Kayaking trip to fundraise for the Royal British Legion Poppy Appeal

A Father and Daughter team - Jason Philips and his daughter Georgia - are teaming up for a special event in the summer, to fundraise for the Royal British Legion Poppy Appeal. The fundraising kayaking trip start on 31st July, and will finish on 6th August.

Jason told us: "I am a member of Stoke Gifford Branch of the Royal British Legion and all the money raised from my canal kayak is for the Poppy Appeal fund to provide welfare support to the extended Armed Forces family."

Jason will kayak / row the length of the Kennet and Avon canal for the Poppy Appeal, covering around 85 miles with 96 lock gates, two aquaducts and one long tunnel. Georgia will be cycling on her mountain

bike alongside on the canal towpath. Georgia's role is to be in support, carry equipment and for safety, she will also be the person providing updates via social media and photo's.

The trip will take 7 days and Jason and Georgia will be camping for the six nights at or near pre-set public houses along the way. All equipment will be carried by the kayak and the bike. We look forward to seeing the photos taken along the way as they travel through the Wiltshire countryside, planning to finish at 1pm on the 6th August at The Cottage Public House, Hotwells, Bristol City Docks.

It's just over a year since the new St Michael's Centre in Stoke Gifford opened it's doors – and already thousands of people have attended events and celebrations in the building.

The first phase of the centre, which cost £4.51m to build, includes a ground floor auditorium with 300 seats, a reception area, office, toilets and showers, seminar and meeting rooms. It's proving to be a popular venue for concerts as well as local and national conferences, with bookings well into 2017.

It's hard to believe that in 1980, St Michael's was a small rural church with fewer than 50 regular worshippers at the only Sunday service. As Stoke Gifford grew, so did the church and there are now over 400 adults and children regularly worshipping across the three main Sunday services. More than 720 people attended the services on Christmas Eve and Christmas Day.

More are being reached through the church's outreach and weekly family service at Cheswick Village.

The church purchased the land next to the Old School Rooms in North Road, on which the St Michael's Centre stands, in 2006, thanks to the generous and sacrificial giving of members of the congregation, who to date have given a total of £2.73m (including Gift Aid).

Planning permission to build on the site was granted in 2010 and the St Michael's Church

Heart of the Community project (HOTC) was established with the specific mission of "living to make a difference by being a Christian heart at the centre of the community".

Little Stoke Gifford Matters has been following the progress of the project since 2013, when building work began.

While the new centre is the most visible and costly part of the project, it is only one part. The church has pledged to:

- preserve and improve the 14th century church building for increased use in the years ahead. There are plans to provide toilets, restore the external lighting and return the sound of bells to the village following a successful trial of electronic bells.
- refurbish the Old School Rooms home to many community groups and the popular Coffee Shop
- complete the St Michael's Centre by adding catering facilities, fitting out the corridor and further downstairs meeting rooms, providing upstairs toilets, offices, further meeting rooms as well as finishing the balcony over the auditorium to provide seating for an additional 220 people.

A tenth of all money donated by St Michael's is being used to support building and development projects by the church's mission partners in the UK and overseas.

The church needs to raise £4.04m to complete the project, which includes repaying loans and interest, taken out to enable completion and use of the first phase of the centre.



The Rev. Si Jones, Rector of St Michael's explained: "The Heart of the Community project is not about community buildings, It's about building community.

"The HOTC project is integral to the vision of St Michael's Church. We are seeing growth in the life of the church, our work with the community and the wider sharing of our resources. Young people, the elderly, local people and those from further afield, church groups, community events and national conferences, are all are finding a home with us.

"We are passionate about our pledge for growth and mission at St Michael's. We are committed to reaching out within our local community – and further afield – through discipleship, outreach and service."

St Mary's Old Boys RFC has recently become an official O2 Touch Centre with the backing of the RFU

O2 Touch at St Mary's Old Boys will run a minimum of 30 sessions throughout the year ensuring it's not just a summer only activity. Once players are registered they can access training sessions and games advertised on the O2 Touch website and app.

Touch is a great way to improve fitness and have fun, whether you're 16 or 80, a beginner or seasoned player. Sessions are inclusive giving the perfect opportunity to get together with mates or meet new people. We now have 60 registered players with a regular 30+ attending training. Some parents of our Bradley Stoke Youth players now play Touch and two mums, who have never picked up a rugby ball previously, have just qualified as referees!

Sessions take place every Tuesday 1830hrs -2000hrs at St Mary's Old Boys RFC. During the Winter season, we will be utilising local astro turf pitches and indoor sports halls.

The O2 Touch Centre is an RFU initiative with St Mary's Old Boys RFC receiving funding for the first three years of the programme, ensuring that in years 4 onwards the club still continues to run O2 Touch but by that stage should be selfsufficient. The first session is therefore offered for free and then just £1 for any subsequent sessions which is payable on the day. There are no upfront costs or obligations to attend every

We are currently in the process of putting together a league structure for those who would like to compete. There is no requirement to enter a league, so whether you're looking for a fun way

to get fit and meet new people or to compete

against other teams, we cater for all

The centre is run by volunteers: 3 Operators, who will run the sessions, book facilities, organise fixtures etc and 2 Ambassadors, who will work in a more promotional role driving social media. organising socials, and promoting O2 Touch in the local community. Training for volunteers will be provided by the RFU throughout the year and their partner, the England Touch Association, who provide Touch specific refereeing and coaching courses for free to O2 Touch centres.

In fact, the local Touch volunteers have in mid-May attended the Touch Takeover at Twickenham with on pitch training sessions and interactive workshops to increase the numbers playing Touch in Bradley Stoke. Kit has been provided for the 5 volunteers as well as equipment including balls, bibs and cones with branded flags and banners to help advertise the centre.

As we approach the Summer a local woodland is celebrating another successful year. The Group has completed it's transition to a fully independent group, (originally it had very close ties to the council). One of it's volunteers has won a prestigious award, and over the last couple of years the woodland has been transformed by regular workdays involving UWE GreenSpace Student Volunteers.

Splatts Abbey Wood Conservation Group has many local residents on its committee. The group is keen to expand its group of volunteers to help it develop the woodland still further.

Fred Hillberg, the Treasurer and Vice Chairman of Splatts Abbey Wood Conservation Group, won the South Glos. Council Chair's Award 2016 for his volunteering with the group. Extracts from his citation for the award read: - "He is the Treasurer and Vice Chairman of Splatts Abbey Wood Conservation Group, since we became more independent of the Council last year. He has volunteered for the Group since 2003, both as a committee member and as an activist (going out on workdays).

"Fred has made a major contribution in terms of his extensive long term commitment and contribution to the Group - by being a hardworking volunteer on workdays, and as a committee member, making valuable contributions. He started in 2003, 13 years ago and is the second longest committee member / volunteer in the group. His contributions are invaluable."

Splatts Abbey Wood Chairman Conservation Group Spokesman, David Bell told us "Fred thoroughly deserves this award. I joined the group in 2002 and as a result have known Fred as a valued colleague during his 13 years on the committee. The survival and subsequent thriving of the group owes a lot to Fred."

Fred said "This award has come as a complete surprise and I am delighted to accept on behalf of all the Splatts Abbey Conservation Group, past and present. I have thoroughly enjoyed my time with the group and hope it has made a contribution to the community and the environment."



Splatts Abbey Wood Conservation Group has been working with it's sister woodland Sims Hill Community Woodland and they have forged a great link with UWE GreenSpace, a Student Volunteering group, who carry out workdays at both the Woodlands, the results of which have been transformational

Jenny Idle, Project Officer at UWE Volunteering commented "The students really value their experience of volunteering with the local conservation groups. This year they have far surpassed our expectations and committed hundreds of hours to the project! We are also very proud of 2 of our Project Leaders who have recently been award Green Volunteers Awards for their work and look forward to building on this success in the next academic year"

David Bell commented "The Splatts Abbey Wood Group is very excited with the progress that it has made in recent times including becoming a more independent group and it looks forward to the future with great optimism. The UWE GreenSpace project has been quite inspirational, with dedicated, hardworking students helping to contribute to their local environment and community. When I first raised doing this with the UWE Volunteering Department last year I had no idea it would blossom into such a great project."

Both woodlands are keen to get greater involvement with the local community, including recruiting more volunteers.

Rugby Community Supports Liam's Day

Around 1,200 people packed St Mary's Old Boys' rugby ground in Trench Lane, Winterbourne in May to boost a major fundraising event for Liam O'Keeffe.

The 25-year-old captain of the Saints suffered life-changing injuries in a match before Christmas and Liam, who is now receiving treatment at the Spinal Injury Unit at Salisbury, made an emotional return to the club for the day which featured three special matches, a raffle and an auction, raising a five-figure sum for a fund set up to assist him.

St Mary's chairman Pete Phelps said: "It's hard to believe the response we've had from the rugby family, it's been overwhelming and very touching. We definitely exceeded all expectations ... the kitchen ran out of food and the bar has been drunk dry, but most importantly people have all been talking about what a great day they've had.

"We're very grateful to so many people for all their hard work and support."

The great majority of clubs in the Bristol area were represented in the three games which began with the Bristol Wanderers facing the Combination Vets, refereed by Bristol Society chairman Steve Leyshon. The under-17 cup final from ten years ago, between St Mary's and Old Reds, was then replayed with Ivor Sobey again the man in the middle. The last match saw a St Mary's President's XV take on the Bristol Combination, a first half squad being selected from clubs in the Gloucestershire and Somerset divisions before clubs from Western Counties North and above took to the field after the break with former international official Tony Spreadbury in charge.



A raffle of a long list of prizes further boosted the fund for Liam before a series of signed shirts, including two England Grand Slam jerseys donated by Billy and Mako Vunipola who played at junior level for Thornbury, went under the hammer.

Pete Phelps added: "We've got plenty of adding up to do as money continues to come in from clubs for the sale of programmes, but a significant five-figure sum has already been raised for Liam which is absolutely tremendous."

Fund-raising efforts continue with the Bristol Combination hosting a golf day at Henbury on 3rd June while St Mary's are organising a dinner at the Marriott on 20th August.



Local MS Patient to Skydive for Charity

Little Stoke Gifford Matters was pleased to hear from local resident Emma Cooke, who is jumping out of a plane later this month in order to raise money for BrAMS (The Bristol and Avon Multiple Sclerosis Clinical Centre) at Southmead Hospital.

Emma. 33. is a university graduate who has lived in Stoke Gifford since a toddler, choosing to stay local when she moved to her own home just across the road from her parents where she currently lives with her cat. She was diagnosed with Multiple Sclerosis

6 years ago, following 2 and a half years of testing. This was a low point in her life and there have been times when she has lost the ability to walk unaided and had to depend on her cane. Through this time BrAMS have helped by listening, and prescribing treatments to keep the MS at bay. They have a superb Neuro Physiotherapist who has prescribed balance courses in order to improve Emma's mobility. BrAMS also pay for part of the courses, with the rest being funded by a small cost to the patients and a big part paid for by the BS7 Gym. The gym provides the location and personal trainers to assist the patients and help them improve. The physiotherapist has created these fantastic courses and has also introduced a Hydrotherapy course at Horfield Leisure centre.

Emma is so thankful to all the specialists who have helped her along the way that she wanted to give something back. She told us "I am passionate to raise as much money as I can to help these courses continue. They have really brought the MS community together."

No longer able to run or take part in sporting events to raise money, she came up with the idea of a sponsored sky dive two years ago and originally had a team of 12 fellow MS sufferers taking part. Unfortunately not all those who wanted to take part could get their doctors permission to do so, so the team has dwindled to 3 participants with MS along with 4 friends and supporters. They have called themselves the MS Warriors!

"Being diagnosed with MS was the lowest point in my life – I didn't know what my future would hold. I thank with every bone in my body all of the neurologists. MS doctors, physiotherapists and specialist nurses who have helped turn my life around. With the other skydiving Warriors I want to raise as much money as I can to help others get the same support that I've received."

Multiple Sclerosis (MS) is the most common disabling neurological disease of young adults. In the UK alone, over 100,000 people suffer from MS and it affects thousands more through their friends, family and carers. The Bristol and Avon Multiple Sclerosis Clinical Centre (BrAMS) combines leading clinical services with cutting edge research. It is recognised as a centre of excellence, bringing together world-class neuroscientists to advance research, clinical care and discover new treatments for this life-changing disease. It treats over 2,000 MS patients a year.

Emma also frequents and volunteers at the MS Therapy Centre in Bradley Stoke, "The MS Centre is just fantastic, there are so many therapies and treatments they can offer. I love helping out on reception and being able to talk to people who call in with gueries. Obviously having MS myself gives me a better understanding of some of the difficulties others are dealing with and I have experienced the treatments myself too. The MS centre has asked me to do a sponsored Sky Dive for them next year but I need to get this one out of the way first!!"

Can you Help provide a minibus? Emma is also looking for help to provide a minibus on the day of the sky dive - 18th June - to transport the team to Salisbury. They have someone capable of driving the minibus but so far quotes to hire are several hundred pounds, which isn't affordable when the team is trying to raise as much needed funds as possible. If you are able to help with this please let us know and we will forward to Emma.



UWE BoxED at Bailey's Court Primary School

The children of Bailey's Court Primary School year 5 have for the past five weeks been involved in a science project with the BoxED team from the University of the West of England, Bristol (UWE). Pupils were tasked with finding bacteria in the playground capable of producing electricity and they did just that!

To begin with they had to build the bacteria a home, called a microbial fuel cell. Within the fuel cell, bacteria were well nourished by the children over the course of the project and rewards for their effort they began to see electricity being produced. Electricity is the waste product of the bacteria as they metabolise, or eat, the food the pupils gave them.

During the course of the project the pupils also had the opportunity to find how well (or not!) they wash their hands by using a special glow cream (which is invisible until a UV light is shown on it), do an experiment to see how easily 'bacteria' aka glow cream could spread from person to person and even grow their own bacteria from hands on special jelly called agar. They began to appreciate that bacteria are all around us, some good, some bad but washing your hands well prevents bacteria spreading.

Bradley Stoke & Little Stoke Gifford Matters was delighted to be invited along to the final session at Bailey's Court where the pupils became engineers, being challenged with building a wind turbine out of waste materials to produce as much energy as possible when powered by wind. The pupils had to consider what was required to make the most effective fan – 2 blades or 4, plastic or cupboard, angled blades or flat. Pupils learned that

engineers need to build, test and then modify their designs to produce the best results. The session closed with an opportunity to link all the teams' microbial fuels cells together and show the pupils that combined they could power small electrical appliances, such as an LED and electronic thermometer!

The pupils in a few weeks' time will be visiting Drs Debbie Lewis, Jon Winfield and the rest of the BoxED team at UWE's Frenchay campus to cement their learning by visiting the Bristol Robotics Laboratory, Science and Education department here. They will see real scientists and engineers at work and hopefully be inspired for their future careers.

UWE BoxED is a school focused outreach programme of STEM (Science, Technology, Engineering and Maths) related activities. The aim is to support schools in delivering engaging STEM content and keep students excited about STEM subjects. Knowing that many pupils ride scooters to school and out and about, we organised to have some Scooter Training for any of our Y3s who ride scooters (which is most of them!) Somehow the weather held out and we were able to run our training, which was really useful and also enjoyed by all who did it.

We take pupil safety really seriously and try to make sure pupils who leave St Chad's are able to moderate their actions to minimise risks in all settings, which is why we really value the pedestrian training we do with the Y6s and so have decided to roll it out to our Y5s this term too and they have enjoyed learning about their local area, route planning, making sure they are safe in their travels and exploring the area.

Rev David Powe, Former chaplain of HMPS Belmarsh & Bristol, visited St Chad's for a one off, very special assembly. More often, retired Reverend Powe works with much older audiences but showed he was more than comfortable with a younger audience when he charmed the entire school with his assembly based around our current theme of 'creativity'.



We had celebrity visitors from CBeebies Rhyme Rocket leaving EYFS, Y1, Y2 awe-struck during their recent visit. It is not all that often that we have TV celebrities at St Chad's school site and to have them helping to teach English from a school's perspective is a bonus. Pupils were excited days before and the team lived up to expectations.

Our new writing course for parents has been a smash hit. It has been full from day one and although I have yet to have any formal feedback, informally some parents have caught me and expressed how interesting and useful they have found it. Many have said it is a good way to find out what their child will be learning and "it's changed a bit from when I was at school"!



Y1 & 2 had a superb trip to SS Great Britain and Bristol Historic Dock Area! They explored the SS Great Britain (including below its water line) were entertained by stories from the staff and had a tour of key points of the floating harbour. The pupils are still talking about it.

The MAD science team visited us again and ran an amazing assembly, this time around air power

and flight. Children watched as items flew, popped and danced around in front of their eyes! Leading on from this, MAD have been running an after school science club which has been hugely popular.

St Chad's ran its first holiday club over the Easter Break. Running from 9.00 to 3.30 children played endless games, showed their creative side through crafts and had a chance to meet with their friends and get lots of enthusiastic ideas for play and entertainment from the holiday club team. This was a trial run and as it was so popular, we shall continue this in each of the upcoming holidays. If you are interested, please speak to the office or look at the banner on the school fence for more details.

SATs week for Y6s is now over. Irrespective of the controversy in the media and the mixed opinions many have around testing of primary aged children, I think the pupils deserve to be hugely congratulated for their exemplary approach to the tests, with a mature balance of a bit of worry (a shame, but inevitable, if for no other reason than they care and want to do their best) but also a sensible outlook and a really great supportive, caring way of being towards each other. The now traditional SATs breakfasts were a great start to the day, with cereal, toast, juice and more being gleefully consumed each morning. All of the pupils of St Chad's are always a credit to themselves and the school and the Year 6s have certainly been role models in maturity and appropriate behaviour - what more could a parent or school ask from them? Well done!

News from St Michael's

from Head Teacher Mark Freeman

What a performance!

At the end of April the school put on a production of 'Annie'. This involved nearly 100 children from Year 3 to Year 6 either singing, dancing, acting or playing music - and the result was a fantastic performance which was greatly enjoyed by parents over two evenings. At St Michael's we are passionate about giving children the opportunity to shine in all areas, and for us the performing arts are an essential part of the curriculum and the wider life of the school. Please read on for more information on different aspects of these performance skills.

Music: We employ our own specialist music teacher who works with children throughout Key Stage 2. This ensures that children receive an excellent theoretical and practical grounding in music. All children have the opportunity to learn the recorder in Year 2 or Year 3, while in Year 4 everyone learns the ukulele. Many children progress to group or individual music lessons, and we can offer a very wide range of teaching, including harmonica, drums, guitar, flute, clarinet, violin, keyboard and brass. The school has its own orchestra, as well as recorder and flute ensembles.

Singing is also highly valued and celebrated. All children have singing lessons weekly, and the standard throughout the school is amazingly high. We have a choir which performs regularly in school and outside, including the South Glos Schools' Concert at Colston Hall in June.

Drama: All children are involved in drama as part of their curriculum, and it is used to reinforce and develop learning in all sorts of situations. These might include role play to get a better understanding of social situations; hot seating to appreciate the viewpoints of historical characters; and whole class and school performances for parents at regular intervals throughout the year. All year groups are involved in a production during the year, culminating in the Year 6 leavers' performance in July.

We also offer several drama clubs both after school and on Saturday morning. These are run by our long-time partner Creative Kidz.

Dance: At St Michael's we love to dance! We have a dance teacher who works for two afternoons per week working with Key Stage 2 children, linking dance to the rest of the curriculum. We also have four after-school dance clubs, and an annual dance competition where children get to show off all they have learnt to music of their choosing. Dance also features prominently in many of our assemblies and performances, and children also have the opportunity to learn dances from other cultures, including flamenco, Bollywood and the Chinese dragon dance.

The Cribbs Patchway MetroBus Extension Updates

The Cribbs Patchway MetroBus Extension item was debated at South Gloucestershire Council's Planning, Transportation and Strategic Environment Committee meeting on 4 May 2016. The item was deferred until the next PTSE Committee on the 29th June 2016 for further consideration of the implications of each of the options for the CPME. Some options require additional funding which has not been identified at this stage. Your local Parish & District Councillors have been working hard behind the scenes objecting to South Gloucestershire Council Officers' recommendation to add an extra lane to Hatchet Road at a cost of £1.4m to save 30 seconds off the journey time.

Stokes Youth and Community Centre goes from strength to strength under the management of Stoke Gifford Parish Council

The Parish Council has turned the youth club from making a loss of approximately £90,000 per annum run by South Gloucestershire Council to now some three years later showing a slight profit run by your Parish Council. This was achieved by good management and hard work by your Councillors volunteers. The Parish Council carried forward a bank balance of £26,557 into the current financial year 2016/17 and have been successful with continued Positive Activities funding amounting to £21,000 for the current financial year. The Creative Youth Network has been commissioned for a further 12 months to deliver provision over 3 evenings per week. Anyone wishing to hire the facilities should contact the Parish Office.

Parish Council Accounts

The Parish Council approved the Accounts for 2015/16 at the Annual Parish Council Meeting held on Tuesday 10th May 2016 and have expressed thanks to the Parish Staff for their work associated with the financial control and management of such information. Parish Councillors also welcomed the significant grant funding secured for a range of projects across the community over recent years. The Little Stoke Community Hall continues to be extremely popular throughout the wider local community and has exceeded funding expectations year on year over the last five years.

The Parish Council have organised a number of regular and occasional activities which have taken place across the community which have included the Bristol Meat Machine, a Fun Fair, Car Boots and a Music Festival which have all generated funds towards the future maintenance of facilities managed or owned by the Parish Council. The Parish Council continues to fund the Highways and Street Scene cutting services which are provided by South Gloucestershire Council and a 3 year contract is now established. The precept for 2016/17 will be £339,734 and has been maintained at a minimum increase over a number of years whilst continuing to deliver and move the Parish Council forward with its work on behalf of the local Parishioners.

Kemps Jewellers still going strong!


It was great to catch up with Michael Kemp in his family jewellers in neighbouring Westburyon-Trym. Kemps has been trading for an amazing 134 years!

New Inheritance Tax Rules

Andrew Jack of AMD Solicitors considers the new Inheritance Tax rules – very good news for some

Under the new inheritance tax rules, far more estates will pass free of inheritance tax post 5th April 2017. By 5th April 2020, some estates worth £1 million will pass free of inheritance tax.

The residence nil rate band

For deaths from 6 April 2017, an additional inheritance tax free "residence nil rate band" will be available. This will begin at £100,000 in the tax year 2017/18 and will increase by £25,000 each tax year, reaching £175,000 by 2021. This "residence nil rate band" is available where the deceased leaves a property (or the proceeds of sale of a property), in which they have lived at some point, to their direct descendents (children and their issue).

The residence nil rate band is available on top of the existing inheritance tax nil rate band of £325,000, so that in 2020/21 an individual will potentially be able to leave £500,000 free of inheritance tax. As is now the case with the standard nil rate band, where the first of a married couple to die leaves their estate to their spouse, the inheritance nil rate band can effectively be "passed on" to the surviving spouse. The estate of the spouse who is second to die will therefore potentially have two nil rate bands (£325,000 x = £650,000), plus two "residence nil rate bands" (£175,000 x 2 = £350,000).

For those with a conventional family, and a modest home and savings (and subject to the rate of house price increases in the coming years) it is therefore likely that no inheritance tax will be payable on their estate. However it is crucial to establish that the wording of vour will is compliant with the new rules, to avoid the risk of the additional tax free band being wasted. The detail of the new rules is awaited at the time of writing this note.
