

Community comes together to respond to COVID-19

We are living in unnerving times, as to what the repercussions of COVID-19 might mean. At time of writing, things seem to be changing on a daily basis. As greater numbers of people find it necessary to self isolate, this situation could be devastating for some people who do not have friends or family close by to support them. Thankfully, I am pleased to report, it is not all doom and gloom, droves of local people have stepped up to work together to support our community in anyway they can.

There may well be further groups established than the ones featured in this article, but we are pleased to share information on a few vital support networks in our local area that are determined to do their best for local people.

Facebook Page: COVID-19 Help, Support And Volunteering South Glos and Bristol



Natalie Harrison who set up this support group via Facebook told us, "I founded this group with my friend Matt Palmer. It originally stemmed from an idea to post on our local Facebook page that if anybody needed help with shopping whilst self isolating, just to let us know. We had such a big response to that post that we set up a support page. Over the coming days the group grew and grew to an astounding amount of members (over 4,000 as we went to print on 19th March!), people offering help, people asking for help, even people saying how they felt safer knowing there was help available. We have a dedicated admin team (that I must give a shout out to they're totally invaluable to our team!) creating leaflets, teams for different areas and even offering posts with things like activities to do whilst in isolation. As a whole, the team are totally overwhelmed with the response and kindness of everybody on this page. It's something I can say I'm incredibly proud of and I'm certain I can speak for the whole team in saying that."

It was back in March 2013 that Matters Magazines first paid a visit to the North Bristol foodbank headquarters on Filton Avenue, during their first full year in operation.

As a result of this meeting, our community magazines worked with local schools to run an Easter appeal. I am delighted to report that many of our local schools still organise large collections over Harvest and Easter, in fact, the foodbank told me out of all the schools across Bristol that generously make collections for the charity, it is the schools in the Bradley Stoke, Little Stoke Gifford and Winterbourne areas that donate the most.

It was good to meet with the dedicated North Bristol foodbank team again, who are still working tirelessly for local families. foodbank Manager Matt Dobson took some time out to bring me up to date.

In 2018 the North Bristol foodbanks (Yate, Thornbury, Filton, Horfield, Lockleaze, Patchway, Mangotsfield and Southmead) fed 6,961 people (individuals helped not the number of food packages). In 2019, the same food banks fed 9,500 people, up a staggering 40% from 2018. These figures make tough reading.

A large part of this increase is due to the roll-out of Universal Credit, that sees people have a 5-week waiting period for benefits to come through when they apply or have a change in circumstance.

Matt told me that foodbanks do not want to exist! They will of course not leave people vulnerable who are in the midst of a crisis but a large part of what they do is campaigning to make much needed changes to our welfare state.

The Trussell Trust, who the foodbank is associated with, currently has a campaign Five Weeks Too Long that it would be great if you could support. It only takes a minute to sign up at - www.trusselltrust. org/five-weeks-too-long.



Editor's note: My visit to North Bristol Foodbank took place before the craziness of Coronavirus had set in. Now, more than ever. we need to help to protect the vulnerable in our community. A huge amount of additional people will be suffering from loss of income and inevitably the demand on Foodbanks will go up, at a time when general supplies are being limited through panic buying and potential restocking delays.

Food donations are still extremely welcome, but if you are self-isolating and still wish to support the charity, you can make a monetary donation - no how matter small, it will be greatly appreciated.

The rise in living costs is another key contributor. Rent prices in Bristol and surrounding areas are through the roof. Matt told me that many families find that after paying their rent and fuel costs they only have £20 leftover to cover everything else.

The team is also seeing a sharp rise in people with mental health issues, so as well as offering food, they are working hard to help get them to the right people or organisations to support their overall

The foodbanks take time to talk with people about their individual circumstances and signpost them to the relevant advice centres etc. They currently work with 320 referral agencies.

I asked Matt if the rise in the use of the foodbanks had helped lift the stigma that can come with using these facilities? He told me that, although some press outlets report that 'of course people are going to want to take advantage of free food', that is not the case at all; many are still reluctant. He had met with a lady that week who had been given a food voucher three weeks previously; she had been back and forth in front of the doors of the foodbank but wasn't able to bring herself to go in. When she eventually did, she was relieved and pleased to be met with such a warm, considerate welcome.

Matt explained that people from any walk of life can find themselves in crisis and the foodbanks are here to offer help and support without any judgement.

"We are always so blown away by the support of our local community. We couldn't run foodbank without the people and business owners that live and work in our community. Not only is the physical support through food and financial donations invaluable, but the picture this shows our city of a community uniting together to support the most vulnerable is incredibly powerful"

How can you help?

- Make regular donations of one or two of the items listed (this can cost less than a £1!) to a local drop-off point.
- Support the 5 Week Too long campaign and put pressure on your local MPs by writing to them to demand change to the welfare state.
- Make a financial donation to ensure this good-work can continue.
- Could your local business or community venue become a collection
- Run a fundraiser at a community group or place of work.

The foodbank always welcomes new local groups or businesses to set up as collection points or run fundraiser events; do get in touch with them on the contact details below if you would like any further information on how to go about this.

The North Bristol Foodbank is thankful that they are currently well-covered with 200-300 volunteers that work across the outlets each week.

Matt told me that, although the work is incredibly challenging and the foodbanks are sorry that they have to exist, joy comes from the the incredible support that the community shows the project, it's a community behind a community.

The Bradley Stoke Easter Cross:

In the light of our current international climate, the stark Christian image of the cross, placed each year on the Patchway [Bradley Stoke Way / Brook Way] roundabout will be one of my lasting memories of my time in Bradley Stoke. As I recall this cross - with it's red swathe of cloth on Good Friday and white sheet on Easter Sunday - I'm again drawn to the reason that Christians highlight this symbol as central to our faith in God and our hope that in the midst of death, there is hope of new life.

I say "lasting images" as cross on the roundabout it will be one of my parting images as I leave town for a new post just after Easter. Like many church ministers, my time in Bradley Stoke has been relatively short, but as Jonah found in the record of his life in the Bible - it's best to listen to God first time round and follow his lead.

We live in a climate of international fear, uncertainty and the genuine threat of death in our midst. Whilst Covid19 has not physically hit our town yet, I'm writing this whilst playing a part in making contingency planning arrangements for our churches and community groups. You, our readers, may be some of the many people who are fearful. Not surprising when our daily news is inundated with real life stories of families facing fear, death, hardship, uncertainty, financial pressures, health worries, family tensions. It's not good news.

Hence I'm drawn to put the spotlight on the Christian symbol of the cross, signalling the Christian claim that Jesus paves the way for new life - good news of hope amidst the shadow of death. This is good news - the best news we can imagine - that fear will not win, that death is not the end, that new life is beginning. The white cloth on the cross on Easter Sunday is a symbol of this hope - faith in Jesus brings a promise of new life beyond the threat of death. Christian faith believes that, as we live in the light of Jesus overcoming death, our lives are transformed, made new. It's a big claim, but many know it to be a true and liberating experience.

It's in the light that I recall some amazing people in Bradley Stoke - people who have [started to] overcome their hardships, worries, fears, uncertainties, dreadful experiences by trusting God to transform their broken lives and make them whole again. It's been a privilege to see



deep sadnesses transformed into a growing hopefilled joy.

In our present climate, we have time and opportunity to ask ourselves "how do I want to live?" - a time to re-assess our priorities. No-one is wholly protected from the invisible enemy of the Covid19 virus - and we will all be wise to take the physical advice from our governments and medical experts. But we can receive protection from fear and despair, from selfishness and exaggeration, from succumbing to false hopes that pitch us into cynicism and despair. If that's a choice you are looking to make as the cross of Easter is pitched again over our town, you might like to join with Christians across the land and across the nations in praying like this [borrowed from the Church of South India]:

God our Father, by whose mercy the world turns safely into darkness and returns again to light:

we place in your hands our unfinished tasks, our unsolved problems, and our unfulfilled hopes.

knowing that only what you bless will prosper.

To your love and protection we commit each other and all those we love, knowing that you alone are our sure defender,

through Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen

As part of the Bradley Stoke Town Festival, this year's 10K race is schedule to take place on Sunday 7th June


This brilliant annual event is so popular that this year it COMPLETELY SOLD OUT in less than 5 hours of entries opening!

Local Headteacher to take on a Marathon in aid of Alzheimer's Phil Winterburn, Head Teacher, Wheatfield Primary School

On 26th April I was planning to be running The London Marathon (my first marathon) to support the amazing work of The Alzheimer's Society. This is my first marathon and (I think) represents a decent level of challenge for someone closer to his fifth multiple of ten than his fourth!

With the run now being postponed until October, I'm aiming to turn this into a positive - I want to run the marathon in Bristol on the original date with a couple of friends (assuming we are not all locked down). I will then also run it in October - this gives more

time to raise even more cash!

I have chosen to support The Alzheimer's Society as my mum has sadly suffered with this dreadful disease for over ten years and I have witnessed the amazing work this charity does in supporting those affected (and their families).

I'd welcome the opportunity to tell you a little more about this disease, the impact it has on those affected and the sense of loss experienced by friends and family as the disease takes hold.

My Mum's story is really a family story with my dad wearing the superhero cape and my brother and I occasionally pulling our underpants over our jeans as his hapless sidekicks! Truth be told, calling this a family story is also misrepresenting it - it's a community story - a people story.

Mum was barely sixty when Alzheimer's first appeared. From what I've read and heard, there are many ways in which Alzheimer's manifests itself and evolves over time - each person's experience is, in many ways, unique. Alongside this, anyone who has a loved one affected by Alzheimer's will have their own perspective on the disease - this is mine.

This story starts with a happy beginning. All is well - memories are made, conversations ignite opinions, calendars are juggled, arrangements re-arranged, influence is exerted, suggestions crafted, social cues read, rounds of drinks memorised and delivered, cupboards stocked,



cobwebs spotted and swept, journeys are planned, appointments kept, books balanced - all is well in your world.

Against this backdrop, Alzheimer's creeps in: a shadow. To begin with it masquerades as the 'easily explained' - a repeated question could just be tiredness or good, old-fashioned, inattentiveness. No one spots the shadow as it cloaks your loved one. enveloping their mind in its inky void.

Over time the shadow becomes a hole - a deep well with a fierce gravitational pull. Invisible tendrils

snake from the well and begin pulling at your loved one, dragging them towards the darkness. Now you know Alzheimer's is in your world - you cling on, you hold tight, you plug the hole with love and time and tenderness but its appetite is insatiable. Alzheimer's keeps tugging - cruelly tenacious, malevolently resilient - knowing its victory is ultimately assured.

I know this sounds bleak but there's a point to it. There's no cure for Alzheimer's. There's no treatment proven to slow its progress. But there are people working on it and there are organisations - The Alzheimer's Society being just one - who, not only enable this research, but also support people with the disease and. equally importantly, the many family members who care for them.

This story also has a happy ending. Mum is still with us. Alzheimer's has taken her cognition, her speech and, most-recently, her mobility but it can't take her spirit - the glint in her eye, a smile which radiates sheer joy and a subtle change in posture which implies she simply wants to give my dad 'a good telling off'! The story is still being written and now you can be a part of it by supporting my challenge, so, from all the Winterburns, thank you. Knowing I have your support will make each mile just a little easier!

Painful Feet?

Pooja Sharma, Podiatrist at Bradley Stoke Physio & Health, shares some tips for fitter feet!



101 Things to Do

before your leave Bailey's Court Primary School!

This term at Bailey's Court Primary School, we have launched an exciting new project. We are calling it '101 things to do before you leave Bailey's Court Primary School'. Our idea was inspired by conversations we've had in school and an initiative that we've borrowed from the National Trust! As we all know, children benefit hugely from playing together with friends and family, experiencing new things, building relationships with nature, being challenged physically and having fun! None of these ideas are new but our project will offer a series of challenges for all of our children from Reception to Year 6 that will build, amongst other things, resilience, a sense of responsibility and some fabulous memories.



We have put together twenty-five challenges for each year group that range from 'catching a falling leaf' and 'learning and performing a nursery rhyme' in Reception to 'cooking a meal on an open fire' and 'planting a tree' in Year 6. Some of the challenges are designed to be done exclusively at home, others are designed with school in mind.

Children and parents can together choose which challenges they would like to do and each year group has a target of either 14 or 15 challenges to complete (depending on their age) which will give a grand total of 101 at the end of Y6! The children have already completed one challenge at school recently and this created a wonderfully busy and creative atmosphere across the school with many children trying something brand new for the first time including:

Reception	Making a leaf rubbing
Y1	Making a fizzing volcano (photo right)
Y2	Mask making
Y3	Learning to play a game of cards
Y4	Writing and performing a poem
Y5	Making bird feeders
Y6	Researching and making a presentation about an endangered animal

At the end of each year, the children can earn a special award building towards a special presentation at the end of Y6.

Air Cadets take to the skies

Basck in January, three air cadets from 37 Squadron **Frampton Cotterell got** a chance to fly over the Bristol channel and take the controls of a light aircraft.

We are also planning a special VE tea dance for children and parents on Thursday 7th May.



Exciting new play equipment at Bowsland Green Primary School

A space known as 'The green area' has been transformed at local primary school, Bowsland Green. The space previously housed a wooden boat which had been in place at the school for close to 25 years.

The Headteacher and Friends of Bowsland Green set themselves an ambitious target to get this space transformed. Thanks to the support of families, fundraising events raised a massive £9,000 towards the project. Headteacher, Mrs Engley, was successful in obtaining a £10.000 National Lottery Grant too. The Young Leadership Team (seen in the photos) were part of the design process, gathering views from their class mates about the type of equipment they would like to see and the reasons why.

The equipment is designed and built by local play equipment company, Pentagon Play. Becky Hazell from the company has worked closely with the school at every stage to make sure the space is being optimized in the best way. Mrs Engley explained that a big focus of the project was to promote purposeful talk through play. We are fortunate to have a diverse school community and many children join the school with English as an additional language. Play is a universal language, it has been a pleasure to see new friendships being formed as the children engage in play together.





Physical play is important in the fight of childhood obesity, Mrs Engley shared that the new equipment features pieces that encourage the children to develop their upper body and core strength.

The children and staff were delighted when Bradley Stoke Mayor, Tom Aditya joined them to cut the ribbon and officially open the new play equipment. Despite the stormy conditions, all children made it outside to celebrate. Mayor Aditya then spent time visiting each classroom, talking to the pupils and finding out more about what makes their school so brilliant.

Mrs Engley, The Friends of Bowsland Green and the children have already started work on their next project, transforming a corner of the playground into a sensory garden. The fence is almost up and the children are thinking carefully about the things they would like to be included.

Our sustainability squad spoke with our caretaker, Mr Irwin and he has transformed the wood from the old boat into planter boxes which will be used in the space. Alongside this, fundraising has begun to add an imagination station to the new play area. we are planning to have this in place before the summer break Mrs Engley told us hopefully.

The school is 25 years old this year and there are some excellent fundraising plans in the place to celebrate!



Running for MS with MS 10 Years, 10 London Marathons

To say that David Elliott has the running bug is an understatement. Running his tenth London Marathon for the tenth consecutive year, London 2020 will also be David Elliott's final London Marathon. It will also be an extra special marathon as he will be joined by his two daughter's Ollie (21) and Meg Elliott (18).

David was diagnosed with Multiple Sclerosis when Ollie was 2 years old and Meg just a week old. Realising the health benefits that running could bring him, David started his running journey and in 2011 was ready to take part in his first London Marathon. Since then he has run in every London Marathon. He has also run the Edinburgh, Dublin, Paris, Manchester, Berlin, Snowdonia, Exeter and New York marathons.

"Being fit, I believe, helps when I have a relapse of my MS. When I am 100% fit it normally gives me a good basepoint so that when I have a relapse I get well quicker. Running is also a great way to escape from the real world for some time, either with a group of runners, music, podcast or even just the sound of outdoor life. It's a great way to de-stress. I leave the mobile at home and get some fresh air. Strangely enough, when I am really tired a quick half hour run energises me more than an hour nap."

To mark his final London Marathon, David will be running with his daughters and they have set a fundraising target of £10,000. This will be split equally between The West of England MS Therapy Centre, part of The Brightwell, MS Trust and MS Society

Ollie (21), who is in her 3rd year studying Sport and Exercise Medical Sciences at Exeter University, is a keen runner who completed her first marathon in 2019 in a very respectable 3hrs 44 minutes. In 2020 she is training to beat her dad's personal best of 3 hours 33 minutes set in 2014.

Meg (18) is in her first year studying Law at Birmingham University. She is not such a keen runner, but has accepted her Dad's challenge to run with him on his tenth and final London Marathon on the 26th April 2020.



Team Elliott will be training at local park runs that are held every Saturday across Bristol and the South West. If you see them, make sure to go and say hello and run along with them. After all, running is a great way of meeting new friends, supporting one another and improving your overall health.

Mother awarded £400,000 as compensation for "relationship-generated disadvantage" in divorce case

Josephine tasker of AMD Solicitors discusses the case of RC v JC.

A recent family court decision, RC v JC generated heightened press attention because a mother who had sacrificed a potentially lucrative career for her family and to care for her children, was awarded compensation of £400,000 in divorce proceedings, in addition to an equal split of the assets totalling nearly £10 million.

Mr Justice Moor found that there had been sufficient "relationship-generated disadvantage" to justify the award of compensation to the wife. However, he stressed that the judgment should not be taken as a 'green-light' for such claims, but restated the case that compensation still exists in truly exceptional circumstances.

How does the court determine how to distribute assets on a divorce or dissolution?

That starting point is laid down in s.25 of the Matrimonial Causes Act 1973. The court has a duty to consider "all the circumstances of the case". whilst giving the first consideration to the welfare of any children who have not reached the age of 18. Thereafter, the court is directed to take into account a range of factors:

- Financial resources of the parties (including) incomes, earning capacity, property and other financial resources such as pension provision)
- Financial needs, obligations and responsibilities
- The standard of living enjoyed within the marriage
- The ages of the parties and duration of the marriage
- Any physical or mental disability of either party
- The contribution each party has made or is likely to make in the foreseeable future to the welfare of the family
- The conduct of each party (where such conduct is so serious it would be inequitable to disregard it)
- result of the divorce (such as loss of pension

principles: needs, compensation and sharing and the courts will have regard to these principles when considering the s.25 factors, where their ultimate objective is to reach a fair outcome.






