Local Art Group's Latest Competition Inspired by Aviation Heritage

Ahead of the highly anticipated new museum opening in late summer, Aerospace Bristol has selected a trio of high-flying artists as the winners of a competition inspired by Filton's aviation heritage.

We have often shared the artwork of The Stokes Art Group (SAG) in previous issues of both Bradley Stoke Matters and Little Stoke Gifford Matters and the group is close to our hearts having been initiated by local resident Susan Hartry with the help of articles in our local community magazines back in 2011. Matters was pleased to be invited along to meet the group

and judge it's very first competition in spring 2012 and also to be invited back in November 2016 to judge the five year anniversary project too, both entitled "Where We Live". As well as taking pride in their art, the group are extremely proud of the link that many of their members share with the local aerospace industry and were keen to celebrate Concorde's arrival into her new home at Aerospace Bristol. Aerospace Bristol was therefore asked to judge the group's latest competition themed around Filton's aviation heritage.

Reflecting the story that will be told in the Aerospace Bristol exhibition later this summer, the group produced a collection of 18 artworks depicting aircraft spanning more than a century of fascinating aviation history; from Boxkite biplanes to Concorde and on to the modern day.

After careful deliberation, the three winners chosen by Aerospace Bristol were:

Winner: Concorde 2017 Home from Home, by Susan Hartry (watercolour)

Runner-up: We Love Concorde, by Sue Kelly (watercolour)

3rd place: Concorde Assembly Line, by Sara Smith (mixed media)

South Gloucestershire Council has approved the installation of a bus lane on Hatchet Road in Stoke Gifford with the aim of speeding up the MetroBus link between Cribbs Causeway and Parkway Station. This is for the benefit of residents of the housing that is being built on Filton Airfield. It will cost $\mathfrak{L}2.2$ million and a computer model estimates that it will save 29 seconds off the journey time.

Stoke Gifford Parish Council and residents have strongly objected to this. Why?

- Hatchet Road will need to be widened by taking land from both sides of the road.
 The mature trees and hedgerows lining the road, providing vital habitat for wildlife, and helping to keep our air clean, will be bulldozed and possibly replaced by a 3 metre high barrier;
- The proposed bus lane will end at the roundabout by Ratcliffe Drive/Sandringham Road, whereupon the MetroBus will have to merge into the regular traffic flow to Parkway Station. As anyone who lives in Stoke Gifford knows, any time saved will be lost in the congestion on that stretch of road and it will also make it even more difficult for residents trying to exit from roads either side of the roundabout:
- There are already concerns about the levels of pollution and its risks to health. More congestion = more pollution;
- South Gloucestershire Council claims the cost will be £2.2million, but we all know how MetroBus costs have soared elsewhere in Bristol;
- There will be a massive impact on the ability of residents and commuters to move around during the lengthy building process - look at what has happened in Bradley Stoke and Stoke Lane! And ultimately the environment of Stoke Gifford will be changed forever.

THERE IS AN ALTERNATIVE: The Parish Council supports the option of installing laybys for buses. This would allow general traffic to keep moving, causing less pollution, less destruction of the local environment, and would cost £1.25 million LESS than the bus lane option. Sadly, South Gloucestershire Council persists in rejecting this option.

Bradley Stoke & Little Stoke Gifford Matters was pleased to meet up with local resident Paul Tanner last month to talk about the proposed bus lane along Hatchet Road in Stoke Gifford.

Paul is a long-established Stoke Gifford resident having first moved to the village in 1979. He was a Governor at Filton High School / Abbeywood for some 27 years and a Director of the Olympus Academy Trust for 4 years.

Aided by two other local residents, Sue Bandcroft and James Buckingham, Paul has brought together an Action Group of local people intent on trying to save the Hatchet Road area in Stoke Gifford from being butchered to make way for the bus lane. On the opposite page is a leaflet with information put together by the group which details more about the proposed scheme and how you can help.

Despite objections from the Parish Council and local residents to date, South Gloucestershire Council are still planning to moved forward with the proposed plans. Paul told me, "I very much agree with your publication that 'Community Matters'. I also strongly believe that local politicians need to listen to the residents in their constituency and work for the local communities that they represent.".

The Action Group was formed in March and the petition drawn up. Paul, Sue, James and other members of the fast-growing Action Group have been handing out leaflets, contacting local politicians, attending local and county council meetings, all to raise awareness of the local resistance to the proposed scheme. 2,500 signatures are needed on any petition to trigger a debate at full council meeting. This was met in early May and Paul subsequently represented the Action Group at a full South Gloucestershire council meeting on 17th May - his transcript is included below:

Thank you for the opportunity to present a petition on behalf of the Hatchet Road Action Group. You will recall that I was one of three people who addressed the Full Council at its March meeting. Since that time the Hatchet Road Action Group has been busy seeking support for our campaign for the Council to review and change the decision made last July by the Environment and Community Services Committee to put a bus



lane on part of Hatchet Road. This proposal is part of the Cribbs Patchway MetroBus Extension scheme. Our preferred option is to review the number of bus stops required between Bristol Parkway Station and Gipsy Patch Lane and install bus lay-bys in those places.

As you will have heard previously, this will provide a much more cost-effective solution for the area, it will be far less damaging to the environment, less disruptive for all traffic in the short-term and reflect and respect the feedback provided from the community.

The number of signatories submitted today totals 2,736. This number is increasing and I expect to have in excess of 3,000 supporters signed up by the end of the month. It is difficult to gauge at the moment what the number will be when I submit a final version.

We ask that the Council receive this petition and arrange for a thorough and objective review of this matter before discussion at a forthcoming Full Council meeting. We maintain that the evidence is overwhelmingly in favour of the bus lay-by option.

As we went to print towards the end of May the number of signatures had amounted to over 2,800 with the hope being to reach the next target of 3,000 by the start of June.

MOT Shaves Minutes Off Runner's PB

You take your car in for its MOT, but have you thought about an MOT for your Running Body? That's just what local Bradley Stoke runner Paul Godwin did and since then his running has gone from strength to strength.

Paul took up running in January 2016 to improve his health and wellbeing. Previously, Paul had been a keen footballer but had let his fitness slide. Joining the North Bristol Running Group was pivotal - after doing the "couch to 5k", he just kept going. Paul's fitness improved and at the same time he noticed the boost to his mental wellbeing from the social side of running with a group.

Last October, Paul saw the offer of a 'Running MOT' with Susie Baker at Bradley Stoke Physio & Health. He thought it would be a good idea to get his running checked out and see if he could run further and faster. His personal bests (PB) were 5k: 27 minutes and 10k: 58 minutes, and he had just signed up for the Bath Half Marathon. Suffering from a few

niggles, Paul was also keen to find out how to keep injury at bay.

Using slow-motion video analysis Susie showed Paul how his running could be improved. Susie discovered that Paul's desk job was taking its toll: the 'before'

photo shows how his shoulders are hunched. Susie also identified that Paul's running style was more like a fast walk, which can lead to knee injury and leg pain.

Paul felt he was a bit of a plodder even though he did like a sprint finish, and agreed the goal was to become more athletic in his running and not run out of puff. He signed up for three sessions focusing on the fundamentals of good posture, balance and coordination for running.

Susie showed Paul some simple exercises and skills that improved his movement as well, giving him an easier and more enjoyable way to run that's also better for his joints. Since then Paul has set PB's of 24:11 (5k), 50:11 (10k), and completed the Bath Half Marathon in a very respectable 2:13:57. Paul said, 'Without Susie's input I don't think I would have got these results'.

New & Improved Services available at our surgeries

It looks like summer is finally on it's way, well it is as I write this! While you are hopefully planning your summer break or just enjoying the longer days, I thought you might be interested to know what goes on at the surgery alongside our regular weekly 620 face-to-face appointments, over 400 triage phone calls, approximately 2600 prescriptions issued, 100 referrals made on to secondary care, and our daily walk in minor injuries service!

We also host: Ante & Post natal clinics; baby check and immunisation clinics; Counselling; Diabetic Retinopathy; Abdominal Aortic Aneurysm screening: Hearing Service (via Scrivens). We have also developed a nurse lead women's and sexual health service. We train GPs and Nurses; contribute to research; develop staff through our apprenticeships programme, and run ongoing education sessions for clinical staff.

We work with local community partners to deliver a number of schemes designed to support our most vulnerable patients. These schemes include: RSVP (Retired and Senior Volunteer Programme). We now have a small team of patients who have volunteered as wellbeing guides and visit our most lonely and isolated patients for a chat and a cup of tea. CURO COMMUNITY CARE. We are pleased to have been selected to run a Community Prescribing Pilot. Working with Curo, a not for profit organisation, the aim is to create a team of local community volunteers that can signpost patients to local services and support networks. This service is working really well and we will shortly be setting up some clinics on site so that patients, of any age, can come to the surgery for help and advice with non health related matters such and housing, finance etc.

Age UK provide a very wide range of services for older people including:

- information and advice on a wide range of topics from benefits and entitlements to care and support
- social activities, including day centres, lunch clubs and befriending services
- home help, including handyperson and gardening schemes
- · IT classes and other training
- and many other services from toe-nail clipping and energy efficiency advice, to dance and exercise classes

CARERS SUPPORT: Becoming a carer can feel isolating and it's often a struggle to get the information you need. When you are looking after someone, it's important to have some help and support for yourself, such as a break from caring.

Carers Support Centre is a local organisation that can provide you with information and advice on any aspect of caring and services that might be useful, the surgery are working much more closely with this terrific organisation and are hoping to set up some 'surgeries' so that carers can meet with support staff both at Stoke Gifford and Convere Road.

TOPICAL HEALTH ADVICE – HAYFEVER! Do you need to see your doctor? Most cases of hay fever can be treated using over the counter medication. Your local pharmacist can advise you on treatments for your or your children. You usually only need to see a GP if:

- * You can't control your symptoms with over the counter medications, or you have troublesome side effects caused by over the counter medication.
- * You are experiencing persistent complications of hayfever, such as worsening asthma or repeated episodes of sinusitis.
- * The pattern of your symptoms is unusual, such as occurring during the Winter or only at your workplace (if this is the case, it is likely to be another substance, other than pollen, that is responsible and further testing will be needed to confirm this.

Follow these simple steps to improve your symptoms:

HAY FEVER DOs

- put Vaseline around your nostrils to trap pollen
- wear wraparound sunglasses to stop pollen getting into your eyes
- shower and change your clothes after you've been outside to wash off pollen
- stay indoors whenever possible
- keep windows and doors shut as much as possible
- vacuum regularly and dust with a damp cloth
- buy a pollen filter for the air vents in your car and a vacuum cleaner with a special HEPA filter

HAYFEVER DON'Ts

- cut grass or walk on grass
- spend too much time outside
- keep fresh flowers in the house
- smoke or be around smoke it makes your symptoms worse
- dry clothes outside they can catch pollen
- let pets into the house if possible they can carry pollen indoors

Lydney Park, and game from nearby shoots. In addition there is free range pork and chickens from Newent. Mutton, local veal and goat are also popular.


The business produces its own range of sausages and BBQ products all the year round, many gluten free. Pies, faggots and black pudding are produced at the sister branch in Newport.

Local Anorexia Survivor Launches Major Fundraising Campaign

A young woman, from Bradley Stoke, who suffered from anorexia, depression and body dysmorphic disorder from the age of 12 has launched a major fundraising campaign to help other sufferers of the illness.

Sophie Mitchell, who is now 20, wants to raise awareness and money for BEAT, one of the UK's leading eating disorder charities. Having spent nearly 6 months in hospital during her illness and only recently returning to a healthy weight, Sophie knows the devastating effects eating disorders can have on sufferers and their families. Having years of her life disrupted by the condition and suffering severe mental and physical deterioration, Sophie is now transforming her life. According to Sophie this is, in large part, thanks to Joanna Nowak, a personal trainer at Bradley Stoke Active Lifestyle Centre where Sophie has been a member for many vears.

Sophie says "Although my battle is far from over. I am finally feeling like myself again thanks to the support from Joanna, she is so much more than a personal trainer - offering me emotional support and being someone I can talk to as well as helping with my programme of dietary advice and exercise. I am lucky that I have access to the Leisure Centre where the staff are always willing to give me advice about nutrition and exercise and I want to raise money to be able to help others to access the same support".

As part of her fundraising campaign, Sophie undertook a sponsored 2km swim at Bradley Stoke Active Lifestyle centre last month, something she says would not have been possible until recently. "It's amazing to think that I am pursuing this challenge. It doesn't seem long ago that I

was diagnosed with osteopenia (the stage before osteoporosis) but now I'm eating. training and getting stronger every day both physically and mentally and I am able to wear a swimming costume for the first time in years".

Joanna commented: "I'm really proud of everything Sophie has achieved. She has

made such progress and is now completely focussed on helping others who are going through a similar experience. She is a real inspiration."

Sophie has been a member of the Active Lifestyle Centre in Bradley Stoke for many years and staff have been able to assist her in a number of ways through her illness. Providing not only exercise and dietary advice but also a support network.

Sophie will be undertaking a number of fundraising events throughout the year, including guiz nights, bake sales, karaoke nights and participation in the Bradley Stoke 10k Run this month, in addition to her 2k swim.

School News from St Michael's Primary, Stoke Gifford Update by Head Teacher Mark Freeman

Enjoying Practical Learning Experiences

One of our fundamental beliefs at St Michael's is that the best learning comes from high motivation. There is no better way to motivate children to learn than to give them stimulating and fun experiences. Our curriculum therefore revolves around 'wow' activities – each topic will have some kind of trip, or visitors, or other memorable experience. Here are a selection of some of our recent 'wow' moments.

Y3 Stone Age Day

In April, Y3 all had a taste of what it was like in the Stone Age. They dressed up (designing and making their own costumes and jewellery), then spent a day outside: building shelters; lighting fires with flints; preparing and cooking fish (then eating it of course!); making cave paintings using natural colours. The children thoroughly enjoyed their experiences (see below), and they learnt lots of new skills during the day. It also gave them a great incentive to write about the Stone Age when they were back in the classroom the following day!

It was so much fun going outside. I especially liked cooking the fish on the fire. We had to be careful to cook it just right, and it was delicious.

Y4 Viking experience



Year 4 were studying the Anglo-Saxons and Vikings, and at the end of Term 4 they were visited by a group of Vikings, who set up camp on the field for the day. The children were able to explore all sorts of Viking artefacts, including weapons, armour, games and cooking utensils. The undoubted highlight at the end of the day were



the duels that were staged for the children. We are very fortunate that one of our teachers belongs to a historical re-enactment society, and he was able to persuade a number of their members to come along for the day to share their knowledge and make learning come to life.

I really enjoyed learning more about the Vikings by being able to hold different things they used. The best part was showing how Vikings used to fight each other.

Other trips and visits

Year 1 have recently been to visit Tyntesfield House, which is an amazing National Trust property near Nailsea. They were able to go into parts of the house normally closed to the public and find out more about how children used to live in the past.

Reception children visited Court Farm at the beginning of May, and had a brilliant time there, learning more about animals and how farms work. Once again we were complimented on the children's excellent behaviour and thoughtful questions.

Year 2 will shortly be visiting Bristol Zoo as part of their 'animals' topic. As well as going round the zoo they will have workshops where they will be able to handle some of the smaller (and safer!) inhabitants of the zoo.

Year 5 and Year 6 have both been on camp to outdoor activity centres earlier in the year. More recently, Year 5 experienced the 'explorer dome',



where the night sky is projected onto the inside of a huge dome-like tent. This is part of their 'space' topic. Year 6 have just come back from the Bristol Lifeskills Centre, where they experience a whole range of scenarios connected with safety – such as how to make a 999 call; how to keep safe if there is a fire at home; and how to keep safe by railway lines.

Update from the Olympus Academy Trust from Dave Baker, CEO

OAT received good news last month that we had been allocated funding for building improvements across Olympus Academy Trust school sites. Some of that work has started and more is planned over the coming weeks and through the summer holidays. In addition, Patchway Community College has finally been awarded money for roof and heating system replacements and refurbishment. They have been allocated over £4 million which includes funding from local developers to provide a floodlit AstroTurf facility and other sports facility



improvements too. This is a long overdue investment in their school community and is very welcome.

Our trustees have now approved Patchway Community College to join Olympus at the start of the next school year. Once the general election is out of the way, the Department for Education will hopefully give us the go-ahead to proceed. We look forward to working with them to develop educational provision for Patchway students.

We have been providing support for Winterbourne International Academy (part of The Ridings' Federation of Academies) since January and, although the Department for Education has not yet made a decision about the long-term future, we are in the process of agreeing arrangements for continuing that support for 2017-18 in conjunction with Castle School Education Trust. One aspect of the support will be to align Winterbourne's post 16 provision, at least in part, with ours so that learners from Winterbourne, Abbeywood and Bradley Stoke schools will have access to a wider range of courses. With funding a significant challenge for all local secondary schools it is important that we pool our resources and expertise to deliver the best provision for young people.

Our financial challenges have not gone away but we are closer to resolving how we will manage the cuts in each school in the Trust now. We have managed some changes by not replacing staff as

they leave, by agreeing to changes in working hours and, in some cases, changes in roles that staff do. However, we have still needed to make some roles redundant which is a horrible process to go through and one we hope we do not have to repeat again. Whilst any redundancy is unwelcome we do not anticipate this to impact more than 1.5% of our total workforce. We will share details of staff changes in each school between now and the end of the school year.

We now face the uncertainty of not knowing the impact of a change of government on our funding but hope that public pressure will ensure better levels of funding for education. We are grateful for the support of a number of parent groups who have dedicated their time and resources to raising awareness on behalf of all schools affected.

It is hard to believe that Key Stage 2 SATs are already over, GCSEs have started and AS and A levels are also getting underway. I am sure you will join me in wishing the best of luck to all our students who are doing exams and assessments in this busy period.



The LPPA – Leading parent Partnership Award – is a national accredited award which aims to support schools in enhancing and strengthening their links with parents.

Achieving the LPPA award is the culmination of 18 months of hard work by the whole school community at Little Stoke: Parents, children. staff and governors. Everyone has contributed to the process of reflecting on, developing, and increasing the ways we link with parents and the impact this has on children's learning. We are very proud that this respected organisation has recognised our progress and achievements. Below are some of the key areas we have developed over this period.

Welcoming School

With the invaluable support of our Parent Contact Group we have changed the reception area to ensure parents feel comfortable and welcome when arriving in school. Signage has been developed and displays around school improved. We have made sure we celebrate and inform parents regularly and that parents have a sense of Little Stoke being 'their' school.

Learning Opportunities

Over the last two years we have developed and increased the opportunities offered to parents to find out about how children learn and how to offer the best support at home. We have run information and training sessions and also increased opportunities for parents to get involved with children's Learning through parent and child learning events linked to our curriculum themes.

The Benefits of Trademark Protection

Grant McCall of AMD Solicitors considers the benefits of Trademark Protection.

For all growth businesses, including start ups, protecting a business name or logo should not be overlooked. The owner of a registered trademark will have a monopoly right to use their trademark in their chosen class of goods or services. The owner will also have the tools to prevent competitors infringing their trademark and benefitting from their hard earned reputation.

Asset Protection

By registering a business name or logo the owner is able to put third parties on notice that they own a registered trademark. The owner of a UK trademark has the right to take action against third party competitors that attempt to register a confusingly similar trademark or are using a similar mark in connection with their business. This preventative tool minimises the risk of a third party diluting a brand.

A further consideration is image. Owners of registered trademarks can apply the ® symbol to their registered trademark. The proof of registration may be a marketing tool to add professionalism for a target audience.

Avoiding Trademark Infringement

If a business commences marketing and promoting their brand in breach of a third party's registered trademark it is likely to lead to costly and time consuming problems. Such problems could derail the product or service development before it gets off the ground. In the worst case scenario, the infringing business could be subject to injunction proceedings, made to completely rebrand their business name or logo, deliver up offending products and pay damages or account of profits.



The Registration Process

Businesses considering trademark protection should conduct a search of the trademark registries to ensure that the mark applied for is not too similar to existing registered trademarks. An application that is too similar to an existing trademark may be contested by a registered trademark owner.

"I have the backing of the committee to bring in my new ideas and if we all pull together this could definitely spell exciting times for the club.



We were recently contacted by Coalpit Heath resident. Caroline Stiddard Bennett, with a request that we help support the animal charity Many Tears, that she is so passionate about.

Many Tears is self funded rescue centre for dogs. that relies entirely on the generosity of the public to donate. It is run by Sylvia and Bill Van Atta at their home in Carmarthen.

In 2006 Caroline's older daughter answered a plea for volunteers from Many Tears Facebook page and went over to help walk the dogs and generally give them some fuss and love. When she came home and described how sad some of them were. Caroline decided to go to the rescue and give some much needed help too. Many of the dogs were ex-breeding bitches and some even with puppies. Caroline was hooked and took to one dog in particular, a Westie called Alice. She told us the poor little dog was so scared she just sat in a basket and shook. Caroline enquired about fostering Alice and so the story began.

After going through the paperwork for fostering, Caroline took Alice home and their friendship blossomed, Alice soon learnt how to be a happy playful dog enjoying life but Caroline couldn't get the other sad dogs out of her mind and so decided to become a fundraiser for Many Tears. She regularly collects old towels blankets food and treats from local people and businesses. A local beautician recently donated all their towels, as they were renewing them. Caroline visits Many Tears once a month with her sister Nicky, to take car loads of beds blankets towels and food. This year Caroline and the Bristol MT buddies organised a table top sale in Henfield Hall and raised over £900!

Many Tears founder Sylvia has become increasingly worried about what will happen to the rescue centre when her and husband die or have to retire, as things currently stand, this would mean the end for the Many Tears. To raise funds needed to safeguard its future, Sylvia recently embarked on an epic 280 mile trek from London to Wales. The journey, undertaken with a tent on her back and 5 rescue dogs as companions, saw her walk around 20 miles a day.


