Remembrance Day in Lockdown

Rev. Rod Symmons led the service at Christ the King on Sunday 8th November, remembering with thanksgiving and sorrow those whose lives in world wars and conflicts, past and present have been given and taken away. Reflecting on the gifts that so many gave of their lives, often at a very young age, Rev. Symmons reminded the congregation watching in their homes, of the gift of Christ for us, reflecting on His love for us, in the words of the song 'Here is love vast as the Ocean', played on the guitar and sang beautifully by Pat Barter.

Words from the Sermon on the Mount were readas well as Laurence Binvon's poem "For the Fallen." written from a cliff-top in Cornwall in September 1914, was read out to remind us that: "They shall not grow old as we that are left grow old: Age shall not weary them, nor the years condemn. At the going down of the sun and in the morning, we will remember them."

The 11 chimes of Big Ben were played in the church to lead into a two minutes silence, joining people across the nation.

The church of Christ the King was delighted to be joined by the Mayor of Bradley Stoke, Cllr Tony Griffiths and a warm welcome was extended to him.

The bugles of the last post were played through speakers in the church to mark the end of the two minute silence and this was followed by the laving of wreaths by Rev. Rod and Mayor Griffiths. "We will remember them."

Mayor Tony Griffiths shared briefly about what Remembrance Sunday means to him, with active service in the Far East, he served with the Royal Observer Corp. The service ended with prayer for all those who suffer as a result of conflict.





Day, Harry Woods (photo) placed the wreath on behalf of the church, at the war memorial at the Willowbrook Centre in **Bradley Stoke.**

Harry joined the Army as a boy soldier, when National Service required everyone at the age of eighteen to join the Army, Navy or Royal Air Force. He was sent to the 16th 5th Lancers, a cavalry regiment and toured all over Europe. In 1963, after 4 years in Germany he was posted to 653 Squadron Army Air Corps to form the nucleus of the regiments Air Troop. During his time with 15 flight he was posted to Radfan, an area very close to the Yemen border, where the local Arabs were robbing pilgrims going to Mecca for their religious ceremony. The local government asked the army for help. resulting in a brigade of soldiers being sent to the Wadi Tame where an airfield was established. Harry's squadron sent 3 Scout helicopters and a field detachment of about 35 men. Harry helped refuel and service the helicopters as well as flying casualty missions to bring back to Base camp, not only the wounded, but also his dead comrades.

Sharing his experience after laying the wreath, Harry explained that it was too gruesome to go into detail but that he did all in his power to keep service men, from the Army, Navy and Royal Air Force alive. In a very moving conclusion, Harry said, "My only regret is we could not save them all. To my fallen Comrades, Rest in Peace, **Duty Done."**

Lockdown doorstep Remembrance Day 8th November 2020 for OSR Scouts

So this year just gets odder and odder. No Remembrance Day parade this weekend for Old School Rooms Scouts, no marching down to the memorial on The Green, North Road in Stoke Gifford. So what to do?

Joining in with Avon County Scouts all over the South West in a 2 minute doorstep silence to remember the fallen and the sacrifices they made for us was a fitting tribute, and the OSR scouts made special Poppy paracord woggles to make it more memorable.

All the scouts and leaders in full uniform asked members of their families to take a photo or two so they could be put on the scouts website plus the County wanted a photo of scouts participating for a large collage, as was done for St. George's day.

It's important we honour the soldiers, sailors and airmen from the past that died in conflicts to protect our freedoms today.

The scouts are more informed nowadays as it's taught in lessons, but there's still room to learn about the roles scouts made during the great wars plus the role of animals and why we wear poppies. This will be covered on a zoom session now there's no face to face scouting during this second English lockdown.

The Toy Library was also aptly decorated for Remembrance by the local guiding group.



Church for Changing Times

The church building at St Michael's in Stoke Gifford is important to the community and to worship for church members. They are now planning improvements to the fourteenth century building, making it fit for worship for now and in the future.

Revd. Canon Simon Jones, Rector of St Michael's says: "We are committed to protecting, preserving and enhancing the building as our legacy for generations to come. We've spent a considerable sum past two years on building work to the tower, stonework, boundary wall and new roofs. We are now looking to improve safety, visibility and accessibility."

This will be done by:

- Removing the raised platform at the altar, and levelling the entire floor of the church replacing the existing worn and uneven flooring.
- Removing the two large, square pillars between the north aisle and the nave and reducing the size of the roof support at the east end of the chancel (in front of the organ).
- Providing two toilets in the vestry, one accessed from the inside and one accessed from the outside.
- Replace the pews with comfortable and flexible seating which will enable a wider range of activities to take place within the building.
- Replace the external vestry door with approved fire escape door.

Revd Canon Jones said "we are excited to move forward on this, making our church building, fit for generations to come, whilst honouring its history."

This is just one of the four key ambitions for the Heart of the Community project which was launched in 2012. Those ambitions are:

 Create a spacious modern meeting place in the centre of the community



- Restore the historic church building for generations to come.
- 3. Upgrade the existing community rooms
- 4. Fund outreach and anti-poverty projects locally, nationally and internationally

The first of those ambitions was seen with the opening of St Michael's Centre on North Road, which boasts a 550 seater auditorium and hosts the larger Sunday gatherings at St Michael's, as well as conferences and events throughout the week. More updates to this have been achieved with the completion of the last phase of St Michael's Centre this month, with additional rooms and a new kitchen.

St Michael's are now keen to keep the momentum going with the plans for the church building:

The Revd Canon Jones said "The church building is still very much in use on Sundays and during the week (present lockdown excluded!) and is always packed at Christmas, Easter and other popular services. Last Christmas we were in the unfortunate position of having to turn people away from our afternoon carol service as we ran out of room. These plans will not only give us extra space and more seating, but also greater flexibility on how we use that seating."

It is important not to feel like you need to 'achieve' anything with the unexpected free time we may have. But I am always more motivated to bring myself to an activity that is constructive. I greatly enjoy spending time producing greetings cards and prints out of my paintings, and this year I have taken it upon myself to produce wall calendars for 2021.

Bradley Stoke Zero Carbon Community Group

Hello from us here at Bradley Stoke Zero Carbon Community Group. We have asked Bradley Stoke & Little Stoke Gifford Matters to give us a bit of space to tell you about our 'newish' group and what we do.

The group was kick started by South Gloucestershire Council passing a climate emergency motion on the 17th July 2019. Our chair and founding member Lorna was inspired by a conference she attended called Zero Carbon Britain at the wonderful Centre for Alternative Technology. The group was formed just over a year ago and as the name suggests we aim to give local people a space to come together, take action to reduce carbon emissions and take care of the land around us.

Initially our chair posted a link asking for local Bradley Stoke people who cared about all things 'green' to join a Facebook group for sharing 'green' ideas. From there we started holding meetings in August 2019, setting up the group formally with a constitution and also started planning events with other local groups. Due to the pandemic we are now holding these meetings online. Some of our planned events were also put on hold however we are dreaming up new ways to share information on what every individual can do to do their bit for the planet. Bradley Stoke Town Council provided financial assistance to the group to support our work in the coming year. We plan to put this to good use for the benefit of local people and the environment.





Reception


human and physical features between living in Bristol and a rural area in Uganda.

If you had any other income in the tax year to 5 April 2020 aside from pensions or PAYE (where taxes are deducted automatically by an employer) then it is highly likely that you will need to complete a self-assessment tax return and file it online by 31 January 2021.

By this date, HMRC expect not only to receive your tax return but also payment in full of any tax due. While that deadline may seem like a lifetime away right now, don't forget there's the small matter of the festive frivolities to contend with between now and then...On which note. 2019 was a record-breaking year for taxpayers filing their self-assessments on Christmas Day itself, with over 3000 successful submissions...248 of which were actually filed before 8am, while the rest of us were only just ripping off wrapping paper and pouring our breakfast Bucks FizzIII

So, to avoid feverishly gathering paperwork over the festive period in a bid to avoid the automatic £100 late filing penalty, our advice is always to get your return in as early as possible, the advantage being that you will then know the exact amount of tax you need to pay – and if paying that sum might cause you any financial hardship, especially in the current Covid-clouded climate, then you still have time to

consider your options. As part of the government's Winter Economy Plan, the Chancellor advised that self-assessment taxpayers may defer tax due on 31 January 2021 for up to 12 months via HMRC's Time to Pay scheme, meaning you can pay tax due in smaller instalments to reduce the impact on your day-to-day cashflow.

But while deferring payment is an option, delaying filing the return itself by 31January 2021 is not – and when it comes to excuses on that front, HMRC have pretty much heard it all - from late filing 'because my mother-in-law is a witch and put a curse on me' or 'I'm too short to reach the post-box' to the taxpaver who tried to claim pet food for his guard dog - a fearsome Shih Tzu, no less (I kid you not) as a tax-deductible expense.

So unless you want to feature prominently in HMRC's classic annual 'Top 10 Worst Late Filing Excuses' (which let's face it, is hardly a BAFTA nomination) then it's time to start thinking about tackling that tax return paperwork pile – and we're here for any advice you need in that regard.



Lasting Power of Attorney

It's never a pleasant thought to think about getting older and what comes with it. Most of us are guilty of forever trying to avoid the wrinkles and grey hair by investing in the next beauty trend. All the while we do not consider what may be ageing on the inside.

It is not uncommon that as we get older, our ability to make our own decisions in life may become harder or impossible for reasons of mental or physical decline. Many of us do not want to consider what would happen if we did not have the capacity to make decisions about our affairs ourselves.

This is why arranging a Lasting Power of Attorney (LPA) is part of good planning and safeguarding against such eventuality.

An LPA gives your 'attorney(s)', a person of your choice over the age of 18, the authority to make decisions about your health and welfare and/or your property and financial affairs on your behalf. 

Back inside the hall meant face masks, hand gels and social distancing but we managed and the scouts parents will be overjoyed at all the badges they have to sew on after all the things we did on zoom etc from April to October!

During the first session back in the hall we invested 3 new scouts into the troop then presented Ollie, Oliver and Emily with their Gold Chief Scouts Awards, socially distanced cake cutting and badge/ certificate presentations. The rest of the troop loved the cake and realising that


