Rainbows Appeal For Help to Open Community Toy Library

2nd Stoke Gifford Rainbows are looking for engineers, carpenters, glaziers and cast iron welders to help them renovate a disused phone box in Stoke Gifford. Once the box is repaired, the girls plan to fill it with good quality second hand toys and books for children in the local community to borrow.

In December 2017 the Rainbows visited the North Bristol Foodbank and learned that not all children were as fortunate as themselves. During a Rainbow chat, the girls decided they wanted to do something more long term, and thought of collecting toys and books.

There is a disused red telephone box near the Rainbows' meeting place, and one of the leaders discovered they could be adopted and put to use by communities. After discussion with the Parish Council, a local engineer provided a free survey of the box, recommending repairs which would allow the box to be a safe, water tight library.

If the Rainbow group can find the right people to help, their plan is to renovate the box, and then decorate it with monthly themes - creating a talking point in the village that not only spreads the word about Girlquiding, but also provides a useful service for families in the area.

Ruth, aged 6, said: "Visiting the foodbank made me think about other children. I want to help them and everyone should have toys to play with"

Michelle, Assistant Leader, said: "We work hard with the girls to encourage them to think about their community. This is a perfect way for them to do something visible and positive in their area, and something to be proud of for years to come. We really hope people will be able to come forward and help us make the girls' ideas a reality".

Great Pilgrimage 90

This year, 2018, marks the Centenary of the end of World War One. The Royal British Legion, as the National Custodian of Remembrance. is planning a special event this year: the Great Pilgrimage 90, (GP 90).



People from every community in the country and from many other nations served in the First World War. On 8th August 1928, a decade after World War One, veterans and widows attended the Great Pilgrimage, visiting the battlefields of Ypres and the Somme and then marched to the Menin Gate.

This August, ninety years later, Legion Members will recreate the 1928 Great Pilgrimage. The public are welcome to attend to watch the Parade to the Menin Gate. After the service the Great Square will host an afternoon of exhibitions and musical performances.



The Stoke Gifford Branch of the Royal British Legion, which covers Stoke Gifford, Little Stoke, Filton, Stoke Lodge and Bradley Stoke, will be attending the Great Pilgrimage 90. Four local Councillors, Brian Allinson, Ernie Brown, Trevor Jones and Keith Cranney, have presented the Stoke Gifford Branch of the Royal British Legion with a grant from Member Awarded Funding, (MAF), to enable the local Legion Branch to attend GP 90 (photo above). The Branch is very grateful to the local Councillors for this grant, which will enable the local community to be represented at this important memorial event.



Ride of Honour 8th May 2018

Little Stoke Gifford Matters was pleased to hear from local resident Alan Powell who is part of a 5-man team (plus crew with 4 living in Little Stoke) looking to cycle from Bristol to Paris this May to raise money and awareness for the Cystic Fibrosis

"We have been a group of 5 friends for a number of years now and although we have always known that Lee has Cystic Fibrosis we have never really known what that has meant." Alan told us. "Then, in May 2017 Lee's younger brother Michael died from Cystic Fibrosis and this really hit us and we wanted to get a better understanding of the disease and what Lee has/is going though.

"This prompted us to come up with something where we can raise awareness and money for the Cystic Fibrosis Trust (who have been a great support for Lee and his family throughout his life), gain some great memories as friends, and also do something in the memory of Michael. As Mike was a keen mountain biker we thought we would do a cycling challenge. which is where we came up with the Bristol to Paris challenge."

Alan Powell, Lee Honour, Rob Haddow, Dan Lunny and George Douglas will set off on their challenge on 8th May, cycling first to Salisbury and then on to Portsmouth with a Ferry crossing to Caen then onto Evreux before reaching their destination of Paris on 11th May. The guys wanted 100% of the money raised to go to the charity and are therefore funding the excursion themselves with the exception of any donations of help eg Brittany Ferries have given the team a 50% discount for the crossing to France. This means that the team is continually looking for ways in which they can get things for free or cheaper to help bring these costs down.

Can you help? The team are still looking for someone to be their Main Event Sponsor to ease the pressures of the costs of the excursion. They very much hope that there will be a generous company out there who will match their personal contribution of £500 which will go into the costs of travel and accommodation for the support crew who are donating their time to be with the team every pedal of the way in case there is an accident or repairs are needed.

As well as supporting the Mayor's Charities, Sole Sisters Running Club will be donating £1 per Bradley Stoke 10k entry to raise funds for the Brain Injury Rehabilitation Unit in Frenchay. Bristol.

In September 2017 one of our dearest club members Dr Bex Mitchell and her family were involved in a horrific car accident which her partner did not survive. Her two children had extensive internal injuries; thankfully they are now fully recovered and being cared for by close family.

Bex herself has a traumatic brain injury.



Since November, Dr Bex has been treated at the BIRU in Frenchay, the unit specialises in the treatment of patients, from 16 years and upwards, who have severe physical and/or cognitive problems resulting from a brain injury. The Centre is led by a consultant neuropsychiatrist who is supported by two consultants in rehabilitation medicine and another consultant neuropsychiatrist. They work with a team of psychologists, speech and language therapists, occupational therapists, physiotherapists, nurses and support workers with decades of experience in neuro-rehabilitation.

It is impossible for us to know what the future holds for Bex, but we can only remain positive and have faith in the expert care she is receiving at such an outstanding specialist Centre and we hope that our fund raising will help to ensure that BIRU continues to be sustainable for the foreseeable future.

We would like to apologise in advance if your journey is delayed slightly due to the race. We try and keep disruption to a minimum and hope you enjoy the Festival and the BS10K.

Jim Durlacher **FAREWELL TO A BOWLS LEGEND**

Jim was a founder member of Northavon Bowls Club in 1991, where my wife and I first met him and his wife Margaret. We have been very good friends ever since, enjoying card evenings and holidays together.

In 2010, some two years after the demise of Northavon Bowls Club, Jim, with the help of Ben Walker then Mayor of Bradley Stoke, made possible the formation of Bradley Stoke Bowls Club, which was opened on the 1st May 2010, by the great David Bryant, three times World Champion.

During the eight years the Club has been going, Jim was very active in its various operations, being Chairman and Captain for the first two years, and then becoming President up to 2013. He was awarded Life Membership for all his hard work, and was recognised by South Gloucestershire Council by the Chair's Community Award in 2013.





Forest School Fun

Forest School has been a regular part of the Holy Family curriculum since 2011. when Executive Head teacher, Mrs Summer-Breeze and Head of School Mrs Carter first qualified as Forest



School Leaders. Since then many other members of staff have undertaken training and Forest School has been available for every child as part of our PSHE and Outdoor Education lessons. The children take part in outdoor learning no matter the weather. With fleeces, wellies and waterproofs, they relish the chance to learn and work alongside their friends in the fresh air.

Forest School sessions cover many different aspects of the curriculum. Children will play games that develop their speaking and listening skills and help them collaborate effectively with others. Favourites include the Forest School 'Name Game' and '1, 2, 3, Where are vou?'.

Other lessons will develop the children's general knowledge of nature and wild-life. We are very lucky to have a purpose built bird-watching tower. where children can gather to listen and identify a range of bird-song. Children also participate in tree identification sessions and by doing this throughout the year, they learn how to spot different trees by their buds, fruits, flowers and leaves. Fallen leaves and fruits are used to create all manner of perfumes and art projects in creative forest art sessions.

A firm Forest School favourite is always the campfire session. The children must first search the grounds to gather and dry enough wood to keep their camp-fire burning. Forest School Leaders will build the camp-fire, teaching the children some science along the way. This is a great opportunity to teach the children about fire safety, whilst they enjoy toasting



marshmallows (on a toasting stick they have whittled themselves) and a campfire sing-song. It's easy to see why Forest School is a long-standing favourite at Holy Family.

Wonderful Wellbeing

We ended January with a very reflective week as our SENDCo Mrs Burn organised a special Wellbeing and Mental Health awareness week for children across the age ranges. Some of our learning highlights last term

Reception: Last term our Reception children have been learning about 'People Who Help Us'. This has included visitors to talk about their jobs and a visit from the police. The children have been acting out different jobs in their role play areas; painting pictures, making models and many are now starting to write about their experiences.

Year 1's recent topic has been 'Toy Story'. They having been finding out about old and new toys; writing about their favourite toys; and bringing them in to talk about and share.

St Chad's Primary School RE Week 2018:

Making Peace

St Chad's CE VC Primary School has been running an RE week for a number of years now.

As a Church school, RE plays a significant role in St Chad's school and underpins a lot of the work ethos and work that is done there. An RE week gives a chance for pupils to explore in depth 'big guestions' that often many religions have looked to answer and also those 'big questions' that play a significant part in human lives.

This year's main theme was 'Making Peace'. This was chosen to give children the chance to reflect on what peace is defined as both internally and within society and the world, how peace is referred to in different religions and to consider how peace might be achieved.

Some of the big questions that the pupils approached in an age appropriate way during the week included:

- What is peace?
- Is world peace possible?
- · What is 'inner peace'?
- Does God help people to find peace?
- Why isn't there peace in the world?
- How do I spread peace?
- Is peace possible without war / anger?
- Do people need religion for peace?
- How can I achieve personal peace?
- · How can I create peace?

In addition to looking at the theme in general, each year group had their own specific subtheme.

EYFS looked at the story of Noah and why the dove and rainbow are symbols of peace. As

an end result to this they worked with Year One to create a peace cloud, as you can see in the images top right.

Year One looked at how Jesus promoted peace. They looked at stories from Jesus' life to explore peace and learnt why Christians say "Peace be With You" to each other in church and shake hands when they do so.

Year Two explored Tu BiShvat (the Jewish Festival of Trees) which coincided with RE week. The festival focuses on tree planting and they linked ecological ideas of peace in the Earth, as well as caring for creation – by planting a Peace Tree which they decorated with wishes and prayers for peace (above centre).

Year 3 and 4 looked at peace through the eyes of Hinduism. Year 3 discovered the work of Salma Arastu and used this to frame their artistic reflections on peace specifically focusing on symbols of peace and their meanings. Year 4 looked at some of the works of Gandhi. They discussed the concept of inner peace and reflected on what this meant to them and how this could be achieved.

Year 5 learned about Islamic teachings on Peace and how this is encouraged in the Muslim faith.



This culminated in pieces of art using Islamic scripture as a basis (above left) as well as creating a rainbow of peace (below left).

Year 6 took the idea of standing up for peace and justice and explored famous peacemakers throughout recent times. They focused on Dr John Sentamu's vigil and its meanings with art work that culminated with a multi class strong photograph showing the world's flags grouped together in peace.

All of the pupils had a chance to explore the work undertaken in each class through a tour of the mini galleries that were created in each

room. The ideas were then taken back to class. and discussed further.

RE Week is a great opportunity to enhance St Chad's pupils' big question learning and spiritual development and the pupils always rise to the occasion.

All of this work had fed into the work the pupils are now doing during National Mental Health Week to look at how to respect vourself and to identify the qualities that make you unique.

WHAT IS THE GDPR?

The General Data Protection Regulation (GDPR) will come into force on 25 May 2018 and will build upon the Data Protection Act 1998 (DPA 1998). It is important for UK businesses to plan for the GDPR and begin implementing the necessary changes to business practices and procedures as early as possible to ensure compliance once the GDPR becomes effective.

WHAT WILL GDPR MEAN TO MY BUSINESS?

The GDPR will apply to most businesses. If you obtain and hold personal information relating to any living individual, including your existing and prospective customers and employees, then the GDPR will apply to your business. The GDPR imposes direct obligations on data processors as well as data controllers so it will apply whether your business processes personal data or controls how the data is processed.

DOES MY BUSINESS HOLD INFORMATION THAT IS CLASSIFIED AS 'PERSONAL DATA'?

The definition of 'personal data' is wider than before and includes any information which either directly identifies an individual or which can be used to identify an individual. Such information includes names, dates of birth and addresses including online identifiers such as IP addresses.

Most businesses hold at least some personal data, whether it relates to their clients, employees or their contacts. It is imperative that businesses carry out an assessment of what information they hold and what changes, if any, should be made to ensure compliance with the GDPR.

WHAT OBLIGATIONS DOES THE GDPR IMPOSE ON ME AS A BUSINESS OWNER?

The GDPR requires data controllers to include specified data protection obligations in processing contracts. It also requires businesses to be able to demonstrate compliance with the GDPR, for example by having relevant data protection policies and procedures in place:

 A company-wide data protection policy paired with staff training, data audits and regular HR policy reviews;



- A compliance programme and privacy governance structure; and
- An updated electronic system that protects data by default by e.g. encrypting data.

WHAT IF MY BUSINESS BREACHES THE GDPR?

The ICO has the power to award compensation to individuals and impose fines up to the equivalent of €20m or 4% of the worldwide turnover of the business who has breached the GDPR, although the ICO has indicated that its first resort will normally be one of the other sanctions available to it, such as warnings, reprimands and corrective orders. A business that fails to comply with the GDPR also puts itself at risk of reputational and professional damage and it is important to take the necessary steps to ensure compliance.

Local Government Boundary Review (New electoral arrangements for South Gloucestershire)

In January 2018 the Local Government Boundary Commission for England (LGBCE) published their final recommendations in respect of the South Gloucestershire District Boundary Review.

The LGBCE will now lay a draft order before Parliament and South Gloucestershire Council will also prepare for implementing the changes (subject to their approval). Stoke Gifford is one of the areas directly impacted by the review and it is anticipated that representatives from SGC will be meeting Stoke Gifford Parish Council to discuss the implementation process and provide an opportunity to ask questions.

The proposed electorate from May 2019 will be over 15,000 and is one of the largest electorates in South Gloucestershire and includes the proposed named Stoke Park and Cheswick Ward.



Hatchet Road Bus Lane Scrapped by South Gloucestershire Council

Stoke Gifford residents were able to give a big sigh of relief recently after South Gloucestershire Council listened to public concern voiced in a huge campaign, against the proposal to remove the Hedgerow separating Meade Park from Hatchet Road and replacing it with a MetroBus bus lane.

The campaign to preserve Hatchet Road hedgerows had been led by local resident Paul Tanner, and the three local Conservative Councillors Brian Allinson, Ernie Brown and Keith Cranny.

Is Core Strength Enough?

Physiotherapist Ali Staveley at Bradley Stoke Physio & Health investigates

We've all heard of improving the strength of your core and thereby improving your performance. Well, strength of those muscles in your torso (front, back, and sides) is just one aspect of core control.

If you watch the Olympic athletes, their technique is enhanced by their core control. This involves strength, efficiency and co-ordination, all leading to a fluidity of movement.

The Olympians are world class at making things look effortless.

Many of us can struggle with achieving this great technique. We might be hampered by the traditional view that core stability is about 'pulling something in' to prevent unwanted movement. This can mean our bodies hold tension, making movement and recovery difficult.

Core control is really about enabling movement. Improving your core strength should see you gain spontaneous natural movement. My holistic approach can also help take pressure off muscles, ligaments, tendons or joints that are overworked or overused, which makes movement easy.

We also need more than core strength to function well. Imagine the split seconds before you fall. Your arms flail and every muscle in your body reacts as you try to return your balance. Everyday, strength in muscles throughout your whole body is needed to keep you upright and mobile, give you your agile reactions, and for controlled movements.

A key to achieving your strength and movement goals is to make sure you don't set them too high at first. Check your range of movement, strength, timing and balance. Challenging yourself is great, but your body will need time to adjust and learn, to allow motor memory to kick in.

So back to our original question – is core strength enough? We certainly need some strength there, but it cannot and should not be separated from the rest of the body. Core strength does not work independently and improving it should be incorporated into a more complex series of movements that, over time, train you to be more fluent.

The good news is that although we may never be Olympians, we can all improve our performance and make our movements more efficient even if it's for a Sunday morning walk, or simply unloading the dishwasher.






