and soon realised he'd covered these subjects and more without even realising!

Year 3 learned about recycling, and designed and made their own birdhouses from recycling materials; they too were very proud of their brightly painted models which will now be hung in the school gardens. many of the children were keen to make their designs to look like a bird or owl. We were asked to judge the best, but to be honest there were so many great models it would've been a hard job (and some were still having finishing touches added!)



Fair trade was the topic for year 2; they made their own body scrubs using natural ingredients.

Year 1 pupils designed on paper their eco cars before making their vehicles out of recycled bottles and other materials. They concluded the week by articulating their design in a poster.

More recycling material was utilised by the reception pupils who made their own musical instruments; our favourite was a guitar!

Engineers visited the school across the week and pupils benefited from different workshops: Airbus ran a cabin design workshop for year 5. Rolls Royce made solar powered cars with the children and a mining engineer spoke to Year 6 about renewable resources.

Water aid delivered a talk to children about their vision of a world where everyone everywhere has safe water sanitation and hygiene. There was also forest school activities such as nature identification walks, fire building and making water filters. We were fortunate to join two classes; one filtering water and the other building a fire. In both sessions, pupils asked many questions and took on board the safety aspects of fire in particular. They seemed to like the outdoor learning experience (and the toasted marshmallows!)

Students from Bradley Stoke Community School taught Year 1 about healthy eating and abut how to grow fruits and vegetables in the school garden and, to end a very busy week, an engineer from Skanska brought in his electric car and helped Year 6 to judge the best designs from each class.

We imagine Mrs Quereshi along with all staff will have enjoyed their weekend after such a busy week of planned activities. The school is thankful for the outside companies, organisations and individuals who took time out to interact and share experiences with the school.

# Looking to the Future: Electricity from Waste

Bradley Stoke Matters has thoroughly enjoyed visiting the year 5 classrooms at Baileys Court Primary School to assist with reporting on their 12 week project with UWE which has been supported by a Royal Society

Since April, pupils have donned lab coats, goggles and gloves each Wednesday afternoon to carry out hands on experiments in generating electricity from waste products. They have focused on and constructed simple microbial fuel cells (MFC's); a technology employing bacteria to produce electricity. Encouraged by Dr Debbie Lewis and Dr Jon Winfield from the Department of Biological, Biomedical and Analytical Sciences at the University of the West of England, pupils were initially encouraged to think about their local environments and where bacteria may live. They have dug deep to make muddy water to add to their MFC's. Over time, bacteria has produced electricity which pupils have measured and recorded on a regular basis.

Pupils have nurtured their MFC's to maximise on the production of electricity. They have taken them outside into the sunshine as well as placing in the fridge and soon realised that, like the majority of us, bacteria prefers the warmth and produces more energy with increased temperatures. Pupils took readings from their microbial fuel cells firstly with a closed circuit voltage then an open circuit voltage. All MCF's were then linked together and connected to a light, a switch to a power bulb flicked and ... It Worked! (which wasn't expected so early in the series of the lessons!). The children were amazed that "things from the school grounds and bacteria from waste products could possibly power a small light bulb" and continued "in the future it could grow to something much bigger!" It is hoped that by the end of the project enough power will be produced to power a small appliance.

Tomissa & Bethan told us "We thought of places which were clean and dirty around the school. We used swabs and petri dishes to collect the bacteria. We went around different areas (e.g. the staffroom, the kitchen, door handles, sinks, computer keyboards, a piano and more). We used our swabs to collect the bacteria. Then we opened the lid of the petri dish and gently smeared an S onto the surface of the agar. We had been told to shut the lid quickly otherwise other bacteria would float up and land on the agar. We did this in two areas then went back to the classroom". The

dishes were then incubated at UWE and returned a week later. "We had a key and a chart and for

each of the colonies we had to write down their individual markings. We had to compare these unique makings with other colonies, and see how many different types there were". The students told us.

Pupils also learnt, to

their surprise, about bacteria on their hands (and of their teachers too!). Washing hands is common practice for us all, however through another test using magic lotion, pupils rubbed this all over their hands then washed their hands as they normally do. The lotion can be seen under UV light and it was soon clear to the children that areas usually missed are around the nails and in the creases of the hands. "We wash our hands properly now" one year 5 pupil has since told us!

As well as investigating bacteria's reaction with various concentrations of ribena, pupils have also explored which bacteria-killer would kill the most bacteria. comparing toothpaste, washing liquid and hand gel.

Aside from the numerous practical experiments carried out pupils have a will out, pupils have written up work, sent Bradley Stoke Matters blogs to share on-line and utilised figures to plot results on graphs. As we go to print, posters of the project are being designed to present their learning to parents in a finale session.

With Bristol being the Green Capital of 2015, the project is very relevant and UWE were keen to share the progress with the community, hence publishing the weekly updates on our website and facebook page. We are grateful for the opportunity of tracking the project as a whole and look forward to working with Dr Debbie Lewis and colleagues in the next local school on a similar project.

# **Commercial Property- Entering in Haste**

Tony Moore, Specialist Commercial Property Solicitor with AMD Solicitors, examines the pros and cons of taking or giving occupation of a commercial property, before a lease is finalised.

Vacant properties are expensive for Landlords. Whilst empty they earn money for neither the Landlord nor a Tenant Business. It is not surprising therefore for one party or the other to be 'champing at the bit' to have a property occupied.

To complete the legal formalities of granting or assigning a lease will often take weeks, perhaps much longer. Understandably both the landlord and the tenant may become frustrated at the uncertain timescale.

### So why not just hand over the keys and let the formalities follow?

There are substantial risks for both Landlord and Tenant in allowing occupation before appropriate documents of the terms have been signed.

For a landlord, there is the danger that the tenant may start on making alterations to the premises and then simply change his mind and walk away. leaving behind an unlettable and expensive mess.

For the Tenant, he may invest large sums in fitting out premises for his business, only for the Landlord to change his mind and refuse to grant the lease leaving the tenant without premises and out of pocket.

Where a current Tenant wants to assign a lease, he must not allow a new tenant in before the Landlord has consented. Otherwise there will be a breach of the terms of the lease. This might result in the unhappy outcome of the lease being forfeited ie the Landlord taking back the lease and allowing neither the old or new tenant to have the premises.

Without a written agreement it will not be clear who will be responsible for repairs and outgoings at the property, who is to insure both the building and its contents and how long the lease will last. A Landlord may also unwittingly allow an occupier to obtain full rights of security of tenure under the Landlord and Tenant Act 1954.

Having said this, the commercial reality is that people do want to

move in before completion of the paperwork. So what are the options?

It is possible to enter into a written agreement which will provide certainty and a degree of protection for both Landlord and Tenant for the interim period before the final Lease is ready to be completed. This can be by either what is called a 'tenancy at will' or a short term licence to occupy. Both a tenancy at will and a licence come with a 'health warning' as neither presents a complete solution and carry their own significant risks.

As a solicitor. I would usually advise both parties to wait for completion of the legal formalities, and not give possession or enter into occupation of commercial premises without proper advice.

# **Gardening Matters**

### Flowers - sowing and planting

Plant out summer bedding and seed-raised plants, if not already done so. Make sure they are well watered in and keep moist during dry weather. Plant out cannas and dahlias once danger of frost has passed.

Gaps in herbaceous borders are best filled with annual bedding at this stage in the season. One exception is anemones (eg Anemone coronaria). which take about three months to flower after planting. The rhizomes are best planted now, after an overnight soaking, 5cm (2in) deep in a suitably moist but free-draining soil or compost with lots of added leaf mould or organic matter. It is not too late to direct sow a few fast growing, late-flowering hardy annuals such as Calendula, Godetia and Clarkia.

Perennials such as hollyhock, delphiniums (D 'Fenella', photo top) and lupins can be sown directly into drills outside once the seed heads have ripened and started to split naturally. If garden space is limited you can sow them into pots and place them in a cold frame or by the base of a sheltered wall in filtered sunlight.

If you want to grow your own spring bedding for next year, many (including wallflowers, pansies, and Bellis perennis) need to be sown between May and July in order to flower next spring. Polyanthus primulas are best sown only when temperatures are reliably warm, as they need a constant temperature of around 15°C (60°F). A sheltered cold frame in June or July provides the right environment.

Winter bedding plants for the following winter can also be sown from May until July. Attractive choices include ornamental cabbages, kales and winter pansies. Tubs can be planted up with summer bedding if not done already.

### Cutting back, pruning and dividing

Spreading and trailing plants, can become tatty and patchy. Trimming them back after flowering encourages fresh growth and new flowers. Cut back dead bulb foliage if not done already. It is important to wait until the foliage dies down naturally, as cutting back too early can lead to blindness next year.

Cutting back clumps of spring-flowering perennials can encourage a fresh flush of foliage.

Euphorbias looks a lot better if spent flowers are removed, cutting the flowered stem back to ground level. This can be especially important with Euphorbia amygdaloides var. robbiae, as old stems of this cultivar are

particularly prone to powdery mildew when grown in dry soils.

Pinch out the leading shoots on plants such as Chrysanthemum and Helianthus to encourage bushy plants. However, if tall thin sprays are preferred, they can be left un-pinched, perhaps removing a few buds (known as 'disbudding') to encourage larger blooms.

Divide hostas as they come into growth. Divide Primula (primroses) after flowering, planting them in a nursery bed until they are ready for planting out again in the autumn. Lift and divide overcrowded clumps of bulbs after they have finished flowering.

### **Propagation**

Perennials that are showing new shoots from the crown can still be propagated via basal stem cuttings.

Take cuttings from garden pinks (Dianthus). They can be pulled off the parent plant by pulling with thumb and forefinger while holding a suitable non-flowering shoot four pairs of leaves from the tip. Treat as softwood cuttings.
