

Teenager turns Anger into Inspiration by staging "Bike Fest @ The Stokes"

A young teenage boy left devastated after his bike was stolen is turning his grief into something positive for his local community.

Josh Harding, from Bradley Stoke, is putting on a bike safety and awareness event to help others take measures to stop them falling foul to his fate. The 14-year-old is working with several organisations, including the local police and South Gloucestershire Cycle Safety team, to organise Bike Fest @ The Stokes.

Josh's mum Sue said: "We became fixated with trying to find his stolen bike, checking selling sites online and driving around our neighbourhood. It was really getting Josh down, so I said let's do something positive instead and that's when we came up with idea for an awareness event."



After saving for 12 long months, Josh had his bicycle stolen just weeks after he bought it. He had cycled to the Willow Brook Centre to buy his parents a gift for their wedding anniversary and came out to discover his bike was gone.

"He was so gutted that he's refusing to let us get him another bike in case this one gets stolen as well," said Sue. "No one is to blame for the theft of Josh's bike, other than the people who took it. We're thankful for the support we've had from the Willow Brook Centre and other organisations, who are backing our event."

Josh and his family have arranged for police to attend and bring along security stickers to be placed on bikes, which can't be removed. They will also have ultraviolet pens that will mark the bicycle frames, but can be seen under a special light.

South Gloucestershire Council is donating a make your own smoothie using pedal power bike that they usually hire out for events. They've donated it, free of charge, to help raise money on the day.

Sue said: "Vouchers as part of the Sports Pound project will also be handed out - a local initiative from South Gloucestershire Council encouraging people to try out sports and activities for free. The council will be collecting old bikes on the day that staff will collect in, repair and handed back out to those in need within the local community.

"It's been great to see so many organisations getting behind Bike Fest @ The Stokes, we're really grateful for all the support."

Bradley Stoke Radio will also attend to play music and keeps people entertained throughout the day.

Josh and Sue are still working on other events and ideas for Bike Fest @ The Stokes. The event will take place, whatever the weather, as it's planned for outdoors but will be taken inside if the weather isn't favourable.

Meet the New Head at Holy Trinity Primary School

Bradley Stoke Matters was pleased to visit Holy Trinity Primary School for this issue and catch up with new Head Teacher Janet Dickson, to find out more about her and how the first full term in her new role has gone.

Janet has been married for 32 years and has 3 grown up children who are all in their twenties. Teaching is Janet's second career: after the birth of her children Janet started as a lunch time supervisor at a local primary school and then a teaching assistant, deciding thereafter to study for her teaching degree with the Open University and completing her final training at the Bath Spa University.

Prior to taking over the headship at Holy Trinity, Janet was the Head Teacher at Rangeworthy Primary School and before that Acting Head at St Paul's in Yate. She told me that the Christian ethos at Holy Trinity Primary School really

appealed to her and that the school just felt 'right' to her when she visited. The staff and general school community has made her very welcome in her new role and she has really enjoyed getting to know everyone although admitted that the hardest part has been learning all the children's names!

To help with this, at the start of the new school year she spent time with every class using the story of the patchwork quilt to show that however different we each are individually, we are also all connected and can fit together. Each child made a patch about themselves which

then was joined together to create a big picture which is now on the wall in the hallway of the school (photo right).

One of the highlights for Janet has been leading worship with the children every Monday and Friday. This term

they have been learning about the values of Generosity and Compassion and also celebrating the children's achievements during the Well Done Worships throughout the term. Years 5 and 6 have also lead class worship this term as well, with Year 5 performing a drama based on Shakespeare and Year 6 focussing on slavery.

One new initiative this term has been the start of a Parents' Forum and Janet has been pleased to get involved in this. There is a meeting at the start of every short term and parents are encouraged to give their views and raise any issues they wish to talk about or know more about in school. All parents are encouraged to join in with the initiative in 2018.

Fundraising for Children in Need was good fun, with a fashion show, cake sale and the children coming to school dressed in spots. The day raised over £300. The Friends also ran a cake sale raising money for the MacMillan nurses.

There have also been some interesting visitors into school with the local PCSO coming in during anti-bullying week and talking to the children about e-safety. Then the High Sheriff of Bristol visited

Three events organised by Bradley Stoke Rotary this year raised money which went to Papworth Hospital Heart Research and ARC, a supportive charity giving counselling advice for parents facing difficult decisions.

A Barn Dance held at St Marys Rugby Club took place in October that attracted over 100 people. raising nearly £1,000 for the aforementioned charity. This is a popular event headlined by Jig Mad Wolf Ceilidh Band.

The Club was also involved in two collections. one at the Moscow State Circus for the homeless in Bristol and one at Bradlev Stoke Willow Brook Centre, again for the charities listed above.

On 5th November the Club supported the Bradley Stoke Town Council's Firework Night by providing and selling food at the event. This is always popular and also shows how we support the local community. The funds from this event went to the Southmead's Neonatal and Still Birth Unit, as did the funds from our Quiz Night on 1st December, which again is popular amongst many but was a unique Rotary event.

During the same weekend in December we ran a Jewellery Party, the proceeds of which will go towards funding hospitals in Nepal. This is part of the International Aid side of Rotary which also involved one our members going to Goa where he supports and funds a local school.

In 2018 we are planning to help the Youth in the community by helping to run a Public Speaking Night. This will involve students from Bradlev Stoke Community School and other schools in the Olympus Academy Trust. We are keen to support other events such as a Young Citizen Award and other Rotary competitions in the Olympus Academy Trust. We are also going to be involved in the Your Green Future Day at UWE where Rotary Clubs and the local education authority tutor and educate local 15 year old students the concepts and ideas surrounding green aspects of our environment.


The core belief of Lion clubs can be summed up by the following:-

As a boy from the age of six, Benjamin Willcox watched everything that his father. William. did to make the farm at Little Stoke a success. He would have listened to the conversations going on around him, while witnessing what was being done and changed on the farm, as the agricultural depression that followed after Napoleon's defeat at Waterloo, began to take its toll. Too young to understand why these changes were happening, he gradually learned how to respond to the challenges they presented. After recovering from the shock of his father's death in 1819, he continued to learn from his remarkable mother.

Her death on May 3rd 1852 enabled the settlement of William's estate to take place. The beneficiaries had had to wait for 33 years. Its implementation was done in a way that treated equally, everyone named in the will. The value of much of the estate was tied up in the live- and deadstock on the farm. The auction of the stock was held at Little Stoke, over three days between March 14th and 16th 1853. It must have been agreed before his mother died, that Benjamin would take over the lease. It was essential for him to know this before entering into any bidding at the auction. Never-theless, the prospect of bidding for animals that he had reared, and for machinery that he had used, perhaps only the day before, must have seemed odd. He bid. successfully, to the tune of £1,444 6s 9d, about half going to the acquisition of live-stock. Was he using savings, or drawing on a loan arranged with a bank in Bristol? There are no clues as to which path he took, but £1,444 was a large sum of money then. equivalent to about £32,000 now! Of his brothers, Joseph spent just £78 15s and Isaac, only £65 7s 6d.

One thing stands out: Benjamin had developed a clear vision for the future of Little Stoke Farm. As soon as any adjoining land belonging to the Beaufort Estate became available, he set about acquiring the lease. By 1861 the main farm had grown from 313 to 560 acres. Farming, in general was entering a period of prosperity across the land. and Benjamin was making sure that he accrued the benefits of the change. It may, or may not, be

significant, but he did not bid for the bull at the auction - new bloodstock was needed to avoid in-breeding. He did buy the four oxen, so ploughing would remain both traditional and, of importance to Benjamin, economical.

Beniamin's impact on the farm was probably greater than that by any other farmer in its recorded history. The farm that survived until its demise in the 1960s to make way for housing, was the farm he created. The changes that followed him were associated with improvements in technology: the farm staved essentially unaltered. The three small paddocks behind the farm were planted as one large orchard; the number of undercover cow stalls was increased by 40%; new stables and pig sties were added and two ponds were redesigned for wagon maintenance. The front garden was extended into the narrow 'village green', and a new high-walled kitchen garden was laid out. A new large rick-yard area was created. Part of the house was rebuilt. The dairy area was modernised and enlarged. At the top end of the farm, Benjamin planted a wood, of hornbeam, ash and oak, for coppicing. It became known as Savages Wood.

Things did not always run smoothly on the farm. On Lady Day (March 25th) 1858, Benjamin took on a dairymaid, Elizabeth Ann James. The events that followed were reported by The Citizen, in Gloucester. 'On Thursday 1st of April, she came down stairs, went into the vard, and afterwards returned into the kitchen. She was unwell, and her mistress (Hannah. Benjamin's sister and housekeeper) ordered her to go to bed, but instead of doing so started to go to her home in Old Sodbury'. Her home was about 15 miles away. In a state of some distress, she must have set out on foot. One of the farm hands chased after her and brought her back to the farm. It appeared that she might have given birth during the night. A search revealed the body of a baby girl hidden in 'the privy'. Elizabeth admitted that she was taken ill the previous evening, her condition worsening until the baby girl was born, apparently a still birth. A formal inquest was held at Stoke Gifford on April 6th. No external marks indicating mistreatment were found on the

baby. Expert opinion from a doctor claimed the baby was alive at birth, the death being attributed to 'lack of proper care and attention'. The inquest jury returned a verdict of manslaughter. This may have been one of the most harrowing incidents in the long Willcox tenure at Little Stoke. On August 11th Elizabeth James appeared at Gloucester Assizes on the lesser charge of 'concealment of a birth'. The quilty verdict was accompanied by a plea for mercy, with which the judge concurred. She was committed to prison for one month. The story does, however, have a happy ending. Benjamin and Hannah, showed compassion, and continued to employ her, promoting her to housemaid and taking on her sister as dairymaid.

In 1860, on October 3rd, the Bath Chronicle included a report about the Iron Acton. Alveston and Almondsbury Agricultural Society's meeting at Latteridge. The society had only been formed a fortnight earlier 'for the purpose of taking into their consideration the advisability of establishing an association for the encouragement of ploughing in the residents of the surrounding neighbourhood'. It was their first meeting and three ploughing judges were appointed: Mr William Williams from Badminton, Mr Joseph Iles from Tormarton and Mr Benjamin Willcox of Stoke Gifford. In the category of ploughing by boys under the age of 16, second prize went to Joseph Sampson, a 'servant' to John Thomas of Woodhouse Farm. John was, no doubt, a nephew of the earlier John Thomas, who had married Benjamin Willcox's

late sister, Elizabeth. The competition took place in a field of quality chosen for its suitability, near the Plough Inn in the village!

Benjamin was foremost a farmer, fully involved in the local farming community. June 9th 1870 was a particularly hot day, perhaps not the best condition for a sheep shearing contest. However such a match of skills had been laid on by the West Gloucestershire Agricultural Society at Almondsbury. Sheep were supplied by three local farmers, including Benjamin Willcox. Standards, reported in the Western Daily Press, were high, despite the heat. After the competition was over, Mr Chapman was reported to have laid on an 'excellent' dinner at The Swan, in Almondsbury.

Benjamin's sister, Hannah, died on November 1st 1874. She seems to have glided through the saga of the Willcox family on silent wings. Other than the census records, her baptism at Winford and her father's will, it is almost as if she had never existed! In fact she must have worked hard behind the scenes, giving Benjamin the support and space to become a very successful farmer. Suddenly he had need of a house-keeper, a role that was briefly filled by Emma, his brother, Joseph's daughter. The 1881 census shows her at Little Stoke with Benjamin, who was then aged 72. In 1881 Emma married her cousin Sidney Witchell, joining him at Bailey's Court

On Saturday, March 13th 1886 the notice of the farm sale appeared in The Bristol Mercury'. The sale, described as important, was a success, as reported in The Bristol Mercury on Friday March 26th 1896. It commented on the attendance 'by most of the leading agriculturists of the district'. Prices were considered to be 'satisfactory'.

Benjamin Willcox now retired, handed over the farm to Sidney and Emma Witchell. He lived on at Little Stoke Farm, cared for by Emma and Sidney.. He breathed his last on February 11th 1890, aged 82, and was buried in St Michael's churchyard, Stoke Gifford, alongside his sister, Hannah. He died a rich man and left a will. He had outlived all his siblings, most by a wide margin. Probate was granted to Sidney Benjamin Witchell of Little Stoke Farm. His estate, which did not include the farm, was valued at just over £26.000, equivalent to about £2.500.000 now, which was divided equally between seven of Beniamin's surviving nephews and nieces.







Winter Health Messages

Winter is a very busy time for the NHS. There is an increase in respiratory complaints and people suffering falls (with associated injuries), with elderly patients and those with underlying health conditions being most affected.

In addition, winter vomiting bugs and coughs lead to more people seeking medical assistance.

Please help us to provide your care by reading about two common minor illnesses that you can normally manage vourselves and where advice and medication is available from a pharmacy.

Norovirus, sometimes known as the 'winter vomiting bug', is the most common stomach bug in the UK, affecting people of all ages. It is highly contagious and is transmitted by contact with contaminated surfaces, an infected person, or consumption of contaminated food or water.

The symptoms of norovirus are very distinctive - people often report a sudden onset of nausea followed by projectile vomiting and watery diarrhoea. Good hand hygiene is important to stop the spread of the virus.

People are advised to wash their hands thoroughly using soap and water and drying them after using the toilet, before preparing food and eating. Alcohol gels do not kill this virus.

An infection with norovirus is self-limiting and most people will make a full recovery in 1-2 days. It is important to keep hydrated - especially children and the elderly.

The advice from Public Health is that patients with these symptoms do not visit either A&E or GPs as this may spread the virus. Further information and advice is available from NHS 111, including an online symptom checker at nhs.uk

Coughs and Colds. A cold is a mild viral infection of the nose, throat, sinuses and upper airways. It can cause nasal stuffiness, a runny nose, sneezing, a sore throat and a cough. Usually it's a self-limiting infection – this means it gets better by itself without the need for treatment from a GP.

Treatment of a cold. For most people, a cold will get better on its own within a week of the symptoms starting without any specific treatment. However, there are treatments that can help to ease your symptoms and make you feel more comfortable. These are available from your pharmacy, which means that you can treat yourself, rather than needing to see your GP.

There is no cure for colds. Antibiotics, which treat infections caused by bacteria, don't work on cold viruses.

Self-help. There are a number of self-help measures that may help to ease the symptoms of a cold.

- Drinking plenty of fluids to prevent dehydration.
- · Steam inhalations with menthol, salt water nasal sprays or drops may be helpful.
- · Vapour rubs may help relieve symptoms for children.
- · Hot drinks (particularly with lemon), hot soups and spicy foods can help to ease irritation and pain in your throat.
- · Sucking sweets or lozenges which contain menthol or eucalyptus may sooth your throat.
- · Gargling with salt water may help a sore throat.

You should try to make sure you rest and look after yourself if you have a cold, but it is not usually necessary to stay off work or school.

Urban Buzz is underway

It is well known that pollinators are in significant decline. Buglife, the Invertebrate Conservation Trust aims to help combat this with the national Urban Buzz project. Recently launched in Bristol the project will inject colour and wildlife back into the Greater Bristol area, transforming mown and unused urban spaces into vibrant areas, buzzing with life!

The Urban Buzz project is funded by The Biffa Award, Garfield Weston Foundation and supported by players of People's Postcode Lottery.

In South Gloucestershire, with help from the Council and Friends of groups, a number of sites have been completed already, aiding the project on its way to its 100 'buzzing hotspot' target!

Meadows have been sown at Lincombe Barn, Patchway Common East and Blackhorse Pond with local schools and volunteers getting outside and learning about bees and other pollinators. Project Officer Hayley Herridge says "The response from the children and community groups has been fantastic, people want to help pollinators and through Urban Buzz they can. Now we just have to wait till next summer to see our flowers buzzing with life!"

Each 'buzzing hotspot' is assessed and

transformed to increase the forage seasonality and nesting habitats required to support pollinator life cycles. This will help habitat connectivity across Bristol, enhancing the cities green infrastructure and increasing invertebrate populations. Hayley goes on to say "the project addresses the serious declines in pollinators over the last 70 years. Urban spaces can provide a safe haven for our flying friends which pollinate many of the foods we eat."

Can You Help Tackle Social Isolation in Your Community?

People living in care are twice as likely to experience severe loneliness and isolation as those living in the community. The recent research also shows up to 50% of older people living in care never go outside. A local organisation, Growing Support, is using a pioneering approach to tackle this isolation. They run gardening clubs for people living in care to help them connect with the outdoors. The clubs use fun, using engaging activities specially designed to increase opportunities for light exercise, sensory stimulation and social interaction.

Growing Support is currently looking for volunteers to support their trained Horticultural Therapists in running the clubs in care homes. You would be helping more people benefit; there is strong evidence

that gardening as part of a group can help people feel a renewed sense of purpose, reduce agitation and improve sleep and appetite.

In 2017, 28 new volunteers joined the Growing Support team, helping them to deliver over 1,000 hours of support. Volunteer Karen said, "I found that often the sight of the plants or the sensory nature of the activity would spark memories to surface and reminiscences about the gardens the residents had at home. Even participants who had quite advanced dementia and limited verbal communication were clearly getting something from the sessions. I saw one woman who went from being quite distressed at the start of a session to leaving us with a big smile on her face and a calm and relaxed demeanour."

When asked if she would recommend this kind of volunteering, she replied, "I would absolutely recommend volunteering with Growing Support to others, and regularly do! The Growing Support team are a lovely bunch and make it clear that the work we do as volunteers is important and valued."

All volunteers receive an induction, support from a mentor and access to further training. There are regular volunteer meetings and Growing Support covers your travel expenses. Growing Support stressed you don't need to be a gardening expert!



Patchway grandfather Phil Kingston in London Climate Protest

On the 500th anniversary of the Reformation and the second anniversary of the Paris UN Climate Agreement, members of Christian Climate Action arranged a direct action protest on Monday 4th December outside the Department for Business, Energy and Industrial Strategy (BEIS) in London. They held a prayer vigil, performed street theatre and used red spray paint to call for a radical reformation of the economy to protect humankind and abundant life on earth from climate change.



Phil Kingston (81), now living in Patchway, took the role of Martin Luther in the street theatre, and was accompanied by a Birmingham Catholic priest as Pope Francis. They and others visited BEIS to remind our government of its commitments to tackle climate change under the Paris Agreement and the Climate Change Act. After joining in a litany of prayer for the earth and a brief piece of street theatre, Mr. Kingston and the Fr. Newell wrote 'Radical Reformation of the Economy now' and 'Stop Climate Chaos' on the department's plaque. They then continued praying there.

The police were called, but the department decided not to press charges.

Mr. Kingston said "As a Christian and a grandparent, I went to the Department of Business, Energy and Industrial Strategy (BEIS) because of its primary role within the current economy of never-ending economic growth and consumption, an economy which is doing enormous damage to the Earth. This damage includes the breakdown of the systems which govern climate stability; the depletion and extinction of other-than-human species; and many kinds of pollution of air, land and oceans. All of this is already causing suffering and unnecessary deaths, particularly amongst the poorest peoples. It will, if not reversed, radically affect the well-being of our descendants."

What's Going On at Winterbourne Medieval Barn

Winterbourne Medieval Barn, Church Lane, BS36 1SE

Local people have been working for 20 years to save the wonderful medieval barn, which was on the verge of dereliction, and bring it into community use. In May 2016 'development funding' of £165,000 was awarded by the Heritage Lottery Fund (HLF) to help Winterbourne Medieval Barn Trust and South Gloucestershire Council progress plans for the long-term future of the barn and associated buildings. These plans were submitted to the HLF in November 2017 as Part 2 of the grant application totalling £1.045m, and the HLF decision is expected in March 2018. Meanwhile the Trust also has to raise an additional £400,000 of match-funding.



On the assumption that the HLF approves the proposals, refurbishment work will commence at the Barn early in 2019 and it is anticipated that the site will reopen fully in 2020. The planning application and listed building application have been submitted to South Glos Council, and progress should be shown on the SGC Planning website.

As a separate project, work started in October

to restore the cart shed as a Reception and Education Facility, and it is hoped that this will be in use from early 2018. The Trust is planning another varied programme of community events for 2018, and full details will be on the website shortly. Popular events that will return this year include a Jazz evening in May, Medieval Fayre in June, summer music and drama, and Orchard Harvest Day in October. The first event of 2018 is another Apple-Grafting workshop on Saturday 3 March, and bookings are now being taken.

Winterbourne Medieval Barn Trust is always delighted to welcome new volunteers, whether to help with maintenance and repairs, with the productive garden, with planning and administrative tasks, or to help out at events. Volunteering provides an opportunity to meet new people as well as helping the Trust and the wider Community, and maybe learning new skills. You can give as much or as little time as you wish. Volunteers have the opportunity to help to shape the future of this
