

A lot of us might dream about being a recording artist but for members of our Stoke Gifford gospel choir, the dream has become a reality! Back in July around 80 singers gathered at Thornbury Baptist Church to record a brand new EP. The Stoke Gifford Gospel Generation Community Choir was one of 6 choirs that were part of this exciting project. Three other GGCC Bristol choirs (www.ggcc.org.uk), one from Torquay and one from Feltham swelled the numbers creating a wonderful rich sound.

Being part of a recording is guite a different experience to singing live in a concert so for most of the singers this was their first experience of the world of multiple takes, instructions for more energy, tighter diction and smiles! It was a long day, took 5 hours to record the four songs but we were kept going with delicious cakes and snacks provided by members of the choir. Once the main choir had finished we still had another three hours to record a smaller group, again featuring members of the Stoke Gifford group and some solos. The backing tracks for the songs had already been done by GGCC choir director Emma Smallwood (www.emfomusic.co.uk) so literally all that was needed was the vocals.

We had the expert help of experienced singer/songwriter Geraldine Latty for the day, she led the choirs through all the songs and two of the songs we recorded were actually written by her and her husband, Carey Luce (www.lucemusic.london). Carey was the engineer/producer for the day, and will be mixing all the songs for us over the Summer. They will both be back to perform with the choir at our Christmas concert at St Michael's Church on Friday 6th December. The title track of the EP is 'Sing our way home' and the other tracks are a mixture of traditional spirituals and more contemporary gospel songs. We're aiming to launch our EP at our annual Gospel singing conference, Sing 2019 which will be in Easton, Bristol on 12th October. This is open to anyone who loves to sing and loves gospel music, still places available (www.ticketsource.co.uk/ gospelgenerationcommunitychoir).

We'll have more details of the launch and how to get hold of a copy when our new rehearsal term starts on Tuesday 10th September, 7.30pm in the lower hall in the St Michael's Centre on the Green, Stoke Gifford. New members always welcome so why not come and join us!

Easily one of the best parts of my job is meeting up with local residents to share a happy story. It was an absolute pleasure therefore to share

I laughed like a drain - there was nothing further from my mind at that time, being only 16."



Brian and Margaret were married five years later, on 30th May 1959.

The couple have lived in Stoke Gifford for nearly 40 years, and prior to that spent 10 years plus in Little Stoke.


"When we went to buy our house in Little Stoke, we were 'two and six' or '1/2 crown' short to raise a mortgage" Brian told me "that's around 12 1/2 p these days! Well I went to my boss and the next month he gave me a rise and thankfully we managed to get the mortgage!"

Their children, David and Laura, both attended Little Stoke Primary School with David going up to what was then Filton High School and Laura moving on to Colston Girls.

Both Brian and Margaret worked locally at BAC/ BAe/Airbus; Margaret as a Secretary/PA to an Executive Director on the Airbus side and Brian in Management and Cost Control. Keeping it in the family, son David also works for Airbus, having spent the last 14 years based in Toulouse. Their daughter remains local, living with her family in Bradley Stoke. The couple have 3 grandchildren. Brian and Margaret are pictured with the family at their party (left).

They both enjoy line dancing, active walks and also volunteer for the National Trust at Dyrham Park. "We are very fortunate to have been blessed with good health".

Brian and Margaret have enjoyed lots of travel over the years including trips to India, Egypt, Jordan, a Nile cruise, Mediterranean cruise and a cruise to see the Northern Lights to name a few; but one trip raises a special memory. "All the kids nowadays seem to have this gap year - we never had such a thing in our time, so we thought why not go now! So in our 70s we spent some time island hoping around the Greek islands, not knowing where we were heading or where we were staying the night!" Margaret said "Brian told me I could only take the clothes I could carry in the backpack on my back! Not the way a lady usually travels!" It sounds like they had a great trip.

To celebrate their Diamond Wedding, the couple held a big party for family and friends in Iron Acton hall, where they were entertained by a local disco, Euphorix, and a Neil Diamond tribute act. A BBQ for neighbours is also planned.

"We had so many presents and cards and I would really like to thank everyone who helped us celebrate. We asked for donations to charity in lieu of presents and are both astounded to have raised £300 - we never had any idea it would be that much. We have long supported the Charlton Farm Children's Hospice, so some of the money will be sent to them and some to the Air Ambulance. As a family we have been extremely blessed not to have needed either of these great charities. Even with a vivid imagination, I cannot think what anguish parents must go through who outlive their child. We are so grateful not to have



needed that support but their work is so important to those that do need them."

"I can't believe we've been married for 60 years. If someone asked me I'd say it felt more like 25, time has just flown" said Margaret, "but that's life".


#### Patchway Judo success for judoka



#### Sun, sea and ...shoulder pain?

I don't know about you, but shoulder pain is the last souvenir I want of my holiday (I'd rather lasting memories of blue skies and white sandy beaches). But coming home from your annual rest with shoulder pain surprisingly common.

Let's look at five things you can do to avoid a [suit]case of shoulder pain on holiday.





- 2. Split your luggage between you: it's likely that you will have to carry your suitcase at some point (wheels don't work everywhere), so packing your luggage in smaller bags that you can share out between you means you can move your suitcases with less strain on your shoulders.
- 3. Pack less in your hand luggage. It can be really tough to swing those bags into the overhead lockers. There's not enough room to lift properly so lighter bags are going to help you avoid this prime cause of stress on your shoulder joints.
- 4. Use backpacks for everyday. Spreading the weight evenly across your body, reduces the pull on your neck and shoulders that you might otherwise experience if carrying a bag on one side of your body for a long period of time.
- 5. Move and stretch regularly. This can be a tricky thought when you'd rather lounge by the pool, but some simple exercises such as a chair twist can help. Sit on the edge of your chair and reach round to hold the back of the chair. You should feel a gentle stretch through your back. Reach around to the other side and do the same.

I'd add a bonus tip and that's keep hydrated. If you haven't drunk enough water, any pain can feel worse.

#### Rear Lane -Do We Have a Right to Use This?

Laura Wilkinson of AMD Solicitors provides an insight into the use of rear accessways and lanes.

In many parts of Bristol there are lanes or access paths to the rear of properties used either to gain access to garages or as a pedestrian right of way for the removal of rubbish. As a property owner it is important to understand whether you have a right to use a rear accessway.

A right of way may exist in one of the following

#### 1. A Public Right of Way

This is a general right which can be enjoyed by the public over an adopted highway or path which is maintained by the Local Authority. A Local Search undertaken at the time of your purchase should show whether the accessway is adopted by the Local Authority.

#### 2. A Private Right of Way

This can be established either by:-

- a) An express agreement contained in historic deeds giving the owner of the property a right of way. The deed should specify the exact route, any restrictions on the extent of the width or height of the right of way whether it is on foot and/or with vehicles. Sometimes there may be conditions on the time of day that the right can be used and who will be responsible for the maintenance and repair of it.
- b) Even if there have been no express rights of way granted it is possible that a private right of way can be established though evidence of long use. This is called a right "by prescription". Provided it can be shown that it has been used for over 20 years without permission from a third party or in secret and that no payment has been made for the use of it, then a right of way can be established.



#### Repairing a Private Right of Way

Often no one party can be identified as responsible for the maintenance and repair of an accessway. In this instance the usual practice is for the owners of adjoining properties to join together informally to contribute towards any repairs or, alternatively, each individual property owner will maintain the part adjoining their property. Buyers should therefore be aware that private lanes may not be maintained and repaired to the highest standard.

#### Going away this Summer?

Summer is here and with it comes sunshine filled days and weeks away exploring the world. While you are away from your garden, you may be concerned about your plants and keeping them watered. There is nothing worse than coming home to wilted plants and withered crops.

Luckily, there are steps you can take to make sure your garden stays looking fantastic! So when you get back home, you can relax with a cuppa in the garden (and ignore the pile of washing!)

- A day or so before you leave, weed your garden. Weeds compete for water with other plants, removing them will make sure your plants have more.
- Cut the grass instead of putting the cuttings in your green bin, pile them on your beds. Not only will your lawn look neat, the cuttings will create a mulch. Mulched plants lose 25% less water, helping keep them healthy.
- 3. Before you leave, water your plants deeply. This means give the soil a through soaking - a quick run around with a watering can will not be enough. If you can leave a sprinkler on for a while this will help when watering large areas.
- 4. If you have areas that dry out quickly because they are in full sun, cover the ground to trap moisture. This can be done with bark or wood chips, mulch or stones. Do not use plastic as you want rain water to still get in to the soil.
- 5. You can also add a shade cloth. Common in greenhouses, shade cloths diffuse the light and help protect plants from direct sunlight. This could even be an old sheet on some poles!
- 6. Use water spikes. These are handy for containers, hanging baskets and houseplants. Using a recycled plastic bottle, fill it with water and screw on the water spike where the lid would be. This will allow the water to slowly drip out, keeping your plants watered. If you are away for two weeks, you can use two or three bottles.
- Create an automated water system. You can add a timer to your garden hose and set up a watering system around your garden. This will make sure your plants are watered as if you were actually there.



4.00pm and the Fair drew to a close with Mr Freeman calling out the raffle winners and thanking everyone for their contribution and help.



#### **Updates from Bailey's Court Primary School**

#### Evacuation Day for Y3 at Avon Valley Railway



When Year 3 were on the bus to Avon Valley Railway Station, we were very excited. We knew we were going to learn a lot of history about World War 2. Our teachers told us to dress up as an evacuee child to give us the full experience of being an evacuee. After half an hour, we got there and we sat down in the seating area. Then the staff introduced themselves and told us all the safety rules. We were split into groups, and after we went on the steam train. We got many fun things to do for example. colouring, guizzes and word searches. After that, they told us a lot of information about WW2 such as, it started in 1939 and ended in 1945. Next, we did a handful of activities and a man told us his story of when he fought in the war. He had also brought some items from the war. Finally, we went back to school, and we all agreed we had an awesome day!

#### Cogginus the Roman Comes to School!



On Monday 1st July Year 3 were visited by a Roman soldier! Cogginus the Roman was invited to school to show us what life was like as a Roman soldier. The first thing he did was to teach us how to say hello in Latin "Salve!". He also taught us the different parts of the armour and what they were used for, we were also able to learn when the Romans invaded Britain (AD43).

After we had learnt all about life as a Roman soldier, he wanted to find out if we would be good recruits

for his army. He taught us how to march in step by shouting "Sin" (left) and "Dex" (right). We also learnt how to turn to the left and right and spin on the spot.

After break, we collected our shields and learnt how to march as a Roman century, it was very tricky to stay altogether, we even got to throw 'pilum' at Mr Potter! Cogginus also taught us how to make a huge testudo and the teachers surprised us by throwing tennis balls and dodgeballs to see how effective our testudo was!

While we were practising KS1 came outside to see our Roman formations, Cogginus said that we were going to scare them so we formed ourselves into a line and we pretended to charge them when we were given the command! We then formed a 'wedge' and marched towards them like Roman soldiers.

We then went back into the learning studio and were able to hold all of the different pieces of Roman equipment. It was a really amazing day and we all learnt a lot!

#### Y3 Giacometti Sculptures

For our Year 3 enterprise event we made Giacometti sculptures. Alberto Giacometti was born on the 10th of October 1901 and he died when he was 64 years old



in January 1966. Giacometti was a famous Swiss artist and he made statues using the shadows of people moving as his inspiration. This is how we made our statues: First, we got 3 pieces of wire to make our person. We then took 1 of the pieces of wire and made a loop. We then twisted the end of the wire round each other not to tight so the second

piece could fit through a gap that was the body. We then wrapped our second piece around as many times as we wanted but we had to make sure it was secure and make sure it was long.

After that, we had to make a knot that was not too tight at the bottom so we could fit our legs in. Then

we wrapped our legs as many times as we wanted so they were whatever length we wanted. After that we had to make our feet horizontal like a right angle. We got some clay and wrapped it around the wire and we made sure it was thin but not too thin otherwise it would crumble. Next we had to smooth it with water so that it wouldn't crack. After a few days, we had to paint it with a mix of paint it and PVA glue that would seal the cracks. We then got a wooden block and sanded it with sanding paper to make sure it was smooth. We then attached our Giacometti to the block. We then created an art gallery to display our amazing statues and invited our parents in to view and buy them. We raised over £120 which will be split between our charity and our year group.

#### Year 5 Microbial Fuel Cell Project 2019

This term. Year 5 began their exciting science project. Five staff members from the University of the West of England came into school to



help the children build MFCs - Microbial Fuel Cells. The children worked in groups of 6 to construct the fuel cells and then they went into the school grounds to collect soil containing bacteria.

Over the next 4 weeks, the children will feed and water the fuel cells, enabling the bacteria to multiply. The cells then produce energy from the bacteria and each day the children measure the voltage generated. Through this project, the children learn the importance of finding new and sustainable ways of producing electricity and, hopefully, by the end of the project, their cells will actually light a small light bulb! An exciting end to the project is a visit to UWE where the children get the opportunity to share their

learning with academics from the university and visit their Robotics Department.

It is a fantastic project and we are really grateful to all of the staff from the university who are coming in to Bailey's Court Primary for the fifth consecutive year to work with our Year 5 children.





#### Year 5 Camp 2019

Just before half term, our children in Year 5 took part in our overnight camping experience on the school field. They spent the Friday of the camp making their own shelters; the main challenge was to make them as waterproof as possible in case it rained!

At the end of the day the children disappeared home for a short while only to return at 6 o'clock to pitch their back up tents and to spend the first part of the evening treasure hunting and taking part in a very competitive game of 'It's a Knockout'. This was followed by a delicious barbeque and a huge camp fire, around which the children took it in turns to sing songs, tell jokes and demonstrate some of the many talents that they had. At approximately 11pm, the children settled down in their shelters for the night, or more accurately, started their midnight feasts. Having eaten their fill, one by one the children started drifting off to sleep and by 4.00am the school field was finally quiet as the last few children drifted

Saturday morning started guite early (at 4.07am more precisely) when the first few individuals woke up and within no time at all, everyone was up collapsing their tents and trying to find their belongings and repack them back into their bags. Soon after it was time for breakfast: bacon sandwiches and rounds of toast which were greatly appreciated by all! The children had a few moments to run around outside before parents began to gather at the gate and it was time for the children to depart for home.

The overnight camp was very successful and we would like to comment as a school, how proud we were of the children who were full of fun and displayed exemplary behaviour throughout the camp. We would like to say a huge thank you to all of the staff of the school who very kindly gave up their time to help look after the children over Friday night - thank you.
