Move Home or Remodel?

Steven Moyse from Bradley Stoke based Home Planning SW Ltd considers the expense of moving house, versus the cost of remodelling your existing home ...

If you are feeling dissatisfied with your current home, you might be considering moving house or perhaps wondering how you might be able to improve upon the one you already own. The choices involved are both financial and emotional - it can be a hard decision to make and one that could potentially be worth thousands of pounds to you and your family.

There are other things to take into consideration too - if you love the area you live in, your neighbours, your outdoor space, your commute or the location of your children's school, then taking a fresh look at your current home and the untapped potential it offers might be a better option. Why go through the pain and expense of moving home (one of the most stressful life experiences, according to a recent survey) when you might be able to realise the same benefits from remodelling your present living space? Not only is the result more space that works better for your needs, but the value it adds to your property is an investment for when the time does come to sell.

Before starting out on your remodelling project - whether this be an extension, a loft/garage conversion or the putting up/taking down of internal walls, a suggestion of things to consider might be (a) how much money you have to invest, (b) how much the work is likely to cost, and (c) the final value that could be added to the property. Unless you really don't mind whether or not you make any profit from your remodelled home, then you also need to think about the maximum value of any house in your area and whether your investment will be realised when you finally come to sell up.

It is also important to consider which elements and features would add the most value to your property. The best way to do this is to ensure that your new plans overcome a negative aspect of the original house, for example a small kitchen or ground floor bathroom. Adding a double storey extension could give you a much needed



extra bedroom, a larger bathroom or perhaps an en suite - all of which would potentially add value to the property.

Other considerations would be to respect the key relationships between different spaces, such as the kitchen and dining area and make sure all of the principal rooms can be accessed directly from a centrally located hallway and landing, allowing you to freely move around your home with ease

At the start of the new term, 32 Scouts from 1st Bradley Stoke Scouts took part in an expedition camp to Botany Bay in Wales with their leaders. This included members of the newly opened Friday night Troop with three troops now operating from Brook Way Activity Centre.

The Scouts arrived on the Friday evening and had to put their tents up before wide games under a full moon and then supper. They also explored the nearby forest and learnt that water that comes out of a stand pipe doesn't quite taste the same as that from home; most of them thought it tasted like grass! As always, sleep is difficult on the first night. The excitement of being in a new place and in a



tent meant that lights out at 11PM just means they are all in their tents. It's the early hours before they are all truly asleep.

They woke early to breakfast, tent inspections, an opening ceremony, preparation of packed lunch and then a briefing for their hike to Tintern Abbey. They split into four groups with some being driven some way away to different start points so that they didn't meet each other. Whilst they had leaders with them, they were responsible for navigating and finding the best route using footpaths and bridle ways. This meant that some may have gone the pretty route! They then hiked back using a different route

again. Back at camp and after dinner, there was a campfire with singing, toasted marshmallows, smores and chocolate bananas. Unsurprisingly sleep was much easier and none stirred before 7:30.

The final day saw them pioneering camp gadgets and learning how to use axes safely to chop wood, strip branches and make kindling. Following a final lunch, the tents were dropped and a litter pick ensured that nothing but memories was left. After the closing ceremony, the Scouts were returned to parents and leaders made for home, all looking forward to a warm bath and soft beds!

Bat walks Report from Sara Messenger

The conservation group has this year put on three bat walks around the nature reserve in Bradley Stoke. After a welcome from the Three Brooks Nature Conservation Group and a brief talk from Bekki Farrar or Avon Bat Group Public Education Officer Stewart, (they alternate walks) everyone is then given a bat species guide and 'bat detector', which we tune in to 45kHz since most British bat calls sweep through this frequency. The group walked around the reserve, although because of the rustic state of some of our paths our two wheelchair users weren't able to access the entire walk but, while waiting for the main group to return from the meadow, we were treated to a heady display by a noctule bat that seemed keen that we shouldn't miss out!

Everyone discovered the bat boxes we have in Savages wood but, as bats are a protected species, the boxes are not opened. We then headed up to the lake which is the best place to see and hear our many bats as they swoop over the lake catching insects. While we were admiring their aerial display our swans, thinking we were going to supply a midnight feast, joined us for a while before giving up and gliding back into the darkness.

We have three species of bat on the reserve, namely Noctule, Pipistrelle & Daubenton bats, although we think this year we may have a fourth. You can tell what species of bat you have found by the sound that the detector picks up, (there are 17 UK species). Pipistrelle calls are described as smacks or slaps whilst the call of the Daubenton's bat would be described as a tick. Although crickets and car keys can also be picked up by the detectors it is easy to tell the difference.

Pipistrelle's are the smallest bat with a wingspan of just 18cm – 25cm and they emerge 20-30 minutes after sunset and are the bats you will see twisting and turning around buildings.

The Daubenton emerge after 40–50 mins, they are larger with a wingspan of 24cm-27.5cm and can be found skimming the surface of the lake, catching insects with their feet.

With a wingspan of 33cm – 45cm the Noctule is the reserve's largest bat, which emerges 5–10



If you missed our walks but would like to do your own bat detecting, we have at the library 10 bat detector packs, which can be borrowed for free with a library card. The leaflet was written by Gill Smith (Three Brooks Committee Secretary) and John Morris (SGC) and contains information on bats and a map showing the best places on the reserve to find them.

Monthly Workdays and weekly Green Gyms take place on the Reserve by a small number of volunteers - if you wanted to join in you would be warmly welcomed!



Advice for the winter from Dr James Bragg:

As you know, during the winter there is a big increase in coughs and colds and therefore an increase in people contacting the Health Centre. Why don't you have a look at some of the NHS minor illness advice http://www.nhs.uk/livewell/ coldsandflu so that you know when you need to worry and when you don't? This should help us provide a prompt and more effective service throughout the winter. A lot of minor illnesses get better just as fast on their own and if you can avoid contacting us for those it will help us help you when an appointment is really important.

We are running open Flu vaccination clinics on the following days for our patients:

SGMC (1.30-6.30pm) A-J (6 Oct), K-Z (13 Oct) CMC (1.30-5.00pm) A-J (5 Oct), K-Z (12 Oct)

Catch up flu clinics will be at SGMC (on 20 Oct between 1.30-6.30pm) and CMC (on 19 Oct between 1.30-5.00pm).

Children's Super Hero themed flu clinics will be at SGMC (on Sat 5 Nov between 0900-1400hrs) and CMC (on Fri 4th Nov between 13.30-1700hrs)

The seasonal flu vaccine is available free of charge for those categorized as being at greatest risk of developing more serious complications as a result of flu (e.g. bronchitis and pneumonia). These patients include: over 65s; all pregnant women (at any stage of pregnancy); under 65s with a chronic illness (e.g. diabetes, heart disease or any other long term condition); residential / nursing home residents, and those who are in receipt of a carer's allowance or are the main carer of an elderly or disabled person whose welfare may be at risk if the carer falls ill.

The viruses that cause flu change every year, so people in at risk groups should get vaccinated annually. There is no live virus in the vaccine so it cannot give you the flu. Please don't underestimate seasonal flu. Be prepared and get your flu jab before there is a flu outbreak.

Staying Green! We want to minimise our carbon footprint and have recently installed solar panels at Stoke Gifford Medical Centre. They have generated over 4000kWh of electricity since installation in August and are producing an average of about 95kWh per day. This is over 80% of the surgery's typical daily energy consumption - we are looking for ways to close this gap further.

Flower Gardens have recently been created in the two courtyards at Stoke Gifford. These have been designed to help bring a more relaxing and fragrant ambience to the waiting room. Plants have been chosen to add colour and scent while attracting pollinating insects. We look forward to seeing them mature and bloom.

To support the wider NHS we are involved in training Doctors. Nurses. HCAs and Admin Staff and are currently training: a year 4 GP trainee, a qualified doctor in training to become a GP; a student nurse and 2 apprentices (one working with the nursing team as a Health Care Assistant and one working in the prescribing team).

We are incredibly proud of two of our younger staff members who are heading off to university. Matt Barrett has been working as a phlebotomist while studying at UWE and is now embarking on a degree in Medicine. Floe Hillson has been working on her Health Care Assistant Apprenticeship and leaves shortly to commence a Nursing degree. We see training and developing such staff as making a vital contribution to our patients in the short term and the wider NHS in the future and wish them both the best of luck.

Talking to your Reception Child about school

After enjoying so much of our children's time in their first few years of life it can be difficult to adjust to the amount of time they spend in school from Reception onwards. It is natural to be curious and interested in how they spend their time during the day, and equally frustrating when they are not forthcoming to discuss it!

Bradley Stoke Matters was pleased to speak to Lauren Burt, Reception teacher at Meadowbrook Primary, who was happy to share her top tips on how to make the most of your conversations with your child about their school day.

Mrs. Burt's Top Tips!

Think about the time of day and the kind of questions you ask. Avoid bombarding them with questions as soon as they come out to the playground which can be noisy and confusing.

Let them know you're happy to see them and maybe leave it until you get home. Bath time or bedtime are nice quiet times to have a quality conversation. They are usually tired or preoccupied when they first come home, or they may want some quiet time.

Young children often respond better to more direct and specific questions. Start with a factual question then you can expand from there.

Try not to judge what your child says; just ask what might happen next or what they learned. This encourages them to share things with you and work out solutions themselves. Don't hesitate to follow up with their teacher if there is

Don't worry if they're not forthcoming there is a lot for them to process and

children often take a while to be able to talk confidently about their home life in school and vice versa. For the vast majority 'no news is good news' - the class teacher will contact you directly with any concerns. Just add "I love hearing all about what you do at school I bet you'll think of some really interesting things to tell me soon."

Who did you enjoy talking with the most today?

Tell me two children you played with today. What did you play?

What was your favourite part of your lunch?

Where is the coolest/most fun place at school?

What was the best/most interesting thing you did at school today?

The Olympus Academy Trust Update for 2016-17



The new school year started with two days of staff training, including a session for (almost) all 550 staff within the Trust on 1st September.

All of the joining schools joining have been presented with an Olympus Plaque during their first assembly of term (photos right).

Given the growth of the Trust to 7 schools, 2 new part-time Executive Headteachers have been appointed (2 days a week each) for 2016-17. Richard Clark, previously CEO and Executive Headteacher of Cosmos Academy Trust, will combine overall leadership of Stoke Lodge Primary with an Executive Headteacher role for the Trust, and Claire Banks will combine her overall leadership of St Werburghs Primary in Bristol with an Executive Headteacher role for the Trust, having supported the Trust's primary schools as an external consultant for the last year or so.

Previous Executive Headteacher Dave Baker will now assume the role of CEO working with both Richard and Claire to give support to all the schools and to provide overall leadership for the Trust

All individual schools will still have a Headteacher or Associate Headteacher who is responsible for the day-to-day running of the school, but with additional support from the Trust.









As all schools are in close proximity (within 3 miles of one another), The Trust will start to provide support services for the primaries in north and south geographical groups ie Callicroft, Meadowbrook and Stoke Lodge together and Charborough Road and Filton Hill together. This will ensure that all the primary schools have access to specialist finance and business support as well as HR and premises expertise.



Olympus Academy Trust

Richard Clark will lead support for Bradley Stoke, Callicroft, Charborough Road and Filton Hill and Claire Banks will lead support for Abbeywood, Meadowbrook and Stoke Lodge, working closely with each school's Headteacher to provide additional leadership capacity, but all will still work together on many aspects to share best practice and support one another.

Governance:

A new Board of Directors has also been announced which is made up of 13 people – a mixture of parents, community members and experts who are appointed based on their skills, insight and knowledge. They work on a voluntary basis and bring a wealth of experience in areas such as HR, Finance, School Improvement, IT and Education.





Dearswood Abbotonians Blues 2-1 in the final (picture top) and the U16's being Div 4 Champions this year, topping the table 9 points clear.


The Club's annual football tournament held at Bradley Stoke Community School in the summer attracted around 100 teams from around South Glos, Bristol and even South Wales.

We hope that Reception class have a good year and enjoy the next seven years of primary school! We give a warm welcome to the new Reception class!


New Equipment

COLLABORATION ON DIVORCE-A different way forward

Alison Dukes, Specialist Family Solicitor with AMD Solicitors and a trained Collaborative Lawyer explains how the Collaborative approach to relationship breakdown may be right for you.

In my practice I find that most new clients have heard of mediation as a form of dispute resolution but very few clients have heard of the collaborative approach.

Collaborative Law is a way of resolving disputes on divorce or relationship breakdown that does not involve going to court. It involves former partners sitting down together and, with the help of their solicitors, working out for example how to share financial assets or responsibilities for any children, as they each go their separate ways.

At the start of the collaborative process each party and their adviser (a trained Collaborative Lawyer) signs a formal agreement confirming that they will reach a solution without going to court. The lawyers involved in the collaborative process are not allowed to represent their clients in any subsequent court proceedings, so that it is in everyone's interests for a solution to be found by agreement.

The process requires a genuine desire on both sides to make it work and a willingness to disclose fully and honestly information about all assets. Negotiations take place at meetings at which each client is present together with their lawyer and it is the clients who set the agenda and the pace of the process. They share their hopes and expectations for the future as they work with their solicitors to try to find a solution which each will find acceptable. Where appropriate, the assistance of other specialists such as accountants and counsellors can be called upon to help resolve outstanding issues or to assist in finding solutions in a particular area of dispute.

Where an agreement can be reached through collaboration there may be significant benefits to the family as a whole. The costs and stress of court proceedings will have been avoided and the assets available to be divided will not have been pointlessly reduced by each side funding heavy litigation costs.

Perhaps most importantly, the relationship between the couple may not have deteriorated to the extent that is sadly common amongst those who have faced a court battle.
This is of course

vital where there are children involved, so that the parents will need to communicate and cooperate for many years to come.

Agreements reached during the collaborative process can be recorded in a Deed of Separation or, if there are divorce proceedings, in an order that the court makes "by consent" which means that the couple will not have to attend court in person.

Collaborative practice will not be appropriate for every couple experiencing family breakdown.
Couples who are "warring" are unlikely to choose to adopt a collaborative approach, nor is it appropriate if one party has already decided the specifics of the outcome they are looking for.
There will be cases where the more traditional and adversarial route of determining the division of family assets will be inevitable, although many of those cases will be still capable of resolution without the need for any court hearing. However, for those who know they want a negotiated jointly "owned" settlement which minimises the emotional cost of divorce or family breakdown, collaborative law will be an attractive and constructive approach.
