

If you have been anywhere near to Bristol Parkway Station, you can't have failed to see the familiar sight of the tower of St Michael's Church. Perhaps you have occasionally attended a Christmas service, or a wedding there. But what you may not know, is that St Michael's is about more than singing hymns on a Sunday.

The phrase "Living to Make a Difference" has been part of the vision of this church for more than a decade, and it sees itself as doing just that.

Revd Canon Simon Jones (photo right), vicar of the church said "Identifying the needs of the surrounding community, and putting plans into action to meet those needs, is what we are all about, it's part of living out the Christian faith that brings us together."


Besides the ancient church building, there is also a large community centre with a 500 seater auditorium. It was built, not just to house their growing congregation, but to be a hub for the local community.

Since opening in 2015, St Michael's Centre has seen lots of activity, including being the base for performances from the local St Michael's Primary School.

With their church-run Old School Rooms Coffee Shop serving lattes and paninis every day, and their support groups for all stages of life, St Michael's wants to help those in the area foster a sense of belonging. Baby groups, toddler groups, groups for the elderly and wellbeing groups are all high priorities.

But it's not just in the buildings where the work takes place. Staff and volunteers from St Michael's are involved in lots of activities in the surrounding



It's the End of an Era at St Michael's Primary School

After 18 years of Headship, Mr Mark Freeman is stepping down from his Role as Head Teacher at St Michael's Primary School, Stoke Gifford.

We have always appreciated his support here at Little Stoke Gifford Matters and I was pleased to be able to catch up with him prior to his departure at the end of the summer term.




I started at St Michael's in September 2003 (photo right). Prior to starting here, I was Head at Elm Park in Winterbourne for 5 years.

Were you new to the area at this time?

Not really. I actually lived in Stoke Gifford for 6 months in 2000 while we were waiting for our house to be built in Bradley Stoke. I was working at the time in Winterbourne and my wife and I wanted to move closer to our work (she was a nurse at Frenchay at the time). Our two oldest children were born in 2000 and our youngest just before I started at St Michael's. We have loved living in Bradley Stoke and I can walk or cycle to school which is great. Just think of all that travelling time saved!

What drew you to wanting to take the position at this school?

I was already a Headteacher, and after 5 fantastic years at Elm Park I was ready for a new challenge in a bigger school. I already knew the school a bit, and knew it was the right place for me, and I knew I could make a difference there.



What was your first challenge?

The big challenge going to a large school like St Michael's was getting to know all the staff and pupil names. For weeks I kept bumping into staff I'd never seen

before and asking them who they were and what they did!

What are the biggest changes that you have seen over your time at the school?

There have been so many over the past 18 years: education never stands still!

The buildings and grounds have changed massively, and I'm really proud of the facilities the school has to offer its community. We have had a 3-classroom extension, a children's kitchen, a conservatory, new play areas, murals, a new library, a new kitchen, and recently a MUGA, which is a fabulous resource for the future.

The curriculum has changed a great deal, and we have employed specialists in art and music which has meant that our provision in those areas is outstanding. In normal times we have put on some amazing musical

performances, including Beauty and the Beast and the Lion King, and I believe that St Michael's offers so many opportunities for its pupils to shine in so many ways.

One other aspect that I am particularly proud of is our extracurricular provision. When I took over there were just a handful of clubs for children. Until the lockdowns we had nearly 40 weekly clubs as well as a thriving Breakfast Club, with a huge variety of things for pupils of all ages to choose from. I really hope whoever takes over from me keeps these going.

What is your best / worst memory?

That's quite hard: there are so many good ones. Probably watching children sing in front of parents or the school. I absolutely love singing, and we do so much here normally. That's why the lockdown period has been especially hard in school: no singing for over a year. Singing is about expressing joy, and life without song is so much the poorer. But those times will return.

I'm not sure I really have a worst memory: I'm glad to say that nothing awful has happened during my time here. There are things I won't miss, of course: there are too many emails and

endless policies and procedures to review: these have been made worse by the pandemic, of course.

What are the best things about St Michael's in your opinion?

Undoubtedly the children, who are absolutely fantastic. They are so enthusiastic, resilient and positive. If ever I'm feeling bogged down by paperwork all I need to do is to walk around the school and chat to children and suddenly I'm lifted up again. They ask all sorts of interesting and quirky questions (often about my age!) and everything is new and exciting for our younger children in particular.

The staff here are super: I have appointed most of them, and we have just a wonderful, caring and enthusiastic team who are dedicated to making this a great place to learn and to thrive. We are such an inclusive school, and we make sure that our vision – to help all children to shine – is lived daily.

I also must mention parents and governors. Over the years I have got to know so many parents and governors, and our partnership has been the foundation for the children's success here. The PTFA has been great, putting on so many community events, including summer fairs, fireworks events and so many more. I still see quite a few ex-parents as I

walk my dog in the local park and fields, and it's great to catch up with how their children – many of whom are adults now – are doing. I'm particularly pleased when I hear about ex-pupils becoming teachers or teaching assistants (and we have at least four ex-pupils now working in St Michael's).

You must be on the verge of seeing some of your early children's own children now starting at the school?

Yes, there are at least three children that I taught myself before I came to St Michael's who now have children at the school. It's hard to imagine that the children I taught when I started in 1986 will now be well into their 40s!

What will you miss the most about life at St Michael's?

So many things. The children of course: they make each day a joy and are the reason we do this job. The staff and the comradeship that we have built up over the years. The staff pantomime to the children! Watching performances, taking children to sports events. Above all just walking around the school and being able to say: 'we did this'.

What do you intend to do next?

I am not sure that I intend to stop working completely, but I certainly want to take a big step back from full-time work and the responsibility of running a school. I have various hobbies and interests that I want to pursue, especially musical. I have been learning the ukulele this year, and want to learn the banjo, and also get better at the trombone, which has been gathering dust for a few years now. I will read more — especially historical novels — and of course walk my dog even more than I do already.

In a few years we will probably move away to somewhere more rural and I want to take up woodworking, something I've always wanted to do but never had the time or space.

So life for me is full of possibilities!

Fantastic, thank you so much Mark, the school and local community will certainly miss you and I would like to thank you on behalf of them and also from myself. Thank you for always keeping us up to date with what has been happening at the school via your regular updates in Little Stoke Gifford Matters - we have enjoyed reading them.

We wish you all the very best for a happy retirement.

Stepping Up & Helping Out at Stoke Gifford Retirement Village

It's Volunteers' Week 1-7th June and we were delighted to hear from Volunteer Co-ordinator, Laura Jones, at the Stoke Gifford Village and to meet some of the extra-ordinary residents who have gone 'above and beyond' over the last 15 months of the pandemic.

With 206 of the possible 261 apartments now being occupied, the country going into strict lockdown at the end of March last year made life tricky for the many residents who had to stay behind locked doors. All usual activities such as Tai Chi, Pilates, the in-house S Glos Library, intergenerational playgroups, restaurant, coffee shop, gym, the Village shop etc all had to close. All external visitors including family, carers, volunteers and usual to-your-door deliveries had to stop as the building was shut to all external visitors.

Whilst the residents are always encouraged to volunteer to support their community, it soon became vital for any willing and able-bodied resident to help out as the limited staff soon became overwhelmed. So many residents needed to shield and, with no family or carers allowed to visit, they were at a loss for food shopping, postal deliveries, collecting medication etc. Those residents that were able to step up as volunteers were deemed as key workers and they formed teams to support those who couldn't leave their apartments.

We spoke to one such resident, Barbara, who took on the co-ordination of the team members and matched against requests for help. Barbara told me she used to be a co-ordinator in a University college in her working life, so relished the opportunity to get involved, even during her own 14 weeks of isolation, as it was something



she could organise via computer links from behind the door of her apartment. "To be honest it gave me something to do during the isolation and it



was incredible to be able to volunteer my help in this way, that I could give something of value back".

The Food Delivery team would collect shopping from the external doors and deliver it to people's apartments; The Medication team made trips to local pharmacies to collect and deliver medication and the Recycling team of 5 (Harford, Graham, Neil, Stuart and Colin) worked exceptionally hard collecting and sorting recycling for the whole village. They each had an area of the building and would collect from outside every apartment door, take it outside and sort and then return to each door - basically one trolley load per apartment each week which meant lots and lots of going up and down in the lifts and along corridors, taking up many hours each week!

Resident Harford (pictured above on his recycling round) was very much motivated to help. He moved to the Village with his wife after living for over 30 years in neighbouring Bradley Stoke. "I am probably one of the more able and active residents here and I'm only too pleased to step up and help. I don't want to see my (cont/..)

neighbours suffer. Although it's been like working a 40 hour week again, it has kept me busy and active at a time when all the other activities that I would usually participate in have not been able to operate. At the worst of the lockdown if you weren't a volunteer you were only allowed out of the apartment for an hour a week! I have been active on the recycling team which has kept me fit and also looking after the garden, which I enjoy."

The recycling team continue to operate in the village, even after all the lockdowns, those who struggle due to their physical or mental health needs. It is a huge help to both the community and the environment as otherwise the recycling of those who remain unable to do it for themselves just goes down the bin shoots.

When we visited mid-May, things were slowly returning to normal at The Village, with the shop, gym, restaurant and library newly opening. In the 'Winter Garden', which is an indoor outdoor space, several residents were playing boules. We spoke to David who, even with some mobility limitations, still volunteers in the gym four

morning a week keeping an eye out on safety issues and cleaning down the equipment after each use.

Volunteers' week is a time to say thank you to all those who volunteer in our midst every day to help in their local communities. Laura really wanted to highlight the work done in the Village by the resident volunteers and say Thank You. Your efforts are very much appreciated and it is hoped that others will step up and help out too.





The first British person in space is coming to Bristol later this year. Helen Sharman blasted off on her mission to the Mir space station on 18th May 1991 - 30 years last month — and, to celebrate, Aerospace Bristol has announced a special Family Space Day featuring the pioneering astronaut.

Inheritance Act Claims

Alison Dukes, Solicitor of AMD Solicitors considers what you can do if your expectations of inheritance are disappointed and the possible claims that can be brought under the Inheritance (Provision for Family and Dependants) Act 1975

The first point to make is that the deceased must have been domiciled in England and Wales before a claim can be brought under the Act. Secondly, claims can be brought even if the deceased left no Will.

Applications may be made by Spouses, parties to registered civil partnerships, former spouses who have not re-married, co-habitants, dependants and children. Children include those who, during any marriage or civil partnership of the deceased, were treated as children of the family and can include adult children.

Dependants include persons who were maintained wholly or partly by the deceased immediately before his death. The deceased must have been making a substantial contribution to the reasonable needs of the claimant.

The Act makes a distinction between claims by surviving spouses or civil partners and those by other claimants. Surviving spouses or civil partners are treated more favourably and the Court will consider whether the deceased's Will or intestacy made such financial provision as it would be reasonable in all circumstances of the case for the surviving partner to receive 'whether or not that provision is required for his or her maintenance'. In practice, the Court must look at what the survivor would have received if the marriage or civil partnership had been dissolved rather than terminated by death.

For other claimants, the issue is whether the deceased's Will or intestacy, in all the circumstances of the case, made reasonable financial provision for their 'maintenance'.

Claims must be issued within 6 months of a Grant of Probate or letters of administration although, exceptionally, leave may be granted after this deadline to issue an application.

In considering the merits of a claim the Court takes various statutory factors into account including the size and nature of the Estate. It is important to note that under the 1975 Act, the Court can treat as part of an Estate property or other assets that the deceased owned jointly with someone else, even though these would usually pass automatically to the surviving joint owner.



The Court will also consider the financial circumstances of the Claimant, the competing needs of any beneficiaries or other claimants, any obligations owed by the deceased to the claimant, any mental or physical disability of the claimant and also conduct, or any other matter considered relevant by the Court.

Most Orders under by the Courts under the 1975 Act are orders for the payment of lump sums, which are generally considered desirable in the interests of finality. However, the Courts do also have the power to make periodical payment Orders and to transfer property.

The Purpose of the Act

The Act was not designed to correct acts of unfairness or to reward the just and deserving. It does not remove a testator's freedom to dispose of his estate as he wishes. The question is not whether it might have been reasonable for a testator to assist a potential claimant but rather whether the provisions of the will or intestacy fail to make reasonable provision in all the circumstances. The question is objective rather than subjective.




