

Welcome to Bradley Stoke:

Newcomers at Christ the King and Holy Trinity Church

Bradlev Stoke is welcoming a new minister - the Revd Rod Symmons, who has been appointed by the Diocese of Bristol to be the Interim Minister of Bradley Stoke, which comprises the churches of Christ the King at the south end of the town and Holy Trinity (which is a joint Anglican and Methodist church which shares a site with Holy Trinity School) at the north end.

Rod and his wife Beth have lived in Bristol since 1999 when Rod as appointed Vicar of Redland Parish Church and Tutor at Trinity Theological College. They left Redland in November 2018 and moved to Henbury and since then Rod has been working for the Diocese of Bristol looking after the training of junior clergy.

Rod is delighted to have been asked by the Bishop to be the Interim Minister. "We have known a number of people at both churches over the years and we are enjoying beginning to get to know more members of the congregation. We are looking forward to building links with others in the wider community."

The post is part-time and is in preparation for the appointment of a permanent full-time minister.

Rod and Beth have three adult children, all living in London. Beth works for Bristol City Council and has always been actively involved in the communities wherever they have lived

At the beginning of the lockdown the two churches took the decision to go online with a joint weekly service involving members of both congregations. These have proved popular and have been watched by many people in the town who don't normally come to church. Both



there are links to the services available there.

Risk assessments are currently being drawn up and where possible to do so in a COVID safe way activities are gradually beginning to start up again, so keep an eye on the churches' websites.

Bradley Stoke Judo Club during the Pandemic and Coping with the Lockdown Restrictions

At the start of 2020 Bradley Stoke had an exciting year planned with competitions and training camps around Europe and the world, including a ten day training trip to Japan for 20 of the club members. Everything had been going well in all departments for the club when we were hit by the lockdown due to COVID-19 at the end of March.

As soon as we knew what the government restrictions meant to our sport, our team of dedicated coaches set about developing a programme of judo based routines and conditioning to ensure all members especially our competitive players return in top condition, when restrictions are finally relaxed and we can return to near normality. Like many other people, businesses and clubs we utilised the capabilities of zoom to deliver training sessions and monitor progress of our members.

As restrictions were relaxed it meant that we have been able to hold outdoor sessions within the guidelines set out by the British Judo Association and the government. These sessions included non-contact judo exercises, conditioning sessions and yoga. As well as allowing our coaches to assess an individual's fitness, it also allowed club mates that we attract from far afield to meet up and socialise. As many people will know

and experienced, the lockdown impacted on people's mental health in various ways so this controlled and responsible socialising has also been important to the club members' mental wellbeing.

Sadly as in many other areas of the leisure industries and sports clubs, these times have seen several judo clubs across the UK go under or lose important revenue streams as inconsistent restrictions on contact sports have impacted martial arts more severely than some mainstream sports. Work has been ongoing in the background on the administration needed to ensure a successful judo club like Bradley Stoke continues to grow despite the restrictions. Due to this work the Club has done, it is in a very strong position and we are looking to forward to when we can open up again fully.

We have launched a new logo which features one of our full time athletes, Lele Nairne, and her throw at the 2019 World Championships in Tokyo, plus we have other exciting initiatives planned once we are back open. We are looking to open up our sessions at the leisure centre at the beginning of October and have already received significant interest from people of all levels of ability wanting to join us.

13 Year Old Pearl, Bakes!

Before lockdown started, Pearl Bruford, who is just 13 and lives in Bradley Stoke, had registered with the Brightwell Centre to take part in their Challenge 35. The idea for this was to make £35 grow as much as possible in one month for the charity.

Pearl had spoken to her school and arranged to have three cake sales for the staff and students, as well as a tea and cake afternoon at home to raise funds. Then lockdown happened and all plans were scrapped!

Pearl was insistent that she still wanted to help the charity and, not being one to give up, began baking cakes from home and selling them online.

Each month Pearl has been posting a menu on local Facebook pages and people have been ordering from her. Since her first order in May, Pearl has baked over 100 cakes!

For her 100th order she gave away a free lemon drizzle cake (chosen by the customer) - she also intends to do the same for her 200th order. She has baked coffee cakes. Victoria sponges, chocolate cakes, chocolate brownies, sausage rolls, cheese and onion pasties, cupcakes, scones with jam portions, cinnamon rolls and lemon drizzle cakes. She has made apple crumble and pear and apple crumble using homegrown fruit. Pearl also caters for vegan and gluten free requests.

Her current project is Halloween cupcakes and she already has over 100 orders!

Pearl is giving 50% of all profits to the Brightwell charity and has so far raised over £200 and is planning to continue raising money until Christmas when she will present the centre with a cheque. Pearl has used the

money raised from selling cakes to buy all of the ingredients she has needed and at the beginning of September, Morrisons at Cribbs Causeway donated Pearl some ingredients. They have also asked to work with Pearl at Christmas - selling her cakes in store! How fantastic - well done Pearl!!








A lifeline for desperate carers

Tim Poole, Chief Executive of Carers Support Centre, said: "Carers are truly the hidden heroes of COVID-19, looking after loved ones behind closed doors. New Careers Support for Women in North Bristol

A new project offering careers development support for women in North Bristol has been launched, aimed at mums with young children and women who are unemployed or in part time work.

Future Me provides one to one support to women looking to improve their employability and work towards a career of their choosing. The year-long programme offers a full package of support to help women identify their career goals, access the training and skills needed and overcome barriers. Future Me is run by North Bristol Advice Centre (NBAC).

It's about helping women get the career they want, instead of just fitting into a job," says Lavern Forbes, project coordinator. "We want to support women to raise their aspirations and help them avoid becoming trapped in low paid, unskilled work,"

The project is open to women who are not currently in full time work. This includes unemployed and part time workers. It's particularly aimed at women with voung children as it provides a unique opportunity to use the time before their children enter full time education to start the process of part time training to develop their own career.

"This is a new area of work for NBAC," says Sally Gapper, NBAC CEO. "We know that mums with young children are under pressure to get into work under Universal Credit and that women have been hugely impacted by Covid-19. The aim is to set them on the path to meaningful employment and increase their financial wellbeing in the long term."

Future Me builds on the success of the Buzz Employability Project, run by Buzz Lockleaze CIC. The social enterprise, which was set up by NBAC, was dissolved in August 2020. NBAC Trustees agreed to take on the employability work as it aligns with the organisation's aim of promoting social justice and combating poverty.



Fundamental Changes to Use Classes

On 30 June 2020, the government announced plans to "radically reform" the planning system, allowing more types of commercial premises to repurpose.

On 1 September 2020 The Town and Country Planning (Use Classes) (Amendment) (England) Regulations 2020 ('2020 Regulations') came into force. Significantly, the Regulations:

- 1 revokes Parts A and D of the Schedule to the Town and Country Planning (Use Classes) Order 1987 in relation to England (subject to transitional and savings provisions) (regulation 2).
 - Part A contained use classes A1 to A5 which includes uses commonly found on the high street including shops, cafes and takeaways. Part D contained use classes D1 which are Non-residential institutions and D2 which is Assembly and leisure.
- 2 inserts three new use classes:
 - Class E which is commercial, business and service
 - Class F.1 which is learning and non-residential institutions
 - Class F.2 which is local community.
- 3 confirms more uses as sui generis (which are uses in a class of their own).

Any building or land which is used for one of the following classes on 31 August 2020 will be treated on or after 1 September 2020 as falling within new Class E:

- Class A1 (Shops).
- Class A2 (Financial and professional services).
- Class A3 (Restaurants and cafes).
- Class B1 (Business).

Class F.1 (Learning and non-residential institutions) and Class F.2 (Local community) will replace Class D1 (Non-residential institutions) and Class D2 (Assembly and leisure).

New sui generis uses

The following uses are confirmed as being sui generis (in a class of their own):

- A public house, wine bar or drinking establishment (currently Class A4).
- A drinking establishment with expanded food provision (currently mixed use of Class A4 with Class A3).

A hot food takeaway for the sale of hot food where consumption of that food is mostly undertaken off the premises (currently Class A5).



- A venue for live music performance.
- A cinema (currently Class D2).
- A concert hall (currently Class D2).
- A bingo hall (currently Class D2).
- A dance hall (currently Class D2).

Generally, sui generis uses cannot be changed to any other use (including any other sui generis use) without express planning permission.

The new Class E is important, covering uses as wide reaching as nurseries, offices, financial services retail, food, gyms, healthcare, and light industry. If there is a change of use within the same use class, it will not be considered a development and will not require planning permission.

These changes are expected to increase flexibility and help high streets and town centres to adapt to the everchanging needs of the consumers and businesses. Developers will no longer need to apply for planning permission for a change of use that fall within the now wider categories under these use classes.

2020 Review Youth Season

Introduction

When we wrote the last article for Bradley Stoke Matters in pre season, little did we know what would unfold shortly after; Covid-19 and the resultant lockdown has affected many people in many ways, some fatally so. And in it's own way the suspension of cricket matches until 11 July had also been a difficult time for all cricket clubs. Bradley Stoke CC were no exception, as we had high hopes for an enjoyable and successful full season.

Instead, we moved quickly to maintain engagement in those typically sunny days when cricket was not possible. A regular Friday night online quiz night, which ran for three months from early April, kept spirits up and also raised funds for the NHS and club. Cricket challenges and regular 'Meet the Committee' features on social media also helped us connect with our members and the wider community.

Following early easing of restrictions, some hard work was put in preparing the use of our net facility to be Covid compliant, and we were able to open our net facility in early June to our members, albeit following strict protocols.

And finally, the green light was given for the return of recreational cricket on 11 July, and after more hard work ensuring match days and training sessions were also Covid compliant, we kicked off with a couple of inter club senior T20 games at that first opportunity.

There are many people to thank who contributed in different ways to the above; we hope they know who they are.

Youth section

In those dark (but frustratingly sunny) days in April, the prospect of any cricket taking place this summer looked remote. So to be writing an



article reflecting on eight weeks of condensed and intense activity within our youth section of 85 members, and with it notable success on a scale not seen before in the club's relatively short history, is both a relief and particularly satisfying.

We kicked off with a friendly for our Under 11s on 14 July, training started on 19 July, and we ended with an Under 15s friendly on 8 September, with plenty in between, 47 games played overall.

We were grateful to our local league the Bristol Youth Cricket League (BYCL), who devised amended 20 over hardball competitions to fit the shortened and later timescales.

Our **Under 9s** sadly had no softball Kwik Cricket festivals to attend this year as these were too impractical to organise given the restrictions that remained. However we were able to arrange a handful of friendly games against other clubs and plenty was learnt in both victory and defeat.

We again had sufficient numbers to enter two Under 11 teams, one 8 a side playing a 16 overs pairs format and one traditional 11 a side 20 over team

Our 8 a side team lost all four of their league games, three marginally so, but did pick up a couple of friendly victories.

Our 11 a side team had a very strong season and remained unbeaten until their very last game. Three friendly wins aside, they won three of their four group stage league games in the BYCL Raise The Bat Trophy (the other beaten by the weather) to top the group on run rate. A 111 run win over Thornbury's stronger side was a particular highlight. This earned them a home quarter final against Frenchay Under 13 girls. A nervy 2 wicket win saw them through to finals day on August Bank Holiday Monday at Frenchay CC, where their great run ended in the semi finals against a

very well drilled Golden Hill side who went on to lift the silverware.

Our Under 13s side went one better. Aside from packing in 13 games into a seven week period including seven friendlies, they reached the final of their Raise The Bat

Trophy. A 100% record from their three group games led to a home quarter final against Downend. Played on the stormiest night of the season, they beat both the elements and their opponents on run rate after another downpour and bad light ended proceedings. Finals day for this team was at Winterbourne CC, with Golden Hill again the

opponents. After reaching 82 after batting first, the feeling was that was a little light, and after a good start by Golden Hill this remained the case. However a sustained high level bowling and fielding effort saw them bowl Golden Hill out for 61 and the final beckoned straight after.

This proved to be a game too far however, as a strong Winterbourne side on their own patch proved a challenge too many, and 62 all out was overhauled with some comfort and 4 wickets down. James Bracey (Gloucestershire and England Lions) presented the runners up trophy to the team.

Our Under 15s also excelled and we had another team with a 100% record in the Raise The Bat Trophy group stages, and another home quarter final, this time against Bristol CC. An outstanding performance with ball and in the field saw them bowl Bristol out for just 40, chased down cautiously but sensibly, and they were to join our Under 13s at finals day at Winterbourne. There they also squared up against a strong Golden Hill side, who did prove to be too strong by 70 runs, and they went on to win the final too.

Both our **Under 17s** and **Under 19s** sides entered into friendly league formats, and with a number of opponents conceding due to lack of available numbers, each team only played three games,

with the Under 19s picking up a victory over Twyford House.

Sadly we did not run All Stars Cricket (5 to 8 year olds) or the new Dynamos Cricket (8 to 11 year olds, our offer was open to girls only) this year. The ECB cancelled the latter and for the former we didnt have enough signed up pre lockdown to make it practical to run. We hope to do so in 2021.

Finals day clashed with our traditional season ending youth/parent double wicket competition, so that sadly did not take place this year, albeit for a positive reason!

But overall it has been a memorable season in many ways. For all three of our teams who entered the Raise The Bat Trophy to reach finals day was unprecedented, and on first glance a remarkable achievement, but perhaps reflects the hard work of the previous years coming to fruition. The support from all sections of the club at finals day but also in earlier games was brilliant and much appreciated. The team spirit in all of our teams from Under 9s to Under 19s has perhaps never been better or so widespread.

Whilst not wishing for a repeat of 2020, we will ultimately reflect on what season we had with fondness and many happy memories.

Everything is crossed for a return to normality and an April start in 2021.

That just leaves me to thank everyone in the coaching team, parents who have got the players to games and helped out on match days with set up/pack away and scoring/umpiring, the support from the committee including our Club Welfare Officer, and our tireless groundsman, all of whom played a crucial part in the above.





With the new 2020/21 season scheduled to start 20th September, as we went to print Bradley Stoke Ladies FC were looking forward to getting back to some kind of normality and to doing what they do best - playing football!

Back to Training

Covid-19 meant that training was suspended in March and the season was voided, but the ladies are now back to competitive training. From Tuesday 22nd September this takes place on the astro at Bradley Stoke Community School from 7pm.

We have also had several new players come and join us recently for the new season across both teams. Another big welcome to all the new players at the club!

Two Teams For The Third Year Running

The BSLFC development team was set up in 2018 when we had too many players to accommodate into one team. However, this has been a huge positive for the club, allowing more and more young girls and women to play football.

For the 2020/21 season the development team has been rebranded as The Vixens. We feel the team has come a long way since it started and therefore the new name better represents the future of the team. The new players who joined last season have really improved and made a stance in the team, which has been fantastic to see.

Both teams train at the same venue and come together at the end of each training session, usually to play a friendly match. We are 2 teams but 1 united club.

After all football being cancelled due to the pandemic in March, it was with excitement yet trepidation we were able to resume training as per FA CoVid guidelines at the beginning of July. This included equipping all teams with PPE and cleaning equipment

as well as ensuring risk assessments and track & trace processes were adhered to. Initially we had to restrict training to 6 people maximum with no contact, which although strange and not quite as full blooded as normal proved a relief just to be back out on the grass and together again (distanced of course).

As restrictions eased at the beginning of August we were able to bring back more normality to things and were able to engage in matches again, albeit in line with revised risk assessments reflecting the new rules created in conjunction with FA guidelines.
