Record Turnout for Remembrance

Report from the Stoke Gifford Branch of the Royal British Legion

Hundreds of people attended the Remembrance Sunday Commemorations in Stoke Gifford on Sunday 11th of November 2018, (also Armistice Day).

It is thought this was the biggest crowd ever at the War Memorial on the Green in North Road, Stoke Gifford, beside St Michael's Church.

There was a service with local ministers and

the traditional Act of Remembrance with the Exhortation: the Last Post: the two minutes silence: Reveille and the reading of the very moving Kohima Epitaph taken from the Kohima 2nd Division Memorial, and originally written by John Maxwell Edmonds (1875 -1958).

There was a great crowd at the Remembrance service, including many young people from youth groups such as the Scouts, Cubs, Beavers, Guides, Brownies and Rainbows. Children from St Michael's Primary School placed wooden Remembrance Crosses at the war Memorial. The children of St Michael's school were asked by Stoke Gifford RBL Chairman John Moloney to represent all the countries that sent men to help out in WW1 and also to place the Thank You message wreath at the memorial, which they did.

Rainbow and Beavers were the group that made the clay poppies around the field of remembrance.

Wreaths were laid by many organisations including the Police, the Parish Council, and the Stoke Gifford Branch of the Royal British Legion.

People then attended the two Remembrance Services at St Michael's Church and at the Baptist Church in North Road. Stoke Gifford.

Investing in Parks and Open Spaces

The Parish Council continues to invest in the local parks and open spaces with funding from the Community Infrastructure Levy (CIL) and the Precept towards new children's play equipment, new paths and new street furniture.

Other improvements to play areas have recently been approved by the Parish Council, along with a further section of new path running from the Little Stoke Community Hall towards the children's play equipment at the back of Little Stoke Park. The new

outdoor fitness equipment that will be located near to the Community Hall will be installed soon.

A new path in Cotswold Golden Stone has been laid to the rear of Meade Park (photo right).



Parish Council Grant Funding

The Parish Council continue to allocate grant funding for local initiatives and organisations.

Grants in the current financial year have been given to the Children's Summer Play Scheme (£5,500), the Stoke Gifford Trust Ground Village Fete (£1,000), Four Towns Community Transport (£1,000), the Volunteer Centre (£500), the West of England MS Therapy Centre (£300), and the 1st Stoke Gifford Guides (£240).







Watch Elm Close Christmas Lights

Raising funds for St Peter's Hospice

Terry James and Mike Checkley have again transformed their home in Bradley Stoke into a Christmas wonderland to raise money for St Peter's Hospice. This year's display has over 30,000 lights and is now one of the biggest displays in the whole of Bristol and South Gloucestershire.

New additions for 2018 include a herd of 12 reindeer, a new Merry Christmas silhouette, a new penguin silhouette; and two new Santa silhouettes. In addition, the display for 2018 will include a large Ho-Ho-Ho silhouette and a Santa Please Stop Here silhouette together with an additional 4,000 bulbs on string and icicle lights.

Mike told us, "We decided to raise money again for St Peter's Hospice as they are a charity very close to our hearts. Most people know that they are a Bristol charity caring for adults with life-limiting illnesses

both in the Hospice and at home, but they also support families and friends and teach other healthcare professionals about how to care for people at the end of their lives". He added that "All of St Peter's care is provided free of charge, but it costs around £20,000 a day to provide that care. In addition, St Peter's 'Room to Care' Appeal is aimed at developing their new Inpatient Unit to meet the complex needs of patients in the 21st Century".

Terry and Mike, with the invaluable help of their window cleaner Kris, spend nearly four weeks putting the display together. "It's a big task" said Terry. "We still aim to keep the display 'A Classic Christmas'. People come from across Bristol and South Gloucestershire to see the display and last year we also had people from Devon, Somerset and The Midlands visiting. The oldest person visiting last year was a very proud 97-year-old grandmother!".

Last year the couple set themselves a target of £2,000 but this was smashed with £3,022 being the final total. For 2018, Terry and Mike have decided to set themselves a stretch goal of £4,000. To help achieve this, several local businesses have been approached to make a donation of £50 and the names of those business who have donated can be seen on banners displayed on the driveway. There will be collecting buckets out every night for donations from visitors who come to see the lights and donations can also be made online via a My Donate page:

The pub will continue to offer live Music, Sport and Entertainment but now we are also able to offer an inviting atmosphere to eat with the family.





10 INSIDER TIPS I BET YOU DIDN'T KNOW ABOUT YOUR GP

1. Your Doctor would like to give you more time

Most GPs provide just 10 minutes for an appointment. Although this might not seem very long you must remember that this has increased over the past 20 years from a typical 7.5 mins per appointment. Depending upon your reason for attending, 10 minutes might be more than enough time, or woefully inadequate. Got a sore throat? You might be in and out in 5 minutes. Hearing voices and suicidal? You might be in there for half an hour, or probably longer. You can help by understanding how long your appointment is, and working with your doctor to get things done in the time allowed.

2. Your Doctor does not like lists

Let me clarify this. Your Doctor would advocate you knowing what you are coming for, and if writing this down in advance will help you, then I would suggest you do so. However, bearing in mind point one above, if you only have 10 minutes and you pull out a list of 5 problems this is pretty stressful for your GP. Be realistic. Prioritise what you want from your doctor.

3. If you arrive 10 minutes late, you have missed your appointment

What this means is if you are 10 minutes late (or more). then you are not just late, but your appointment slot has come and gone. The next patient is now due. Remember that the impact of being late is not just on your doctor. They may be prepared to finish their surgery late in order to see you, but other patients probably wont!

4. Your Doctor is not telepathic

Some people think their GP will know what they are worried about, which of their problems is a priority for them and what their hidden fears are. Be up front about what is on your mind. If you are worried because you think your rash or lump might be cancer, then say so.

5. Your Doctor is a specialist

They have just specialized in being a generalist! Don't make the mistake of thinking that there is a hierarchy of doctors, with GPs at the bottom and hospital consultants at the top. Your GP will have spent a minimum of 5 years in training AFTER medical school. Sometimes people think that going to A&E means you get to see a 'proper

doctor' - remember that the junior doctor in A&E is likely significantly less experienced than your GP. If you are concerned that you might need to see a specialist, then talk this through with your GP.

6. Your Doctor is self-employed

GP partners own the business of the practice and are 'independent contractors' to the NHS. Many members of staff at the surgery, including some of the doctors, will be employed, but by the surgery not by "the NHS",. This has a number of implications:

Your GP receives a set amount of money per patient per vear to provide all of their care. It doesn't matter whether you see your GP every week all year, or don't attend for 5 years: your GP gets the same amount of money for looking after you.

Your doctor's surgery is contracted to provide certain things, and not others. This is why you will sometimes be asked to pay for things. In simple terms your GP is contracted to provide medical care, but not to do things outside of this such as the multitude of letters they are asked to sign.

The payment GPs receive is not affected directly by referrals or prescribing – the costs for this are in a separate budaet.

Because they are small businesses, they bear any increasing costs themselves. Rising indemnity fees (insurance against being sued) have to be paid by the doctor themselves. A doctor working only 2 days per week can be paying £6.000 per year on indemnity insurance.

7. Your Doctor wants the best for you

If your GP decides not to refer you on, or not to prescribe anything, or not to investigate you it is not because they are trying to be difficult or just trying to save money (don't forget, their take home pay is not affected by these things). It's usually because they don't feel you need any of the

8. Your Doctor is not taking part in a medical drama

When you watch the TV, I bet, 9 times out of 10, doctors get the diagnosis right, first time. I'm afraid this is not real life. Many conditions are not at all obvious, and time is the only sensible way to start to differentiate between them.



In reality, serious illness often initially presents the same as mild, self-limiting illness.

9. Your Doctor might play golf, but probably not in their lunchbreak!

Most GPs see/speak to 18-20 patients in morning surgery, followed by visits, and then a further 18-20 patients in the afternoon. In addition to these face to face consultations, there will be phone calls and paperwork. Paperwork is an essential part of patient care, but takes time. It consists of looking through the results of the investigations that have been ordered, reading letters from consultants, acting upon these letters, signing prescriptions and arranging the investigations and referrals from the previous surgery. The waiting room may be empty, but that doesn't mean the GPs are all putting their feet up. That's a lot of patients seen, and a lot of decisions made. If you are waiting for the results of an investigation, this can be stressful, and you guite rightly will want the results as soon as possible. Here are some things you should consider:

If the test was arranged by your hospital consultant - that's who you should go back to for the result. Ring the consultant secretary and ask when the consultant is going to convey the results to you.

If your GP did arrange the test, the smart thing is to make sure you know from the outset when and how you should expect to get the results.

10. Your Doctor has entrusted their reception staff with an important iob

And that job is not just to make things as difficult as possible to make an appointment! The receptionist's main job is to deal with enquiries, book appointments and generally ensure all is running smoothly. They are not medically trained, but they will have a really good understanding of the services on offer. Entrust them with a rough idea of the problem that you have. This way they are able to direct you to the most appropriate course of action. Don't forget that everyone who works in the surgery is covered by the same confidentiality clauses.

If you are polite and friendly to reception, they will be polite and friendly to you. They are not trying to be obstructive, they are just doing their job - you might be anxious and stressed, but try to keep calm. The receptionist can be key in getting the right help as guickly as possible - just remember, that help might not be the GP.





Anti Bullying Month kicked off to a fantastic start at Stoke Lodge Primary School with the children designing 'Odd Socks' in support of Odd Socks day on Monday 12th November.

All of the children's designs were displayed in the anti bullying section of the main corridor with the children all receiving a certificate from the Anti Bullying Alliance and an anti bullying badge for their hard work. During term one our Anti Bullying Ambassadors were voted in, in readiness for anti bullying month. We have two children in each class in both KS1 and KS2 who are voted for by their classmates. The only class that we don't have this in is Reception who have regular lessons about friendship, bullying and inclusion with their class teachers.

The role of an Anti Bullying Ambassador is to make sure that they listen to and help any of their classmates at break times and lunchtimes. Anti bullying Ambassadors help their classmates if they are upset and have nobody to play with - they play games with them, talk to them and introduce them to other children. If someone in their class thinks they are being bullied they try and help them by listening to them and encourage them to tell an adult. They can also write their name in the 'Help Me' box and the Anti Bullying Co-Ordinator will go and help them if they have come across an issue that feel they need help with. The Anti Bullying Ambassadors have regular meetings and training with the Anti Bullying Co-Ordinator each term.

Anti Bullying Month is a great addition to the school calendar and the children thoroughly enjoy getting involved. These are all things that we use to work towards gaining the BIG Award for Anti Bullying which we have achieved for the last years and are very proud of.

News from St Michael's

Owl Day: September 2018

In September each year we celebrate the feast day of St Michael, our patron saint, and this year we had a special event centred around the owl, which is the school emblem.

First we had a visit from Ian Maguire and one of his owls. The children were fascinated to find out all sorts of information and facts about owls, and to see a real barn

owl up close and watch it fly through the hall.

Following the visit, children worked with a partner from a different year group to create lots of different owl artworks. These included paintings, drawings, models, collages: see the gallery here for just a few examples.

Theme Days and Curriculum Enrichment

Throughout the year we hold a number of theme days and occasionally theme weeks. These allow children to come together as a whole school and focus on something altogether.

We have just finished a theme week centred on the local environment, the highlight of which was a theatre performance of 'The Selfish Giant'. As I write this, our next project is a day looking at Remembrance and 100 years since the end of the first world war: children will be involved in creating lots of different poppies in a variety of media and styles.

After that will be a Christmas theme day, and in the new year a science day. Later in the school year there will be a week where we celebrate song and dance.

We want our curriculum to be fun and inspiring for children, which is why we also have regular trips and visitors linked to our topics. and lots of practical activities to engage in.

STEM

We will be building more STEM activities (Science, Technology,

Engineering and Maths) into our curriculum as well over the course of the year. There are already a number of topics studied by the children which focus on these areas (such as 'robots' in Year 6), and we held a really successful science day last year where children were given demonstrations of different scientific processes by a member of the Bristol University Science faculty.

Does your business need a shareholders' agreement?

Anna Sivula, Solicitor in AMD's Commercial team, explains how Shareholders' Agreements ('SA') should be a key consideration for any private limited company with 2 or more shareholders.

In the absence of a SA, a company's internal affairs will be regulated by the Companies Act 2006 and the Articles of Association. For a lot of SMEs, the Articles are taken from an incorporation agent or based on the 'model' articles which contain standard provisions. Standard Articles may be suitable for a 1 person company or a small business that is just starting up but they may not be appropriate for a growth business or one with a more complex share structure.

Unlike the Articles which are a public document, a SA is a private contract between the shareholders of a company which does not require registration at Companies House.

A SA is therefore a flexible way of regulating a company's affairs and allows for bespoke drafting, tailored to the specific objectives of the shareholders.

Some of the key considerations in a SA include:

- Decision-making directors have control of most of the Company's decisions but a shareholders' agreement can reserve certain key decisions for the shareholders or a majority percentage.
- Share transfers shareholders may want the freedom to sell their shares but the remaining shareholders may want to ensure they have some control over who becomes a shareholder in their company. A SA can balance these objectives by providing a clear procedure for share transfers during life and on death.
- Shareholder dilution a shareholder will not want to find out their share percentage has been diluted without their consent. A SA should contain anti-dilution protections, particularly to protect a minority shareholder.



Bad leavers – a SA can set out clear guidance on what should happen to a shareholder who commits a serious breach whilst they are a shareholder. Whilst employment law regulates the actions of employees, the SA can regulate how shares are dealt with in the event a shareholder/ employee leaves the business as a bad leaver. For example, this could include returning shares to the Company at a discounted rate.

There is no legal requirement to have a SA but companies with two or more shareholders should consider having one in place. In our experience, trying to resolve shareholder disputes without a SA will always prove more problematic. It stands to reason that there is less potential for conflict between shareholders when their roles and responsibilities are discussed and clearly recorded from the outset.



Great Western Air Ambulance Charity takes up Tenancy in New Air Base

Great Western Air Ambulance Charity (GWAAC) have taken up tenancy of a new air base in Almondsbury. The charity will share the facility with the National Police Air Service (NPAS), and currently have a ten year tenancy agreement. Their helicopter took off from the new base for the first time at the end of October, taking the medical team to a critical incident.

The move is a huge milestone for the charity. who have been operating from a hangar on Filton airfield which was one of the oldest in the country.

In a move which would ensure stability for the life-saving charity, the landlords of the new base have offered GWAAC the opportunity to purchase the facility at a significantly reduced price.

GWAAC Chief Executive Anna Perry explains: "We're thrilled to have moved into the new air base at Almondsbury, however with our current tenancy agreement we could be asked to leave again after ten years. This could be extremely disruptive to our service. Owning our air base will ensure we can continue to carry out our lifesaving work well into the future. It's unlikely we will have the opportunity to buy a facility like this

Russ Woolford, Assistant Operations Director for the National Police Air Service (NPAS) said: "We are delighted that NPAS Almondsbury is now operational. The state-of-the-art air base, including a 520m lit Final Approach and Take Off (FATO), is a great addition to our national network of bases. NPAS Almondsbury is operational 24/7/365 and our crews will regularly support police colleagues on the ground to find missing people and search for suspects. Air support is a vital tool available to police forces and flying at average speeds of 138mph crews will also help bring many other 'crimes in action' to an end, to help keep communities safe. NPAS Almondsbury replaces the existing NPAS Filton site which is now under redevelopment for housing."

Earlier this year, GWAAC launched an urgent appeal to help them raise the additional £1.25 million needed to fund the purchase. They are half way towards their target, but still have a long way to go.



As a charity they rely on generous donations from members of the public to stay operational. Excitingly, if they can raise another £315.000 then a generous local organisation has pledged to double this money!

GWAAC Lead Critical Care Doctor Ed Valentine continues: "The whole crew are really pleased to have moved into our new hangar, which is warm, dry, and has all the facilities we need to train for and deliver our service. We operate at the forefront of pre-hospital emergency medicine, and are here for every single person across the region. Owning this base would mean that we can continue to expand and continue our work long into the future. We're extremely grateful to everyone who has donated so far, and would urge anyone who is able to contribute to the Buy Our Base appeal to do so."

The truth about lower back pain

Hannah, our Osteopath at Bradley Stoke Physio & Health, answers some common questions about lower back pain.

Why have I got lower back pain?

Lower back pain can be caused by a specific event, such as a fall, or lifting something awkwardly. Most often though, it starts for no obvious reason, or from a simple movement like bending to pick something up. The demands on our bodies can build up, then bending is the 'final straw', resulting in pain. Poor sleep, stress or worry, long sedentary working hours, and changes to exercise habits, can all contribute.

What is causing my lower back pain?

Local nerves (called nociceptors) sense the injury or strain and send messages saying 'something has happened here' to the spinal cord, which passes them on to our brain. The brain then weighs up the situation using lots of information, including our thoughts, beliefs and experiences, to decide whether pain is felt and how much. This tells us that pain is a unique experience, and that pain is not always an accurate measure of the amount of damage. Although unpleasant, pain can help protect us from further damage, or prompts us to do something differently to look after ourselves.

Will my back pain get better?

Lower back pain is rarely serious and gets better in most cases. Even when there is a great deal of pain, the body does a great job of repairing and healing. You may or may not get a flare up once in a while or with certain activities, but this doesn't mean your back is damaged, more that it might be sensitive now and again.



However, if your pain won't go away, see your GP, an osteopath, or physiotherapist.

What can I do to help my back pain?

My top tip is to try to keep moving, even if it is uncomfortable. Taking painkillers could help you to stay active and to get a good night's sleep, which will aid your recovery. When you feel up to it, regular exercise such as walking, yoga, swimming, running, cycling - whatever you enjoy - will help keep your back strong and healthy.

How can osteopathy help?




