



# 100th Anniversary of the **Royal Air Force**

Formed on the 1st of April 1918 with the amalgamation of the Royal Naval Air Service and the Royal Flying Corps, The Royal Air Force is 100 years old. 2018 is also the 75th anniversary of the famous Dambuster raid and there are a number of events taking place across the country to mark both of these milestones.

The centenary itself will be marked by special events, activities and other initiatives at local, regional and national levels running from April to the end of November 2018. The centrepiece of RAF100 will take place on 10 July, with a centenary service in Westminster Abbey, followed by a parade in The Mall and spectacular flypast over Buckingham Palace.

One of the many events is the Centenary Baton Relay which sees a specially designed baton visit 100 sites associated with the RAF in 100 days. The relay began its journey at the Royal Courts of Justice on 1 April 2018 and will end 100 days later on 10 July on Horseguards Parade.

On Sunday April 22nd, Bradley Stoke & Little Stoke Gifford Matters was privileged to be invited to witness the arrival of the RAF 100 baton and RAFA token to Filton, received by Air Marshall Sir Ian Macfadyen, senior RAF Officer.

There was a fantastic parade and march past by the RAF Air Cadets in honour of the occasion. and special quest, 96 year old Johnny Johnson MBE, DFM; the last surviving member of the original Dambuster Squadron was given a heroes welcome.

The RAF 100 baton is travelling between 100 locations significant to the RAF around the world. over 100 days; it displays the RAF roundel, RAF crest and the RAF 100 logo, while the RAFA token depicts Major General Trenchard, and is travelling from branch to branch throughout the South West area to highlight the Association's work in support of the RAF family.

A more fitting venue, could not have been chosen for this centenary event, home of the last Concorde ever to fly, Aerospace Bristol Museum in Filton tells the story of more than a century of remarkable aerospace history.





# What a come back! 2018 English Champion and Bronze in Russia for Lele

On Saturday 12th of May, GB judo squad player Lele Nairne, a Bradley Stoke Judo Club member, won the bronze medal in Orenburg, Russia. This was her first senior international competition.

What makes her win so special is that there is a huge and very touching story behind this initial senior sporting victory. Lele's story has been fraught with injuries and difficulties that would have seem most people give up years before. ...NOT Lele!

Her father identified Peter Douglas, the Bradley Stoke Judo Club coach and his team as the ideal partnership for Lele some seven years ago. Shortly after joining BSJC, and under Pete's diligent tutoring, Lele's judo career took off. The British judo squad began selecting Lele to fight abroad, and she started winning medals for the UK becoming a full timer in the GB squad. She threw big and regularly, until one day while training, she threw to the accompanying sound of tearing sinew. Lele had ripped the hamstring muscle off her left leg. This was a huge set-back and required a surgical operation and many painful and boring months of rehabilitation to become mat fit again.

Eight-months later she started competing once more. Then, while fighting in an International held in Glasgow she heard that terrible sound a second time. On this occasion it was in her upper arm which at first, she thought she had broken. Unfortunately, she had ripped the rotator-cup in her shoulder which required another painful operation and a further 8 months of daily grind rehab.

Lele's biggest strength is her attitude, and she was fighting in contest again just as soon as the British judo coaches allowed. ...and once again for a short period, started to win and display her true potential. No sooner had Lele started to get back into her judo stride than

she detached the hamstring of her right leg.

Bad luck would be an understatement for this young athlete, who has endured 3 BIG operations inside a 3-year period. In fact, and due to her injuries, Lele has missed virtually the whole of her junior judo career completely. To keep going forward she obviously possesses an amazing attitude and a castiron mentality to keep getting back up when life has knocked her down so regularly. However, when you believe you can, there is a good chance that you will, and Lele was about to prove it!

She knew this was her last opportunity to make it happen. Now 20 and senior, she really prepared for her first senior competition on the 5th of May. This just happened to be the English open where she took on all comers to win the gold medal and become the 2018 English champion.

Considering the short time that she has been fighting in-between her unbelievable bad run of injuries, Lele has still managed to be selected for 2 European championships; Won 7 Euro cup medals, 1 gold, 3 silvers, 3 bronzes, and taken three 5th places. *So, what's next for Lele?* Big things we hope, and we will certainly be rooting for her!



Year 5 student, Eduardo, was excited by the whole experience, "She was such an expert - the whole workshop was so interesting."

The children re-enacted the trip by boat and train, before learning how to bandage patients. They enjoyed listening to stories from the lady with the lamp. Amongst many other lovely items on in the school grounds, the wooden pagoda which stands facing the entrance to St Chad's gets a lot of attention. The school has been looking at ways to create a mud free path around the outside of the hexagonal shaped building because, as well as being a place that pupils enjoy sitting in the shade, chatting with friends and just relaxing, it is also a very popular 'tag base' which means that you will often see pupils chasing each other around its sides. The outcome of this has been of course that the grass wears away quickly and although the school wants the pupils to have fun, this is not so much fun in the rainy wintertime.


The Friends of the school proposed creating a stone walkway around the school's pagoda and this idea evolved into creating a memory path.

Mr D Lippiatt, a parent of two children in St Chad's school and the owner of D J Lippiatt carpenters and builders, too home the nearly 300 stones and varnished each one by hand.

After digging out and laying the groundwork, the pupils were treated, a class at a time, to coming and setting their stone into the wet concrete and, as you can see from the above photograph, they all had a great time!

The path is now set and waiting to cure and, after one last varnish, there will be a small piece of everyone currently in St Chad's primary school for many years to come.

At St Michael's School we place a high value on fitness and sporting enjoyment. We aim to give all children high quality PE, dance and gymnastics opportunities within the school curriculum, as well as providing many additional sporting clubs. We have a number of school teams who regularly take part in competitive games: to find out more, please read on!

### **Sports Premium**

All Primary schools receive additional funding to develop sport and fitness. This has doubled in the coming year, making this worth, for St Michaels', a little over £20,000. Full details of how we spent the sports premium last year, and our plans for the forthcoming year, can be found on the school website (www.stmichaelssg.co.uk). In brief, we spend the money in three main ways:

- Provision of additional sports coaches to provide expertise in areas of sport where our own staff are less secure. Last year this has been in tag rugby and gymnastics. Our staff attend these sessions, meaning their own skills are developed
- Development of facilities to provide our pupils with a greater range of opportunity to play sport. Last year this funded the installation of moveable sports fencing to allow children to play football on the playground every day.
- Extra staff release time to take children to competitions, and for staff training. One of the aims behind the Sports premium scheme is to make sport sustainable for the future.

### **Partnership with Bristol Sport**

We work in close partnership with Bristol Sport, who provide regular coaching (11/2 days per week) in tag rugby and gymnastics. This ensures our children have top quality coaching throughout the year. Next year we will focus on netball and

gymnastics. We also send children to an annual sports festival at Ashton Gate stadium (the home of Bristol City), and have also had extra training in basketball through the Bristol Flyers.

### **Sporting Clubs**

As well as sport in the curriculum, we also provide many opportunities for children to engage in sport at lunchtime and after school. These clubs give children the opportunity to extend their skills, take part in tournaments and competitions, and have fun with a sport they enjoy. Over half the school – around 350 children - take part each week in our sporting clubs

We offer a (mixed) football club for every year group from Y1 to Y6, run by our longterm partner Steve Porter. There is also a girls-only football club for children in Y4-6 run by the teachers. Children from Y3-Y6 have opportunities to play in matches and competitions in the local area, whilst our main school teams (boys and girls) play in both league and cup matches. This year our girls' team reached the cup semi-final, whilst our boys' team won the schools cup for the second year running, and hope to win the league again as well.



### Netball and basketball

Children in Y4-6 are able to play on the basketball court every lunchtime, whilst our netball club (also Y4-6) meets every week and plays regular matches and competitions against other schools. Whilst mainly girls, boys are also very welcome!

### **Gymnastics**

We have worked with Vicky Armstrong for many years providing three gym clubs after school. This gives children from Y1 upwards the chance to develop their skills, earn badges - and many then go on to become members of one of the various local clubs in the area. Our gym clubs are really popular: next to football it is without doubt one of our favourite sports here.

### **Swimming**



All children in Year 4 go swimming, with the aim that, by the end of Y6, all children can swim 25m and do some basic lifesaving skills. We also take part in a local swimming gala three times per year, winning the trophy last year!

### Tag Rugby

This has been one of the newer sports on offer, and over the past couple of years we have got better and better. Our Y5/6 team won their local tournament this year, and came fifth in the regional finals.



Over the summer months many children choose to play cricket on the field at lunchtime, and there is a weekly cricket club for KS2 children. We take part in various competitions, and always perform well. A number of children are members of local cricket clubs, and we have enjoyed having coaches work with us over the years from several of these clubs.

### **NFL** (American Football)

Brand-new this year! We had a 10-week coaching programme in American football, leading to a tournament at the local WISE campus. The children thoroughly enjoyed learning a new game, and we did extremely well at the tournament, just missing out on getting to the final. We hope this will continue next year.

### **Summary**

As you can tell, sport has a really high profile at St Michael's, and we enjoy a lot of success. Most importantly, however, we want to provide opportunities for ALL children to enjoy sport and try something new. For those who aren't so interested in some of the above sports we also offer: dance club; Bollywood dance club; table tennis; running club; and athletics (leading up to our sports days in the summer).

### Parish Council Annual Meetings

The Annual Meeting of the Parish Council took place on Tuesday, 8th May 2018. Cllr Ernie Brown was re-elected as Chair, with Cllr Keith Cranney re-elected as Vice Chair. Presentations were given by the Parish Council and the Creative Youth Network during the Annual Public Meeting which took place on the same evening.

### **Local Green Spaces Designation**

The Council have submitted a response to the South Gloucestershire Council Local Plan regarding the designation of Local Green Spaces. Both Meade Park and Forty Acres/Royal Park will now be reconsidered for designation following the withdrawal of the proposed MetroBus Extension along Hatchet Road.

### Section 106 Funding

The Parish Council have been successful with further Section 106 funding towards Sports Maintenance Machinery amounting to £10,187. The purchase of new equipment will be progressed during the Summer and will provide the Council with new machinery to assist with key maintenance tasks across the parks and open spaces.

### Little Stoke Park

The Little Stoke Community Hall building works remain ongoing and will create new changing rooms, a new café/social space, new meeting and office facilities. New fitness equipment has also been purchased and will be positioned near to the building once works are nearing completion.

### Community Infrastructure Levy (CIL)

The Parish Council have been allocated £39,845.61 from the Community Infrastructure Levy from 2017/18. This funding is 15% of the £265,637.40 collected from within the Parish area during the last financial year. CIL funds can be spent on the provision, improvement, replacement, operation or maintenance of infrastructure; or anything else that is concerned with addressing the demands that development place on it.



### **News from Bailey's Court Primary School**

### 'Adopt-a-School' Engineering Project at **Bailey's Court Primary School**

At the beginning of 2018 we met with a group of engineers representing ISG Construction who were keen to 'adopt' Bailey's Court as a partner school to work with us over the next couple of years. The purpose of the partnership is to provide our children with an insight into the world of work and help them understand the value what they are all learning at school.

Our first visit took place on Wednesday 9th May with our Y6 children being challenged to build a giant tetrahedron (nearly 5 metres high) using 50 cm lengths of dowel. The children worked in small groups to build individual tetrahedrons and then each tetrahedron unit was combined to build the giant tetrahedron (see photos right). The children were using their knowledge and understanding in maths to help with this challenge and they were certainly developing their team-building, negotiating, compromising and questioning skills too!

This was the first of a number of projects we will be running with ISG Construction over the next two years.

### **Pitfalls of Probate**

In the first of a series of articles AMD solicitors discuss the pitfalls of DIY probate. In this instalment Sarah Burgess, a Solicitor dealing with contentious and non-contentious probate, highlights some of the issues she has come across.

There have been many occasions when an executor of a Will has come to our firm for advice after beginning to administer an estate but things haven't gone according to plan. Our job is to help the executors progress the estate efficiently whilst keeping the beneficiaries well-informed so that the executors themselves do not become personally liable for causing loss to the estate.

The legal costs involved in resolving a dispute or rectifying any errors will often far outweigh the initial costs of seeking professional legal advice regarding the estate administration.

If you find yourself named as an executor in a Will, you should be aware of the most common pitfalls to avoid:

### 1. Incorrectly interpreting the Will

The laws regarding interpreting Wills are hundreds of years old and don't always follow a common sense approach. For example; if the deceased made a homemade Will which was signed and witnessed correctly, then a couple of years later decided to change his beneficiaries and amended the Will by hand (but without getting the changes witnessed), the subsequent amendments will fail. An executor cannot say "well the new beneficiaries were clearly who the deceased intended to benefit and so that is who I will pay" without breaching his duties as executor and becoming personally liable to the original beneficiaries.

### 2. Failing to conduct a thorough search for assets and liabilities

When you are an executor you have a duty to carry out thorough searches of the deceased's property and paperwork to establish what the assets of the estate are and to obtain probate valuations for all of the assets and liabilities. You should always try to obtain professional



valuations of property and shares. When you submit the inheritance tax forms to HM Revenue and Customs you will be signing a statement of truth to confirm that the information is correct.

It is not uncommon for lay executors to miss assets completely and recently I had to try and recover an asset which should have been administered 40 years ago! As time passes it can become more difficult (and therefore more expensive) to collect in assets, for example, if the original executor has since died. If an asset has decreased in value (e.g. shares) then an executor can become personally liable for the reduction in its value.

Glenside Hospital perceptive Museum's documentary drawings by Denis Reed (ARCA. RWA), artist and patient at Bristol Mental Hospital, speak volumes of what life was like in this psychiatric hospital in the 1950s, shortly after the NHS had taken over the management. Each of his beautiful A4 line drawings of patients - sleeping, shaving, bathing, walking, talking - retain a startling power. The Victorians had placed a value on occupation as a treatment and previously patients, wherever possible, would have been given a job to do within the hospital community. This was not considered appropriate for the new establishment and this lack of occupation is illustrated by Reed's drawings.

On display will be a selection of photographs and artefacts to give further insight into the hospital at that time. To accompany the free exhibition there will be a series of one hour, £5 per person, experimental drawing workshops, no experience necessary and open to all.

Supported by Esmée Fairbairn Collections Fund, Bristol City Council Imagination Fund and the Association of Independent Museums Pilarims Trust Fund, the exhibition is designed to broaden the public's understanding of mental health and inspire the creative process.



### **Exciting times ahead for Winterbourne's Medieval Barn**



A project to help secure the future of Winterbourne's Medieval Barn has taken a major step forward thanks to a £936,600 grant from the Heritage Lottery Fund (HLF), made possible by money raised by National Lottery players.

This funding will have a hugely positive impact on the £1.76 million project that will conserve and refurbish the historic barn and its adjacent buildings. The Winterbourne Medieval Bard Trust (WMBT) now has to make a final push for fundraising to make the £400,000 which has to be raised as part of the HLF bid. The committee are hugely thankful to all the pledges they have received to date. They are now looking for about £50.000 so that work can ago ahead on this major community project. Any local businesses, individuals or organisations who can help WMBT reach the funding target are encouraged to email the Chairman of the Trust. Sue Parsons (sue.parsons6@btinternet.com), or contact WMBT through the Barn website.

Once the total is reached, the funding will be used to restore, refurbish and find new uses for the 14th Century Court Farm Barn and associated outbuildings, ensuring its long-term sustainability in the heart of the local community. A heritage education centre will also be created to demonstrate the history of the barn and its architecture as well as information about the local area. Overall, the complex would provide flexible spaces for a variety of community, educational and commercial uses.

The restoration and refurbishment will enable the Trust to offer many more events and activities throughout the year, including heritage and craftthemed events, craft workshops, guided tours, more musical and theatrical performances, and a brand new schools' programme. There will be new rentable workshops for creating traditional crafts and more space will be available for public and commercial hire, income from which will enable the Barn to operate on a sustainable basis.

Cllr Heather Goddard. Cabinet Member responsible for Communities and Tourism, said: "This funding will help secure the future of one of our area's most important sites by creating a multi-purpose rural heritage venue which will interpret and celebrate the history and heritage of this extraordinary building and its environment

"We are very grateful to the National Lottery for their generous support towards making this possible. We would also like to thank the many other organisations and individuals who have contributed to the project's fundraising cause, and to the volunteers of Winterbourne Medieval Barn Trust. who have worked tirelessly over many years to save the barn for the community."

Sue Parsons Chair of WMBT said: "Winterbourne Medieval Barn Trust is delighted with the funding provided by the National Lottery which will enable us to realise the full potential of this iconic building and enable it to become a true community asset."

Nerys Watts, Head of HLF South West, said: We're delighted to support this project which is an excellent example of how our historic buildings can be used in new and sustainable ways for the benefit of people, local organisations and communities. Thanks to money raised by National Lottery players, Winterbourne Medieval Barn is on its way to an exciting future with its heritage and community at its heart."

When all of the required funding has been raised, building work is planned to start early in 2019, with the redeveloped site expected to open the following vear. Activities and events will be run both at the Barn and in the community whilst the building work is taking place, to enable visitors to continue to learn about the history of the barn and its surrounding environment as well as stay in touch with the project's progress.


