



Project Update

As reported in our June edition of Little Stoke Gifford Matters, the new church and community centre in Stoke Gifford is now open and in regular use, however the

project and the fundraising still has some way to go before it is finally completed.

A recent congregational appeal, aimed primarily at new members and those who had been unable to give previously, raised a tremendous £110,000. However it wasn't enough to continue with the fitting out at this stage, and building work has therefore been suspended until further funding is identified

The auditorium is now in regular use for church meetings and events. It was very useful for the recent annual Open Air Service on 28th June – offering a large enough space when rain forced everyone indoors! During the evening service on 28th June the church held its first full immersion baptisms in the new baptistery and on 12th July Bishop Lee Rayfield (Bishop of Swindon) led a confirmation service. About 25 people from across the Deanery were confirmed on that occasion - and with a congregation of nearly 300, the auditorium was packed!

The auditorium and seminar room are also available to hire – contact the Church Office for more information.

Fundraising to progress with the project is ongoing and the HOTC committee continues to apply to charitable trusts and look for other possible sources of grant funding, as well as organising community events to boost the available funds.

The first fundraising event in the new auditorium took place on 16th May when the Bristol Male Voice Choir perforned a concert. There have also been two group photo shoots to date whereby a member of the congregation utilisies her interest and skills in portrait photography by offering sessions for families and other groups, and donating the proceeds to HOTC. On 7th June the auditorium hosted a Children's Concert and on 19th July there was an open garden, plant and produce sale.



Bristol's first University Technical College rated "Good" by Ofsted Inspectors

Bristol Technology and Engineering Academy in Stoke Gifford has several "outstanding" features and has been rated as "good" following its inaugural Ofsted inspection.

Inspectors who visited the BTE academy in April commended its principal Rhian Priest and other senior staff for providing "strong leadership, so that the academy has clear strengths less than two years after opening."

They added: "The academy is well on its way to meeting its vision of becoming a centre of excellence in teaching engineering and environmental technologies."

The BTE academy in Stoke Gifford is one of 30 University Technical Colleges across England, catering for pupils in Years 10 to 13 and with a strong focus on engineering and environmental technologies. The state-of-the-art academy opened in September 2013 to create a specialist technology and engineering school. It gives students technical knowledge and focuses on work-based skills in addition to their academic qualifications. Students experience real life industry projects supported by key engineering employers including GKN Aerospace, Airbus, Astra Zeneca, Rolls Royce and Atkins Global. Additionally, it is formally affiliated to the Royal Navy and will have a Combined Cadet Force (CCF) on site from late 2015, being one of only five schools nationally to receive this recognition.

It is sponsored by the University of the West of England and GKN Aerospace and there are also strong links with the City of Bristol College and South Gloucestershire and Stroud College.

BTE Academy was rated by Ofsted as being "good" overall and it received the same rating in several other categories: leadership and management, behaviour and safety of pupils, quality of teaching, achievement of pupils and sixth form provision.

Inspectors describe the teaching of top ability sets in Years 10 and 11 maths and science as being "outstanding" and say its governing body "provides outstanding support and challenge to the academy's senior leaders." Provision for students who are disabled or who have special educational needs is also "outstanding", as is



climate for learning" in the sixth form. "These lessons often feel more like high-level seminars than typical school lessons," it says.

"The BTE Academy is a brand new type of school, the first of its kind in the West of England and one that is providing a unique learning opportunity for young people," says principal Rhian Priest.

"As such, we are delighted to have been rated in our first Ofsted inspection as being 'good' across the board but also having several outstanding features. After less than two years, we are already seen to be on course to achieving our core vision – that of becoming a centre of excellence for teaching engineering and environmental technologies, and preparing students for a potential career in these crucial and exciting disciplines.

"However we are not complacent and will continue to strive to become outstanding across all categories."

10 years, Wow! I can still remember turning 10 years old. As a July birthday I was

always one of the youngest in my year at school and the youngest of my friends set. It seemed to take forever therefore to reach the magic milestone of double figures, but how sweet it felt when I got there!

I'm not quite sure where the last decade has gone but I am very proud that this is now the 10th anniversary of the very first Bradley Stoke Matters community magazine landing through the door. Our first edition was still the same high quality gloss but black and white throughout and just 32


pages. It was also delivered to just 2000 houses. I remember our first mock up of what it might look like and showing that to potential advertisers. Our very first call resulted in a year's booking! This was quite a shock at the time - we had yet to produce one edition and now we were committed to doing 12! It was a steep learning curve. A qualified accountant I did sometimes wonder how I came to be selling advertising space! I'm pleased to say that that very first advertiser is still advertising with us today! BIG SHOUT OUT to Lois Coulson of Medway Design. Other current advertisers who were in our very first edition include mechanic

I moved to Bradley Stoke in 1994 (can't quite believe that that was 21 years ago). We bought our house off-plan, scrimped, saved, and per the mortgage request sold our car (!). Our house in Saxon Way cost £90,000. An amazing first house, we'd stretched ourselves fully and we moved in with not one bit of furniture! Just a pile of clothes and an inflatable mattress. Happy days!. I remember when I used to get lost going between various house builders as we were deciding where to buy. In the end I liked Saxon Way as I could find it from the motorway without getting lost!

How it all began

10 years on and I was at home with my first child, I was lucky enough not to have to go back to work, which, after 18m was



The magazine proved very popular very quickly and grew into something that we had never really envisaged, a full time activity!

I recall when that first edition went out at the end of July 2005 we were really excited - what feedback would we get? My first call later that day was an eye opener - "is that Bradley Stoke Matters? Yes it is! Fabulous - I was wondering, please could you help me fill out my passport application?" Of course I was happy to oblige but I never realised just how much we were putting ourselves out there in the community and how many different ways we would be called upon to help. Eventually to save our sanity I did move the phones away from the homeline, just so that we weren't constantly being interrupted at all hours and days (9pm on a Sunday evening was the most popular time it appeared!)

Extending to meet to demand

The magazine originally went out to 2000 homes each month, and we received many requests to extend the coverage. As soon as we had



the revenue covered to do so, we therefore extended distribution to accommodate these homes too. There is such a fine line between Bradley Stoke and areas of Little Stoke and Stoke Gifford -




website launched in May 2007

in some instances just the other side of the road - that we were also regularly asked in our first year why they could not have their own copy of the magazine too. Therefore exactly one year later Little Stoke Gifford Matters was born too.

Always reacting to the feedback we received, as we grew we were getting told that people didn't have time to fully read each magazine before the next one arrived so we reduced to printing two BSMs and one LSGM per quarter, which eventually changed to one BSM and one LSGM which also kept costs down for our advertisers. Our feedback was that one edition per quarter through the door was perfect, and have regularly been told that each edition is kept until the next arrives. In fact last year I met a lady who told me she had a copy of every back edition as she loved to keep them for the articles! Moving to full gloss colour a couple of years later was a huge step in cost of production, but we have not looked back! We now produce 8 editions per year, 4 of each title. Every single edition is still edited and produced by ourselves, personally, in-house before being sent to the printers.

Happy memories

We love it that people in the community have been brought together through the information we share with you in the magazine. It's even better when whole new community groups are formed through a resident's initial seed of an



idea being promoted within the pages of this magazine. Two of many such groups over the last 10 years have been The Stokes Art Group and the Bradley Stoke Reading Groups.

We have received much lovely feedback in 10 years but I think the most memorable was a lady who approached us at the Outstanding Women's Awards one year. She came up and told us "I had to come over and say hello, I am so pleased to meet you and just want to thank you as your magazine literally saved my life." I won't share the story that followed but I have never forgotten it and am just so pleased that by doing something small and sharing the amazing stories about our community with people through this magazine, that hearts are touched and people are connected. I can't emphasise enough that Community really does matter.

Giving something back

One thing that has always been important from the very start is giving back to the community and, apart from all the support and coverage in the magazines, we have also been able to give back over £20,000 to local individuals, groups,

clubs and organisations. A few years ago we made a list of all the different people/organisations we had given money to and it was over 100! Some might only be £10 to cover the community charge that was levied on community stalls at the festival on some years, others are in the form of team sponsorship and donations. We have just seen our third year of sponsoring the Bradley Stoke Town FC Reserve team and are committed to 2015/16 too. We are also current sponsors of the Bradley Stoke Youth Rugby Bradley Bull and are also supporting the Cricket Club this year. We sponsored 3 runners in this year's London Marathon and were following their progress all the way round via the tracker ap!

The other thing of course is that several other Matters Magazines have sprung up from this very first one and we are very proud that other local communities are benefitting from local

advertising with Bradley Stoke & Little Stoke Gifford Matters for approaching 10 years and have always been proud to be part of such a great community magazine. Jaci and the team have always been so helpful and accommodating to our ever changing needs.

sentury with specialist facilities throughout and those who are a part of the school from the beginning will be pioneers. It is a fascinating process considering all aspects of developing a school from scratch, with interesting tensions between adhering to tried and tested ways and

The vision is for a school which will be both in the community and for the comm aim is to establish strong relationships with the town council, local schools, clubs and churches, the leisure centre, local businesses and other agencies but especially with the

The school boasts two sprung floor halls; one with tiered, retractable seating, stage and an acoustic sound system the other is big enough to hold four badminton courts. It also offers fully equipped classrooms. ICT suite, modern science and technology laboratories and under floor heating. The school is currently proposing a bid for specialist status in performing arts and language in 2006 and devising its school travel plan.

The 5th of September 2005 will bring 182 year 7 students through the doors, with a further 180 places available in four subsequent academic years. When should a mother be expected to return to work?

Anne Thistlethwaite a Solicitor and Mediator at AMD Solicitors Considers Two Recent Cases on Financial Provision After Divorce

Over the course of, say, a ten-year marriage a wife may have given up her job and have three young children in primary school. Why do I mention this? Mrs Wright was in the news recently as a Judge told her that she is expected to go back to work now that her children are 16 and 10 years old.

When the original maintenance order had been made, in 2008, the youngest child had been only 3 years old. The Judge at that time said that within a couple of years the wife should be contributing financially, whilst fitting in with her child care responsibilities. Before the marriage she had worked as a Legal Secretary and an Administrator. The Judge said that there was "a general expectation that once a child is in Year 2. most mothers can consider part-time work consistent with their obligations to their children". By 2012, the husband's financial circumstances had worsened so he applied to the court for the maintenance to be reduced. It seems that in the intervening years, the wife had not made any effort to find employment. It is also reported that the wife was rather evasive on questions about her own earning capacity. Her spousal maintenance was reduced.

This case is fact specific as are all cases you hear about, each case depending on the circumstances. There are a number of factors, not just the length of the marriage and ages of the children that are relevant to the financial outcome in each case.

How long after a divorce can a spouse make a financial claim?

The facts of the case of Wyatt v Vince have been widely reported in the press. The parties divorced in 1992 and 19 years later Ms Wyatt applied, in particular, for a lump sum order against her former husband. During the marriage the parties had had one son but Ms Wyatt already had a daughter of her own who was treated by Mr Vince as a child of the family. They separated in 1984 and Mr Vince lived as a "new-age" traveller while Ms Wyatt brought up the children without any substantial financial contribution and in difficult financial circumstances.

Subsequently, Mr Vince set up a green energy business and became a multimillionaire prompting

Ms Wyatt's application in 2011

Mr Vince applied to strike out his former wife's application on the basis of the delay in bringing the claim. His application was initially unsuccessful but he appealed to the Court of Appeal where the judges agreed with him and Ms Wyatt's claim was struck out. She recently appealed successfully to the Supreme Court which has re-instated her claim and the case will go back to a lower court for a judge there to decide on the value of her claim.

What this case illustrates is the importance of obtaining a financial order at the time of any divorce proceedings. In appropriate cases a court can make what is known as a "clean break" order that will ensure that parties do not have to face unwelcome applications many years after they have divorced.



Textures in the Garden

Health Matters by local GP, Dr Knut Schroeder

When your baby is unwell

What to look out for and when to seek help

All young children fall ill from time to time. Most of the time, harmless infections are to blame, which will get better by themselves. But occasionally, symptoms may mean that something more serious may be going on – and you may worry and wonder what to do next.

So how can you tell the difference between what's normal and what isn't?

When your child is unwell, look out for the following warning signs that may suggest serious illness and should prompt you to seek medical help urgently:

- Fever: A raised body temperature of more than 38°C in babies under 3 months or 39°C in children 3 to 6 month old – especially when your child's hands and feet are cold
- Skin colour: Looking unusually pale or blotchy
- Drinking: Not drinking for more than eight hours
- Soft spot: The soft spot on your baby's head bulges or dips
- Alertness: Your child is drowsy and doesn't respond to you in the normal way, or you have to try quite a bit harder than usual to wake her or him
- Behaviour and response: Your child is much less active than usual, doesn't look content and doesn't smile
- Crying: Your child just doesn't stop crying, or the crying sounds very different – particularly if it's high-pitched or weak
- Breathing: Your child's nostrils flare, and her or his breathing appears much more laboured and faster than normal
- Dry mouth: Your child feeds poorly and has a dry mouth
- Wet nappies: Your baby has less or no wet nappies anymore.

- Rash: Your child develops a new rash
- Vomiting: Repeated vomiting

If you notice any of these signs, contact your GP surgery urgently.

Give first aid and call 999 for an ambulance if your child:

- Stops breathing
- · Struggles for breath
- Doesn't respond and won't wake up
- Has a fit for the first time

Remember that most childhood illnesses are harmless – but trust your instincts and don't hesitate to seek advice if you're worried.





School News from Holy Family Primary School

FAB Science Sessions



Science Week has gone with a bang yet again at Holy Family Primary School. Children have experienced a Wacky Wizards Day and turned detective with a Crime Scene Investigation Day. Pupils relished the learning opportunities that this week provided for them and enthusiasm for science has exploded across the school!

Pupils in Years Five and Six were privileged to have an extra special opportunity to work alongside members of the School for Policy Studies at Bristol University, and take part in dedicated FAB Science Workshops. FAB is an acronym for Food, Active and Body. The eldest pupils at Holy Family have participated in three investigative workshops to learn more about their bodies and how to look after them as they grow up.

The Food workshop focused on analyzing the sugar content of a number of different food and drink products, with some really surprising results. "I knew energy drinks were full of sugar but I couldn't believe how much sugar there was in my yoghurt drink!" said Christopher Willmott of Year Six. As a consequence pupils and staff will be changing their drinking habits!

During the Active Workshop pupils had the exciting opportunity to learn about the effect of exercise on the human body. In fact a number of pupils wore heart monitors throughout their morning playtime, just to see how their bodies would respond. They returned puffing and panting after a energetic game of tag.

Hubert Galczynski groaned, "My heart rate went from a resting 80 to 180 beats per minute after vigorous exercise. My heart was working harder to provide my muscles with more oxygen."

Creating a giant puzzle of the human body was the challenge during the Body Workshop. Pupils were tasked with placing the internal organs accurately before learning about what each organ in the body does. They were then taught about how to exercise and eat well to look after those organs, linking the ideas from the other two workshops.

This educational and exciting morning was the highlight of an already thrilling week of explorations and experiments. Science coordinator, Mark Handley, commented, "Science is taught regularly at Holy Family but it's always great to raise the profile of such a practical subject in Science Week. I am already looking forward to next year's!"

For many years pupils at Holy Family Primary School have had the benefit of learning in partnership with volunteers from local businesses. The Ablaze project provides reading and number buddies for children in Key Stage Two. Workers from Airbus visit the school each week with the aim of improving pupils' attainment and developing self-esteem.

News from St Michael's School

As another school year draws to an end, it seems a good time to reflect on some of the highlights of the past year, as well as looking forward to the next. At St Michael's we believe passionately in providing outstanding opportunities for all children to develop their talents.



We provide a whole range of sporting opportunities for children throughout the school. Within the school day children learn a whole range of skills, including sports such as gym, football, netball, cricket, rounders. We use a

number of specialist coaches to support particular areas such as gymnastics and dance, and this is supplemented by numerous after-school sports clubs. Over the course of the year children have represented the school in: football (boys and girls); netball; athletics; cross country; swimming; basketball.

Next year we are developing a partnership with Bristol Rugby, and all children will learn how to play tag rugby. We also organise a number of house competitions within the school.

Dance

The school holds an annual dance festival, and all children in Key Stage 2 can enter either as soloists or in groups. We employ a specialist dance teacher to work with children in Key Stage 2.

Music and Drama

Throughout the year we put on different events, including Christmas and Easter shows; a spring production by Year 1, and a Harvest Service in St Michael's Church. For the last two years we have put on a whole-school production halfway through

the year. This year we put on a musical version of 'The Pied Piper of Hamelin', which was a fantastic opportunity for children to display their talents. We work closely with 'Creative Kidz' who run after-school and Saturday morning drama and musical theatre clubs.

At the end of each year our Y6 leavers put on a music and drama performance which is always a treat. This year the production was 'Yee-Hah!', a cowboy-themed play, and the children did a brilliant show, with great acting, singing and dancing.

Our choir and flute ensemble again excelled themselves with their performance at the South Glos Schools' concert at Colston Hall in July. The choir also performed on several occasions for the local community, most recently at the newly opened School Rooms.

Arts Weeks

Each year we hold three theme weeks in school which have a strong artistic aspect. Our first, in October, was on the theme of the environment; our second, in March, was based on a puppet show, following which children throughout the school made their own puppets and puppet shows. Finally, in the summer we held a sports themed week with artwork linked to Nepal.

Next Year

We are looking forward to another exciting year ahead. We will be welcoming 90 new Reception children in September, and hope that they will enjoy the opportunities and facilities here just as much as those who have just left.



RFU Lead Up & Legacy -**Transforming Social Spaces**

Local rugby received a major boost last month when St Mary's Old Boys RFC was chosen by the Rugby Football Union to be a recipient of one of their 'Transforming Social Spaces' grants for the 2015 Rugby World Cup which is being staged in England and Wales.

St Mary's and their Junior Rugby partners Bradley Stoke Youth has been chosen as a recipient of the grant, strengthening the partnership between the RFU and Club to be 'Fit for 15'. The grant will enhance the club's social facilities and also provide a resource to be used by the local community. Whilst they have often funded pitches. posts, changing rooms etc, the RFU has traditionally never funded bars. The World Cup being hosted here this year is seen as an opportunity for amateur clubs to increase local interest in being part of the game - and what better way to encourage participation than by tranforming the social space into a great venue to go and watch the World Cup games later this year!.

To qualify for the grant, the Club had to attend a workshop where there were presentations on design, and information on capitalising on commercial opportunities. After this clubs were invited to apply for funding. The project had to cost at least £20k of which the club had to find £10k.

"The new social space will improve the quality of the rugby experience for everyone using the site and provide more playing opportunities, especially for local people in the 14-24 age-group." said RFU Area Facilities Manager Jon Bendle. "This investment will also support the club's financial sustainability leading into the Rugby World Cup and will create a focus for England 2015 and a lasting rugby union legacy for rugby in the community. The bar refurbishment will help the club raise its profile and encourage more players, volunteers and spectators to share the special values that distinguish the sport."

The Club Chairman Peter Phelps told us - "We are delighted that our project has been chosen as a recipient for this grant. We will now have some of the best facilities in the area that local people from Bradley Stoke can use. The 2015 Rugby World Cup will inspire a new wave of people of all ages to become involved in rugby and this RFU investment will help our club to be even better equipped to welcome newcomers. St Mary's and Bradley Stoke Youth has an enthusiastic group of hard-working volunteers and this funding will enable them to do even more for young people in our community in the future."

Works were well underway when we visited the club and we look forward to seeing the end results!

Gardening Matters

August -Sultry late summer



August is usually one of the hottest months of the year - making watering essential. Try to use grey water wherever possible, esecially as water butts may be running low if it has been a dry summer.

August is traditionally holiday-time, so you might need to enlist the help of friends and family to look after the garden while you are away.

When you are at home, take the time to prune summer-flowering shrubs.

Lawns

Raise the blades on the mower before cutting fine lawns. This will help to reduce drought stress.

Mow lightly and frequently so that short grass clippings can remain on the lawn during hot summers to act as a moisture-retentive mulch. Excess thatch can be scarified out during autumn maintenance next month. Mulching mowers cut the clippings even finer than normal rotary blades, make mulch less visible.

Lawns on thin soils may benefit from a high phosphate feed. This will strengthen the roots for winter, rather than encouraging lush top growth that could suffer in the cold and weaken the grass.

Avoid using lawn weedkillers in late summer they will be more effective in the cooler, damper autumn weather.

Dig over any areas due to be grassed over later in the year. Leave them for a few weeks to allow weeds to re-emerge, and then spray with a weedkiller or hoe off to ensure thorough weed clearance before seeding or laying turf in the autumn.


