

Andy Ward is Bradley Stoke's New Mayor

At Bradley Stoke Town Council's Annual General Meeting in May. Councillor Andy Ward was appointed by the Council to the position of Mayor of Bradley Stoke for the forthcoming year.

Bradley Stoke Matters was pleased to catch up with Andy for this edition, who told us:

"When I moved to Bradley Stoke 25 years ago not for one minute did I ever envisage that at some point in the future it would be my honour and privilege to become the Mayor of my home town.

Like many of the town's residents we moved to Bradley Stoke to start our married life together, put down roots and start a family. I'm pleased and proud to say this has been our home ever since.



Over the years I have been fortunate to be involved in many areas of our community. Many of you may recognise me as the man who talks in to a microphone as a Bradley Stoke Radio presenter, usually in the middle of the town square or on a stage at one of the many local community events the radio station attends, or possibly as one of the hosts on the Drive time show on the towns local community radio station BSR103.4FM.

This year our town achieves not one but two significant milestones. It's thirty years since the first turf was cut marking the start of construction of what was back then the largest new town in the country. The Town Council is also celebrating this year as it reaches its twenty-fifth anniversary and, to commemorate this, a silver theme has been chosen for this year's carnival parade.

The town has evolved over the years from its very earliest days as a dormitory town with very few facilities, to the modern vibrant town that we enjoy today. We are fortunate to have a diverse population, and for me it's a great pleasure working with and alongside some of the amazing community groups that operate within the town, our sense of community is strong, our people friendly and welcoming; quite frankly I wouldn't want to live anywhere else."

At the Annual Town Assembly, which took place immediately before the AGM, Councillors, Officers and Electors marked the special occasion of 25 Years since the formation of the Town Council back in April 1992, with the cutting of a commemorative cake.

The outgoing Mayor Councillor Elaine Hardwick, as the last action in her role of Mayor of the Town, presented cheques to the two recipients of the Mayor's Charity Fund.

A total of £7.814.40 had been raised over the past year that was split between the Heartful Dodgers and Transplant Sport UK, both receiving 50% of the total amounting to £3,907.20 each. Representatives of the charities accepted the cheques.

The two Mayoral Charities for the year 2017/18 as selected by Andy Ward will be Cardiomyopathy UK and Freewheelers Emergency Voluntary Service.



Stoke Lodge Brownies Celebrate 40 Years!

Second Stoke Lodge Brownies started in October 1977, meeting at Patchway Church of England School. Wendy Wooster. Pat Hutton and Caroline Summerill were the founding leaders responding to their daughters' request to be Brownies.

The Unit moved to the Blue Hut and then to the Jubilee Centre in Bradley Stoke. The Brownies used to enjoy going away on Pack Holidays, where they learnt many new skills.

Wendy and Pat, known to the Brownies as Brown Owl and Tawny Owl, returned to Second Stoke Lodge on 14th June and led an evening of games, activities and singing based on what they did at Brownies 40 years ago. As a real treat for the Brownies, they brought various versions of the Brownie uniform over the past 97 years that the brownies had fun dressing up in!

One of the Brownies wore an original brown dress with a brown tie, that was worn between 1920 and 1934, the oldest Brownie uniform that is stored in the archives. Two of the Brownies wore a similar dress with an orange tie that was worn between 1935 and 1966 and lots of the Brownies wore a brown dress and yellow cross over neck tie, worn from 1967 until 1990 when the uniform



changed to a vellow T shirt and culottes. The uniforms were adorned with original badges and had the accessories of woolly hat or beret, brown leather belts and purses.

Pilates for Back Pain?

With the effectiveness of traditional painkillers on low back pain recently questioned by scientists, physio-led Pilates is often recommended instead.

According to Sophie this is, in large part, thanks to Joanna Nowak, a personal trainer at Bradley Stoke Active Lifestyle Centre where Sophie has been a member for many vears.

Sophie says "Although my battle is far from over, I am finally feeling like myself again thanks to the support from Joanna, she is so much more than a personal trainer – offering me emotional support and being someone I can talk to as well as helping with my programme of dietary advice and exercise. I am lucky that I have access to the Leisure Centre where the staff are always willing to give me advice about nutrition and exercise and I want to raise money to be able to help others to access the same support".

As part of her fundraising campaign, Sophie undertook a sponsored 2km swim at Bradley Stoke Active Lifestyle centre, something she says would not have been possible until recently. "It's amazing to think that I am pursuing this challenge. It doesn't seem long ago that I was diagnosed with

osteopenia (the stage before osteoporosis) but now I'm eating. training and getting stronger every day both physically and mentally and I am able to wear a swimming costume for the first time in years".

Joanna commented: "I'm really proud of everything Sophie has achieved. She has made such progress

and is now completely focussed on helping others who are going through a similar experience. She is a real inspiration."

Sophie has been a member of the Active Lifestyle Centre in Bradley Stoke for many years and staff have been able to assist her in a number of ways through her illness. Providing not only exercise

New & Improved Services available at our surgeries

It looks like summer is finally on it's way, well it is as I write this! While you are hopefully planning your summer break or just enjoying the longer days, I thought you might be interested to know what goes on at the surgery alongside our regular weekly 620 face-to-face appointments, over 400 triage phone calls, approximately 2600 prescriptions issued, 100 referrals made on to secondary care, and our daily walk in minor injuries service!

We also host: Ante & Post natal clinics; baby check and immunisation clinics; Counselling; Diabetic Retinopathy; Abdominal Aortic Aneurysm screening: Hearing Service (via Scrivens). We have also developed a nurse lead women's and sexual health service. We train GPs and Nurses; contribute to research; develop staff through our apprenticeships programme, and run ongoing education sessions for clinical staff.

We work with local community partners to deliver a number of schemes designed to support our most vulnerable patients. These schemes include: RSVP (Retired and Senior Volunteer **Programme).** We now have a small team of patients who have volunteered as wellbeing guides and visit our most lonely and isolated patients for a chat and a cup of tea. CURO COMMUNITY CARE. We are pleased to have been selected to run a Community Prescribing Pilot. Working with Curo, a not for profit organisation, the aim is to create a team of local community volunteers that can signpost patients to local services and support networks. This service is working really well and we will shortly be setting up some clinics on site so that patients, of any age, can come to the surgery for help and advice with non health related matters such and housing, finance etc.

Age UK provide a very wide range of services for older people including:

- information and advice on a wide range of topics from benefits and entitlements to care and support
- social activities, including day centres, lunch clubs and befriending services
- · home help, including handyperson and gardening schemes
- IT classes and other training
- and many other services from toe-nail clipping and energy efficiency advice, to dance and exercise classes

CARERS SUPPORT: Becoming a carer can feel isolating and it's often a struggle to get the information you need. When you are looking after someone, it's important to have some help and support for yourself, such as a break from caring.

Carers Support Centre is a local organisation that can provide you with information and advice on any aspect of caring and services that might be useful, the surgery are working much more closely with this terrific organisation and are hoping to set up some 'surgeries' so that carers can meet with support staff both at Stoke Gifford and Convgre Road.

TOPICAL HEALTH ADVICE - HAYFEVER! Do you need to see your doctor? Most cases of hay fever can be treated using over the counter medication. Your local pharmacist can advise you on treatments for your or your children. You usually only need to see a GP if:

- * You can't control your symptoms with over the counter medications, or you have troublesome side effects caused by over the counter medication.
- * You are experiencing persistent complications of hayfever, such as worsening asthma or repeated episodes of sinusitis.
- * The pattern of your symptoms is unusual, such as occurring during the Winter or only at your workplace (if this is the case, it is likely to be another substance, other than pollen, that is responsible and further testing will be needed to

Follow these simple steps to improve your symptoms:

HAY FEVER DOS

- put Vaseline around your nostrils to trap pollen
- wear wraparound sunglasses to stop pollen getting into your eyes
- shower and change your clothes after you've been outside to wash off pollen
- stay indoors whenever possible
- keep windows and doors shut as much as possible
- · vacuum regularly and dust with a damp cloth
- buy a pollen filter for the air vents in your car and a vacuum cleaner with a special HEPA filter

HAYFEVER DON'Ts

- cut grass or walk on grass
- spend too much time outside
- keep fresh flowers in the house
- smoke or be around smoke it makes your symptoms worse
- dry clothes outside they can catch pollen
- let pets into the house if possible they can carry pollen indoors

Largest Ever Group Camp at 1st Bradley Stoke Scouts

As well as the physical activities, children learnt about the countries where martial arts originated, how to count in those languages, and learnt about medal-winning athletes within some of the Olympic martial arts.

The children had a wonderful, fun week and Mrs Hall, who organised it, is hopeful that some of the children will have been inspired to explore martial arts further and perhaps join some of our local clubs in the area.



Bradley Stoke Youth FC (BSYFC)

On Saturday 10th June 2017 the annual Bradley Stoke Youth FC Football Festival took place at the Jubilee Centre and attracted 130 Year 1 children from 13 different local schools and 45 BSYFC Year 2 children.

Thirteen schools, each parading squads of ten enthusiastic Year 1 players, were invited to take part for the annual showpiece occasion which began in June 2006 and has become bigger and better each year ever since.

Bradley Stoke Youth Community Coach and Festival organiser Martin Lee explained: "As always the occasion is very much connected with the club's school link program, which started coaching in the schools in the period February to May timeframe and it is all about sending our BSYFC coaches into schools every year and getting their Year 1 youngsters engaged and enthused by football with weekly fun football sessions involving all the Year 1 classes at their school. The school link program started way back in 2007 and has been developing and growing ever since".

"The Festival itself is free of charge and it's not a tournament. All teams play four games each and the scores are not recorded. Winners are effectively determined beforehand via a points-scoring system based on the attitude and approach by players and teachers to their football, how well prepared and organised they are, that type of thing".

Every school participating received a cup, ball bag and size 3 footballs to continue the football coaching in their schools. The top school also received a complete football kit.

Each child received a participation medal celebrating the 25th Anniversary of Bradley Stoke Town Council, a sports bag containing football-related essentials such as shin pads, football socks, sports water bottle, sports activity pack, baseball caps and sweets.

The Bob Irving Room

St Mary's Old Boys RFC have recently opened the Irving Room, an extension to their clubhouse instigated by Bob Irving who served the Combination club as a player and administrator for more than 60 seasons.

Bob moved to Bristol from Swansea in 1951 and through his friendship with Gerry McCarthy, played his first game for Saints in 1953. Bob told Steve Hill, Bristol Post, during an interview to mark his 60th season with Saints "I was welcomed to the club and immediately became one of the boys ... despite being a Taff here on my own and a 'Proddy'! Back

then, I think there were only three non-Catholics at the club" Bob made over 250 appearances for Saints from 1953 to 1964, and went on to become a Selector, Chairman from 1978-1986 and President in 2006 before retiring from the role not long before he passed away.

Bob was a club trustee for many years and a key figure on the committee that oversaw Saints' move from the Filton Combination Ground to their own facility at Woodlands which was later sold ahead of securing the club's current base at Northwood Park.

The history of the club interested Bob - he once said "It was a working class club that started with nothing and we built ourselves up to become one of the best in the Combination. Before I joined, in 1950/51 we were unbeaten. And in my first two years here we lost only one game ... being a part of that was great."

Current Club chairman, Peter Phelps, confirms what lots say about Bob. "He was a fantastic club member for such a long time. After his playing career he made a tremendous contribution as a committee member. Bob was just a smashing bloke, someone who always made people welcome at the club".

Margaret, Bob's niece, cut the ribbon to mark the opening of the room on Bob's birthday in March. Pictured with her daughter Kirsty and granddaughter Shara, she said "It was a pleasure to open the room for Bob; he and Christine would be very proud of the space". Lots of club history can be found on the walls, with Bob featuring in a few of the photographs as a player (1954) and selector (1964). The room will be used for smaller functions, sponsors' lunches, meetings and training sessions within the club, as well as an additional bar for club members whilst the main bar is in use.

Managed by Andrew Weare, clubhouse manager, the extension was designed by Andrew and plans drawn up by Nigel Wiltshire. Club sponsor GBuild (ex-players Matt & James Gallagher) undertook the works with help from Gerry Byrne who laid the floor at cost and Steve Gale who sprayed fittings in the disabled toilet to comply with regulations.

Ilott V Mitson – The final verdict!

Sarah Burgess of AMD Solicitors discusses the recent Supreme Court decision in the case of llott v Mitson..

Background

The case of llott v Mitson concerned a daughter's claim against her late mother's estate, despite them having been estranged for much of the previous 26

Melita Jackson (the deceased) and her daughter (Heather llott) fell out when Heather, aged 17, left home in the middle of the night to elope with a boy who her mother strongly disapproved of. Melita never really forgave her daughter even though Heather later married and had 5 children with her childhood sweetheart.

Melita Jackson made her last Will and Testament in April 2002 leaving the majority of her £486,000 to several animal charities, expressly excluding her daughter. Melita felt so strongly about excluding her only daughter that she left instructions that her executors must defend any claims against her estate.

Court Judgments

- In the first instance. Mrs llott was successful and awarded £50,000. Mrs llott appealed on quantum and the charities appealed the decision.
- · The High Court upheld the original award of £50,000. It was appealed.
- The Court of Appeal awarded Mrs llott the sum of £143.000 plus an option to draw down a further £20.000 at will. The award was calculated so that Mrs llott could purchase her home from the housing association and so as not to disrupt her right to state benefits. The charities appealed the decision to the Supreme Court.
- On 15 March 2017, the Supreme Court overturned the Court of Appeal decision and re-instated the original judgment from 12 years earlier which awarded Mrs Ilott £50,000.

Supreme Court Judgment

Apart from surviving spouses or civil partners, claimants can only seek reasonable financial provision for their maintenance. The judges' view was that the terminology used in the legislation is flexible, for example 'maintenance' usually means what is sufficient to meet every day expenses but this varies depending on personal circumstances. The court confirmed that maintenance cannot extend to 'any or every thing which it would be desirable for the

claimant to have'

Some of the main points we can take from the judgement are

- · testamentary freedom has been preserved;
- · it has restored charities' status as proper beneficiaries;
- estrangement is a relevant factor (conduct);

The charities' appeal was successful but what does this mean for potential Inheritance Act claimants?

Some of the factors courts consider when hearing Inheritance Act claims include:

- any financial resources or needs (present or future) of the claimant
- any financial resources or needs (present or future) of any other potential claimants
- · any financial resources or needs (present or future) of the beneficiaries
- · the size and nature of the estate

Time limits apply to the bringing of an inheritance claim, and potential claimants should obtain professional legal advice regarding the merits of their claim at the earliest opportunity and be willing to engage in alternative dispute resolution to avoid costly and lengthy litigation proceedings.

Bradley Stoke Carnival - Saturday 26th August







The youth section is thriving with, at the time of writing, 90 different players between the age of five and 17 attending at least one training session since indoor training began back in March, 42 for the first time, with 69 becoming members of the club. This includes an increasing number of girls taking part, which the club are keen to encourage.



The Under 9s (school years 4 and below) play softball Kwik Cricket. They have just attended a festival at Chipping Sodbury CC, winning 3, drawing 1 and losing 1 of the 5 matches played. They have also played Chipping Sodbury at home, winning both matches played.

The Under 11s (school years 5 and 6) play hardball cricket and have started well in the Bristol Youth Cricket League (BYCL). They are undefeated so far after 4 completed 20 overs per side matches, including winning their first round cup game. The club have also entered for the first time a winter Under 12s indoor league which should keep the players' eve in during the off season.

The Under 13s (school years 7 and 8) are competing in both the BYCL and the Gloucestershire Youth Cricket League, the latter being 35 overs per side designed to prepare the players for longer form adult (open age) matches which they can play in from year 8 upwards. Most of this squad are in year 7 so are relatively young compared to their opponents, and have found these games challenging against tough opposition. So far they have lost the three games they have played in this league but have won the BYCL league game they have played. The club view this season very much as a learning curve for this squad, which should stand them in good stead for next year.

The Under 17s (school years 9-12) league matches are played later to allow for exams. They have played just one cup match so far which was abandoned before a result was achieved and will be replayed shortly.

The club are not running an Under 15s (school years 9 and 10) team this season due to low numbers in this age group. Most of these players will be part of the Under 17s squad and also play adult cricket. The club are keen to resume this team next season so would be delighted to hear from all potential players, but particularly from those currently in school years 8 and 9, of all abilities and experience, who are interested in taking up or resuming playing cricket. Lydney Park, and game from nearby shoots. In addition there is free range pork and chickens from Newent. Mutton, local veal and goat are also popular.


The business produces its own range of sausages and BBQ products all the year round, many gluten free. Pies, faggots and black pudding are produced at the sister branch in Newport.




