### **Update from the Local Beat Team**

A new year has arrived and the beat welcomes back Kirsty McKillop who has been missing from the Neighbourhood Policing Team for some time. Kirsty is keen to get out and about and engaging with the community on her new beat. Kirsty has already conducted a couple of beat surgeries at the old school rooms at the Green, Stoke Gifford, and will be once again involved in assisting in supporting the local pubwatch scheme, which is now five and a half years old. We are fortunate to have both Kirsty and Jason on the beat as they are two of the most senior and experienced Community Support Officers for the area. Together Jason & Kirsty have already been out visiting local schools and interacting with students this year.

In February both Jason & Kirsty undeertook a bike marking day at the Friends Life Offices for the staff. Local schools are welcome to request they attend at their schools too, if interested please contact the team to make enquiries.

As many of you will have noticed, the Filton Sector Police teams are now housed in a shiny new office building built for purpose on the A38 Gloucester Road, Patchway, known as the Patchway Police Centre. This houses the core shift teams, Neighbourhood Policing teams, a large Custody unit of 48 cells and many other departments. We are now fully staffed in the building and it's a massive improvement on our old station in Filton. We are now much closer to our beat for patrols.

The local Safer Stronger Community Group (S.S.C.G.) meetings raised issues at the end of last year, of Anti Social Behaviour at the small development at Cob Court & Great Swanmoor Close, and drugs concerns around Little Stoke Lane and the Kingsway. Through

closely working with the Housing Associations that



Police patrols, the problem has greatly reduced. The drugs concerns have been a problem in this area for many years, and recent police operations have reduced the activity in this area. We will be continuing to work on this in the coming months with the Housing Associations.



### Nick Smart would love your support ...

We were really pleased to hear from local resident Mel Smart this month, who's husband Nick is running the London Marathon in April and raising support and awareness for the local charity Brain Tumour Support (previously Hammer Out).

Having lived in Bradley Stoke for 18 years, Nick and his wife Mel are well known across the Stokes. Their two girls went to Wheatfield Primary and are now both at the Bradley Stoke Community School. His story is an inspiring one and we are very pleased to be able to share it

On Christmas Day 2011, completely out of the blue, Nick suffered a seizure in front

of the family. He later came away from hospital advised not to drive for a year. Two weeks later he was called in for an MRI scan and subsequently diagnosed with a type of Brain Tumour called a Meningioma.

with our readers...

This was a hugely traumatic time for the family with no idea what the outcome would be. Contact was made with the Thornbury-based charity Brain Tumour Support on

the day the diagnosis was received - "They were fantastic" Melanie told me "we had a two hour conversation over the phone and they sent us out lots of information that day." Nick had to go on steroids for a period of time before having an operation to remove the tumour on 13 March 2012. "The charity was a lifeline to our family at this time, providing support to us all. They provided a counsellor - Kate - who was just fantastic. We still use some of her ideas today!"

Nick has always been a keen runner, having competed cross-country for England in his younger days. Melanie told us that on diagnosis Nick was less worried about dying than he was about being left unable to run after the operation! Fortunately Nick's operation was a success and, once he had regained his balance and confidence, he made steady progress.

In Nick's own words "Starting from the horizontal position, I worked through the phases from standing, shuffling, walking and finally, a gentle jog." Melanie told me Nick achieved this in just 6 weeks!

Nick and his family were invited to a coffee morning at the Brain Tumour Support group to meet with other survivors, which was a humbling experience.



"At this point, I decided to set my own personal physical challenge of completing the Marathon distance. I achieved this in Bournemouth in 2013 and luckily my time was good enough to gain me an automatic entry into the London Marathon in 2015."

Nick entered the Riverbank Rollick in Thornbury and came 3rd out of 500 entrants, he came 5th in the Sodbury Slog and 18 months after his surgery in October 2013 he completed the Bournmouth marathon.

Following the operation Nick was initally closely monitored, has now been put back on annual MRI scans, which is great news for him and his family.

His previous runs have been for himself and his personal recovery, but for the London Marathon he is aiming to fundraise as much as possible for Brain Tumour Support. "This time I want to give back to the charity who supported me and my family at a very stressful and upsetting time in our lives."

To fill the gap between Bournemouth and the London marathon this year Nick also successfully completed a Half Iron Man triathlon distance in 2014. He is aiming for a time of under 3 hours this April.

**Bradley Stoke & Little Stoke Gifford Matters was** extremely excited to be invited over the bridge to sample a fine lunch at the New Inn, Pwllmeyric in Chepstow this month.

This early 18th Century Inn has appeared in many historical travels books as being the place to stop and revive, with one edition stating it as being precisely 136½ miles from Hyde Park Corner, London - fortunately it's only about a 20 minute drive from the Stokes!

The lovely Grade II listed property has recently been brought back to life by its new owner, whose vision is to put the New Inn back on the traveller's map - a place to enjoy fantastic hostlery, offering excellent, locally sourced food and fine wines and a revolving selection of real ales. Head chef Aidan Fisher has created a mouthwatering menu, having previously spent four years at the 3 AAA rosette restaurant, Terry M, at the Celtic Manor working alongside some of Wales' top chefs.

My family and I visited on a Saturday lunchtime, just two weeks after the official opening. From bar snacks, sharing platters, traditional pub food to a creative a la carte menu (not forgetting

Ethos at the New Inn:

a children's menu!) there is plenty to choose from. We selected from the lunchtime menu, £16 for three courses. I chose the Pant ys gawn goats cheese, roasted beetroot walnut and pear salad (which was gorgeous) and Tim had the duck liver and cognac parfait with red onion marmalade and toasted brioche (delicious). For main course I selected the Salt Pollack fishcakes, braised lentils with chorizo, salsa verde (photo top left). If I'm honest, not a selection I would have chosen at home or eaten previously. However, my meal was amazing - a real taste sensation that I would definitely go back for! Tim chose the slow cooked blade of beef, celeriac, red wine and bone marrow (photo top right) - the meat was beautiful, simply falling apart.

On to the desserts and I had been particularly looking forward to the fabulous sounding 'melting chocolate pudding with malt ice cream and caramelised banana'. I wasn't disappointed, worth going back for on its own! Not a sweet tooth person, Tim chose the selection of local cheeses and was mightily impressed - with cheeses either made in-house or sourced locally. The crackers were amazing, again made in-house along with the chutney. The children selected from the children's menu. Hannah thoroughly enjoyed her fish, chips (triple cooked) and peas followed by chocolate brownie and ice cream and asked when we could come back again! Even my exceptionally fussy 8 year old son was accommodated, with something cooked especially for him.

With friendly and efficient staff, large comfy sofas in front of wood-burning fires, the pub is certainly very welcoming, offering quality food in a comfortable, casual dining environment.

We can certainly recommend this lovely pub, it has definitely been put on our travel map for a repeat visit! To entice you over the bridge, The New Inn is offering a fabulous 10% discount - why not give it a try!

Looking After Our Local Woodlands

Two local woodland groups are working together, and with the UWE and others too, to develop and protect their woodlands.

The two woodlands, Splatts Abbey Wood, near the MoD, and Sims Hill, near the Bristol Business Park, are also keen to engage with and involve the wider local community.

#### The Splatts Abbey Wood group

has been going for many years and is responsible for the historic woodland sited between the MoD and the UWE. It can trace the woods' roots back centuries. The group seeks to conserve and enhance the biodiversity and environmental quality of the woodland and to provide good quality public access to the woodland at levels that are in balance with the conservation of its biodiversity. It seeks to build links with the local community and different local groups through the organisation of work parties and events. The group has close links to South Glos Council,



but is in the process of becoming a more independent organisation.

It's committee has members of the public from Stoke Gifford, Filton and Bradlev Stoke on it, and also Susie Weaver the head teacher of the new Wallscourt Farm Academy School - the group really values its links with the school.

Dom Driver, Chair, Sims Hill Community Woodland added - "Many of us in the Sims Hill Community Woodland group happen to work for Forestry Commission England in their Bristol office. We all love trees so it is great to be walking the walk again and looking after a local wood, especially alongside Splatts Abbey Wood group and the students from UWE".

### **Gardening Matters**

Brought to you by Jeff Havvock

Things to do in the garden this month: flowers, trees and shrubs, lawns, ponds, structures, greenhouse, conservatory and houseplants

#### **Taking Care of Your Lawn**

Leaves and general debris should never be allowed to accumulate on the surface of the lawn during the winter as it can smother or weaken the grass causing it to go yellow.

In milder districts worms can become active by the end of February. Any casts should be swept away as soon as they appear to keep weeds down and prevent them being trodden into the lawn. Worms are a great help with drainage, so they should not be considered at pests.

If the weather is settled, treat moss-filled lawns with a proprietary moss killer, first raking up the worst patches with a lawn rake.

If you need to re-turf or sow bald patches, weed and fork them over first to break up the soil.

Scarify old lawns that have become thatchy, with a spring-tooth rake, to remove the dead or decaying vegetation at the base. Rake first in one direction and then at right angles.

In mild areas some lawns may need an occasional light mowing, to keep them neat and to prevent deterioration. However, the mower blades should be set to at least 4 cm (1.5 in) high, with the lawn just being 'topped' to keep it tidy and prevent the grass getting too long and matted.

Broken lawn edges can be repaired using a sharp spade or a half-moon edging-iron to cut the turf so that the broken edge can be turned into the lawn and a fresh, new edge left at the outside. Use sieved soil to fill up the hole where the turf was broken.

#### **Spring arrives!**

Spring usually arrives by mid-March and the frequent sunny days provide the opportunity for an increasing range of gardening tasks.

It's time to get busy preparing seed beds, sowing seed, cutting back winter shrubs and generally tidying up around the garden.



### Top 10 jobs this month

- 1. Protect new spring shoots from slugs
- 2. Plant shallots, onion sets and early potatoes
- B. Plant summer-flowering bulbs
- Lift and divide overgrown clumps of perennials
- 5. Top dress containers with fresh compost
- 6. Mow the lawn on dry days (if needed)
- 7. Cut back Cornus (dogwood) and Salix (willow) grown for colourful winter stems
- 8. Weeds come back in to growth deal with them before they get out of hand!
- Start feeding fish and using the pond fountain; remove pond heaters
- Open the greenhouse or conservatory doors and vents on warm days



### Little Stoke Garden Society - Update by David Hutton

Members of Little Stoke Garden Society are looking forward to the longer days and the opportunity to get out in the garden and on the allotment.

Although we may not like the cold weather, lots of plants need a cold spell to help them develop properly. The heavy clay soil in the Stokes area also benefits from the frost. Ground dug over during the winter will break down to a fine tilth ready for seed sowing and planting out in the spring.

Snowdrops (Galanthus) are a good sign that spring is not far away and there are wonderful displays that can be seen locally at this time of year. The displays at Colesbourne Park near Cheltenham has a collection of 85 different varieties. The collection was started by Henry John Elwes (1846-1922) a traveller naturalist who in the course of an adventurous life introduced many plants to cultivation. Among these was Galanthus elwesii, which he found in western Turkey in 1874. After his death, the collection lay more or less undisturbed for 60 years until great grandson Henry Elwes and his wife Carolyn began to identify the plants and spread them out through regular division. The garden is well worth a visit and in addition to the snowdrops there are aconites, cyclamen, iris, daffodils and hellebores. Henry Elwes is on hand in the gardens to chat to. There is also an excellent tea room!

Other displays can be seen at the Rococo gardens at Painswick, Newark Park near Wotton under Edge and locally at Elberton.

### **Communicating Excellence in Local Education**

We were pleased to have the opportunity to catch up with Dave Baker, Executive Headteacher at the Olympus Academy Trust (photo), which currently looks after both the Bradley Stoke and Abbeywood Community Schools.

We were keen to learn about the progress of the new primary phase at the Bradley Stoke Community School (BSCS), the building of which is now well underway and due for completion this summer, ready for the first Reception class to start in September 2015. Eager parents have already attended open events at BSCS to find out more about the new primary phase and make the decision whether it is the right choice for their preschooler to start school life.

Just as when the secondary school opened, the new primary phase will commence with just the one Reception class and grow an additional class per year until all 7 class years are completed. It is at the entry reception level where it is forecast that additional places are needed and so the primary will grow from the ground up and there will be no impact on existing classes in other local primary schools. Children who attend the primary phase will automatically have the

right to a place in the secondary phase when they reach year 7.

Dave admitted that it has been difficult to talk to parents about a potential school for their child

when there has been no building, no teachers and no curriculum as such to show them. Dave told us that this is why the follow on tour has been so good - "if parents chose to send their child to this new primary phase, they are buying into an ethos and culture which is judged to be outstanding. Parents need to see the existing school for this to make sense. It is a very exciting time for us. The primary phase will certainly add a new dynamic to the school and we feel very excited about the prospect of us knowing each child for that longer period of time. Think how much more we will be able to help them at secondary level, when we will have known them and have been teaching them since they were just 4 years old." Dave recognises that the biggest challenge will be how

to connect the youngest members with the older

when there will be such a gap in age between the

How to bridge this age gap, and give the new reception children the opportunity to interact with children closer to their own ages, will be an area to be explored further with Meadowbrook Primary School, which is in very close proximity to the Bradley Stoke School. Both Meadowbrook Primary School and Charborough Road Primary School (in Filton) are now part of the Olympus Academy Trust. Many children from Meadowbrook move up to BSCS and similarly many from Charborough Road move up to Abbeywood, there is therefore great value in coming under the one umbrella of the Trust and benefitting from the excellent resources and experience already on offer. Dave told me "This can only be a win-win solution for all involved. If we can't improve the transition arrangements between KS2 and KS3 and make this a better experience for all pupils, then something would be fundamentally wrong!"

Whilst mentioning Abbeywood, Dave also informed me that the latest Ofsted report received before Christmas was "Good" in all aspects. This is fantastic news for everyone who has been involved in the school since it came under the Trust's umbrella 2 years ago. With the retirement of Associate Headteacher Judith Mee. David Howe has been appointed as her replacement. Ofsted was very positive about the school, commenting that it now has the capacity to push towards Outstanding, and this will now be in Mr Howe's remit moving forward! Dave Baker commented "We all feel so very pleased at the latest Ofsted report. It is a good feeling to know that Abbeywood Community School is now being viewed so positively and is also enjoying a positive vibe in the community. In September 2014 the school was oversubscribed for the first time and it looks like it is the same again for September 2015."

Huge thanks to Dave Baker for taking the time to talk with us. He is such an inspiration, filled with enthusiasm and passion and it is always such a pleasure to hear him speak about the schools in his care.



### **News from St Chad's C of E Primary**

Term two ended with a bang and term three has just built on the success of the year so far.

Since our last news, we have had a host of exciting events here at St Chad's. Christmas seems a long time ago now, but it is worth mentioning the huge successes for school. Due to the size of KS1 currently, we held a number of different Christmas 'productions': one for Year 2, one for EYFS and Year One and one Carol Service in the Church (KS2). I have had many parents and family members congratulating the staff and the pupils on these events; it is lovely that the pupils get this positive feedback as they are superb and very much deserve it. The Christmas lunch for over 240 pupils, plus many visitors such as Governors, ex-Head teachers (2 out of the previous 3!) and other supporters of the school was both tasty and lots of fun. The Christmas Fair was very well attended and enjoyed by everyone (thank you Friends and staff for organising and running this), the Clifton Cathedral Carol Service was superb, and again, lots of praise came back to school from non-school members about the performance and behavior of St Chad's pupils, so well done! We were joined by Fiona from NSPCC in January, sharing with us the great work they do and the support they offer children from those in dire need, to those who just need a bit of anonymous advice. We undertook our first Readathon, seeing how many books pupils were be able to read in a 48 hour period. We don't have the final count but we have raised in the region of £1500, which is amazing!

Early in January, our Dinner ladies received more training on playground games and minor conflict resolution, which has already shown itself in the increased engagement with games in the playground at lunch times and you know our lunchtime sports buddies (trained Y6) support all ages of children with using an array of equipment and play a range of games.

Years 4 and 5 undertook some Solar Energy training in week one of January, with outside visitors sharing their knowledge of renewable energies and pupils turning their hand to designing and making solar powered vehicles.

The year 6s have been to Lifeskills, which is a center set up with (very life-like) rooms where children are able to explore dangers they may come across such as how to respond to house fires, crossing at a railway crossing, telephoning the emergency services or navigating a dark alleyway. Lots of fun



and learning was had by all.

The two Y3 classes have been having some slightly different, but equally fun

opportunities with Miss Thomas's class have been working hard for towards a dance production to be held at Abbeywood School on the evening of the 10th February and Mrs Hachani's class working with a talented musician to learn to be 'Stomp' musicians using percussion, movement, body and ordinary objects to create a performance. Pupils are loving it.

We were very lucky to be joined by volunteers from DWP who kindly gave their time to come and work with pupils of all ages in St Chad's to support in a wide range of ways across the school.

We held our annual RE week 2015. During our this week we like to spend a little more time than usual delving into themes that exploration of Religion sets in our minds. Often we call these the 'Big Questions', and this year, our theme was 'Prayer'.

As well as the usual maths, English and so on, we looked at Prayer through a variety of perspectives,





looking through major religions, at what prayer is and its functions. We compared and contrasted key features and also looked at how people who do not follow a religion choose to fulfil some of the end results of prayer (such as obtaining solutions, preparing for major decisions, to gain strength, etc). Leading on from this, we create personal and class prayers., which are now displayed in each class... I must say I was blown away

with the depth at which the children in St Chad's are able to reflect on some large issues. To pull all of this together, we created prayer spaces around school. These are places where pupils can go to pray, think about questions and reflect on life. From this we hope to provoke thought, wonder, prayer and reflection. The week was truly an oasis in the fullness of a modern primary school (and modern life) and many commented on how they enjoyed the chance for stillness, reflection and the chance to explore something less tangible.

All this, in so few weeks! Just wait until next term!



In January this year Ofsted returned to Little Stoke Primary School after a two year period of change since the last inspection, in 2013, that had judged the school to be 'requiring improvement'.

### **News from St Michael's**

We are halfway through the school year, so it's a good time to reflect on the changes we have made this year, and the impact these have made on the children's learning.

We have changed our curriculum – in line with the new National Curriculum - and introduced a

number of new topics. All topics have 'wow' moments which create something memorable for the children to do with the topic, and these often lead to fantastic writing, drama or other topic work. We also have three themes which are woven throughout the curriculum:

- Spirituality encouraging children to reflect on their learning
- Enterprise giving children regular opportunities to plan and carry out practical (and sometimes moneymaking) enterprises
- Environment ensuring that children build on their natural concern for the world in which they live, and look for ways to make their environment better

**Reception** - This term the topic has been 'People who help us'. We have had lots of visitors into our classes to talk about their jobs, including a policeman, nurse and an ambulance driver with their ambulance!

**Year 1** - Our topics have been' Toys and Dinosaurs'. We have been able to bring in toys, and also find out about toys in the past. We have made some fantastic music and some clay dinosaur pictures.

**Year 2** - We have been learning about China. Our 'wow' moment was when we had a dance and music workshop where we learnt to do a dragon dance and performed dragon music.

**Year 3** - Our topic was 'Funny Bones'. We have been learning all about the body, and doing lots of experiments and practical work, including making our own skeletons!

Year 4 - Our topic has been 'That's entertainment'. We have been learning all about the Harry Potter books and films. The highlight of our topic was going up to London to 'Harry Potter World'. It was amazing – the best trip ever!







Year 5 - Our topic was 'Space' – we have learnt all about the solar systems; written space stories and made plaster-ofparis models of aliens. Our wow moment was having the explorer dome in school where we crawled into a big indoor dome to look at the stars – brilliant!

**Year 6** - Our topic has been North America. We have found out about the history of North America,

the American Indians, and built or own totem poles. We did some fantastic artwork and made videos in French!



### Celebrating 50 years of law!

**Unbelievably, John Todd of AMD Solicitors** has now been working in law for over 50 vears!

John began work as an "articled clerk" on 27 November 1964 and so celebrated his golden anniversary of legal work at the end of 2014. Matters have improved somewhat since John's first employment contract which was both unpaid and somewhat less stimulating than his work in later years!

In the course of his career John has worked in divorce, family disputes, criminal law (including murder trials!) and civil litigation. For the last 40 years he has practised in Bristol, including sitting as a Deputy District Judge at local courts for over 10 years.

John started his legal career working largely in conveyancing and debt-collection, which was not the work of his legal dreams. While John grew up his father worked initially as a barrister, and latterly as a High Court judge in Kenya, so John knew very well that a more exciting legal world existed beyond the walls of his office and at the first opportunity he left conveyancing behind and started work in litigation. This was clearly the right move for him.

The aspect of legal life John has most enjoyed throughout his career is presenting cases at court. Nerve-wracking while preparing certainly, but full of challenge and adrenalin on the day. and a great sense of achievement afterwards.

Being a glass-full person John can't remember many low points to his career. However he did think that being 'on call' for long periods over the weekend as a duty solicitor (in criminal law) was not always a lifestyle choice. John recalls answering a call late at night and hearing a perhaps worse-for-wear client shouting "I am an innocent man" repeatedly down the phone. Being a duty solicitor was clearly not the recipe for a good night's sleep.

Working in family law inevitably exposes you to some of the worst aspects of family life. John recalls advising a client whose family home had been stripped by his wife whilst he unsuspectingly continued his day at work.

Practising as a **Deputy District** Judge enabled John to see litigation from the 'other side'. the judge's perspective. He feels this experience was invaluable in helping him to approach Court



proceedings in a balanced and reasonable way, in the light of his understanding of the judge's likely point of view.

Despite his work commitments, John enjoys a busy social life, including singing in two local choirs. Clearly the work-life balance is another lesson John has learned over the course of his long career.



### Bristol Rugby player receives Oxygen Treatment at local centre after concussion

Bristol Flanker Olly Robinson was injured during their game against the Cornish Pirates on 1st February. Suffering a head injury, Olly attended the West of England MS Therapy Centre in Bradley Stoke for Oxygen Treatment to speed up the healing process. Concussion is a prevalent injury in Rugby at all levels, most recently affecting Welsh international George North during his side's defeat to England in The Six Nations.

Oxygen Treatment involves sitting in a pressurised chamber where patients breathe in 100% pure oxygen through a mask. The benefits of the treatment vary from person to person. however it can improve cognitive function, eyesight, pain and inflammation and a variety of other symptoms. Members of the Centre believe that Oxygen Treatment makes their neurological conditions more manageable, which leads to fewer visits to GPs and hospitals thus alleviating pressure on the NHS.

Oxygen Treatment has been in the press recently with injured paratrooper Ben Parkinson who lost both his legs and suffered extensive damage to his spine, skull, pelvis, arms and brain. Parkinson was an Olympic torch bearer in 2012, and is currently undergoing Oxygen Treatment in Castle Craig Hospital south of Edinburgh.

Olly told us "My granddad had Multiple Sclerosis (MS), he's passed away now, but it would have been a great facility for him to have used. I think it's fascinating to have seen what happens at

the Centre. I've never heard of it before I came here, however the service is amazing. When I started on Tuesday I was aettina headaches and now I'm glad to say they have stopped. When I came out of the oxygen chamber I felt really invigorated".

### Help give Hope to Morgan

The face of local resident Morgan Walker has rapidly become a familiar one across the Stokes, appearing in local publications, on television, T-shirts and flyers. His hand print is the logo of the 'Hope for Morgan' appeal, created in his favourite colours of black and red.

Morgan was born 8 weeks premature, weighing just 3lb 10oz and spent the first traumatic month of his life in the neo-nato unit. At two months old he returned to hospital (on his due date) for an MRI brain scan. The results of this scan were devastating for the family, who were advised Morgan had cerebral palsy and it was unlikely he would ever walk or talk.

Thankfully Morgan proved everyone wrong and walked at 17 months and can talk, he even attends a mainstream school - Wheatfield Primary.

Having endured 19 operations and procedures in his eleven years, taking medication daily and sleeping with an oxygen heart monitor, Morgan suffers from additional complications as well as the daily effects of cerebral palsy. His mum, Zoe, states "His determination to succeed in life in everything he does is a testament to him and his will to be just like his peers".

Morgan has been offered the opportunity to undergo surgery in the USA. Selective Dorsal Rhizotomy aims to improve mobility and increase independence through neurosurgical procedure. It is a chance to significantly improve his quality of life and reduce the pain Morgan constantly endures.

"There is no cure for Morgan, but there is hope and, like any parent, we would do anything for our child. Our aim is to give him the best possible chance in life".

### Middle ear infections in children:

### What can you do, and when is it best to seek medical help?

#### What is a middle ear infection?

When germs (such as viruses or bacteria) enter the small space behind the ear drum (the middle ear) during a cold, a middle ear infection can develop. This is common in children.

#### What are the symptoms?

Older children usually complain of earache, while younger kids often pull or rub their ears. Other common symptoms include a runny nose, a raised body temperature (fever), being irritable, crying, sleep problems, cough and poor feeding. Sometimes a hole may form in the ear drum and cause infected thick fluid (pus) to run out of the ear. This usually relieves the pain as it reduces the pressure on the ear drum.

#### What can I expect to happen?

Symptoms of middle ear infection tend to develop quickly and usually last an average of four days. Most ear infections are not serious and get better by themselves.

#### What can I do?

- · Give painkillers: You can give either paracetamol or ibuprofen if your child unwell or appears distressed (make sure you check the label for the right dose).
- · Keep your child cool: Avoid over- or underdressing your feverish child. Keep your central heating down. Tepid sponging is no longer recommended.
- · Fluids: Offer your child regular fluids. If you're a breastfeeding mother, offer as many feeds as she/he will take. Avoid dummies and feeding while lying flat.
- · Body checks: Check your child at night for signs of serious illness.

#### Does my child need antibiotics?

Most children with a mild middle ear infection will not benefit from antibiotics. Antibiotics can be useful in children younger than 2 years who have infections in both ears, or who have an infection together with a leaking ear.

#### When should I seek medical help?

Contact your GP surgery for urgent advice if you notice one or more of the following:

- **High fever**: A body temperature over 38°C in children age 0-3 months or over 39°C in children age 3-6 months.
- · Not improving: Your child is generally unwell or doesn't start to improve after four days.
- · Fluid: Fluid leaks out of the ear, suggesting a burst ear drum.
- Other symptoms: Your child shows additional symptoms, such as being sick repeatedly, feeling dizzy, a stiff neck, a rash, slurred speech, confusion, seizures (fits), and/or being sensitive to light.

#### Where can I find out more?




