100th Anniversary of the Battle of the Somme, 1st July 2016

The Stoke Gifford Branch of the Royal British Legion, which covers Little Stoke, Stoke Gifford, Bradley Stoke, and Filton, held a service at the Stoke Gifford War Memorial at 7.28 am on the morning of the 1st July 2016, to mark the hundredth Anniversary of the start of the Battle of the Somme in 1916.

At 07.28 RBL members and members of the public observed the national two minutes silence, and at 07.30 whistles were blown to mark the Anniversary.

Stoke Gifford Branch member Lee Bushby laid a wreath on behalf of the Stoke Gifford Branch at the Thiepval Memorial for the hundredth anniversary of the Somme.

The local Royal British Legion are celebrating a partnership with The Students' Union at UWE. This is building on years of collaboration with The Student's Union at UWE, and the University itself.

Recently a couple of UWE students volunteered at the Stoke Gifford Branch's stall at the South Gloucestershire Armed forces Day held in Kingswood.

In a city as busy as Bristol it's not surprising that two events collide - the surprise is that it hasn't happened before. The Celebrating Age Committee was stunned to learn that their launch day of September 25th in M Shed, planned for a year, conflicted with Bristol's Half Marathon!

With all the roads closed, the only way for people to get to M Shed was to come by water, or run in the Marathon, so wisely the committee has decided to change the date to the week before, Sunday 18th September.

"Bristol's older people are pretty game and usually up for anything, but I thought asking them to swim to M Shed was a bit much!" laughed Judith Brown, Deputy Chair of the Committee. "We plan the event from year to year, and all our little cards publicising the event have gone out around the city, but the brochure due out soon will have the right Celebration Day date of Sunday September 18th. The two week Festival of city-wide events will still begin on September 26th."

The Celebrating Age Festival will officially

open on Sunday 18th September, 10am at M Shed with the Opening address from the Lord Mayor, The Older

Achiever Awards Ceremony, The winners of the Art & Craft Competition and a wide range of activities from print making to yoga, information and advice stands, health checks and musical entertainment

The Festival is aimed at engaging older people in a wide range of activities taking place across the City. It runs from Sunday 18th September, until Sunday 9th October. The numbers of people attending has grown each year from approx 600 people in 2008 to over 4,000 people in 2014. #### Local Resident Making Moves to raise money for a Stoke Gifford Defibrillator

Many local people across the Stokes will recognise Andrew Phelps (Phelpsie), who is raising funds to provide a defibrillator in Stoke Gifford.

Phelpsie tells us "The other day the local Scout troop was doing first aid and, having spent several weeks trying to think of how I could help the community of Stoke Gifford, I hatched the plan to raise the money for a defibrillator boxed on the wall of the Old School Rooms. I've spoken with Simon Jones, who told me that this is something the committee were thinking of working towards and he has agreed to it being housed at the OSR and connected to the electricity supply. So, now I'm trying to fundraise for the defibrillator. I have opened a justgiving page and am looking for local support!"

Previously working for the police, Phelpsie had to retire from service in 1998 due to injuries sustained in the riots at Knowle West. In October

2014 he underwent spinal surgery to replace and fuse his lumber spine. As part of his recovery and to encourage regular activity, Phelpsie has been prescribed an exercise regime resulting in him joining the Bradley Stoke Leisure Centre. He tells us: "It is a challenge for me going to the gym regularly but once there I always try my best and can complete about 1,000 Moves (don't ask me what a Move is but it's tough and takes me 66 minutes on 6 different pieces of equipment!). For this challenge I am asking people to sponsor me to help me achieve 100,000 moves, which should take me about 34 weeks."

Advice for the summer from Dr James Bragg: Dehydration is one of the most common reasons for people seeking GP help in the summer. In warm weather you lose a lot of water by sweating. This puts you at risk of urine infections, fainting, headaches and other unpleasant symptoms if you are not drinking enough. For some people, such as the elderly and very young, dehydration can be serious. Remember at this time of year, it is important to drink a lot more! Try and stick to water rather than alcohol, fizzy drinks or drinks containing caffeine.



New Minor Injury Service: Since April this year, we have been offering a new Minor Injury Service to our registered patients. The purpose of this is to provide a local and responsive service for minor injuries that replaces the need to attend A&E. Minor ailments, such as: suspected fractures; cuts and lacerations; minor burns; animal/bug bites; slips; trips and falls; sunburn, and minor head injuries can all now be treated at the surgery. You do not need to make an appointment - one of our nurses will assess you as guickly as possible and you will be seen in one of our treatment rooms.

Community based social prescribing: We are also about to start work with Curo and Age Concern that are aimed at improving community based social prescribing. We hope these initiatives will really help our local community and we look forward to starting to work with them.



Devlopment and Refurbishment: A successful bid to the Primary Care Infrastructure Fund allowed us to develop Conygre Road Surgery by refurbishing all the clinical rooms, creating a new room and adding a lift. Work was concluded in April and we now have 6 clinical rooms that will allow us to increase the range of services offered in our Filton Branch.



Teamwork: We are very proud of our evolving clinical team which sees the 6 Partners (Dr Bragg; Dr Aitken; Dr Warnock; Dr Young; Dr Wood and Dr Bodey) supported by 3 Associate GPs (Dr Haque; Dr Herring and Dr Blenkharn (currently on maternity leave)); Our Nurse Practitioner (Annie McGuiness) and Nurse Prescriber (Indira Timothy), and a great nursing team consisting of Treatment Room nurses, Chronic Disease Nurses, a Sexual Health Specialist Nurse, Health Care Assistants and Phlebotomists along with excellent back up and front line support from our Management, Reception, Admin, Secretarial & IT staff.

Training: To support the wider NHS we are also involved in training Doctors, Nurses, HCAs and Admin Staff. We are keen to develop our patient care and will shortly be supporting medical research.



Blood donations are vital for helping save and improve lives. Each donation can help up to three people. Craig Shellard (right), from Little Stoke, knows just what an amazing gift blood donation is.

The 35-year-old received numerous transfusions of blood and platelets after being diagnosed with a type of blood cancer called Follicular Lymphoma. *"I took it relatively well, the most difficult part was telling family and friends,"* said Craig. *"At the time it was considered noncurable."* 

After the cancer was diagnosed in 2008, Craig began a treatment journey that took many years. Both cancer and chemotherapy damage the body's bone marrow, which is where blood and platelets are produced. Blood transfusions are a vital part of treatment for many cancer patients. Unfortunately Craig's cancer returned after treatment and he also needed a stem cell transplant - receiving both his own stem cells and stem cells from his brother in 2013.

When Craig then developed Graft Versus Host Disease – his immune system started attacking his own body – he was given only a 10 per cent chance of survival.

Craig had specialist treatment at NHS Blood and Transplant's Therapeutic Apheresis unit in Bristol, and a further blood transfusion. He recovered gradually and was able to return to work as a business analyst earlier this year. Craig said: *"I have needed many blood products over the years and I am indebted to donors for the help I received."* 

Blood is always needed and hospitals in England rely on around 6,000 units a day to treat patients. But blood stocks can come under pressure over the summer as people get distracted by holidays, sporting events, and the warmer weather. NHS Blood and Transplant particularly needs people with blood groups O negative, B negative, AB negative and A negative to come forward, and people from Black and South Asian communities.

Bristol's blood donor centre is on the grounds of Southmead Hospital and it is open every week day and every other Sunday with free parking and wifi.

### **BTEA Students are Fast Learners at Bloodhound Project**

Pupils at Bristol Technology and Engineering Academy in Stoke Gifford spent an afternoon with the British team which is attempting to break the world land speed record.

The Bloodhound Super-Sonic Car aims to raise the current mark of 763mph (1,228km/h) to over 800mph in the South African desert.

At 13m in length and weighing more than 7 tonnes, Bloodhound features a rocket system which will fire in tandem with a Eurofighter jet engine to push the vehicle through the sound barrier. The ultimate goal is to go above 1,000mph (1,610km/h). The science behind Bloodhound is now being used in STEM activities in schools, and Year 10 pupils at BTE Academy paid a recent visit to the car's home in Avonmouth.

The programme has installed a BBC Micro:Bit codable computer, which enables students to investigate the behaviour of mini rocket cars. Working with a group of British

Army engineering instructors, the group used the technology to test the concept that acceleration is the rate of change in velocity over a period of time.

Jon Furber, the member of staff supporting the students, said: "The Bloodhound Project is a global engineering adventure, using a 1,000mph world land speed record attempt to inspire the next generation to enjoy, explore and get involved in science, technology, engineering and mathematics."

Finally, to mark the 400 year anniversary of Shakespeare's death, we were privileged to have students from the Bristol Old Vic Theatre School come in to perform their 'Rough Guide to Shakespeare'. What a treat to end our fantastic week.

Since the last issue of Little Stoke Gifford Matters 1st Stoke Gifford has had several new scouts join the troop and has also attended the Apple store for an ICT session using some coding software and learning about iphone and ipad functions etc.

Public Exhibition – Proposed Enhancement of Little Stoke Community Hall, Little Stoke Park

A Public Exhibition will be held on Tuesday 2nd August 2016 between 4pm and 7pm at the Little Stoke Community Hall, Little Stoke Lane, Little Stoke.

Local residents will be given the opportunity to hear more about the proposed plans to enhance the existing community building, to include new sports changing rooms, an open social space with kitchen and drinks preparation area, and improved meeting facilities.



Local Parish Councillors and the Parish Clerk will be in attendance during the exhibition. It is anticipated that a formal planning application will be submitted to South Gloucestershire Council later in August.

## Stoke Gifford Cenotaph Proposed Restoration Works

The cenotaph was erected on the green at Stoke Gifford around 90 years ago but in the last three years the base of the monument has begun to subside. The local stone pillar, set on a square plinth, was erected in 1927 to commemorate the 18 "men who fell" in World War One and World War Two.

The Parish Council have ring-fenced £2,000 towards the project but further funding is still required towards the essential repair works.



Built largely from public funds, the monument is now the responsibility of Stoke Gifford Parish Council and it is hoped that some funding will be secured from the War Memorials Trust towards restoration work. Support has also been welcomed by the Parish Council from within the community, and local artist Steve Brimble has offered watercolour sketches and soft pastel paintings for sale with the proceeds going towards the required works.

#### Metrobus Extension in Stoke Gifford

At the last full Council meeting held on 12th July 2016, it was reported on the outcome of the South Gloucestershire Environment & Community Services Committee meeting where the route of the Metrobus extension through Stoke Gifford was voted on. The Committee voted 7 to 6 in favour of adding a bus lane along Hatchet Road which runs the length of Meade Park, incurring a spend of £2m to save an estimated 30 seconds off the journey time.

#### COLLABORATION ON DIVORCE-A different way forward

Alison Dukes, Specialist Family Solicitor with AMD Solicitors and a trained Collaborative Lawyer explains how the Collaborative approach to relationship breakdown may be right for you.

In my practice I find that most new clients have heard of mediation as a form of dispute resolution but very few clients have heard of the collaborative approach.

Collaborative Law is a way of resolving disputes on divorce or relationship breakdown that does not involve going to court. It involves former partners sitting down together and, with the help of their solicitors, working out for example how to share financial assets or responsibilities for any children, as they each go their separate ways.

At the start of the collaborative process each party and their adviser (a trained Collaborative Lawyer) signs a formal agreement confirming that they will reach a solution without going to court. The lawyers involved in the collaborative process are not allowed to represent their clients in any subsequent court proceedings, so that it is in everyone's interests for a solution to be found by agreement.

The process requires a genuine desire on both sides to make it work and a willingness to disclose fully and honestly information about all assets. Negotiations take place at meetings at which each client is present together with their lawyer and it is the clients who set the agenda and the pace of the process. They share their hopes and expectations for the future as they work with their solicitors to try to find a solution which each will find acceptable. Where appropriate, the assistance of other specialists such as accountants and counsellors can be called upon to help resolve outstanding issues or to assist in finding solutions in a particular area of dispute.

Where an agreement can be reached through collaboration there may be significant benefits to the family as a whole. The costs and stress of court proceedings will have been avoided and the assets available to be divided will not have been pointlessly reduced by each side funding heavy litigation costs.

Perhaps most importantly, the relationship between the couple may not have deteriorated to the extent that is sadly common amongst those





who have faced a court battle. This is of course

vital where there are children involved, so that the parents will need to communicate and cooperate for many years to come.

Agreements reached during the collaborative process can be recorded in a Deed of Separation or, if there are divorce proceedings, in an order that the court makes "by consent" which means that the couple will not have to attend court in person.

Collaborative practice will not be appropriate for every couple experiencing family breakdown. Couples who are "warring" are unlikely to choose to adopt a collaborative approach, nor is it appropriate if one party has already decided the specifics of the outcome they are looking for. There will be cases where the more traditional and adversarial route of determining the division of family assets will be inevitable, although many of those cases will be still capable of resolution without the need for any court hearing. However, for those who know they want a negotiated jointly "owned" settlement which minimises the emotional cost of divorce or family breakdown, collaborative law will be an attractive and constructive approach.



At Stoke Lodge Primary School we work very hard to ensure that all children feel safe, happy and are included. At the beginning of the year we became members of the Bullying Intervention Group and as part of that, worked towards the BIG Award, which is an award for excellence in bullying intervention.

This award is recognised nationally by Childline, Anti Bullying Alliance, Anti Bullying Words, CEOP and Each Education. To achieve this award we had to meet



externally agreed criteria and be able to demonstrate that we work to agreed standards and ensure that every child is enabled to fulfil their true educational potential, or enjoy their community activities, without fear of being bullied.

In KS2 we have Playtime Buddies at lunchtimes whose role it is to look after our 'buddy bench' and any children that use it. The purpose of a buddy bench is so that children can always find someone to play with. At the end of each term we have peer and teacher nominations for both KS1 and KS2 children that have displayed positive and friendly behaviour. We have a dedicated area in our main corridor for Anti Bullying where children can find books and advice if they need help and a display board that is changed termly. We also have a dedicated Cyber Bullying display in our KS2 hall which has lots of information about how to stay safe on line and the steps to take if children are experiencing Cyber Bullying. At the end of each term we have an Anti-Bullying newsletter that is sent home and uploaded to our dedicated Anti-Bullying page on the school website.

Towards the end of last term we received confirmation that we had been successful in all criteria and were awarded the BIG award. We are one of the first Primary Schools in the South West of the country to obtain this which is a massive achievement. Our certificate is displayed proudly in the main reception area as well as the anti-bullying corner of the main school corridor.

Val McFarlane, Director, Bullying Intervention Group stated 'Stoke Lodge Primary School take bullying very seriously. Although they do not have a problem with bullying, they ensure that they have excellent systems in place to ensure the safety and wellbeing of all of their pupils. They involve the children and their parents/carers in all aspects of their anti-bullying work, and also have an up to date, effective anti-bullying policy. I am delighted that they have now achieved the BIG Award for excellence in challenging bullying.'

### Move Home or Remodel?


