Caring during COVID – Making carers visible on Carers' Week #CaringBehindClosedDoors

Carers Week 8 - 14 June is an annual campaign to raise awareness of caring and highlight the challenges carers face. Carers don't choose to become carers and many don't even see themselves as carers. Throughout the COVID-19 outbreak, family carers have continued to provide unpaid crucial care to their loved ones, with little to no support.

Care is usually provided behind closed doors, in people's homes and is largely invisible to the general public and support services. This hasn't changed during the pandemic. While COVID-19 has very rightly reminded us all of the crucial role of NHS staff and keyworkers, family carers have been largely forgotten. The role of carers has never been more crucial. Yet, while the challenges carers face have increased, their role remains invisible. The majority of carers are struggling alone and do not know that help is available to them.

Carers Support Centre is working locally to support carers of all ages through this very challenging time. Services include information and advice, carers assessments, counselling, befriending, employment support, virtual carers' groups, online training, and the Carers' Emergency Card. On Thursday 11th

June, the charity is also holding its first ever online Carers' Open Meeting. Visit their website for more details.

Recent research from Carers UK has found, since the pandemic started, carers are providing 10 additional hours of care per week. The average figure is now a staggering 65 hours per week, with 70% of carers providing more care due to local services reducing or closing. This has been particularly hard for certain groups, such as those caring for someone with a learning disability, autism, or dementia.

This Carers Week, join Carers Support Centre in recognising the massive contribution carers make to families and communities across the UK. St Michael's Church in Lockdown

At St Michael's, it's been really important for us to continue serving our community, as well making worship and prayer accessible for all.

We've been live-streaming Sunday worship every week at 10:30am on our Youtube channel, as well as Morning Prayer on Facebook twice a week. Our Easter services all took place online, and we are still doing monthly traditional Evensong too. We also have fortnightly online Sunday Evening Worship.

It's been great to see so many people join in with online worship, some for the first time.

We had started our live-stream just before full lockdown, and we have loved seeing this evolve, with everyone learning and adapting along the way.

We are staying connected with children and young people through online activities. And our youth team have just launched a special St Mike's Minecraft!

For those in our church family who don't have internet access or are vulnerable and shielding, we set up a Pastoral Buddy initiative. This has encouraged connection and helped people feel cared for.

We've been staying connected with care and retirement homes in the parish too, with special acts of worship from the Stoke Gifford Retirement car park, for residents to hear from their rooms and balconies.

Perhaps above everything else, we wanted to serve the community, supporting people prayerfully, pastorally and practically during lockdown. In April we delivered postcards to all



homes in the parish, letting people know about our online services, and that we are here to help. Using a team of volunteers, as well as staff members, we've been helping in ways such as collecting shopping and prescriptions.

Our popular Old School Rooms Coffee Shop, and St Michael's Venue Hire have both been closed in line with government guidance. However, we hope to reopen both from July, ensuring social distancing. Venue hire will be for smaller conferences/meetings only.St Michael's Preschool and Nursery has been open for children of keyworkers, and will also be opening further in line with government guidance.

Extracts from the South Gloucestershire Council's Latest Bulletin as at 27th May

Confirmed cases in South Gloucestershire

As of 27 May, the official figures show 400 confirmed cases of Covid-19 in South Gloucestershire. The national picture is a total of 267.240 UK cases. The Department of Health and Social Care now publishes its daily announced figures on deaths from Covid-19 for the UK in a new series that uses improved data for England, produced by Public Health England (PHE). These figures now provide a count of all deaths where a positive test for Covid-19 has been confirmed, wherever that death has taken place. Total UK deaths are 37,460 (coronavirus.data.gov.uk).

Mortgage payment holiday extended

Homeowners struggling to pay their mortgage because of Covid-19 will be able to extend their mortgage payment holiday for a further three months, or start making reduced payments, in proposals published last Friday (22 May).

The availability of a three-month mortgage holiday was first announced in March as part of a package of support for individuals, businesses and the economy. Over 1.8 million mortgage payment holidays were taken up, and the first of these will be coming to an end in June.

Shops to re-open

The government has announced a timeline for retailers re-opening from 1st June:

Outdoor markets and car showrooms will be able to re-open from 1 June, as soon as they are able to meet the Covid-19 secure guidelines to protect shoppers and workers.

All other non-essential retail will be expected to be able to re-open from 15th June if the government's five tests are met and they follow the Covid-19 secure guidelines. This gives them three weeks to prepare.

Businesses will only be able to open from these dates once they have completed a risk assessment, in consultation with trade union representatives or workers, and are confident they are managing the risks. They must have taken the necessary steps to become Covid-19 secure in line with the current Health and Safety legislation.

Re-opening schools and early years settings

The government has asked early years providers to open for all of their intake from 1 June. Primary schools have been asked to open more widely to pupils from nursery, reception and Years 1 and 6, where it is safe to do so from 1 June.

All South Gloucestershire Early Years settings, primary and secondary schools are risk assessing their sites in relation to the need for social distancina.

We have prepared some questions and answers for parents and carers on what to expect and how to prepare your child for increased contact with schools/settings as they anticipate re-opening. You can read this via the southglos.gov.uk website.

The government has issued guidance to secondary schools with an expectation that they will begin to re-open to Year 10 and Year 12 pupils from 15 June, with a quarter of a year group in school at any one time.

Recycling and waste update

Our Sort It recycling centres are now open for all types of waste except clothing, shoes and textiles which we can't recycle at the moment. Little Stoke is still closed. We have made some changes to maintain social distancing on site and have arranged temporary extended opening hours from 6am to 6pm. We're experiencing high levels of demand so please do hold onto your waste and recycling if you can and visit us in a few weeks. The reuse shop at Thornbury is currently closed.

Household recycling and waste collections are all running as usual, with weekly food and recycling collections and fortnightly black waste. Some days, it's taking our crews a bit longer to get round so please don't report a missed bin until the day after your usual collection day.


Garden waste collections are all running as usual. For those who missed out because of the pause in service, we added five weeks onto the subscription to make up for the lost time. We're also taking new subscriptions which are £30 per year (or £15 if receiving certain benefits).

Optometrists urge lockdown DIY caution

Optometrists are urging DIY enthusiasts to take extra care to avoid eye injuries as home improvement projects prove popular during lockdown.

An estimated 200,000 eye injuries are caused by DIY mishaps every year and Specsavers opticians throughout the UK have treated patients for an array of incidents in the last few weeks – from foreign objects to chemical burns.

Gaurav Patel, store director at Specsavers Bradley Stoke, says: 'We often see a spike in these types of accidents with the warmer weather, so as lockdown-DIY becomes popular it's no surprise to see a number of patients contacting us with these types of injuries. Indeed, some stores have reported treating up to three DIY-eye injuries in a single day.

'It is important that you are cautious and pay close attention when you are carrying out any activity which might lead to something going into the eye, such as chopping firewood, pruning in the garden, drilling or grinding and that suitable eye protection is worn. In the event that an injury occurs, you can call us on 01454 275020 and we'll be able to discuss the best course of action with you.'

Specsavers stores, in line with government guidelines, have suspended routine testing during lockdown, but emergency and essential eye care is still available to those in need.

In a UK first, Specsavers has launched a free nationwide sight and hearing consultation service offering access to vital advice and care from optometrists and audiologists, via video and telephone link. As well as RemoteCare, anyone concerned about their eye and hearing health can access care through a variety of ways, including 'Specsavers Ask the Expert' public group on Facebook and the Specsavers website care hub. Customers who have an existing prescription can buy glasses and contact lenses online at specsavers.co.uk



For general queries about glasses, contact lenses or hearing aids; including replacements or repairs, customers can still call the store and they will be able to help.

Below, Guarav provides advice on DIY danger areas and on the action you should take if you do have an eye injury – but stresses prevention is better than cure and says suitable eye protection is the real solution.

DIY EYE HAZARDS

Trimming the hedge: 'Twigs in the eye are incredibly common – sometimes people may fail to notice the tip of a branch as they lean over to prune a hedge or push piles of twigs into the bin. This can cause anything from small scratches to ripping off layers of the cornea which can be extremely painful.'

Mowing and strimming: 'Watch out for objects hidden in your lawn that could be caught up and spat out by your lawnmower or strimmer, like roque clothes pegs for example.'

Handling irritants: 'It's so important to avoid touching or rubbing your eye as there are chemicals which can burn the eye and even plants that can cause severe allergic reactions. We have treated reactions that have caused significant swelling or have caused tiny blood vessels to leak and cause extreme redness.'

Power tools and pressure washers: 'Take extra care using power tools and pressure washers that can cause foreign objects to fly into the eye at speed. We once treated a man who had used electric shearers on a hedge concealing a wire fence – he thought it was a piece of bark that was

causing his eye pain but when we examined him we realised it was actually a small piece of metal which had lodged itself right inside his eye.'

Paint, solvents and chemicals: 'Paint can contain chemicals that are severe irritants while substances with a high alcohol content – even alcohol-based hand gel for example – can be a real danger as it can remove the epithelium... the layer of tissue that covers the cornea.' Strong alkalis such as caustic soda and wet plaster and cement are also very harmful to the eyes.

Joinery: 'This can be a key culprit of foriegn objects in the eye. Don't risk hammering without safety googles on as it's so easy for a nail or flint to spark back up into the eye'.

DIY SOS: WHAT TO DO

Foreign object in eye: 'The more you blink the more damage you can potentially cause. Imagine it like a leaf stuck on your windscreen wipers... it will keep scraping and scratching. Try to flush it out, and if need be use your eyelashes to lift the eyelid off the surface of your eye while you do so. See your optician who can swab to remove the foreign body and apply an antibiotic ointment to help prevent infection and lubricate the eye with a gel or ointment for up to three months to prevent a recurrence of the scratch.'

Chemicals or solvents in the eye: 'Irrigate, irrigate, irrigate, irrigate, irrigate! It's essential to flush out the eye immediately with water. Tilt your head so the water runs across your eye towards your ear... you don't want it running in the other direction where it could potentially transfer chemicals into your other eye. Alkali substances are so



dangerous that time really is of the essence - so use any water source you have to hand and flush out for a good 20-30 minutes as well as seeking urgent medical assistance.'

Cuts: 'If you get a cut on the outside of your eye, on your eyelid for example, clean it out and treat it like you would with any other scratch – keeping it clean and dry and applying antiseptic ointment if need be – and attend A&E if you think stitches are required. If, however, the cut or scratch is on the eyeball itself and is causing pain or visual disturbance you should definitely seek help from an optician.'

Black eye: 'Many black eyes will heal by themselves within a few weeks but if you do experience problems with your vision, issues focussing up close, pain in reaction to light or distortion of lines, speak to your optician. In extreme circumstances a significant bump could cause iritis, retinal detachment or bruising of the layer beneath the retina.'

Perforated eyeball: 'While some eye injuries may cause an eye to water, a perforated eyeball is much more serious and can release fluid from inside the eyeball, reducing the pressure in the eye and may cause severe infection which can travel to the brain. If the eyeball is perforated your vision will usually be severely reduced (only able to see movement, or possibly nothing at all). This is a medical emergency and we'd recommend going straight to hospital for treatment.'





Almondsbury Charity

(REGISTERED CHARITY No. 202263)

Almondsbury Charity is a charity which provides help to people and organisations within the local area.

The origin dates back to medieval times when various benefactors made bequests for the benefit of the poor and needy and for the repair and maintenance of the churches within the parish.

In succeeding years, with the agreement of the Charity Commission changes have been made to enable the trustees to meet requests which are appropriate to the needs of modern society.



To benefit from the charity, individuals and organisations must reside or be located within the boundaries of the parish of Almondsbury that existed in 1881. Today this includes Almondsbury, Patchway (including Charlton Hayes), Pilning, Easter Compton and Bradley Stoke, north of Tesco.

The Charity's income is derived from a capital sum which is professionally managed and is paid annually. The net income is divided between the two funds; 60% is used for Education and Relief and 40% for the Upkeep of the local Churches. The Charity is managed by 12 trustees who are representative of the local community.

The Education and Relief Fund is available to help individuals who are in need because of illness or financial hardship. In particular the trustees are always pleased to receive requests from the elderly.

The trustees can also provide support for those, under the age of 30, looking to further their education,

Community Fridge

A simple way of sharing food that would otherwise go to waste

The 19th May saw the one year anniversary of volunteers at Cafe Church in Amberley Road, Stoke Lodge launching their fabulous Community Fridge initiative. In that year they have saved 1000s of kgs of food from going to waste and fed lots of tummies with it instead!

The idea of the Community Fridge came from the realisation of just how much food is wasted by the food industry every week just because it reaches it sell-by date - 1.9million tonnes each year! Meanwhile 8.4million people struggle to afford (healthy) food.

Cafe Church volunteers have therefore arranged to collect food from local supermarkets and food retailers that they would otherwise be throwing out. This food has passed its best before date but is usually still good enough to eat. The contents of the fridge are checked regularly, but ultimately it is up to the person taking the food to check it's ok. No food passed its sell by date is allowed.

As well as collecting from food retailers, people can also put food into the fridge. For example if you grow your own vegetables and have surplus to requirements or if you are going away on holiday. As long as the food is still good enough to eat it can be put in the fridge.

Things have been a bit different through the lockdown, with the community fridge initially having to close in March, but the volunteers managed to re-open from the end of April with social distancing measures in place and have kept stocks replenished as far as possible over recent weeks.

To further help during the lockdown volunteers have made up selections of food, making it quicker and easier for people to collect and just pick up a bag of supplies, keeping vigilent about current social distancing rules. They have also made up 'care packages' full of essentials and snacks for those still living on the streets or in shelters, which the amazing volunteers of Blonde Angel street team have then handed out to those in need. A fantastic community effort.

The fridge is there for absolutely everyone to use!

The Community Fridge is 'Free for All' but not 'A Free for All'!

There is a suggested limit of 5 items per person, it is run on a trust basis by volunteers. Please be respectful of others.

Supplies vary and totally depend upon what is available to the volunteers at the time of their collections. There are regular updates on the Facebook page - @CafeChurchBristol.

The fridge's usual opening hours are 9.30-5pm Monday- Friday, staying open later until 8 on a Wednesday, 10-1pm on a Sunday.

These hours have differed over the lockdown so do check the facebook page for updates - @CafeChurchBristol.

Hello everyone, I hope you have all been keeping safe and well in this very different time! Like so many of us my Holistic Health Clinic in Little Stoke had to close on 23rd March and so too did the classroom. Social distancing is not really possible as a holistic health practitioner and teacher of holistic therapies!

However I did start to run the teaching courses online, with great results! So much so that I have decided to offer more virtual online classes through the summer and am planning (hopefully) to start back in the physical classroom from the end of August onwards. See below for what I can offer:

Online courses, these are ongoing and will go ahead when I have minimum of 5 people registered for each course, they are held in Zoom.

Please contact me for how to register and pay and let me know which class time suits you.

REIKI

Introduction to Reiki - free Monday 3-4pm

Reiki 1 - £70 over 2 sessions (same day over 2 weeks) Mondays 7-9pm or Fridays 2-4pm

Reiki 2 - £90 over 2 session (same day over 2 weeks) Tuesdays 2-4pm or Wednesdays 6-8pm I will need to see a copy of your Reiki 1 certificate if you haven't previously completed it with me

Reiki Master - £225 over 2 sessions (same day over 2 weeks) Tuesdays 7-9pm or Wednesdays 2-4pm

I will need to see a copy of your Reiki 2 certificate if you haven't previously completed it with me and you will need to be a Reiki practitioner, we will need to discuss whether you are ready to go to this level, prior to booking.

There will be a third session for your attunement for each of the above levels on a 1-2-1 basis, which will be put in the diary after the teaching is completed.

Ongoing "circle sessions" will also be set up after each course.

AROMATHERAPY

Introduction to Aromatherapy - free Wednesday 4.30 - 5.30pm

Aromatherapy level 1 - £90 (there is an additional charge if you want to have this assessed so you can use it in practice setting) Thursdays 6-8pm. There will be 5 sessions starting 18/06/20.

Introduction to Reflexology - free Monday 4-5pm Reflexology level 1 £90 (there is an additional charge if you want to have this assessed to use it in practice setting) This will start once a video can be made of the thumb movements on the feet.



Memorial Woodlands Move Towards Larger Funeral Services

Bristol Memorial Woodlands is now able to offer larger scale funeral services depending on the number of households involved. Congregations of between 20 and 30 people can now be accommodated in the chapel and rooms at the woodland burial grounds near Alveston, just outside of Bristol, with careful planning to keep households separate.

In keeping with the guidance, which is under constant review, Bristol Memorial Woodlands has been able to arrange for the required spacing to be possible in its chapel. The funeral directors, working with each family, are able to ensure that social distancing between different households can be maintained during services while allowing the maximum number of people to attend.

Christopher Baker, who founded Bristol Memorial Woodlands, where a woodland nature reserve is being created with trees planted in memory of those buried there, said:

"For some weeks now we have been restricted to a maximum of 10 people at a funeral but the relaxing of regulations, and with planning over seating, we can now accommodate between 20 and 30 people, depending on the households involved.



"Throughout the pandemic we have been offering people an opportunity to come back later in the year to have a memorial service after a small-scale burial service. The time is not yet right for us to start booking those services but we can offer some comfort to those organising a funeral now. It has been terribly distressing for families not being able to say goodbye properly to their loved ones. The great comfort that we can offer is that the woodlands will be here for all time. managed by our charitable trust, so people will be able to come back in the future, gather under the trees near their loved one, picnic and remember lives well lived."

Bristol Memorial Woodlands contains dedicated Muslim and Jewish burial grounds and are also supporting these communities through the current restrictions. More information on the new half day funerals can be obtained by calling Luke on 01454 414999 or Ella, at Westbury-on-Trym, on 0117 9504100.



Saving an un-known endangered animal

When people think of endangered animals, they probably think of the white rhino, pandas or leatherback turtles, but unfortunately, there is an animal in danger that people simply do not know exists. Have you ever heard of a pangolin? I doubt it.

It's time to find out more about these curious creatures.





The name Pangolin comes from the Malay word 'penggulung' which means roller, because they curl into a ball if distressed or under attack. Pangolins are often mistaken for reptiles but they are actually scaly mammals, which eat

termites and ants. They are fully armoured with scales from head to tail and their large scales, which make up 20% of their body weight, are made of keratin (like rhino horns) making them desirable in the illegal trade. In 1 year alone, over 1 million pangolins were poached and trafficked to China, where the meat is considered a delicacy and their scales are traded to be used in traditional medicine.

There are 8 species of pangolin, 4 in Africa and 4 in Asia. All are endangered or critically endangered. A pangolin only weighs 4-7lbs. It is nocturnal and eats 70 million ants per year using a tongue that is longer than its entire body.

Unfortunately, Pangolins are known to carry a strain of the coronavirus. It is not the exact one currently proving so deadly to humans, but by ensuring there is a complete ban on poaching and trafficking them, the threat of it spreading to humans is less likely.

What can be done to save these creatures?

Even though there are laws in place to protect the trafficking of pangolins, they are still in demand and in decline. They are heading for extinction if something is not done to save them. People can buy a cuddly pangolin or donate money directly to WWF to raise funds to support this cause.

Enjoying the outdoors

Contributor Louisa Tickner-Jenkins has worked in the early years sector for 30 years, and been a childminder for the last 14 years

As I write this, we are 8 weeks into the lockdown and the restrictions are slowly beginning to lift. We are now allowed to go out for exercise more than once a day and venture a bit further, still adhering to social distancing requirements.

I was reflecting recently about what have been some of the key aspects of usual activity that young children have been restricted on. With playgrounds closed many children will not have had many opportunities for climbing and playing on swings or roundabouts, especially if you do not have a garden or those kind of play resources in your garden. Heading out to the woods provides great opportunities for children to climb and balance. We are extremely blessed to have a

number of local woodland areas and spending time in woodlands can be very calming for children. There are often fallen branches or tree trunks for children to balance along and you can have lots of fun searching for a climbing tree. Make sure you do a quick risk assessment of climbing opportunities, for example, that all the branches are 'live' so they do not snap and that you are able to keep your child within reach in case they need help. Ensure the tree is a very established tree so that you do not damage it.

Being outdoors can really help children engage their senses.

take full advantage of a cloudy day, find a space to lie down and cloud watch. Encourage children to use their imagination to see pictures in the clouds. Use water and a paintbrush to 'paint' your own clouds on the ground and see how long it takes for them to evaporate. Play a game where everyone closes their eyes and listens carefully to what they can hear, with older children see if they can hear different bird song, perhaps record the bird song and then search online to see if you can identify the bird and then head out again with some binoculars or homemade binoculars

for some bird spotting. Play 'guess the object'. children close their eyes and you ask them to feel an object and quess what

it is, for example a twig, leaf, pine cone, stone, shell. You can play the memory game with the same objects where one item is removed and the child guesses which one is missing. Make up a scavenger hunt or search online for one to download. If you have an abundance of plants/

> flowers growing in your garden make potions and explore the smells they create, or buy some flowers from the shops that are on sale and use those.

Being outdoors provides a great opportunity for collecting 'loose parts' to play with. Loose Parts is a term used to describe a collection of objects/materials that provide opportunities for children to explore their own learning with no pre-planned use, rather than 'toys' that may have a prescribed way to play with them. With loose parts children can combine, redesign, line up, take

apart, move, in multiple ways to explore and play with. If you are taking 'loose parts' home from nature ensure the children are not picking live plants/branches/leaves but collecting found items, for example fallen twigs, pine cones, acorns, fallen leaves. Ensure you supervise children fully so they do not pick mushrooms for example that maybe harmful. Loose parts play is something we can do at home either indoors or outdoors. How often do we hear that a child played for hours with the cardboard box a tov arrived in. Collect empty cereal boxes and other boxes of various sizes. empty pots with lids, jam jar lids, pebbles, to



name but a few, and store these alongside your

child's toys this can breathe new life into toys that had lost interest value for a child.

We can create pictures and patterns from found objects, if children would like to create something, a piece of card, a glue stick or double-sided tape enables creations to be more permanent. If you search 'loose parts' online you will come across a plethora of ideas of what to collect, setting items out so they are inviting for children, and more focused activity ideas using loose parts. Having an old sheet available to make a den over a washing line in the garden, or look in the shed for spare pieces of wood that can be painted to make a road track, or spare guttering for water play, balls, cars. Use loose parts for pretend camping in the garden, make a tent/den, build a pretend fire, make pretend food from stones, sticks, leaves. The story Alfie's Shop is a lovely example of loose parts play in the outdoors. The possibilities are really endless, but always ensure any loose parts do not have sharp edges, and anything that presents a choking hazard is not left available for children to help themselves but played with under close supervision and then packed away again.

The troop are averaging 29 members per session and on top of these weekly sessions are camping in their own gardens with cooking and activities, taking part in Lego Challenges, badge designs for the new way of scouting and also baking, doing badges, hiking to the moon and even an Easter Egg



"The weekly zoom sessions are fab and the challenges such as highest newspaper tower or junk model robot are keeping the scouts busy. To be honest I think the leaders are having as much fun as the scouts are." Andrew Phelps, Scout Leader

The first time we held the zoom session it was great to see everyone, we chatted and laughed and joked. The parents joined in and comments were made that it was the best fun they'd done since lockdown and it was nice for a bit of normality. We've invested six new scouts into the troop and renewed our Scout Promise on St. George's Day whilst also clapping for the essential workers.

For Mental Health Awareness Week late in May, the leaders at OSR built a website 'Worry Box' for our scouts. Each scout has registered and can leave messages when they need to. This is because before lock down we had a physical worry box at the Old School Rooms that the scouts could leave a post-it note in for the designated leader to read and give a reply if needed. We are hoping that this will help the scouts during this time to share their worries and talk about them with a scout leader if necessary. As we write this we have already had a few worries left on the website, to which we have been able to give helpful advice and ease the scouts from worrying.

The no face-to-face has meant scrapping a fun filled and packed summer programme of expeditions, dragon boating and much, much more but the scouts and scouting has adapted and everyone is safe and staying home.

Meeting up after this is all over will be awesome!!



Supporting disabled people through Covid-19

The recent COVID-19 pandemic has seen Paul's Place day facility in Coalpit Heath close until it is safe to re-open. Despite this, the charity continues to offer care and support for their Members (those who use their services) and in the last two months has been busier than ever.

Since the announcement that the day facility was to close, the team took just 24 hours to create the Emergency Response Project and have continued to support disabled people and their carers during the crisis.

Since the end of March Paul's Place launched its telephone befriending service and between then and mid-May has already made 1,880 calls offering the service 7 days a week to those in most need.

In addition to this Paul's Place has partnered with Southern Brooks, South Gloucestershire CVS and South Gloucestershire Council in providing mutual support to people. They have also been getting food parcels out and helping with the collection of prescriptions.

CEO Daniel Cheesman states, "Paul's Place started with a group of compassionate individuals seeing a need in their local community and this still continues to motivate all our staff here today. I am so proud that we have been able to respond so quickly but I want us to do more. The reality is that for many disabled people the impact of coronavirus is going to be felt for a long time yet. We need to ensure that people remain connected with others."

Paul's Place is planning for the next few months as it continues to support individuals who are high risk due to living alone or having other support needs. Telephone calls are a lifeline as are the increasing online services that Paul's Place is offering people.

Daniel also said 'Staving connected virtually, via things like Zoom and other such platforms is now



the new normal for people and we are working tirelessly to ensure that people can still see their friends, stay connected and live their lives to the full, even in lockdown,'

In order to fund this vital work Paul's Place has launched an Emergency Appeal so that it is able to keep on supporting physically disabled people in the coming months.

Clair, responsible for the campaign has said, "We have been blown away by the support that we have already seen and a lot of money has already been raised by our Members and their carers. It really will make a difference to the work that we will be doing in the coming months. This lockdown will be the reality for many of the people we support for a while longer. To sustain this level of support, we are looking to the local community and asking people to donate whatever they can afford."



Mother awarded £400,000 as compensation for "relationship-generated disadvantage" in divorce case

Josephine tasker of AMD Solicitors discusses the case of RC v JC.

A recent family court decision, RC v JC generated heightened press attention because a mother who had sacrificed a potentially lucrative career for her family and to care for her children, was awarded compensation of $\mathfrak{L}400,000$ in divorce proceedings, in addition to an equal split of the assets totalling nearly $\mathfrak{L}10$ million.

Mr Justice Moor found that there had been sufficient "relationship-generated disadvantage" to justify the award of compensation to the wife. However, he stressed that the judgment should not be taken as a 'green-light' for such claims, but restated the case that compensation still exists in truly exceptional circumstances.

How does the court determine how to distribute assets on a divorce or dissolution?

That starting point is laid down in s.25 of the Matrimonial Causes Act 1973. The court has a duty to consider "all the circumstances of the case", whilst giving the first consideration to the welfare of any children who have not reached the age of 18. Thereafter, the court is directed to take into account a range of factors:

- Financial resources of the parties (including incomes, earning capacity, property and other financial resources such as pension provision)
- Financial needs, obligations and responsibilities
- The standard of living enjoyed within the marriage
- The ages of the parties and duration of the marriage
- Any physical or mental disability of either party
- The contribution each party has made or is likely to make in the foreseeable future to the welfare of the family
- The conduct of each party (where such conduct is so serious it would be inequitable to disregard it)
- Any benefit that either party may lose as a result of the divorce (such as loss of pension benefit)

principles: needs, compensation and sharing and the courts will have regard to these principles when considering the s.25 factors, where their ultimate objective is to reach a fair outcome.

While coronavirus has turned our lives upside down in the last couple of months, our wildlife has

been thriving, something many of us have now had more time to appreciate than ever before.

With research showing that UK wildlife is in serious decline, the lockdown slowdown has brought a break from the norm that our wildlife urgently needed. Bristol has announced both ecological and climate emergencies, with action plans being drawn up to enable nature to recover on a grand scale. In response to this, Feed Bristol, Avon Wildlife Trust's wildflower nursery, has been renamed as Grow Wilder. Our aim is to play our part in inspiring people, communities, schools and businesses to take action for wildlife and grow wilder food, wilder gardens and wilder people.

As lockdown began, the team at Grow Wilder ambitiously set up an online shop delivering native wildflowers and vegetable plants. Thousands of plants were ordered, many by people having a go at growing for the first time. A team of fabulous

volunteers responded to our call to arms to help us pick, pack and deliver the orders, a task made all the more interesting with social distancing a necessity.

Despite the many challenges of organising over a thousand deliveries in a short space of time, not least in the midst of a global pandemic, it is truly uplifting that so many people across Bristol are creating wildlife-friendly gardens, providing crucial food for pollinators, and helping nature recover from their homes.

We are working up plans to safely re-open Grow Wilder's nursery and, hopefully, an outdoor café to the public in July. A haven of wildflowers, greenery and birdlife, we hope it will be a place where people can come and enjoy nature and a cuppa. Keep an eye on our website for updates on re-opening.
