Bradley Stoke Community School Primary Phase opened its doors on Wednesday 9th September to the first cohort of 4 year olds.

Dressed in a plain white polo shirt with BSCS logo and the same teal coloured jumpers as worn by the secondary phase of the school, there is a clear identity. With over 100 applications made by local families for their children to attend the school, the first intake into Acorn Class is full.

In response to a shortage of local primary school places, Bradley Stoke Community School was approached by South Gloucestershire Council to become an all-through education provider. The school has a well-established ethos and culture and a positive reputation in the local community. Senior leaders were keen to offer a learning continuum from age 4-18 and a bid for funding was successful in 2013, with building work commencing in September 2014. Midas completed the work and did "an excellent job" handing over the building on schedule, as well as allowing pupils throughout the build to visit site linking with maths and engineering subjects. Whole school assemblies were also held sharing explanations and progress of the project.


Head teacher, Mrs Sharon Clark, was appointed in December 2014 and started formally in post in April 2015. Meadowbrook Primary School, also a member of the Olympus Academy Trust (OAT), has worked closely with the new Head teacher and BSCS staff to share expertise and learning ahead of welcoming the first cohort of pupils. Story times and family activities were held during the summer and home visits made by Miss Geraldine Rodgers (Reception Teacher) and Miss Nicola Burge (Teaching Assistant) prior to the start of the school year.

Considered as part of the main school, the building is detached from the main site but within the grounds. The space is bright and airy, modern with colourful furniture. Wi-fi, I-Pads and interactive white boards are in every classroom and Apple TVs. In addition to the foundations of reading, writing and numeracy, extra curriculum opportunities will be offered including a sports coaching programme and Irish dancing to name a few. Unique access to Savages Woods, just outside the school itself, will allow pupils to enjoy a comprehensive Forest School programme.

Secondary students continue to be very enthusiastic about ensuring primary pupils are part of the school community. Pupils have already created lots of art work (caricatures based on real head and shoulder

photos of the new pupils) to display in classrooms so that the new pupils feel welcome and the building feels 'lived in'. There will be plenty of opportunities for pupils to engage with older students through learning and enrichment as the school grows. Integration will be key, and will ensure that transition from Yr6 to Yr7 is seamless, which can only benefit their progress and achievement.

With slightly different start times to the Secondary phase and the provision of wrap around care, the



Reflecting on the first week, Sharon Clark told us "The children have had a lovely first week; they are really enjoying exploring the classroom and outdoor area. Among other things, we've had den building, water-play, sandcastle-making, painting, dinosaurs and a vast amount of glitter, glue and sequins! We are so pleased with how quickly they have settled into their new school and we are really enjoying getting to know our new children and their families.

Our new building has been full of visitors from across our OAT schools as well as tours for all the students in the Secondary Phase and Post 16. One of our spare KS2 classrooms is now home to the South Gloucestershire Early Years Advisory Team who will be using it as an Early Years training room; meaning we have easy access to advice and support from a team of Early Years experts.

We have started to build opportunities to work together with Secondary students; with dates planned for some of our year 8 students to come and share books with the reception children".

As we went to print on this edition BSCS were planning a balloon launch on 21st September to celebrate the first full day of school for all their pupils together. Bradley Stoke Matters also looks forward to attending the official launch of the Primary phase on October 21st where time capsules will be buried and a ribbon cut.

Redland High's Prize Winners Reach For The Sky!

On Friday 18 September 2015, Redland High School for Girls' alumna, Jenny Body OBE, gave the keynote speech and presented prizes to the girls of Redland High School during their annual Prize Giving Ceremony at the Wills Memorial Building in Bristol.

Jenny has worked as a professional engineer in the Aerospace Industry for more than 40 years and was the first ever female President of the Royal Aeronautical Society. She spends much of her time promoting the study of the STEM subjects: science. technology, engineering and mathematics.

"It is fantastic to return to the school 44 years since I have graduated," said Jenny, "and see that the girls who study here now are just as enthusiastic, intelligent and generous as ever. I am honoured to be awarding them prizes for the quality of their characters and their academic achievements.

Redland High gave me an excellent start to my future career, and it is obvious that it is continuing to support girls by giving them the tools they need to set them up for life."

Jenny's speech will undoubtedly inspire Redland's young women, many of whom excelled at the STEM subjects this year.

Over 80% of all pupils who sat their A Levels at Redland High in 2015 studied at least one STEM subject, and over 70% of the grades awarded in biology, chemistry, physics, mathematics and further mathematics were top A*/A grades.

Miss Stephanie Ferro, Headmistress at Redland High, said, "Prize Giving is always an extremely important event as we take time to recognise the incredible achievements of our girls.

We were honoured to welcome Old Girl Jenny Body OBE to the event, and I feel certain that her incredible achievements in Aeronautics



will further encourage Redland High Girls to reach for the skv!"





Bradley Stoke Youth FC expansion continues with their affiliation to the newly formed Bradley Stoke Ladies Team.

Bradley Stoke's first ever adult female team only got together and started training on May 6th this year, so it has been a fast learning curve to get the players in, organization of summer and winter training sessions, fund raising, player registrations, League registration, facility visit from the League, presentation to the League of our strategy and development plans plus many more activities.

The management team of Martin and Ross Lee is a well trusted pairing from their current duties with BSYFC as the managers of the U14 girls, coaching of U6 and U7 squads, and also their coaching for children with disabilities. They are assisted by Connall Tudor and Roger Hartill to ensure the Ladies team will be a success into the future.

The first training session on May 6th attracted 21 players and the squad now have 26 registered players for the season. However they continue to welcome new players to come and join the squad and to be part of something exciting. The range of ages of the players currently go from 16 to 40 plus!

The team was formed to enable the BSYFC U16 girls from last season the opportunity to continue in football within the town and we are pleased to see that six of them are now playing adult football. The town of Bradley Stoke has never had an adult female football team so this is a first and, with the links to the BSYFC girl squads, the future for the Ladies team looks great.

The team play in the Gloucestershire County Women's Football League Division 2. The team did not get a chance to play any friendly matches before the season started, so their first ever match was on Sunday Sept 6th against Port of Bristol Ladies.

Martin told us "I am pleased to report that the team played very strong and battled to a 2-2 draw with both goals coming from India Gay (ex BSYFC U16 player). We were worried we may not get any points this season but we already have one point on the board and with the way we played I am sure there will be many more to come."

The squad is based around the ethos of a fun and friendly environment with development of football skills high on the agenda. If anyone is interested in joining the Ladies squad please contact Martin Lee at mlee1@btopenworld.com

Bradley Stoke's first Triathlon voted huge success

Bradley Stoke has held its first and sell out community triathlon over the August Bank Holiday weekend, with 150 first time and experienced participants swimming, cycling and running their way to the finish line.

Bristol locals Martin Reed and Nikki Smith won the Male and Female Open title and Simon Ward and Michelle Kerfoot came first in the veteran's category. It was local man Simon's 26th triathlon event and he completed the course in just one hour and 40 seconds.

Matthew Fratesi, aged 18, peddled his way to victory, coming second in the open male category, as well as achieving the fastest bike split time. The event, which consisted of a 400 metre pool swim, 18 km cycle and 5 km run attracted crowds of supporters, including 40 volunteers to keep everything on track.

It was organised by Active Centres in partnership with South Gloucestershire Council and Triathlon England with the swim completed in the pool at Bradley Stoke Leisure Centre.

Afterwards the Triathlon Federation praised the organisers for a friendly and well organised competition.

Nick Groves, Assistant Manager at Kingswood Leisure
Centre who came over the line in 1 hour 9 minutes, said: "It was such an exciting atmosphere on race day, everyone was in high spirits and it was great to be a part of. I'd like to thank my fellow team members at Active for organising such a fun and well-managed event."

Fiona West, Sales and Marketing Manager at Circadian Trust, said: "Our first Triathlon was a great success and we are really proud of everyone that took part. We'd like to take this as an opportunity to thank the local community for their support and we hope that this event will become an annual occasion following the feedback we have received."

The Triathlon was part of Active Leisure Centre's tenth anniversary celebrations. Any profits made will be reinvested into future events and other sport development projects in the local community.

Working out of the new Patchway Police Centre on Gloucester Road (where the enquiry office is open from 0800hrs -

2000hrs Monday-Sunday), they host drop-in surgeries at the Willow Brook Centre, lunch time sessions every fortnight at Bradley Stoke Community School and also take the mobile station to Woodlands Park in Woodlands Lane, North Bradley Stoke.

Alicia is new to Bristol and South Gloucestershire, moving from Somerset. She admits she used to get lost in the town centre! Prior to working for the Police, Alicia worked as a Youth Leader for the local council whilst attending Bridgwater College to complete a diploma in Production Arts. Loving theatre and live events, if Alicia hadn't chosen to work within the local police force, she would like to be working

within the production industry. With her passion for music, she is always looking to encourage people to get into music by playing or singing. She did state "Who knows maybe a Police band will play on Bradley Stoke Radio one day!"

Over the August bank holiday weekend, the team supported the well turned out local Carnival as well as the triathlon on the Sunday when 150 contestants turned out to compete. They get involved with both national and local initiatives: Rogue Traders week is coming up and the local initiative is to join the regular coffee morning at Christ the King Church to share advice on crime prevention and give out information leaflets. Claire and Alicia will both be present at the coffee morning on 2nd October.

The beat team continue to use their strong links with the schools to go in and teach the children. Their lesson packages range from Online Awareness to Choices and Consequences of Crime. The team are actively looking at ways to reduce parking issues in and around the schools, especially with the onset of wetter weather when many parents tend to drop off by car. On the 12th of October they will be at Baileys Court Primary School for a week looking at the parking issues in the morning and the afternoon.

Supporting local residents with the onset of Halloween, posters will be available from the Willowbrook Centre for the public to put up in the windows to let the Trick or Treaters know if they don't want to be called on.

Resident's Welcome Development of New Clothing Stores within Tesco Extra

Since our first announcement on Facebook on 9th September of the new Tesco Extra plans within the Willowbrook Centre in Bradley Stoke, we caught up with Dan Morris, Refit Manager, for a greater understanding of the new layout of the store.

Having trialled the idea in Europe, the success has encouraged the General Merchandise (non food) transformation in the UK, although with different concessions, and Bradley Stoke is the first in the South West group to do so.

With just 5 weeks from start up to the project going live, it's all hands to the deck and you will have seen sections of the ground floor being moved and transformed with new styles of racking, A-frames, nesting tables and towers and hoardings erected upstairs. Arcadia Group will be taking space upstairs for their Dorothy Perkins store and Burtons and there will be a refit for the F&F brand. The mobile phone shop will be relocated to the front of the store where the Direct desk is currently. Customer Service will remain in the same location

alongside the foreign exchange bureau and you will soon find the Direct desk located at the back of the store, alongside the electrical line.

Claire's will also be in store mid November, also going upstairs.

Non Food and F&F will be completed by 12th October and the launch of the new store by 26th October (dates just advised as we go to print).

The onset of additional clothing shops to the Willow Brook Centre store seems to have initiated a positive response locally; our Facebook post on 9th September reached nearly 8,000 users, attracted over 100 likes and a vast amount of positive comments!

Dan also commented that "The response from the community has been overwhelming so far, with one local resident having recalled purchasing his first tailored suit from Burton's on the Gloucester Road for £4". Many will know that Burton's was the first to sell off the peg tailored suits! It is also thought additional customers will be visiting Bradley Stoke because of the new stores resulting in a larger footfall for other local businesses too.



Testamentary Freedom - Fact or Fiction ?

Andrew Jack of AMD Solicitors considers whether you can draft your will leaving your property to whomever you wish in light of recent case law.

The case of llott V Mitson has been in the press recently with various degrees of accuracy and scaremongering. Reports in the press have claimed that you can now no longer leave your money to whomever you wish. While I love a good story as much as the next man, perhaps it is time to step back and see whether this decision has really decreased your opportunity to leave your money however you wish.

The background to the case is well known by now but, in brief, Heather llott was omitted from her mother's will after her mother never forgave her for eloping at the age of 17. On her mother's death she discovered that she had been left nothing from her mother's £486,000 estate, and that her mother had left it all to charities, including 3 with whom her mother had no previous donating history.

This seems to have been the focus of the court when deciding the outcome of the appeal. The ruling, whilst touted in the press as limiting your freedom to leave your estate to who you wish, has more to do with disinheriting a child in very specific circumstances. Heather llott had lost her father before she was born and her mother inherited everything from her husband. There was also a very specific need from Heather llott's circumstances. The court also took the view that the mother's behaviour had been unreasonable and capricious.

While you still have the freedom to leave your estate to who ever you wish, it may now be a touch riskier if you are disinheriting a child. Anyone seeking to make a will should seek advice before doing so and, if you are intending to disinherit a child, this has now become even more crucial







Health Matters by local GP, Dr Knut Schroeder

When your baby is unwell What to look out for and when to seek help

All young children fall ill from time to time. Most of the time, harmless infections are to blame, which will get better by themselves. But occasionally, symptoms may mean that something more serious may be going on – and you may worry and wonder what to do next.

So how can you tell the difference between what's normal and what isn't?

When your child is unwell, look out for the following warning signs that may suggest serious illness and should prompt you to seek medical help urgently:

- Fever: A raised body temperature of more than 38°C in babies under 3 months or 39°C in children 3 to 6 month old – especially when your child's hands and feet are cold
- Skin colour: Looking unusually pale or blotchy
- Drinking: Not drinking for more than eight hours
- Soft spot: The soft spot on your baby's head bulges or dips
- Alertness: Your child is drowsy and doesn't respond to you in the normal way, or you have to try quite a bit harder than usual to wake her or him
- Behaviour and response: Your child is much less active than usual, doesn't look content and doesn't smile
- Crying: Your child just doesn't stop crying, or the crying sounds very different – particularly if it's high-pitched or weak
- Breathing: Your child's nostrils flare, and her or his breathing appears much more laboured and faster than normal
- Dry mouth: Your child feeds poorly and has a dry mouth
- Wet nappies: Your baby has less or no wet nappies anymore.

- Rash: Your child develops a new rash
- · Vomiting: Repeated vomiting

If you notice any of these signs, contact your GP surgery urgently.

Give first aid and call 999 for an ambulance if your child:

- Stops breathing
- Struggles for breath
- Doesn't respond and won't wake up
- Has a fit for the first time

Remember that most childhood illnesses are harmless – but trust your instincts and don't hesitate to seek advice if you're worried.
