Stokes Artists paint 'Trolletheus' - God of the Three Brooks ...& it all started with a supermarket Trolley!!

A chance encounter between Susan Hartry of the STOKES ART GROUP and Sara Messenger of the THREE BROOKS **CONSERVATION GROUP last spring,** sparked an idea for an Art Project.

Sara explained that just as the River Severn has Sabrina Goddess of the River, the Three Brooks Nature Reserve had a God called Trolletheus - after two rusted and battered supermarket trolleys she and the TBCG Team had dredged from the Pond some time earlier. Susan picked up on this and suggested giving Trolletheus a face, as an SAG Project Competition later in the year. Enthusiastically Sara liked the idea - and even agreed to judge it with Adoption Papers at the ready!!!

Both passionate about their respective Groups, they soon realised they greatly complimented each other: after all...Conservationists maintain our landscape, and for centuries Artists have enjoyed painting it!

The Competition Brief was structured in two parts- Part 1 to create an image for Trolletheus -





and Part 2 to create a Landscape from any scene or feature from the Three Brooks Reserve. The resulting unsigned collection was displayed at the Stokes Art Group end of year Awards Event, where Sara and fellow Conservationist Kerry selected their favourite artwork from each.

Sara was thrilled that finally Trolletheus had a 'face' - though the look of surprise on her own face when she announced the artist was Susan Hartry© - was also worthy of a prize! Inspired by features of the Reserve itself Susan's Trolletheus (pictured above), armoured with two supermarket trolleys, is based on the Turkey Oaks of Sherborne's Brake.

The winning Landscape by Stokes Artist Sue Kelly© (pictured left), taken from her own photograph, represents a typical Three Brooks woodland scene familiar to those who go off the beaten track and enjoy the diverse variety of trees, plants, wildflowers and undergrowth found right on our doorstep.

Local Boxing Champion has successful start to 2019

Ellouise Challenger, from Little Stoke is just 16 years old and already a 3x National Champion in her chosen weight ... STOP PRESS 4x!!!

Ellouise has lived in Little Stoke her entire life, first attending Stoke Lodge Primary School, fthen the Ridings Academy in Winterbourne and laterally a student at the Filton Wise college where she is currently studying sport and science and also part of the boxing academy.

Ellouise was a keen gymnast from the age of 5 until 13, when she had to give it up due to an ankle injury. Looking for an alternative sport to keep up her strength and fitness, Ellouise tried boxing. Discovering early on that this was a sport she could do well in, Ellouise really started to improve under the supervision of motivational England Coach Craig Turner at the Downend Boxing Club.

Within just a few months Ellouise had won the National Development Championships and then went on to win at first the National Championships, then the NABGC championships. She travelled to Sweden and won the Golden Girl that year and has since been to Ireland and won gold in the Wexford Box Cup too.

To date this winter Ellouise has won the National Clubs for Young People Championship held in Bridlington, with a unanimous points win over classy boxer Demi Uscroft from Hull. A week later, saw Ellouise win the inaugral England Boxing Women's Winter Box Cup in Manchester against talented Irish International Lisa O'Rourke who is the European Junior Silver Medallist. At the end of January, Ellouise was selected to represent England against Ireland at the City Hall in Bristol. She won her bout against Ireland's National Champion and European Bronze medallist Leah Gallen.


At the start of February, Ellouise flew to Sweden to compete in The 'Golden Girl' Championships again, where she had to step up a class to box older and more experience boxers, as there was no one in her own age/weight class of 69kg to compete with. Ellouise did well, winning her semi finals against an aggressive Danish girl by a unanimous decision. In the finals she faced a 17 year old who was competing as part of Thailand's national team. This girl had previously been in the World Championships twice, as well as the Youth Olympics. Ellouise boxed her heart out in the final, coming home with the Silver medal after losing out on a close split decision. Mum Nicola told us "We are so proud of Ellouise and this just shows how far she will go, to box so well like this against a world class boxer".

As we went to print on the 17th of February, Ellouise was taking part in the Youth National Championship Finals in Banbury. A win here will hopefully see her competing in the European Championships later this year. We wish her the very best of luck. STOP PRESS: ELLOUISE WON THE CHAMPIONSHIP (photo right) !!



Local children's charity nurse takes on 24 hour run to raise money for terminally ill children

This July a nurse at children's hospice at home charity Jessie May is taking on a 24 hour running challenge to boost funds and raise awareness of the charity.

Local Stokes resident Steve Wiltshire, 30 (right), is one of the Jessie May Nurses who provides vital respite support to families caring for a terminally ill child in their own homes. He has worked in the Jessie Mav Care Team for over 21/2 vears and is now combining his passion for his job, and for running, and tackling




a gruelling 24 hour run to raise money for and awareness of the local charity.

Steve has created his own fundraiser 'The Difference a Day Makes' to inspire donations online here (https://uk.virainmonevaivina.com/ thedifferenceadaymakes) as he takes on the 24 Hour Conti Thunder Run on July 19th, in Waltonon-Trent. He aims to raise £3,000 - the cost of running the charity for one day - and has so-called his fundraiser 'The Difference a Day Makes' to reflect the importance of at-home support for families caring for a terminally ill child.

Steve said: "As a Jessie May Nurse, I understand the enormous difference Jessie May's support makes to families with a terminally ill child. Many rely on our respite visits and emotional support and have said they'd now be completely lost without us. This is why I want to help raise money for Jessie May - I have seen the impact we have on families firsthand. The challenge that I have decided to undertake is to run as many 10km laps as I can in 24 hours through the 24 Hour Conti Thunder Run. It's pretty extreme!

"Caring for a terminally ill child is an exhausting, 24 hour task; both physically and emotionally. This 24 hour run is quite symbolic of the 24 hour care the children require and I hope by completing the 24 Hour Thunder Run, it inspires people to talk about Jessie May, and why our support is vital to families, and make a donation through my fundraising page if they can."

One of the Jessie May children Steve supports is 2 year old Alba, who has a life limiting condition which means she cannot walk or talk, and needs 24/7 care and attention. She suffers from seizures on a daily basis, and has to take 14 types of medication each day. She has poor vision, very limited body movement.



Alba's mum Roz said: "Jessie May is so important to us because we totally trust the nurses. They know Alba so well; they understand how she can communicate, and her needs. They can be trusted to feed her, put her to bed, and give her medication when it's required. Not many people can do all this without someone else there to support them! Knowing Alba is in safe hands means the world to us. I am amazed at what Steve's doing with the 24 hour run. We wish him luck for the day and can't wait to hear all about it."

Steve is now encouraging donations to his online fundraising page here as he trains ahead of the big day, in his purple Jessie May running vest.

He added: "It's truly an honour to run and raise money for families like Alba's. It's an honour in itself being invited into their home every month! Now I'm actually really excited for the day to come! I hope to raise as much money as possible so Jessie May can continue to support families, and also welcome additional children with life limiting conditions to our caseload.

"I will also be blogging about my training ahead of the day and sharing updates on my progress, so keep an eye on the Jessie May blog page and my fundraising page too."



The secret to a healthy garden – a healthy gardener!

Louise Dodds, Physiotherapist at Bradley Stoke Physio & Health shares some tips to help you enjoy the fruits of your labour

If like me you are looking forward to the lighter nights in order that you can get outside and do your gardening, you may benefit from a few tips on getting and staying fit and flexible enough to continue to garden all through the summer.

As all gardeners are aware, the months of March and April are two of the busiest with lifting, carrying, bending, weeding and digging. The knees, lower back, shoulders and arms may all feel the strain. In particular, this sudden increase in activity comes after a relatively sedate period for most people.



Gardening is an active pursuit, and we know that heavy lifting and sustained static postures associated with gardening increase blood pressure. The physical stress increases inflammation in the body – our sore muscles! This is actually necessary for the body to then adapt and become stronger and fitter. It is the recovery that allows the inflammation to reduce and this process to complete.





We can help our body prepare for our gardening activity, to prevent as many aches and pains. Walking is really beneficial as a way of building up our aerobic capacity. Before gardening, stretching our arms above our heads and twisting the trunk in a sitting position is helpful too, as are the exercises shown in the photos here.

These exercises performed 10-15 times, 2-3 times daily, can help keep the hips and the knees strong. These joints can appreciate a little more looking after when you're a keen gardener! As with all exercises, they should be built up gradually.

GEM Boccia Club - friendly, fun and welcoming to all

Who am I?

My name is Georgina (Elizabeth) Moore (GEM: Hence the Club's name). I'm 34 years old and have a neuromuscular condition. It means I'm a permanent wheelchair user and cannot weight bare. I live independently with 24-hour care in my own flat in Chipping Sodbury, South Glos.

My background is I have a degree in Marketing and then I went on to be a Primary School Teacher for a short time, but sadly could not physically continue with it. I'm not the type of person who likes to sit around not doing anything but knew I couldn't commit to working regularly. I like to try and stay as fit and healthy as I can but could only find swimming as a form of exercise.

What is Boccia?

It is not uncommon for people to say to me "What is Boccia?" when I tell them I run a Boccia Club. This highlights the lack of publicity the sport gets, which is a real shame seeing as it's a Paralympic event!

Boccia is very similar to bowls: With the fundamental aim of the game being 'get your balls closest to the jack'. The main difference being that you have to be seated when playing Boccia. This makes the sport inclusive for all. The sport can be played individually or as a team. It is played as red balls VS blue balls, with the jack being white. There is also increasingly new technology that means visually impaired people can also take part in the sport.

After watching Boccia being played at the 2016 Paralympics I decided to try and find a local Boccia Club. Much to my disappointment there wasn't a Club in the South Glos area. The nearest Club was in Henbury and was run by Access Sport. I decided to go along and give it





a try. Immediately I loved playing because it was competitive and I felt that throwing the balls was actually great exercise for me, it meant I was moving in my chair!

I continued to attend the Henbury Club weekly for a few months but the 30-minute journey there and back was tiring and expensive. I kept saving to people maybe I should just set up my own Club. After much encouragement by others and fundamental support from Access Sport, that's exactly what I did. GEM Boccia Club's first session took place in September 2017. I managed to liaise with Yate Leisure Centre to use the badminton courts, which have since been marked out as Boccia courts too. I produced my own leaflets and flyers, set up social media pages and tried to promote the Club as much as I could. My main carer, Tom, completed a Boccia Coaching Course, so he could use the knowledge and skills from that to help me deliver meaningful sessions, where members can progress over time. We were lucky to be loaned sets of Boccia balls initially as each set of 12 balls costs over £200.

The first session saw 11 people turn up and I was overwhelmed. They were a range of ages and abilities and that's the main ethos behind our Club: Inclusive to all. This means you don't have to have a disability to play with us. We have siblings, carers and parents all join in, although to compete in official competitions you must have a disability. The other important part of our Club is we have fun! We split the sessions into playing proper Boccia matches and also playing fun, skills games. We believe this is what keeps people coming back. To this day we are still going strong and numbers are increasing.

Future Goals

We started with no money towards the Club and that's why we charge £2 per person each week, to cover the cost of the courts. Other costs include equipment / resources, admin and training. Fundraising activities and a generous personal donation has allowed us to purchase our own balls, equipment and get t-shirts printed for our regular members. As member numbers grow we will need to purchase more balls etc, so continuous donations are always appreciated.

GEM Boccia Club recently took part in their first competition. Members who want to play competitively can choose whether to be part of the team. So 7 of us went along to Bath Leisure Centre with 4 other teams from the West of England. We all had a really enjoyable day and it was great experience for us. We are looking forward to competing more in the future.

We were also nominated for Club of the Year award as part of Boccia England's National awards. Apparently 4 different individuals nominated us, and Tom also got nominated for Coach of the Year. We were all so touched and overwhelmed by this. I personally feel honoured to be appreciated and know I'm having a positive impact on my local community.

We always encourage new members and anyone is welcome along. We are currently also looking for volunteers who could help run the Club because at the moment it is just run by my carer and myself. My family help out most weeks but we want to be able to give some responsibility to people outside the family. A&E ONLY for head injuries, loss of consciousness, suturing (stitches), foreign bodies, suspected broken bones or heavy blood loss, persistent chest pain or difficulty breathing, overdose or poisoning

Medical advice? - call 111 or visit www.nhs.uk/conditions/

Morning after pill? - local pharmacy or family planning clinic

Common conditions?- see our, or NHS website for very useful information and advice

Dental problems? - see your dentist, GPs are advised NOT to treat patients with dental conditions. If you are not registered with a dentist, you can ring NHS 111 for more information on your nearest dental surgery.

Accident or injury, or think you may need an x-ray? Minor injuries unit at Southmead or Yate

We now have brand new solar panels along the full length of the school and we have been generating our own electricity since just before Christmas! 70% of the energy that our panels generate will be directly used in the school and the remaining 30% will be sold back to the National Grid. This is great news for our school and great news for our environment.

Protecting and Improving our School

Environment Last summer, two girls in KS2 came up with the idea of creating a litter-picking team. Through their energy and commitment, we now have enough brand-new litter-picking tools, gloves and buckets to enable children in all of our KS2 classes to take a turn in maintaining our lovely school grounds. Each class will have two opportunities between now and the end of the school year to join the litter-picking team on either a Tuesday or a Thursday and keep our school looking clean and tidy. Very well done to Lois and Martha for setting up this whole project!



This system has been up and running for a couple of months now and the children are doing a fantastic job, improving our school environment and raising our awareness of the importance of behaving responsibly with our own litter.

Reducing Waste across the School On top of the recycling of paper and card that happens in each classroom, we are looking at lunch-times to reduce and manage our waste better. We are about to start using special recycling bins for the paper and tin-foil waste that is generated over lunch from packed-lunches so that it is separated from rubbish that goes to landfill. Our goal is to try and reduce the amount of waste that will go to landfill from our school. We can measure the impact of this by keeping a tally on the number of bins we are filling for collection each week. The fewer bins we fill, the more progress we are making.

An Anaerobic Digester? What is that?

We are also about to begin recycling our food waste by taking part in an initiative run by South Gloucestershire County Council which will generate energy that can be sold back to the National Grid. The waste that is left after lunchtime every day, plus the fruit skins left after break times, will be collected and taken to an anaerobic digester. Anaerobic digestion is a process which breaks down organic matter (like food waste) to produce bio-gas and bio-fertiliser. The bio-gas is burned to generate energy and the bio-fertiliser can be used as a source of fertilizer which is free from nitrates that can be used on farm land. We think this is brilliant idea!

We believe we all have a duty as members of our Bailey's Court school community to act responsibly showing that we understand how to look after and respect our local and global environment. We are keen to do as much as we can and we are always on the look-out for new ideas!



Radio BCPS Visits Bradley Stoke Radio!

BCPS have been running our own radio station since September 2018. Every class produces a radio broadcast during the school year and for the last few months a group of Y6 children have been presenting a daily lunchtime radio show. We were visited recently by one of Bradley Stoke Radio's presenters to give the children a master-class on presenting skills and we were also invited to visit Bradley Stoke Radio.

Here is an account of the afternoon, by Jess and Harri: On Thursday 7th of February, a group of Year 6 children (the radio presenters) went to visit Andy Ward (the former mayor of Bradley Stoke and a governor at Bailey's Court Primary) at Bradley Stoke Radio Station.

We all went in the minibus with Mr Lynham and Mr Telfer. When we arrived, we went around to the back of the Bradley Stoke Surgery and met Andy and Becky Ward, who greeted us at the door. The first studio that that we entered was a smaller room called Studio 2 with two microphones, which meant that only two people could record at

the same time. After that, we walked down another hallway to the main recording room called Studio 1. In this room, there was four microphones and six pairs of headphones. The girls stayed in Studio 1 and the boys went into Studio 2. In Studio 1, Becky taught Taylor how to work the main board. In addition, Andy taught Jack M how to work a smaller board in Studio 2. After everyone had a go in their first recording studio, the boys and girls swapped over. Becky taught Josh to work the bigger board and Andy taught Jess how to work the smaller board. All of the twelve radio presenters had so much fun: Jess and Lois; Harri and Jack; Taylor and Megan Hartley; Samuel and Jack; Georgia and Ailsa and Josh Miles and Haris.

2018 was an encouraging season at Bradley Stoke Cricket Club, and hopes are high that 2019 builds on this.

Adult section

The Saturday 1st XI maintained their Bristol and District Senior Division status following promotion in 2017 to their highest level so far. After a challenging start a predominantly young side finished strongly to finish seventh from ten.

The Saturday 2nd XI finished fourth in Division 4 to consolidate after promotions in the last few years.

The Saturday 3rd XI finished fourth in Division 11, with not much to seperate the top four teams. Their performance was rewarded with a move into Division 10 for 2019, due to a realignment following the withdrawal of some teams placed higher in the league.

The Saturday 4th XI also finished fourth, in Division 15A, and find themselves in Division 15 for 2019.

The Sunday 1st XI were placed third in the top division of the North Somerset Cricket League, one win shy of being crowned champions.

The Sunday 2nd XI finished sixth from eight in the third tier of the NSCL. However after struggling to raise a full side towards the end of the season, this team will operate on a friendly basis in 2019.

Youth section

A record 146 different players were seen in 2018. thanks in part to All Stars Cricket being launched at the club, a national initiative aimed at 5-8 year olds. 62 signed up to this.

Squads were also run at Under 9s, 11s, 13s, 15s

and 17s age groups, all overseen by a coaching team including 3 ECB level 2 and 4 level 1 equivalent qualified coaches.

There was success on the field, notably the Under 11s reaching the semi-finals of their Bristol Youth Cricket League (BYCL) cup, and the Under 17s finishing runners up in their BYCL league play-offs.

The new net facility built at the ground during the previous winter has enhanced training sessions and thus match performances.

Three players played representative age group cricket during the 2018 summer, two for Stroud and South Gloucestershire district boys, with the club proud to have nurtured the captain of Gloucestershire Under 11 girls.

A further three players are currently taking part in the representative winter indoor training programmes following trials in late summer, making six of the club's players currently recognised in this way, three at county and three at district level.



In 2019, in addition to the above teams, a second Under 11s team will be run to cater for the increasing numbers in this age group.

Winter training for 2019 is at the Winterbourne International Academy sports hall. For adults this is on Sundays from 7pm to 8pm from 3rd February to 7th April inclusive. For youth it is Tuesdays 7pm to 8pm from 12th to 26th March and 7pm to 9pm on 2nd and 9th April.

Outdoor training from around mid April is at the club ground. For adults it is Wednesdays from 6.30pm, youth is Sunday mornings from 10.30am and women's is on Tuesday evenings, but not when clashing with scheduled home women's matches.

From Menace to Miracle:

Prisoner turned prison minister releases book to raise money for NHS that saved his daughter's life

now ordained minister prison has released a book about his life to raise money Southmead Hospital Charity to

thank the NHS who saved his daughter's life.

Reverend Larry Harvey (pictured above outside HMP Bristol), a leading figure in the traveller community, was born into an English Romany Gypsy family but fell into a life of crime from an early age.

He is now full time chaplain at HMP Bristol - where he was once a prisoner – and works closely with offenders to help them build a life without crime.

His remarkable life story has been captured in a new book called from 'Menace to Miracle' and all proceeds of the sale of the book will be donated to Southmead Hospital Charity to support the neurological department at Southmead Hospital, Bristol.

Larry, who lives in Coalpit Heath, had 27 crime convictions ranging from thefts to assault. But in 1999 Larry turned

A former prisoner his life around after his 18-year-old daughter Joanne fell seriously ill, needing several ground breaking major neurological operations at the former Frenchay Hospital to relieve pressure on her brain.

> Larry became a committed Christian and started to work in Ashfield Young Offenders Institution.

> Menace to Miracle has been written with Hilary Field, a former BBC Radio 4 producer and volunteer chaplaincy assistant at Southmead Hospital. The book is available on Amazon as a hard copy or as a download on Kindle and an audio version is planned.

Larry said: "For a long time I have wanted to encourage youngsters and others to know that no matter how awful their lives seem now, they can change it from a life of drugs, violence and crime to a life with a purpose and hope, just as mine was changed. So when we wrote the book, I decided I wanted the money from it to go to Southmead Hospital, where my daughter's life was saved and where my life was so dramatically changed."

Winterbourne's Medieval Barn – News & Events



Winterbourne Medieval Barn Trust (WMBT) is preparing for much of the site to go into hibernation in 2019 to allow major building and refurbishment work on the medieval barn, its two ranges (the South and West Barns), and the outbuildings. But that doesn't mean there are no community events this year! WMBT is making use of the recently renovated Cartshed to keep a programme of workshops, lectures and nature walks alive throughout 2019, and will also be developing their Education offer and expanding the Barn's volunteer team. Can You Help Raise the Roof?

Although WMBT has now raised most of the £400,000 funds required to restore the various buildings on the site, they still need a little more money to support this ambitious refurbishment project. They are therefore hoping that local people will come together and help them raise £5000 to 'Raise the Roof' and ensure that the site can be used by the community for generations to come.

The Trust writes: 8,500 pantiles make up the red tiled clay roof of Winterbourne's West Barn, which is currently very dilapidated and needs extensive restoration. Filming at the Barn! The film company (Elephant House Studios) approached WMBT in 2018 asking to film dendrochronologists from Swansea University taking a core sample from the beams in the Barn. They were filming for a new channel 5 series. Each programme is based around an on-going archaeological dig, and they film other things linked to that dig in some way. The episode which involved the Barn focuses on rural life in medieval Britain. A dig in Poulton in Cheshire unearthed hundreds of medieval skeletons, and researchers looked into the life of average Britons in the 14th century, particularly the challenges posed by famine, plaque and conflict. They believe the great famine of 1315 may have been caused by exceptionally wet weather, which is recorded in historical documents. Dendrochronology (tree rings) can provide a good record of the weather. and so the timbers used to construct Winterbourne Medieval Barn in 1342 could provide clear evidence of the climate over the previous 100+ years before the trees were cut down.

The TV crew came in November 2018. The TV crew filmed the presenter and the dendrochronogy expert taking a sample from the Barn's roof timbers and then studying the it in the lab. This showed clear evidence of successive unusually wet years in the early 1300s which backs up the written documents recording poor weather and crop failures.

The show 'Digging Up Britain's Past' aired the 'Peasants' episode featuring our local barn at the end of January 2019.




