Regular readers of Little Stoke Gifford Matters will know that we have been following the progress of this project at the Heart of the Community since it started on site in July 2013 (who remembers the early photos on site above right?).

It has been an interesting journey to be allowed to visit site on a regular basis since to keep our readers updated whilst we watched the vision, and the building, come to life.

At the end of April the build was sufficiently complete to allow the community in for the first time!

Over 260 people attended the first services to be held in the new Community Centre over the weekend of 25/26th April when members of the congregation were able to use it for the annual Church Weekend and both the 10.30am and 6.30pm Sunday services.

For more than a decade the 10.30am family service has had to be held in two separate locations – the 14th century church and the former village school, known as the Old School Rooms - as the church is no longer large enough to accommodate the growing membership. The new building is therefore a key element of the St Michael's Heart of the Community project bringing the congregation back to worshipping together, with the new auditorium currently capable of seating 350 people. The facilities also include room for a shop, a large reception area,

church office, conference areas for schools and businesses, meeting rooms and accommodation for wedding receptions, birthdays and other celebrations.

After much fundraising effort, this first phase was completed for a cost of £4.2m - the congregation and local community's reponse to this has been fantastic throughout. Once further sufficient funds have been raised, a second phase of building work will add catering facilities, additional meeting and conference rooms and a further 220 seats on a balcony over the main auditorium.

The Reverend Simon Jones. Rector of St Michael's said:

"We bought the land 10 years ago, and after eight years of planning, four years of preparing and two years of building, the new St Michael's Centre in Stoke Gifford is now open! It has been a long journey, but I am delighted that the new centre is now being used.

St Michael's has a long history of serving the local community and we hope that the centre will benefit not only the local community, but also the wider reaion.

It's been a challenge to secure the £4.2m needed to get to this stage, but the congregation have responded magnificently and we are now seeking to raise the £1.5m needed to finish the centre and complete the project."



Back in September the new building was dedicated by the Archbishop of Canterbury, Justin Welby, and a corner stone built into the reception area of the centre commemorates this. As he stood in the then shell of the new church and community centre Archbishop Welby stated:

"This project warms my heart. This is not about a community building: this is about building a community."

On Sunday 10th May the new centre was officially dedicated and licensed by The Bishop of Bristol, the Right Reverend Mike Hill, who carried out the ceremony during the 6.30pm evening service. The centre is now officially open for public worship, marriages, baptisms and funerals.

Rev Simon Jones further commented: "We welcome new people to the church every week. With more than 3,000 homes due to be built in the parish over the next decade, there is a pressing need not only for more space for the church but also local amenities for the community. Our vision is for the facilities to make a real difference to groups, organisations and events across the community and the Bristol region. There is a lot of interest in the new building and we are already taking bookings."

St Michael's Church looks forward to welcoming you! The 10.30am and 6.30pm Sunday worship services will be held in the new centre. The 9am Sunday service and monthly evensong will continue to be held in the church.





This open, green space, much loved by bird watchers, dog walkers and many others, is cared for by a small team of volunteers.

We planted 70 trees last year and they were staked and guarded with the help of the Green Gym from Bradley Stoke. Following the winter and spring they are looking strong and showing their buds and leaves.

As we write, we have a few projects planned, waiting for the better weather so that vehicles can be driven into the fields to work on the brick building in the middle of the large field. A new door with a steel front will be installed and Bat boxes fitted inside the building. It will be a Bat Sanctuary for our many Pipistrelle Bats that fly around our fields at night.

It is also planned to plant many wild flower seeds on the tump in that field, when it has been prepared.

Keeping the stream clear of rubbish, overgrown vegetation and Himalayan Balsam is important to the Kingfisher, dragonflies, ducks etc. We definitely need help with this task, also litter picking, so if anyone can give up a small amount of their time with helping us, please come and join us. It can be fun!

We must mention the amount of 'dog poo' left in the fields. Families, people walking to work or the shops etc. all use the fields and should do so without carrying it on their shoes. There is no such thing as a 'Poo Fairy' so please pick it up and any bin will do. There are many bins placed in the fields - there is no excuse! Crisp packets are lethal to hedgehogs that walk in after food but cannot reverse, so die of starvation.

Little Stoke Garden Society -**Update by Maureen Harris**

Winter is gone, and summer is coming – hurray! But we still need to be careful of frosts on tender shoots. The blackthorn bushes flowered heavily this spring, giving promise of a good crop of sloes in the 40 acre fields later in the year.

On the allotments the planting of crops has started in earnest, but as always the fastest growing plants seem to be the weeds. We still need a bit more warmth to encourage the vegetables.

Rhubarb is cropping well already, and the apple and pear trees are blossoming well, with raspberry canes showing a growth spurt.

The Society administers the allotments on behalf of Stoke Gifford Parish Council, and allotments are available to people who live in the Parish. The waiting list for allotments is quite short at the moment; if you think you would like to have a go at growing your own, do contact the postmaster@ littlestokegardensociety.co.uk, or pop into the shop on a Sunday morning to put your name down on the list.





Gardening Matters

Flowers - sowing and planting

Plant out summer bedding and seed-raised plants, if not already done so. Make sure they are well watered in and keep moist during dry weather. Plant out cannas and dahlias once danger of frost has passed.

Gaps in herbaceous borders are best filled with annual bedding at this stage in the season. One exception is anemones (eg Anemone coronaria), which take about three months to flower after planting. The rhizomes are best planted now, after an overnight soaking, 5cm (2in) deep in a suitably moist but free-draining soil or compost with lots of added leaf mould or organic matter. It is not too late to direct sow a few fast growing, late-flowering hardy annuals such as Calendula, Godetia and Clarkia.

Perennials such as hollyhock, delphiniums (D 'Fenella', photo top) and lupins can be sown directly into drills outside once the seed heads have ripened and started to split naturally. If garden space is limited you can sow them into pots and place them in a cold frame or by the base of a sheltered wall in filtered sunlight.

If you want to grow your own spring bedding for next year, many (including wallflowers, pansies, and Bellis perennis) need to be sown between May and July in order to flower next spring. Polyanthus primulas are best sown only when temperatures are reliably warm, as they need a constant temperature of around 15°C (60°F). A sheltered cold frame in June or July provides the right environment.

Winter bedding plants for the following winter can also be sown from May until July. Attractive choices include ornamental cabbages, kales and winter pansies. Tubs can be planted up with summer bedding if not done already.

Cutting back, pruning and dividing

Spreading and trailing plants, can become tatty and patchy. Trimming them back after flowering encourages fresh growth and new flowers. Cut back dead bulb foliage if not done already. It is important to wait until the foliage dies down naturally, as cutting back too early can lead to blindness next year.

Cutting back clumps of spring-flowering perennials can encourage a fresh flush of foliage.

Euphorbias looks a lot better if spent flowers are removed, cutting the flowered stem back be especially important with Euphorbia amygdaloides var. robbiae, as old stems of this cultivar are

to ground level. This can

particularly prone to powdery mildew when grown in dry soils.

Pinch out the leading shoots on plants such as Chrysanthemum and Helianthus to encourage bushy plants. However, if tall thin sprays are preferred, they can be left un-pinched, perhaps removing a few buds (known as 'disbudding') to encourage larger blooms.

Divide hostas as they come into growth. Divide Primula (primroses) after flowering, planting them in a nursery bed until they are ready for planting out again in the autumn. Lift and divide overcrowded clumps of bulbs after they have finished flowering.

Propagation

Perennials that are showing new shoots from the crown can still be propagated via basal stem cuttings.

Take cuttings from garden pinks (Dianthus). They can be pulled off the parent plant by pulling with thumb and forefinger while holding a suitable non-flowering shoot four pairs of leaves from the tip. Treat as softwood cuttings.

Update from St Chad's - Feedback from Ofsted and SIAMs

Standards across the board higher than expected for children's age and rapid improvements at St Chad's Patchway CE VC Primary School identified in a double inspection success.

Here at St Chad's Patchway CE VC Primary School we are celebrating Ofsted and SIAMs (Statutory Inspection of Anglican and Methodist Schools) success with a grading of 'Good with Outstanding features' (OFSTED) and 'Outstanding' (SIAMs), when we were visited by the two inspection teams in late April.

Previously we were classed as 'Requires Improvement', and we have rapidly accelerated progress in all areas while keeping our "high level of care and support, strong sense of community and a school environment that makes pupils want to come to school" says OFSTED; "Nothing is too small to be noticed at St Chad's." (SIAMs).

Everyone at school is delighted to share that the Ofsted inspection judged St Chad's School as a good school with elements of outstanding, and described us as a rapidly improving school which cares for our pupils exceptionally well. They recognised the exemplary academic, social and emotional education we provide our pupils within a very positive ethos which permeates all aspects of the school. They recognised the pupils' general behaviour continues to be superb. They noted the rapid developments in behaviour for learning which has created an outstanding attitude toward learning and skills to access learning in all pupils.



Separately, the overarching role of the SIAMS inspection is to identify the effect that the Christian ethos of the church school has on the children and

young people who attend it. The SIAMs inspection graded us as outstanding with an extraordinary focus and high profile of spiritual development and a dynamic living ethos.

I would like to take this opportunity to thank the staff, pupils and governors (and parents) who have worked tirelessly over the last 2 years to make the necessary improvements in support of the school. These improvements were considered to be substantial and now embedded in school life.

I would also like to thank all of the parents who have supported the school in all we have been aiming to achieve. The inspectors noted; "The vast majority of parents who responded in the questionnaire feel that their children are very happy at school. This is reflected in the pupils' above average attendance, which also shows the school's supportive partnership with parents." We always say how school is a partnership and these reports have certainly shown that.

Both sets of inspectors found that parents and carers were extremely positive about the school, as were the pupils, who expressed how much they enjoyed coming to school and how safe and nurtured they felt when they are here.

The extent to which the school keeps children safe was judged to be outstanding by Ofsted (not individually looked at by SIAMs). The team also reported that behaviour was outstanding, and within this judgement how well pupils understand their personal impact on those around them, how they approach their own learning and the skills they have to be lifelong learners is graded. Ofsted noted how this had significantly developed over time and the skills that school teaches children creates a climate for this to blossom.



The way we cater for all needs in all areas was identified as being exceptional and contributed to the marked improvements across all areas with the result of: "a substantial number of pupils in all classes now show levels of skill that are higher than those normally *expected for their age.*" (Ofsted)

Teaching and attainment was praised highly. SIAMs noted that we are a "values driven community, the school is a place of nurture where the needs of each child are known, considered and addressed." While Ofsted stated the staff "have shared a sustained determination

to improve the quality of pupils' learning", and "as a result, pupils across the range of ability learn well."

For St Chad's it is not about an Ofsted or SIAMs label, it is about providing the very best all round education that we can. We strive to enable all children to find their talents, build on their strengths, recognise where they may find something tricky and help them have the skills to move forward from this. We strive to create caring, thoughtful and passionate pupils who are proud of themselves and the communities they live in, and we are pleased that Ofsted and SIAMs recognised this in their reports, highly praising the school and the pupils for this.

It was hard to write this without sounding like we are showing off! However, St Chad's school community has a lot to be proud of; the staff, parents / carers and most importantly the pupils have all worked hard to create something very special here in school.

Mathematics makes a splash at Clifton High School

At the beginning of May, pupils from Clifton High School undertook a live Skype call with the Song of the Whale research boat (pic right), currently based in Ipswich, which is home to a team of marine biologists. The pupils have been studying data from the boat in their mathematics lessons. looking at how its position is charted using mathematics, exploring co-ordinates and how the locations of whales and porpoises are tracked. The boys and girls had their questions

answered by a research scientist and also had a video tour of the boat.

Looking to the Future: Electricity from Waste

Year 5 pupils from Baileys Court Primary School have commenced a 12 week project in conjunction with UWE and supported by a grant received from the Royal Society. Bradley Stoke & Little Stoke Gifford Matters has been invited to go along and share this learning journey.

Whilst thinking about the depletion of the earth's resources and challenges created for future generations, the children will be gaining hands-on experience in generating electricity from waste products. With Bristol being the Green Capital of 2015, the project is deemed relevant and we are delighted to be a part of it to share their progress with the community. Microbial Fuel Cells (MFCs) – a technology employing bacteria to produce electricity – will be the main focus and in small groups MFCs will be constructed and inoculated from where bacteria may live.

In their first session pupils added various combinations of yeast, sugar, salt, hot and cold water to bottles to see if and how large they could blow up balloons. Results were recorded. There was a great buzz of excitement from the pupils, one of whom said "it's more fun than being sat in the classroom" and another "I just love science and experimenting!".

Drs. Debbie Lewis and Jon Winfield from UWE returned for week 2 at Baileys Court Primary School to begin constructing the MFCs, which are, in essence, "bacterial houses". Children built their MFCs, specially designed by UWE specifically for the Royal Society Schools' project. They then went outside to dig deep in the mud (home to lots of bacteria), to make muddy water and add this to the MFC. Over time, bacteria from the mud that are able to produce electricity, termed "electrigens", will begin to thrive in this environment and the pupils

will be able to measure how much voltage is produced from each MFC on a daily basis. In

daily basis. In the comming weeks the children will learn how to nurture their MFCs to maximise energy production and learn that what is essentially a waste product for bacteria - electricity, can be captured by the pupils to power small electrical appliances.

After week 3, two pupils Tomasina & Bethan wrote the following -

This week, we've accomplished a lot in our weekly science lesson with UWE.

Firstly, we read a voltage reading from our microbial fuel cells (MFCs). Then, we agitated mixed up - the mud inside the MFCs. We then took another voltage reading. The results were interesting. Secondly, we sucked up the muddy water using a syringe. After that, we fed sodium acetate to our microbial fuel cells. Now came the fun part! We each had a petri-dish that had a special type of jelly in it called agar. We had to press our fingers gently into the agar to see how clean our hands were. After a few seconds, we took our fingers out of the agar and shut the lid auickly. Debbie told us we could see the bacteria in next week's lesson. She also said that she would take them to UWE to incubate. After we'd done that, we thought of places which were clean and dirty around the school

We used swabs and new

petri dishes to collect the

bacteria. We went around in different places (eg the staffroom, the kitchen, door handles, sinks, computer keyboards, a piano and more areas.). When we got to specific area, we used our swabs to collect the bacteria. Then we opened the lid of the petri dish and gently smeared an S onto the surface of the agar. We had been told to shut the lid quickly otherwise other bacteria would float up and land on the agar. We did this in two areas then went back to the classroom. We discussed what we did in the afternoon. It was really fun, and we enjoyed it.

Over the course of the project, year 5 will vary the type and amount of food and monitor electrical output in order to observe the correlation between power and microbial metabolism. At the end of June, the pupils will have the chance to visit UWE to present their findings and also experience what university life is all about. A grand finale is scheduled for 8th July when hopefully individual MFCs will be joined and used to light up lights or move a windmill.

News from Little Stoke Primary School

The summer terms are a busy time at Little Stoke Primary when we can make the most of the fine weather to enjoy a lot of outdoor activities.

Forest School Update

living things. With this focus in mind, teacher, Miss Stephanie Crane, arranged for some very special visitors to join the foundation stage children in their classroom.

Towards the end of April the children arrived bright and early and were delighted to find an incubator, warming a clutch of eggs. The children learned that the incubator had two trays, which needed to be regularly filled with water in order to keep the air around the eggs moist. Everyone was thrilled to have a turn to hold, feed and care for them until it was time for them to leave for their new life on the farm. What a super learning experience!

The Big BBC Bug Hunt

The school recently received a very exciting invitation. The BBC asked a number of pupils to visit Broadcasting House, in Clifton, to participate in an activity day, in the BBC Wildlife Garden.

Pupils from the school's gardening club were obviously champing at the bit for such an amazing opportunity. So our representatives from ages 4 – 7 joined other schools from across Bristol and South Gloucestershire for a day of learning in the outdoors, alongside television presenter from The One Show, Mike Dilger.

The children worked in teams to carry out an enormous investigative task. They searched every inch of the BBC garden to find as many different species of mini-beast, grass and moss as was possible. A variety of techniques was employed: pupils were crawling on their hands and knees, sucking mini-beasts into bug-bottles and shaking wildlife into white umbrellas to see them more clearly. The results were amazing. Numerous beetles were discovered and over five species of spider.



"There were so many spiders!" said Josh Loud of Year 1. "I showed them to Mike and he told me their names – it was amazing."

The Gardening Club returned to school bubbling with excitement. Not only had they enjoyed every minute but their explorations were filmed and featured on the local news! In addition every child was presented with a special BBC Wildlife Garden pin-badge which they now wear with pride on their school uniform.

News from St Michael's Primary School

What a performance!

In April the school put on a production of 'The Pied Piper of Hamelin'. This involved nearly 100 children from Year 3 to Year 6 either singing, dancing, acting or playing music – and the result was a fantastic performance which was greatly enjoyed by parents over two evenings. At St Michael's we are passionate about giving children the opportunity to shine in all areas, and for us the performing arts are an essential part of the curriculum and the wider life of the school. Please read on for more information on different aspects of these performance skills.

Music

We employ our own specialist music teacher who works with children throughout Key Stage 2. This ensures that children receive an excellent theoretical and practical grounding in music. All children have the opportunity to learn the recorder in Year 2 or Year 3, while in Year 4 everyone learns the ukulele. Many children progress to group or individual music lessons. and we can offer a very wide range of teaching, including harmonica, drums, guitar, flute, clarinet, violin, keyboard and brass. The school has its own orchestra, as well as recorder and flute ensembles.

Singing is also highly valued and celebrated. All children have singing lessons weekly, and the standard throughout the school is amazingly high. We have a choir which performs regularly in school and outside, including the South Glos Schools' Concert at Colston Hall in June.

Drama

All children are involved in drama as part of their curriculum, and it is used to reinforce and develop learning in all sorts of situations. These might include role play to get a better understanding of social

situations; hot seating to appreciate the viewpoints of historical characters; and whole class and school performances for parents at regular intervals throughout the year. All year groups are involved in a production during the year, culminating in the Year 6 leavers' performance in July.

Dance

At St Michael's we love to dance! We have a dance teacher who works for two afternoons per week working with Key Stage 2 children, linking dance to the rest of the curriculum. Dance also features prominently in many of our assemblies and performances, and children also have the opportunity to learn dances from other cultures, including flamenco, Bollywood and the Chinese dragon dance.

Commercial Property- Entering in Haste

Tony Moore, Specialist Commercial Property Solicitor with AMD Solicitors, examines the pros and cons of taking or giving occupation of a commercial property, before a lease is finalised.

Vacant properties are expensive for Landlords. Whilst empty they earn money for neither the Landlord nor a Tenant Business. It is not surprising therefore for one party or the other to be 'champing at the bit' to have a property occupied.

To complete the legal formalities of granting or assigning a lease will often take weeks, perhaps much longer. Understandably both the landlord and the tenant may become frustrated at the uncertain timescale.

So why not just hand over the keys and let the formalities follow?

There are substantial risks for both Landlord and Tenant in allowing occupation before appropriate documents of the terms have been signed.

For a landlord, there is the danger that the tenant may start on making alterations to the premises and then simply change his mind and walk away, leaving behind an unlettable and expensive mess.

For the Tenant, he may invest large sums in fitting out premises for his business, only for the Landlord to change his mind and refuse to grant the lease leaving the tenant without premises and out of pocket.

Where a current Tenant wants to assign a lease, he must not allow a new tenant in before the Landlord has consented. Otherwise there will be a breach of the terms of the lease. This might result in the unhappy outcome of the lease being forfeited ie the Landlord taking back the lease and allowing neither the old or new tenant to have the premises.

Without a written agreement it will not be clear who will be responsible for repairs and outgoings at the property, who is to insure both the building and its contents and how long the lease will last. A Landlord may also unwittingly allow an occupier to obtain full rights of security of tenure under the Landlord and Tenant Act 1954.

Having said this, the commercial reality is that people do want to

move in before completion of the paperwork. So what are the options?

It is possible to enter into a written agreement which will provide certainty and a degree of protection for both Landlord and Tenant for the interim period before the final Lease is ready to be completed. This can be by either what is called a 'tenancy at will' or a short term licence to occupy. Both a tenancy at will and a licence come with a 'health warning' as neither presents a complete solution and carry their own significant risks.

As a solicitor. I would usually advise both parties to wait for completion of the legal formalities, and not give possession or enter into occupation of commercial premises without proper advice.

We were delighted to hear from Mike Mundy with regards to the Bradley Stoke Cricket Club. Mike is currently Club President and was also the founding member of the Club.

The main reason for the catch up was regarding the Club's impending 25th Anniversary in 2016, an event already in the planning!


Nine months on from Mike's original idea to form a local cricket club, the newly formed 'Bradley Stoke Cricket Club' was officially notified on 12th June 1991 that they had been selected by North Avon District Council to be the Cricket Club to use the superb new facilities at the Bailey's Court site.


Over the winter of 1991/early 92, the Club arranged some social evenings including some highly successful live band extravaganzas. They also had the idea for a major fundraising exercise which was to invite local England and Gloucestershire wicket keeper Jack Russell to officially open the premises. The date for this official opening was set for Saturday 11th April 1992. Jack came along and met with people, signed autographs and officially opened the Cricket Club. Not just a cricketer but a renowned painter too, one of Jack's limited edition paintings was offered as the first prize in the day's raffle. The print in question was called "Moment of Victory" depicting the winning run scored by England against the West Indies on the 1st March 1990. It was signed by all the England players taking part in the match. Entry for the raffle was by programme only and each one was individually numbered. We have included some scans of that original programme (right) as it makes interesting reading when Bradley Stoke was just in its infancy!

BSCC has grown into a popular, friendly and well utilised cricket club with over 60 adult members and also a vibrant youth section with over 80 youth members playing in 5 youth teams. It is currently looking to fund a new project for outdoor practice nets, with plans drawn up in February this year.

As a reflection of the opening nearly 25 years ago, the plan for 2016 is very similar. The Club is in the process of constructing a new programme and looking for local community sponsors to help with this. Jack Russell, now reitred from cricket and a full time artist, has been invited to the Club once again to mark the occasion. It is also anticipated that one or more of Jack's paintings will be up for prizes in the raffle, entry to which will be via the programme which this time will cost around £3 each (just an increase of £1 in 25 years!). Programmes will be on sale later this year and the day for the celebrations next year has been planned for Sunday 6th June to coincide with the Bradley Stoke Festival weekend.
