#### **Bradley Stoke Charity Shop Needs Your Donations!**

The Children's Hospice South West (CHSW) shop in Bradlev Stoke has issued an urgent appeal for donations of summer clothing.

The shop at the Willow Brook Centre has experienced a surge in demand for good quality second-hand clothing since reopening in April and is asking people to consider donating any unwanted items.

Shop manager Glynnis Eaton said: "We have been very busy since the easing of lockdown and while we have a great choice in store right now, we know we are going to need more summer clothing to meet the demand of the next few weeks.

"We think that because of the lockdown last summer, people didn't refresh their wardrobe as much as normal. Then with lockdown in the early part of this year, they weren't able to have a clear out and donate any preloved summer clothing.

"If anyone has any men's or women's clothing they no longer wear but would like to donate, please drop it off at the shop."

The shop is also in need of children's toys and bric-a-brac and donations can be dropped off at the shop from 9-5. Tuesday through to Saturday.

"We have donation bags at the shop if needed and suggest people phone ahead if they are planning to make a special trip or donating a lot of stock," added Glynnis.

Everything sold in the shop helps CHSW provide vital care to local children with life-limiting conditions and their families. The charity's three hospices - including Charlton Farm in North Somerset – rely almost entirely on voluntary donations.

The hospices have remained open during the pandemic for emergency and end-of-life care and care teams have extended their lifeline support by visiting families in their own homes.



"Everv item donated and everv item sold really does make a difference," added Glynnis.

"And not only is it such a great way to support such a worthwhile cause, recycling unwanted clothes

### OSR Scouts from Stoke Gifford take on the Blue Peter Climate Heros pledge challenge

Blue Peter have set up a challenge to reduce plastic use, save energy and plant pollenating plants. 15 OSR scouts signed up for the challenge and decided during a zoom session

(prior to easing of virus restrictions) to make a giant globe from papier-mâché and cover it in green and blue crisp packets which need specialist recycling and not by SUEZ who do weekly collections of waste and other recycling in South Gloucestershire. There are specialist drop off points run by https://help.terracycle.com/hc/en-us/categories/360002626232-Public-Drop-Off-Location for recycling of crisp



packets etc; the nearest for Stoke Gifford is at the Wise Centre.

A few weeks later and the team had been split into 2 sub teams to build the super pledge! Team 1 covered the 40" natural rubber balloon in papier-mâché and a week later Team 2 covered the globe in green crisp bags for the land masses and blue crisp bags for the seas and oceans.






The whole team had 2 weeks to fulfil the pledges and once the globe was completed we sent in our entry to Blue Peter. Added to this, the team wanted a picture of them all holding the globe with a recycling truck in the background so they contacted SUEZ in Yate and Andy the Contract Compliance Officer jumped at the chance to be involved as the company are trying to get the message out to South Gloucestershire residents that crisp packets and other thin plastics are not as yet recyclable with the weekly collections. It was great news that they were more than happy to help support the scouts.

During Spring half term the team held a litter pick around Stoke Gifford collecting 3 bin bags full of rubbish from the parks. This counted towards the Supersized Pledge also.

So the scouts have reduced their time on games and computers, switching off consoles instead of putting them in standby mode. The return to face to face scouting helped with this as it meant they didn't need to do their 80 minute weekly zoom sessions. They also had to try meals with no red meat, dairy or fish, use multi use water bottles instead of throw away plastic and plant hanging baskets or planters full of pollinating flowers to attract bees and butterflies.

This whole experience has been great for the scouts and 1st Stoke Gifford OSR Troop haven't ever tried to earn a Blue Peter badge of any colour before. Even the badges are made from recycled yoghurt pots!

At the start of last month we heard that our challenge has been successful!! We received a 100% recycled envelope from Blue Peter containing our Climate Heroes Certificate and a green Blue Peter badge for each scout, which also gives free access to over 200 attractions in the UK!!







#### Long Overdue Rebuild of Patchway Community School Finally Given Go Ahead

The Olympus Academy Trust (OAT)was elated to receive the news in July that Patchway Community School has been selected for a rebuild under the Prime Minister's scheme to rebuild 50 schools across the country each year, for the next 10 years.

We were pleased to catch up with Dave Baker, CEO of the OAT who told us this good news is the result of much campaigning over many years after the school missed out being selected back in

"This rebuild is very much needed and long overdue" Dave told us "It has been unfair for local residents that Patchway has missed out for so long. The other schools in the Trust have benefited from new builds in 2005 (Bradley Stoke), 2010 (Abbeywood) and 2014 (Winterbourne Academy) and Patchway pupils, who live in the local areas of Patchway, Little Stoke and the north end of Bradley Stoke, have really missed out.

"Anyone who says that the school environment does not impact upon students' learning has not visited Patchway Community School! The original building dates back to the 1950s and is in stark contrast to the other local secondary schools which are all managed by the Trust. Whilst significant improvements have been made over the last few years, most of these (with the exception of the Astroturf) have been essential building maintenance (such as roofing and heating) which has been invisible to students.

"We are grateful to all who have supported us in making representations and for helping others to recognise Patchway Community School's need. Jack Lopresti MP has been very helpful to us in getting started on our campaign - his own children having attended Patchway School themselves.

"We look forward to progressing discussion on what the new school will offer, either a replacement for what we have existing or an all-



through facility (from primary to 6th form). We are hopeful that work will start on site in the not too distant future and that it might even be ready to open for Sept 2023. This is a really exciting time for us!"

The new school building will be net-zero carbon in operation, helping to meet South Gloucestershire and the Government's respective net zero targets.

Following the news, the South Gloucestershire Council's Leader and Education Lead, Cllrs Toby Savage and Erica Williams, met with Dave Baker and Head Teacher Karen Cornick to celebrate and discuss next steps (above photo).

#### Other Olympus Academy Trust news

From September the Stoke Gifford based Bristol Technical & Engineering Academy (BTEA) will be joining the Olympus Academy Trust, working in conjunction with Abbeywood Community School, with Dave Howe as Executive Headteacher for BTEA and Abbeywood and Ben Dilley as Associate Headteacher for Abbeywood.

Catering for students aged from 14-19, Dave told us how he envisions this move will be greatly beneficial. "It has been a long time coming and will cement our working relationship with BTEA. It will mean that we are able to offer a specialist engineering pathway to any and all Olympus students who are interested from Year 10 onwards as well as any external applicants who wish to follow an engineering programme."

Course details for the specialist pathways will be available in the autumn and the plan is to be able to offer taster days to all Olympus Year 9 students in due course.



#### Trailblazing artist channels creative talents to raise awareness of potential answers to climate change

An acclaimed local artist is harnessing her lifelong passion for art to address some of the biggest challenges - and possible solutions facing humanity and the environment, as the countdown to COP26 continues.

In less than four months, more than 190 global leaders will gather in the UK city of Glasgow for the 2021 United Nations Climate Change Conference, better known as COP26, to accelerate action towards ambitious targets aimed at cutting carbon emissions and safeguarding the world's future.

Leading experts from the University of Bristol's Cabot Institute for the Environment will be contributing to the discussions and a high-profile campaign has been launched in the city this month to bring the important issues at stake to a wider audience.

The campaign designs are the brainchild of Emma Blake Morsi, aged 24, who has created a series of evocative billboards and posters, currently emblazoned across Bristol, to highlight how innovative, pioneering research holds the key to unlocking such pressing problems. including access to water, sanitation, and sustainable food sources.

Emma, of British-Nigerian heritage, who was raised in the city, said: "Leading this campaign fulfils a big ambition because I'm passionate

about finding creative solutions to the world's social and sustainable challenges. COP26 may not be on everyone's radar, so this is an important and exciting way to make the hot topics under discussion more accessible and relatable."

The keynote design vibrantly illustrates the interdependent fragility of ecosystems, which are vital for plants, water, and food, while emphasising that access to water and sanitation is a human right. Another captures the ravages of climate change, depicting a scene of desolate drylands juxtaposed against lush greenery - a harsh reality which imperils 2 billion people.

"I really immersed myself in the research so I could fully understand it and make the artwork both appealing and meaningful. The response so far has been fantastic and I'm proud of the result." Emma said.

"The biggest reward is that the designs might spark ideas and conversations with people walking past on the street or waiting for the bus who have never thought about or maybe weren't even aware of the issues before. I truly believe creative art can help champion environmental progress and that discussions about climate change, and possible solutions, must be inclusive, starting at a grass-roots level. There's no better place than out on the street to do that."

Climate change is clearly a cause close to Emma's heart and the messages appear to be hitting home in more ways than one.

"Producing the work in lockdown has been difficult for all sorts of reasons, so this was quite an emotional moment. My family, who also live locally, have been spotting them in different places and are very proud."

Although Emma is now an award-winning artist and writer, who uses multiple story-telling mediums including graphics, photography, and film, her path to success has at times been a struggle with frequent moves all over Bristol and caring commitments to juggle alongside schoolwork while growing up.

After years of carefully honing her skills which started in early childhood, Emma had gained her Gold Arts Award at the age of 18 and a place to study BSc Fashion Management at university.

"It was by no means certain I would go to uni and get a degree as by that point I had my freelance and creative work to fall back on." she said. "I'm glad I did because it made me push new boundaries and ignite a new passion for STEM subjects. I also gained the opportunity to live abroad in Germany, working as an intern for a major global company on its sustainable

creative direction and design. My research involved studying the circular economy and developing waste management systems, which was totally fascinating."

Not one to rest on her laurels. Emma is also working on a wide range of other artistic projects to advance inclusion and innovation.

"The COVID-19 pandemic has been tough for everyone and marginalised groups have been hit especially hard.






survival depends on finding answers to these huge challenges and time is running out."

Professor Guy Howard, Interim Director of the Cabot Institute for the Environment and Global Research Chair of Environmental and Infrastructure Resilience at the University of Bristol, said: "Thank you Emma for creating such a wonderfully vibrant and engaging series of designs, which really bring to life the huge global challenges we're facing and how research happening right here in Bristol plays a crucial role in tackling them.

> "The agreements on action reached at COP26 will have a bearing on all our lives both now and long into the future, so it's important to raise awareness and improve understanding of pressing problems. such as access to water and sustainable food sources. I hope this fantastic artwork sparks lots of conversations about climate change and related issues, while also encouraging people to find out more about the amazing work scientists are undertaking to identify possible solutions."

Prints of the designs are being produced to raise funds for intersectional environmental charities.







**Great Western Air Ambulance Charity** (GWAAC) has recently introduced three new critical care cars to their response vehicles, alongside their helicopter.

The cars were purchased thanks to a one-off grant from the Department of Health and Social Care in 2019, and will allow their crew to respond to more people in urgent need across the region.

The charity's team of Critical Care Doctors and Specialist Paramedics respond to people suffering from life-threatening illness or injury, bringing hospital-level care direct to where it's needed most.

In 2020, the charity's critical care cars were more important than ever in keeping their service running, as COVID-19 restrictions meant that their helicopter had to be decontaminated after each mission. They responded to over 70% of their 1,726 missions last year by car, ensuring that those in need could still receive urgent care.

The cars carry exactly the same specialist equipment as the helicopter and allow the crew to get to the scene of a patient quickly. In instances where a patient needs transporting to hospital, the air ambulance crew will accompany them in a land ambulance whilst continuing their critical care on route. Having critical care cars also enables the team to respond to incidents in all weather conditions, when the helicopter may be unsafe to fly in.

Previously, the charity operated two critical care cars that were becoming increasingly unreliable and unfit for purpose, having done many miles since their introduction.

By adding a third car to their fleet, they will now be able to bring their lifesaving care to up to 50 more patients a year.

CEO Anna Perry, said: "Although GWAAC goes to around 2,000 incidents each year, there are even more people in our local communities who could benefit from our service. By adding a third critical care car to our fleet, we can deploy our clinicians to more people who need our expert skills and lifesaving care."

As a charity, they respond to over five critically-ill patients a day on average, many of which are by critical care car. Despite this, a recent survey carried out by the charity showed that 66% of people living in their region didn't expect or didn't know that they responded by car as well as helicopter.



#### HRH The Princess Royal opens new 'Conservation in Action' Workshop at Aerospace Bristol

The ceremonial opening marks the completion of the 106-year-old hangar's restoration, with museum staff and volunteers now preparing the new workshop to welcome visitors in August.

HRH The Princess Royal has visited Aerospace Bristol as the museum's Patron and formally opened its new Conservation in Action Workshop. Situated in a restored Grade II listed WWI aircraft hangar, built around 1915, the latest addition to Aerospace Bristol will allow visitors to get up-close to conservation projects - including the Bristol Freighter, Fighter and Bolingbroke - and watch as volunteers work on historic Bristol aircraft. Visitors to the workshop will discover tools and techniques used to manufacture aircraft and get a glimpse into life inside early aircraft factories.

As part of the formal opening occasion, HRH The Princess Royal stamped a clocking-in card using one of the original factory clocks.

After becoming the first person to clock-in to the new workshop, The Princess Royal was escorted on a tour by the museum's Chair, Professor Iain Gray CBE, who introduced Her Royal Highness to supporters, donors, conservation volunteers and members of staff. The tour included conservation projects, archive materials relating to the hangar and the history of aerospace engineering in the region, and a demonstration of the English Wheel metalworking tool.

Professor Gray said, "I am most grateful to Her Royal Highness The Princess Royal, Patron of Aerospace Bristol, for so kindly accepting our invitation to formally open Aerospace Bristol's exciting new Conservation in Action Workshop. This wonderful new space will not only allow our fantastic team of volunteers to undertake crucial restoration work, and share their valuable knowledge and expertise with visitors, it will also enable the museum to further enhance our award-winning learning programme, providing new learning opportunities and invaluable hands-on experience to the next generation of engineering talent."

Guests present at the opening event included the museum's Vice Patron, Sir George White, GKN Apprentice and Aerospace Bristol volunteer, Josh King, and representatives from Biffa Award: a multimillion pound fund that helps to build communities and transform lives through awarding grants to communities and environmental projects across the



UK. It was thanks to a £547,277 grant from Biffa Award, part of the Landfill Communities Fund, that the restoration of the 106-year-old hangar was made possible.

Rachel Maidment, Biffa Award Grants Manager, said: "Since awarding funding to Aerospace Bristol through our Partnership Grants Scheme in 2018, we've seen this historic hangar transformed from a deteriorating, unused structure into the fit-forpurpose workshop we see today. It's exciting to think that young people, community groups and visitors will soon have access to new learning activities, be able to engage with local heritage and even get hands-on with conservation projects, while benefitting from the expert knowledge and vital heritage skills of Aerospace Bristol's volunteer team."

Before departing the museum, Her Royal Highness spoke to the volunteers, donors and museum staff who made the new workshop possible and unveiled a plaque to mark the occasion (above photo). The plaque will be displayed on a historic time clock at the entrance to the Conservation Workshop, alongside similar clocks sponsored by museum supporters.

The Conservation in Action Workshop is set to open to the public in August when it will become the third hangar open to museum visitors, joining the WWI grade-II listed building that houses the main museum collection, and the Concorde Hangar, which is home to the last Concorde ever to fly.

A museum ticket will be required to enter the Conservation Workshop andadvance booking is highly recommended.
