

Young Carers' Action Day: Protect young carers' futures

Did you know that many local children and young people are caring for someone at home?

Young carers are just kids, yet they care for someone at home who could not do without their help. The average age of a young carer is just 13 years old, and some are as young as 8.

Local charity, Carers Support Centre, is raising awareness for Young Carers Action Day, which is on 16th March. The charity supports young carers with assessments, one-to-one and family support, groups and activities. Young carers carry a heavy responsibility, caring for sick and disabled family members. They are often anxious, isolated and lonely: fall behind with school work and are bullied.

Local carer Tasha was supported by Carers Support Centre's young carers service when she was a young carer. She said: "The support and respite were incredible, and everyone was so encouraging. Without Carers Support Centre, my life would have taken a completely different path. They gave me a voice and made me feel listened to. The charity gave a lot to me and I wanted to give back, so I now volunteer for the young carers service."

They aim to highlight the incredible skills they have developed through being a carer - like resilience. time-management, organisational skills and empathy. To mark Young Carers Action Day, Carers Support Centre is making a short film for local schools. In the film, those who were once young carers will share their experiences of caring and how they have achieved their goals. E-scooter rental expands to South Gloucestershire and new areas in North Bristol

Residents in parts of South Gloucestershire, as well as new areas in North Bristol are able to use rental e-scooters to access essential work and services.

Following the successful launch of the West of England e-scooter trial, the trial area for the 'hop-on hop-off' e-scooters is expanding to include Bradley Stoke, Stoke Gifford and Filton in South Gloucestershire.

While the lockdown is in place the e-scooter operator, Voi Technology, is offering free rides to NHS workers, emergency service personnel and the armed forces, providing these key workers with a green and socially distanced alternative to commute to and from work.

With the trial expansion, the numbers of scooters will increase to 400 in Bristol and 200 in South Gloucestershire, giving more residents access to a green and flexible way to move around the city.

Since launch, back in October 2020, there have been over 100.000 rides taken, and over 246,948km travelled in the region. Mayor of the West of England Tim Bowles said: "The West of England has really embraced our e-scooter trial and I'm pleased that many more people will now have a chance to benefit from this low-carbon alternative to the car for short journeys to access essential work and services.


"E-scooters are part of our transport plans for the region alongside metrobus, MetroWest rail network and plans for a regional mass transit, to make it easier to get to the jobs and training opportunities that will secure our recovery."

E-scooters are available to unlock for £0.99 and cost 14p per minute. There are also various discounts available and passes for students, key workers, and those on low-incomes.

To unlock an e-scooter, riders can download the Voi app, (available for free on iOS and Android) must be 18 years old or over and have a valid UK provisional driving licence (full or provisional). Safety measures to protect riders against Covid-19 include equipping all handlebars with anti-bacterial tape and ensuring the vehicles are regularly disinfected.



The West of England Combined Authority has also recently introduced long-term e-scooter rentals that can be stored at home and used by residents across the whole of Bath and North East Somerset, Bristol and South Gloucestershire giving unlimited access to costeffective and socially distanced transport, within the entire geofenced WECA area.



Richard Corbett, Regional General Manager of UK, Ireland and Benelux for Voi, said:

"It's a pleasure to continue to work with the West of England Combined Authority to continue to expand the number of scooters and operating areas in the region. As more people adopt this green mode of transport, ditching short-car journeys, we will certainly see improvements in congestion and in air quality in the region."

The following rules and safety measures apply for the e-scooter trials:

- Only e-scooters that are hired or leased through the West of England's trial can be used legally on roads, cycle lanes or cycle tracks.
- E-scooters cannot be used on pavements or parked in a way that disrupts pedestrians or causes nuisance.
- Using GPS technology, there will be no-ride zones and slow-speed zones for some areas.
- All e-scooters will have clear number plates to help identify riders.
- Driving licence and identity checks will be required.
- · Voi ambassadors will be present on the streets to enforce safe behaviour.
- Ambassadors will work with Avon and Somerset Police to restrict or ban noncompliant users.
- Privately owned e-scooters remain illegal to use on roads, pavements, parks and any other areas. The only place that privately owned e-scooters can legally be used is on private land with the permission of the landowner.

The trial forms part of the West of England's £28m plans for a Future Transport Zone in the region that will improve access to public transport for local communities through trialling innovative new transport technologies.



Last year at the beginning of lockdown, Pearl who is only thirteen, started to bake cakes from home and sell them online to raise money for the Brightwell Centre in Bradley Stoke.

Each month Pearl posted a menu on local Facebook pages and people ordered from her - since May 2020 she has baked over three hundred cakes and for the 100th, 200th and 300th order she gave away a free cake. For her fundraising Pearl baked coffee cakes, Victoria sponges, chocolate cakes, chocolate brownies, sausage rolls, cheese and onion pasties, cupcakes, scones with jam portions, cinnamon rolls and lemon drizzle cakes and made two different types of crumble using homegrown fruit.

To end the year. Pearl made a lot of Christmas themed cakes ranging from Christmas cupcakes. chocolate Bundt cakes and Christmas pudding cakes.

Since the start of this year we have been in a third period of national lockdown and the second time where schools have been closed to everyone except the children of key workers or vulnerable students. This has meant that at Abbeywood Community School we have had around 900 students learning from home with another 100 or

so with us in school each day - a pattern replicated in the majority of schools up and down the country since the start of the new year.


What has been astonishing yet again is the resilience shown by our staff and students in so readily adapting their daily routines to remote learning and quickly upskilling in the use of google classrooms. Our amazing teaching staff have run our full curriculum remotely, including assemblies, tutorials and PE lessons, along with lessons in all other subjects. While globally this has gone really well, we all agree it is no substitute for high-quality learning in school. Running alongside the curriculum has been weekly calls to every Abbeywood family as well as specific support for those in need. This help




has included the school loaning out nearly 200 laptops to ensure all our students can access our online curriculum, as well as countless visits each week to support any of our families in need.

Throughout this term we have also set up a Covid-19 lateral-flow testing facility which has been successfully run by our wonderful Abbeywood Support Staff together with some kind volunteers from our local community. Again, it has been incredible how people have stepped up to play their part in helping us get through the pandemic.

It is acknowledged that we are not yet 'though the woods' as there feels like so much still to get through before we are able to reflect on the personal and collective impact of the past 12 months, but what is clear is that we will get through this together as our collective school community's resilience and spirit is stronger than ever.

Lockdown Art at BSCS

As lockdown was announced at Christmas we knew as a department we wanted to make sure our students were given the best experience possible. We wanted to make sure we could still provide opportunities for them to be creative, to record and observe as well as experiment with materials. We also knew that a lot of time was going to be spent on computer screens and that an hour away from a computer to complete some practical art work would be hugely beneficial to the wellbeing and mental health of our students, so we made a plan!

In the first week of the January term we prepared and sent out an Art pack to each of our year 7 and 8 students. In the pack was a printed booklet that contained resources for the whole term as well as some coloured reference images and a 2b pencil. We wanted to make sure every student had the equipment and resources to be successful.

We also organised resource packs for our year 10 and 11 students that were sent home, they included coloured photographs, images of Artist work and lots of cartridge paper and pencils to work with. Students were also given the opportunity to borrow paint and brushes and 100s of mini art packs have been made up and given out to students. Our GCSE textiles students have also had packs of resources sent home including fabric, wool, needles etc.

It is a critical time for our exam students as they are in their final stages of their coursework, we wanted to give them every opportunity to be successful so each student has been given a bespoke curriculum to follow each week and have each had an individual pack of resources sent home to support them with their learning.

As a department we are so impressed with our students. Despite everything going on in the world right now they are still turning in creative, unique and inspiring art work. We have been utilising social media to

share some of the amazing work our students have been producing and have built up quite a following during this lock down in particular. If you would like to follow us. our Instagram account is **bscs** art (2 underscores!). We hope the work our young people are producing can brighten your day as much as it does ours!

we felt a mixture of emotions but one thing was certain. We were ready! Our remote learning offer had been ready since September, it had been shared with all of our families and had a successful test run when we closed a bubble during term 2.

The Kindles we had purchased were charged and ready to support families without technology at home. The portable Wi-Fi was also ready for those families who required it. Our critical worker questionnaire was sent out to parents and our lessons began to be moved to our remote learning platforms - Seesaw and Tapestry.

Teachers worked tirelessly to make adaptions. record lessons and prepare for live teaching during our morning meetings. Teaching Assistants set up Critical Worker bubbles to support our frontline workers and vulnerable families. Everything that we had planned began to slot together.

At the time of writing this, we have 70 children in total coming to our Critical Worker provision. This is roughly a third of our children on roll. All children, whether they are using the provision or remote learning, are accessing the same high quality provision. Learning continues to progress with all


leading the school to continue to build on the incredible work that has gone into making this school a place where "all children from all backgrounds are able to dream, plan and achieve."

Four Towns Community Transport was founded in 1999 and merged with Vale Link Community Transport in 2005. We are a registered charity controlled by an unpaid board of Trustees. We provide transport to those members of the community who, for whatever reason, cannot use existing transport services.

Our aim is to promote social inclusion within South Gloucestershire by helping residents to be self-sufficient and maintain their personal independence. We provide essential travel (supported by South Gloucestershire Council) for Diamond Travel Card holders as well as social trips for leisure. If you do not have a Diamond Travel Card you may still be able to become a member of 4T&VL and pay to use our services.

We make over 90,000 trips each year taking people to:

- The supermarket and other shops
- Work or education
- Lunches, on social visits and local trips
- GP and hospital appointments

Who can use our services?

You need to live in the Four Towns and Vale Link area: Almondsbury, Alveston, Aust, Bradley Stoke, Charfield, Cromhall, Falfield, Filton, Frampton Cotterell, Hallen, Hill, Oldbury on Severn, Olveston, Patchway, Pilning, Severn Beach, Rockhampton, Stoke Gifford, Thornbury, Tortworth, Tytherington, Winterbourne

ONE or more of the following must apply:

- Aged 60 years or more
- · Have special needs
- Be on benefits
- Have access problems
- Be a Diamond Travel Card Holder

You'll need to become a member

Four Towns and Vale Link will be offering free membership for the year from April 2021. This will be for our existing members (who paid last year.) From the April renewal date.

For each new member there will be no change in fee this year. Its only £15.00 to join, with group membership remaining at only £20.00 for a full year.



Diamond Travel Card holders travel with a £2 charge per single journey and £4 per return journey, payable to the driver on local journeys with us. For more information about obtaining a Diamond Travel card contact South Gloucestershire Council.

If your journey takes you over certain boundaries, charges will apply. We will advise you of this at the time of booking.

Social Car Scheme

If we can't get you onto one of our Ring-and-Ride services we will try to get you transport with one of our volunteer drivers in their own car. This costs 45p per mile from your drivers starting point to your destination and return to the drivers starting point.

Property fraud – are you protected?

Millions of pounds are lost each year to Property fraud in the UK, which unfortunately is a serious ongoing issue with fraudsters continuing to target property owners regardless of whether owners are individuals or companies, and leaving you to deal with the consequences.

The most common types of frauds are typically where criminals steal a property owner's identity and then attempt to sell or mortgage their property by pretending to be them.

In particular, fraudsters are more likely to target properties where:

- the property is rented out
- · the property is empty
- the property is not mortgaged
- the property is not registered with HM Land Registry; or
- · you live overseas

If you have a property which you rent out, a second home or live somewhere else for all or part of the year, you should consider registering a Restriction against the property. The benefit of taking this additional step means it will prevent the Land Registry registering any sale or mortgage on your property unless a conveyancer or solicitor certifies that the application was made by you.

The Land Registry's Free Property Alert Service

The Land Registry offers a free 'Property Alert Service' for properties registered in England and Wales. This is an essential tool that should be considered by anyone wishing to take steps to protect a registered property from risk of fraud.

To sign up, all you need to provide is a valid email address and the postcode or title number of the property(ies) you want HM Land Registry to monitor (can be up to ten properties). Once you have signed up to the service, you will receive email alerts from the Land Registry when certain activity occurs on your monitored properties, allowing you to take swift action if these activities are suspicious. The alert email you receive, will signpost you to who you need to contact if you are suspicious.



Keep your contact details up to date!

Please remember to update the Land Registry in writing if your contact details change while you own the property to ensure you receive any such correspondence. For added peace of mind, the Land Registry can hold up to three contact addresses for you, including an email address and an address abroad.

What if my property is unregistered?

If your property is not registered at the Land Registry, you should consider making an application for voluntary first registration because it helps protect against fraud, gives you proof of ownership and makes it easier to buy and sell.


