#### Local Members of The Royal British Legion Represent Stoke Gifford at WW1 Comemmorations In Belgium

Karen Falconer and John Moloney will travel to Europe for the Royal British Legion's Great Pilgrimage 90 - 5-9th August 2018

2018 marks the Centenary of the end of World War One. The Royal British Legion, as the National Custodian of Remembrance, has co-ordinated a very special event this summer - the Great Pilgrimage 90, (GP 90) involving people from every community in the country and from many other nations who served in the First World War.

GP90 takes place between the 5th and 9th of August and will be one of the largest in the charity's history. It marks 90 years since the original RBL pilgrimage in 1928, which saw 11,000 World War one veterans and war widows visit the battlefields of the somme in France and Ypres in Belgium, a decade after the conflict ended. That pilgrimage culminated in a March through Ypres to the Commonwealth War Grave Commission's Menin Gate Memorial for a ceremony to commemorate the launch of the hundred days offensive and in remembrance of those who never returned.

Local legion members, Karen Falconer and John Moloney will represent the Stoke Gifford branch (which covers Bradley Stoke, Stoke Lodge, Stoke Gifford, Little Stoke, and Filton) and the local community as standard bearer and wreath layer respectively. They will tour some of the same battlefields and cemeteries visited by those on the 1928 pilgrimage. They will join more than 2,200 other legion representatives and dignitaries, including civic and military guests from the uk, commonwealth and northern europe who are taking part, in marching along the original route through Ypres, to the Menin Gate on the 8th August.

Once at the Menin Gate, John will lay a wreath on behalf of the Stoke Gifford community.

John, who is the local branch Chairman, commented: "Great Pilgrimage 90 is a unique opportunity for the legion community to come together and bear our standards along the same route in Ypres taken 90



years earlier by the veterans and widows of the first world war. The Stoke Gifford branch looks forward to proudly representing our local community at the event."

Thanks to local Councillors, Brian Allinson, Ernie Brown, Trevor Jones and Keith Cranney, who presented the Stoke Gifford Branch of the RBL with a grant from Member Awarded Funding, (MAF), to enable them to attend this important memorial event.

#### **Watch Out for Foreign Invaders!**

Britain is at risk from a foreign invader – the Asian Hornet! These insects were accidentally introduced to France in 2005, where they have now established themselves in large numbers across the whole country and are expanding into Spain Portugal and Germany. They are literally just across the channel! Two outbreaks have been eliminated already in the UK.



The Asian hornet is a voracious predator of all sorts of insects, and can seriously damage the populations of our native species, not least of which is the Honey Bee! In France losses of up to 50% of honey bee colonies have been blamed on the Asian Hornet. British Beekeepers are on high alert for the pest, and we need the help of everyone in the country to spot the beast so they can be eliminated before they become established.

The Asian Hornet is very distinctive, it is almost all black, with one bright yellow band near the tail, an orange face and yellow legs. It should not be confused with the native European Hornet, which has a brown coloured front end and very yellow rear end. There is an excellent guide to identifying the Asian Hornet produced by the Non Native Species Secretariat, (part of DEFRA) which can be downloaded from several sources, including the Asian Hornet Action Team website. http://ahat.org. uk/wp-content/uploads/2018/02/ID\_Vespa\_velutina\_Asian\_Hornet\_2.0-2.pdf

There is also a mobile phone app "Asian Hornet Watch" for identifying and reporting the Asian Hornet, available from both Google Play and i-tunes stores. Bristol has set up a local Asian Hornet Action Team, which will help identify hornets and work with the National Bee Unit if the hornet is found nearby. Last year there were 4,500 calls about possible Asian Hornets, of which only one was identified as the real thing, so if you do see an unusual insect that raises your suspicions, take a photograph and try to catch it, but don't necessarily kill it! Check out the identification sheets and if it really does look like the Asian Hornet, please report it to

alertnonnative@ceh.ac.uk or through the Asian Hornet Action Team network www.ahat.org.uk if you would like some local advice on reporting or identification.

Please help us keep this beast out of the UK, we know it is coming and we are ready to repel it, unlike the French, who found out too late. An Asian Hornet week is planned for 10th - 16th September this year, with wide publicity and asking as many people as possible to spend an hour or two watching for the hornet, however we do need to start now!




We have all seen the advert for **FAST** about the need to act quickly if you suspect someone has had a stroke.



Therefore a complete overhaul was determined to be needed and funding found with the help of the Friends of the school. The aim was to create an outdoor learning environment with open ended resources that provided the same opportunities available in the classroom, but lending itself to a more active approach to learning. This new area is the first stage in the redevelopment of the Early years provision at Holy Trinity with an update of the inside classrooms taking place during the summer holidays.

I arrived whilst Sports Day was still in full flow and it was lovely to see the children in action. It was great to meet and chat to ex pupil Joseff Morrell who was quest of honour responsible for officially opening the new play area. Joseff is now a professional footballer for Bristol City and the under 21 captain of the Wales team. He had fond memories of his years at Holy Trinity.

The new all-weather climbing equipment which has been installed on part of the field looks fantastic (see photos). The government funding for this wonderful new feature came from that devolved to all schools to encourage and promote agility, balance and coordination opportunities that are accessible to all ages of children. Sarah told me "As part of the enhancement plans we discussed the lack of opportunities for children to be active in this day and age and sought to provide safe, stimulating opportunities to support to develop good habits. Children should be physically active every day. The children have been very excited to watch as the equipment was put in place and are enjoying being able to explore the new opportunities."

# News from St Michael's Primary, Stoke Gifford - July 2018 Update by Head Teacher, Mark Freeman



This year we have been looking at our vision and values, to make sure they reflect what we see as our core purpose as a school. We have now come up with the following statement:

#### **Let Your Light Shine**

At St Michael's School we provide a safe, happy and inspiring learning environment based around our core values of love, joy, hope and forgiveness. We celebrate the uniqueness of every child, and encourage them to shine in all they do, preparing them for life's journey.

So what does that mean in practice for the 650 children who currently attend St Michael's? In a nutshell, we want to give them as many opportunities as possible to develop their individual talents and potential. This means having an exciting, motivating curriculum and having high standards in maths and English; but just as important, we want children to develop their creative and expressive talents, in particular through art, music, dance and sport. We employ specialist teachers and coaches in all of these areas, so that children get really high quality experiences and have all sorts of additional opportunities.

#### Main School production: Beauty and the Beast

Without doubt the outstanding event of the year was our production of the Beauty and the Beast (see photos). Every year we put on a whole-school musical, allowing children across the school to come together and showcase

their talents. Following the success last year of the Lion King, we decided to put on Beauty and the Beast. #### **Local Green Spaces Designation**

South Gloucestershire Council are now reviewing responses received from the recent consultation. Over the next 12 months the Council will be reassessing those spaces that were nominated, but not designated in the Policies, Sites and Places Plan (PSP), along with any new nominations, and comments made to existing designated spaces. South Gloucestershire Council will then present the final list of spaces suitable for designation and their preferred approach for working with communities to deliver these in the draft Plan once the outcome of the Joint Spatial Plan (JSP) is confirmed.

#### **Little Stoke Community Hall Enhancements**

Works remain ongoing in relation to enhancement works at the Little Stoke Community Hall which will see the introduction of new changing facilities, a new café, a larger meeting room, new office, along with the creation of a new entrance foyer to the building. The project remains under budget, but has faced several construction delays.

#### **Parks and Open Spaces**

It has come to the attention of the Parish Council that matters relating to the parks and open spaces in the Parish are being discussed by residents on local social media sites. Residents are encouraged to report any issues or concerns directly to the Parish Council Offices, so that the appropriate action can be taken.

#### Section 106 Funding

New machinery attachments have now been purchased to assist with key maintenance tasks across the parks and open spaces. The Parish Council has now received a significant amount of funding from this funding stream covering a range of projects in the local community. There are several other projects which have been submitted to South Gloucestershire Council for consideration in the near future.



#### **EPC** changes -What Landlords need to know

#### What is an EPC?

An Energy Performance Certificate (EPC) which is valid for 10 years shows information about the energy efficiency of the property to which it relates and what you can do to improve it.

EPCs are needed whenever an eligible property is constructed, sold, rented out or when certain improvements are installed.

#### What is changing?

From 1 April 2018, if you are a landlord and you are granting, renewing or extending a lease of a property, it must achieve a minimum energy rating of band 'E', this means properties with a rating of F or G are non-compliant. This rule applies to both domestic and non-domestic properties.

The regulations will be phased in and will apply to continuing lettings from 1 April 2020 for domestic properties and 1 April 2023 for nondomestic properties.

If the regulation applies, landlords will need to ensure that energy efficient improvements are made to the property which raises the EPC rating to a minimum of E. However, these prohibitions on letting 'sub-standard' properties (i.e. an EPC rating of F or G) are not absolute.

#### What is the risk if Landlord's don't comply?

A landlord who does not comply with MEES rules may be liable to enforcement action.

Financial penalties are based on rateable values and can be as much as £150,000 for long periods of breach.

In addition to, or in substitution, landlords found to have been in breach will be named and shamed on a public register for up to 12 months or for such longer period as is considered appropriate.

Aside from the risk of a substantial fine and/ or adverse publicity, a sub-standard EPC rating can have a number of negative effects, including:



- · The property may not be marketable without improvement works to bring the efficiency rating at least to the minimum standard;
- The valuation of properties may be affected if the marketability is diminished; and
- · The assessment of market rent at rent reviews may be affected and there may be implications at dilapidations assessments.

#### What should I do next?

Prudent landlords should be assessing their properties and preparing an action plan for managing risks to properties which are deemed sub-standard.



Heritage Open Days celebrate England's fantastic architecture and culture by offering FREE access to properties across the country that are usually closed to the public or normally charge for admission.

Winterbourne Barn is an outstanding and unique building of national importance. All other surviving medieval great tithe barns were built by the monastic estates, universities, or the Knights Hospitaliers, but Winterbourne Barn was built by Thomas de Bradeston in 1342, just a few years before the Black Death first hit in England. Only three barns of this scale are recorded as built by gentry' families, and Winterbourne is the only survivor. The Barn was built using the green-timber construction methods which were the cutting-edge technology of that period. It is a fine example of a raised-cruck construction and one of the largest and earliest raised-cruck barns.


