# Concorde Completes Final Journey To New £19M Home

The last Concorde ever to fly has safely completed her journey to Aerospace Bristol, a new £19m museum taking off in Filton, to the north of Bristol, this summer.

The complex move was conducted with the greatest care by engineers from British Airways and Airbus, who managed every facet of Concorde's final journey. The iconic aircraft was towed across Filton runway and up a ramp into the new purpose-built hangar at Aerospace Bristol. The hangar, constructed by Kier, had a wall removed to allow the aircraft to enter the building and, with less than a metre between each wing tip and the building, Concorde was slowly and carefully winched into her exhibition position.

British Airways' Concorde Alpha Foxtrot – also known as 216 - was the last Concorde to be built and the last to fly. She made her maiden flight on 20 April 1979 and touched down on her last flight to Filton on 26 November 2003. Since that landing, Alpha Foxtrot has stood alongside the Filton runway, cared for continuously by Airbus UK and remaining in remarkable condition. Now inside, she starts a new chapter as the centrepiece of the new Aerospace Bristol museum.

lain Gray, Chairman of Aerospace Bristol, said: "We couldn't be more delighted to welcome Concorde 216 into her new purpose-built home at Aerospace Bristol. With such enthusiasm

for Concorde in this country, and particularly in Bristol where she was designed, built and landed for the final time, it is only fitting that this magnificent aircraft should have a permanent home at Filton. I would like to thank all of our donors for helping to make Aerospace Bristol a reality and look forward to welcoming our first visitors on board this summer."

Mark Stewart, General Manager and HR Director, Airbus said; "Airbus has been the proud custodian for Alpha Foxtrot since 2003 and has been keen that we could find a permanent location for such a fantastic historical exhibit of Filton engineering skills. After 13 years of caring for the aircraft we are pleased to deliver her to Aerospace Bristol so that people can visit and admire her for years to come."

David Hart, British Airways' Head of Fleet Planning said: "It is with great pride that we have helped to deliver our iconic Alpha Foxtrot to her new home. This move will allow thousands more people to be inspired by her sleek, innovative design and supersonic statistics."

Starting in the earliest days of flight, when Bristol Boxkite biplanes flew over Brunel's Clifton Suspension Bridge, **Aerospace Bristol** will transport visitors through more than one hundred years of fascinating aviation history.

Visitors will travel through two world wars, exploring the vital role of aircraft in these conflicts, through the drama and technological advances of the space race and on to the modern day, where they will discover the latest technologies of today's aerospace industry. As a first-class museum with learning at its heart, Aerospace Bristol aims to inspire the next generation of engineers with remarkable stories of ingenious design and engineering innovation.



The idea came after a first aid session back in June 2016 where the scouts learnt how to use a fully automatic defibrillator unit.

The defibrillator has been provided by The Community Heartbeat Trust Charity who will provide maintenance for the unit, batteries and replacement pads as and when necessary.

This bright yellow circular box has been fixed to the wall of the Old School Rooms next to the original entrance on North Road by John and Matt from M.G. Electric Solutions. The code to the locked box is available from South West Ambulance Service by ringing 999 or 112 when a resident is suffering from a suspected cardiac arrest. This life saving piece of medical equipment will be an asset to Stoke Gifford and the scout troop are proud to have helped to make this happen.

There will be a session at the OSR for members of the community to be shown how to use the defib on Thursday 20th April 2017 at 1pm, there is room for 50 people bookable at the OSR office please use welcome@stmichaelsbristol.org or admin@stmichaelsbristol.org

The unit is the top of the range and not only does it talk the user through the process but it also has a display screen to assist in the event of an emergency.

This brilliant idea originated from the children at Coniston Primary asking for a space where they could sit and read, in the playground, at lunchtime. After some research, Head Teacher Nigel Isaac came up with the idea of a converted bus!!

Having made contact with the local bus companies, First Bus were fantastic in coming to the School's aid: not only did they provide an old disused bus drained of oil and made immobile. but Engineering Director Rich Northey, along with his team of engineers, then spent time working with the school to find out what was needed and offering their help. The team refurbished the bus to the school's specification, including removal of some seats to make room for tables and storage. They re-upholstered the seats and painted the bus in school colours before delivering it to the school playground – and all in 4 months!!

Managing Director of First Bus. James Freeman, told Bradlev Stoke & Little Stoke Gifford Matters "Most of our old buses just

go to the scrap man and it's been rather nice to do this project. Our team really rose to the challenge of making the bus suitable for its new life and we've really enjoyed today seeing how much the children love the bus". Rich Northey added "We've found a good way of re-utilising the old bus, we've enjoyed being part of the project and to be invited here to see the kids busy playing in it is just fantastic."

The school also approached Almondsbury Charities and Friends of Coniston PTA who kindly donated money to help resource the bus. The bus now offers the children somewhere to seat and read, play games, do puzzles and arts and crafts. It is also used for intervention groups and story times plus St Chads Preschool who are based on the school grounds are also planning story sessions on the bus.

Chair of Governors for Coniston Primary, Mike Lloyd, thought the bus was "Absolutely fantastic" and expressed his grateful thanks to the First Bus team, and also to the PTA and Almondsbury Charities, for making the project come to life.

### **Duties of a Personal Representative of an Estate**

When you lose someone close to you, you may be surprised by the volume of paperwork that needs to be completed to deal with that person's estate. The person responsible for dealing with the estate is the next of kin under the intestacy rules or an executor under the terms of a Will. Increasingly more people are appointing family members rather than legal professionals to administer their estates and this can be quite daunting for the family member left to deal with everything.

#### **Personal representative duties**

If you find yourself having to administer an estate, you will need to consider your personal representative duties which are set out in statute.

Among them are dealing with the estate assets efficiently and keeping a detailed account of the assets and liabilities of the estate to show how the estate funds are being dealt with.

Most estates in England and Wales require a Grant of Representation which is the general term given to the court order providing the authority for the personal representative to deal with the person's assets.

# How to apply for a Grant of Representation

You can apply for the Grant personally or you can instruct a solicitor to act on your behalf. Before deciding whether or not to act you should consider:

- The amount of time you have available per week. Most estates take between 6-9 months to administer and that includes writing letters and making phone calls on a regular basis to obtain information.
- How comfortable you feel with completing forms and understanding the process. You will need to declare all the assets and liabilities of the estate to HM Revenue and Customs on the relevant tax form, self-assessments may be required to finalise the deceased's income tax and claim forms will need to be completed to close down all of the bank accounts.

The level of accountability you feel comfortable with. If the estate is relatively straight-forward you may feel happy signing all the paperwork required to obtain the Grant and later on making sure that the estate is distributed correctly in accordance with either the Will or intestacy rules. Some people prefer to instruct legal professionals on their behalf because it gives them peace of mind that things are being done properly and the responsibility of administering the estate shifts to the legal advisor.



#### Frequent Headaches? Physio could be the answer

#### What causes headaches?

There are lots of types, but the most common are tension type headaches. These can be stress or anxiety related, but often no one knows what causes them. To find out what causes your headaches, a good place to start is to write a pain diary. This can help you pinpoint the cause of the symptoms and help you start to manage them.

Of common tension type headaches, we know the causes can be stress, squinting, poor posture, tiredness, dehydration and irregular meals. In this case, there are a few key things you can already do to help you prevent and manage them:

- · Get an eye test
- Remember your posture sit up
- Sleep well
- Stay hydrated
- Eat Regularly

#### News from St Michael's Stoke Gifford

The term started with an icy blast, as you can see from the picture. Much to the children's disappointment there was no great snowfall, and it all very quickly disappeared. However, despite being a cold and wet term, we have had plenty of exciting opportunities in school to enjoy and celebrate.

Some of our learning highlights last term:

#### Virtual Reality comes to St Michael's

This term we organised a 'virtual reality' day at the school, where all KS2 children were able to try out a virtual reality headset and experience a range of amazing environments. Children were able to go underwater; go into space; visit the

Great Wall of China – and lots more. Here's what one of our pupils said about it: "This was an amazing experience. It felt like you were really under the water with all those creatures. I really hope we can use this more in the future."



We employ two teaching assistants to teach the children how to cook: they take groups throughout the week to our children's kitchen (recently refitted), and take them through a whole programme of food preparation and cooking. Recipes include: green stir fry; cinnamon swirls; exotic fruit smoothies; chicken and mango salad; spinach and ricotta cannelloni; courgette pancakes with feta and pepper filling. Yum Yum!

#### **Getting Fitter**

We are having a big push on fitness this year. We are supported one day per week by a coaches from Bristol Rugby, who organise lessons for all children combining fitness with rugby skills. As a result we have fitter children and an excellent tag rugby team!



#### Visits and visitors

We believe that our curriculum should be enjoyable and inspiring: a key element in this is a regular amount of visits and visitors. Our Reception classes have been learning about 'People who help us', and they have had visits from a nurse, a police car (very exciting!), and a firefighter. # Silver Sporting Success: St Chad's placed in the top 20 South Glos Schools for Sport!

We are proud to say that we are recent winners of the Silver Sainsbury's School Games Mark, putting us in the top 20 schools for sport provision (both Primary and Secondary) in South Gloucestershire!

At St Chad's, we believe that all children should have the opportunity to access high quality P.E. and Sport so that they can develop key skills in a broad range of physical activities and lead healthy, active lives. Every child takes part in a minimum of 2 hours physical education each week (plus additional active club provision), where we aim to inspire every child to enjoy physical activity.

Our sporting provision at St Chad's has led us to work towards the Sainsbury's School Games Mark. We are currently holders of the Silver School Games Mark, having achieved all of the Silver criteria plus many of the Gold criteria too, which is a huge accolade and not easy to achieve. We are delighted to have recently been informed that we are one of 27 schools in South Gloucestershire who have received a sporting award as part of the Sainsbury's School Games Mark and as a result of receiving our Silver mark, it places us within the top 20 schools in South Gloucestershire (both Primary and Secondary) for sport! A big well done to the St Chad's community for all of their dedication to sport and the future of our young people!

In order to achieve the Silver Mark, we have raised the profile of sport across the school and within the community. 100% of our children participate in intra-school competitions at least six times a year, enabling children to compete against other children within the school and in addition to this. the numbers of children competing against other schools within the area has increased significantly over the last two years. The children of St Chad's have represented the school in Cross Country. Archery, Football, Rugby, Rounders, Multi-Skills, Athletics and Dance. Our continued focus on sport has raised outcomes for children resulting in some great sporting successes, where we were crowned champions in rugby at Patchway Community College (PCC) Tag Rugby tournament, multi-skills (also at PCC), archery hosted by Gordano Archers in a local competition and archery (again) at the Festival of Youth Sport.

Having won at the South Gloucestershire Festival of Youth Sport, our archery team was selected to

represent South Gloucestershire County against North Somerset. The result was very close and ended up with North Somerset coming away champions; St Chad's missed out by only needing 5 more arrows in

the gold ring. This was our first ever live arrows competition, where St Chad's demonstrated a very high level of skill, fantastic sportsmanship and were wonderful role models for the school.



In order to encourage more children to become active, we have continued to develop strong links with the community by hosting a fun-packed Rugby World Cup Day with North Bristol Rugby Club, holding a Dance Dazzle Day, organising an Archery Day with Gordano Archers, inviting community coaches from Future Stars to host intraschool football competitions, holding a sponsored community fun run and delivering dance workshops for Year 2 based on street dance from around the world, which they performed to the local community (provided by Amy Boucher from ConfiDance).

At St Chad's, we have set ourselves the challenging target of achieving Gold Mark this year. In addition to maintaining the Silver Mark criteria, we will be required to raise the number of children participating





in competitions and clubs, develop leadership skills for children and build a sports working party.

Like every term, term 3 has proven to be another busy sporting term. On our journey to Gold, we have entered four inter-school futsal teams into a tournament at Patchway Community School (PCC). Two year 4 teams (both boys and girls) represented the school on Thursday 26th January and two year 5 teams (both boys and girls) competed on Thursday 2nd February. We are incredibly proud of the teamwork skills and sporting behaviour that was demonstrated by all of the children, who attended the events. Overall, our team representing class 5L came back champions and one of the year 4 teams (with representatives from both year 4 classes) came 2nd overall.

Congratulations to the children from our Dance club, who performed in the Festival of Youth Dance at Abbeywood Community School on Thursday 9th February. They performed dances they have been learning in Dance club after school. The theme for the festival was 'Dance around the UK'. One of their dances was inspired by the 'Pirates of the Carribbean', making a link to Bristol's ancient harbour and pirates like 'Blackbeard'. The other dance was called 'At St Chad's, we believe to achieve', linking to the St Chad's community. Both dances were freestyle. The children will perform to the school in our I Can Achieve (ICA) assembly, which we are looking forward to very much. A big well done to St Chad's Dance club! We are very proud of what you have achieved. Thank you to Miss Davies for all of her hard work and enthusiasm in coaching the children to performance standard.

Mr Hayward (the Chairman of Aretian's Rugby Club), along with Mrs Hayward and Miss Stevens (representatives from Aretian's RFC) have continued to volunteer their time to help coach rugby as an additional P.E. session and have

worked with year 3 children this term. The children have thoroughly enjoyed the sessions and learnt a great deal from the coaching. A big thank you to all coaches for continuing to provide such a fantastic opportunity. Aretian's RFC are always keen to recruit new players. As leadership is part of the success criteria for Gold Mark and also as part of the ethos of St Chad's school, all key stage two children will be working on leadership opportunities in class during P.E. and Games lessons. Year 4 children designed and lead a fabulous sports session for reception and year 1 children in mid-February, which included warm ups, skills development and an element of competition. It was great to see so many smiling faces from all children involved. Year 6 children continue to work with Jamie and Dave (sports coaches from Future Stars) to increase structured physical activity provision at lunchtime. They have been learning new leadership skills and developing games to play with children of all ages during the lunch hour.

In order to achieve Gold Mark, we need to continue to raise the numbers of children participating in extra-curricular clubs. We have a whole range of sports clubs running during lunchtime and after school at St Chad's, which will continue next term. Our sports clubs look at developing a range of skills, including sporting skills learnt in PE/Games lessons, competitive skills, teamwork skills, perseverance and many of our school values.

We look forward to continuing to build on sporting opportunities at St Chad's. Stay active everyone!

### Parish Council Receive Support from Probation Service

The Probation Service Community Payback volunteers have been assisting the Parish Council on a weekly basis over recent months with edging works to the pathway in Meade Park (photo right). These enhanced works now provide a clean and tidy setting with a much improved wider access for all users of the facility, and is all down to excellent teamwork. This has been well received by both Parish Councillors and members of the public. It is anticipated that the Probation Service will continue to provide support over the coming months, and assist with local projects to include the painting of play equipment and the varnishing of park benches.

### Updates on the Cribbs Patchway MetroBus Extension (CPME) Along Hatchet Road

Following a public meeting organised by the Parish Council on Tuesday, 22nd November 2016, South Gloucestershire Council have confirmed they will be continuing with a previously approved plan to introduce a South Bound Bus Lane on Hatchet Road in Stoke Gifford.

The recent public meeting that was attended by nearly 200 residents strongly objected to proposals to introduce the bus lane in one direction through the





heart of the Village. These objections and concerns have been rejected by South Gloucestershire Council following numerous attempts by Stoke Gifford Councillors to defer the decision on economical grounds. The works will continue to proceed as agreed at the ECS Committee in July 2016, and it is understood that the CPME scheme will commence during 2018 and be completed early in 2021. South Gloucestershire Council have also confirmed that they are currently in the process of firming up the overall CPME programme, which has lengthened from the original publicised timescales.

The Parish Council urge South Gloucestershire Council to reconsider their decision to introduce a bus lane in one direction along part of Hatchet Road, which includes the removal of mature trees and hedgerows at a cost of £2.2 million pounds to save an estimated 29 seconds, especially as the overall MetroBus Scheme is already overspent.

A revised detailed design phase is yet to be viewed regarding the implementation of the new South Bound Bus Lane, which may vary from the original specification. At the same time, it is understood that surveys are being conducted along the wider route regarding feasibility. However, the new bus Lane will potentially impact on one or two parks under the current management of the Parish Council that are currently leased from South Gloucestershire Council; namely Meade Park and Forty Acres which incorporates Royal Park and are located on either side of Hatchet Road. The new equipment will be modern and up-to-date and will fit into the existing footprint, to afford excellent play value and look good too!

**Project title:** New Park Fitness Equipment. The request for funding for new fitness equipment for Little Stoke Park came third in the voting and has been granted an award of £8,000! The Parish Council can also begin the process of purchasing items of new fitness equipment, providing a new and exciting scheme for use by all visitors to Little Stoke Park.

**Project name:** Bench/Bins and Floral Display Units. As we go to print on this edition voting was still taking place in local stores, and it is hoped that this project will also win some funding from the Bags of Help initiative.

#### Winter/Early Spring Health Messages

This continues to be a very busy time for the NHS. There is an increase in respiratory complaints and people suffering falls (with associated injuries), with elderly patients and those with underlying health conditions being most affected. In addition, vomiting bugs and coughs lead to more people seeking medical assistance. Please help us to provide your care by reading about two common minor illnesses that you can normally manage yourselves and where advice and medication is available from a pharmacy.

**Norovirus**, sometimes known as the 'vomiting bug', is the most common stomach bug in the UK, affecting people of all ages. It is highly contagious and is transmitted by contact with contaminated surfaces, an infected person, or consumption of contaminated food or water.

The symptoms of norovirus are very distinctive – people often report a sudden onset of nausea followed by projectile vomiting and watery diarrhoea. Good hand hygiene is important to stop the spread of the virus.

People are advised to wash their hands thoroughly using soap and water and drying them after using the toilet, before preparing food and eating. Alcohol gels do not kill this virus.

An infection with norovirus is self-limiting and most people will make a full recovery in 1-2 days. It is important to keep hydrated – especially children and the elderly. The advice from Public Health is that patients with these symptoms do not visit either A&E or GPs as this may spread the virus. Further information and advice is available from NHS 111, including an online symptom checker at nhs.uk

Coughs and Colds. A cold is a mild viral infection of the nose, throat, sinuses and upper airways. It can cause nasal stuffiness, a runny nose, sneezing, a sore throat and a cough. Usually it's a self-limiting infection – this means it gets better by itself without the need for treatment from a GP.

Treatment of a cold. For most people, a cold will get better on its own within a week of the symptoms starting without any specific treatment. However, there are treatments that can help to ease your symptoms and make you feel more comfortable. These are available from your pharmacy, which means that you can treat yourself, rather than needing to see your GP. There is no cure for colds. Antibiotics, which treat infections caused by bacteria, don't work on cold viruses.

**Self-help.** There are a number of self-help measures that may help to ease the symptoms of a cold.

- Drinking plenty of fluids to prevent dehydration.
- Steam inhalations with menthol, salt water nasal sprays or drops may be helpful.
- Vapour rubs may help relieve symptoms for children
- Hot drinks (particularly with lemon), hot soups and spicy foods can help to ease irritation and pain in your throat.
- Sucking sweets or lozenges which contain menthol or eucalyptus may sooth your throat.
- · Gargling with salt water may help a sore throat.

You should try to make sure you rest and look after yourself if you have a cold, but it is not usually necessary to stay off work or school.

#### **News from Holy Family Catholic Primary**

#### **An Inspector Calls**

The Ofsted inspectors visited the school on 29th November to carry out the first 'short' inspection since Holy Family was judged to be 'good' in 2012, and concluded that the school continues to be good. It recognised that the leadership team is providing, "a strong drive for Holy Family Catholic Primary School to continue to improve."

Over the course of the inspection the views of all stakeholders were sought, through face to face meetings, questionnaires and responses on the school Parent View site. As expected, there was a great focus on safeguarding of pupils and learning outcomes for the children. The inspectors carried out a range of activities. including observing pupils in class, listening to children read and meeting with the School Council. Happily, as anticipated, the report concluded, 'Leaders have developed a wellbalanced and broad curriculum. Pupils enjoy learning about topics in depth."

Reporting on how well the school had progressed with the minor areas to improve identified in the previous report, the inspector commented that these had been, "tackled well" and that it was clear that pupils approached problem solving, "enthusiastically."

The inspectors recognised that, "Staff and pupils take a great pride in being part of the lively learning community you have built, based on values that prepare pupils well for the next steps in their education. Parents say how welcoming the school feels."

Headteacher Mrs Summers-Breeze was very pleased to have this affirmation. The proud headteacher commented, "I think the key to Holy



Family's success is that every adult works hard for the benefit of every child. All the staff put in over and above what is expected of them. They see themselves as role models for the children, showing them the way to

behave and treat everyone with respect. They always do their best every day for every child and I am honoured and privileged to be working with such an outstanding team."

#### **Mystery and Suspense**

Pupils have undergone detective training for Book Week this year, as they have studied The Mysteries of Harris Burdick by Chris Van Allsburg. English co-ordinator Mrs Carter explained, "The book is a collection of images by the mysterious author and illustrator, Harris Burdick, who, as legend has it, disappeared before his stories were ever told." This thrilling week began with the children developing theories to account for Mr Burdick's vanishing act. "I believe he stole the ideas from another writer and had to run away," suggested Harry from Year 5.



During Tuesday, the children enjoyed the opportunity of a visit from Sue Perks of Belly-Buster Storytelling, who dazzled the whole school with a range of suspenseful stories and workshops which were both thrilling and peculiar. "The story teller was really funny," declared Ben, from Year 5, "It was so interesting hear someone tell whole stories without relying on a book. She told traditional stories but made it really entertaining."


