

#### Cameron's Smile

Raising Awareness of Caring for a child with Rare and Complex Needs

Carla Golledge lives locally in Bradley Stoke and got in touch with Bradley Stoke Matters to share her story. She is a mum to three children, one of whom was born with a rare genetic condition called Norrie Disease.

Cameron was just 8 weeks old when he was diagnosed. Norrie disease usually only affects males and causes blindness and progressive hearing loss. Cameron is completely blind with no light perception whatsoever. He started to lose his hearing at the age of 3. He is non verbal, has global delays, autism, adhd, profound learning disabilities and a feeding tube. But his personaility shines through all of that, and the most important thing you will remember about Cameron is his smile.

Carla told us "It was really isolating when we first received his diagnosis, so that's when I turned to social media. I started writing a blog raising awareness of his condition and then connecting with other families in similiar circumstances. This is what gave me the idea to write a book: to help others on this journey feel less alone. Raising awareness of rare and complex needs and getting our story heard felt really therapeutic and helped me deal with a lot of the anxiety I face as my son's carer.

"I self published on amazon and was amazed at the response, overnight I went to number 1 best seller and the reviews I have recieved (see one example above) have made it feel so worth it."

"This book is a real insight into the difficulties faced by having a child with additional needs. A beautiful reflection of the struggles families face and have to come to terms with. Written with true love for Cameron. Loved reading this."



### Laura Webber of AMD Solicitors Considers the Dangers of Homemade Wills

Making a Will is the only way of ensuring that your estate and assets are distributed according to your wishes. If you die without a Will, your estate will pass in accordance with the rules of intestacy. This could mean that your estate will pass to someone who you may not want to benefit.

Reasons clients have mentioned for not making a Will include not having enough time, not wanting to talk about death and the cost involved. Concerns over fees may lead someone to prepare a home made Will.

Although a Will does not need to be prepared by a Solicitor, there are inherent dangers in preparing one yourself.

#### 1. Invalidity

A recent example of this involves a husband and wife who had each prepared identical homemade Wills. As far as they were concerned, from the time they had signed their Wills to the date they instructed us to make new ones, they had valid Wills. It was quickly spotted, however, that the Wills had only been witnessed by one person at the time of signing.

Due to this small but vital mistake, these Wills were invalid from the day they were signed.

#### 2. Changes in circumstance

If you decide to get married and already have an existing Will, that Will will automatically be revoked on your marriage, unless it was drafted in expectation of the marriage. A professional would advise you of this but a lay person might not be aware of the affect of marriage if they are making a homemade Will. Equally, divorce affects inheritance under a Will

#### 3. Dates

Another situation we have come across is an undated Will. Although a date is not required for a Will to be valid, it is your last Will that must be proved on your death. If the Will does not have a date then it is difficult to prove that it is the last Will and often sworn



statements are required from witnesses to provide evidence as to when they were signed.

#### 4. Inappropriate Clauses

If you try and take clauses from a previous will or use clauses from someone else's Will without fully understanding what those clauses mean and what their effect will be, you can end up with a Will that does not achieve what you wanted, with the result that some or all of your estate may go to someone you had not intended to benefit.

#### Who Cares? by Sheila Lally

We were pleased to be contacted by local resident Sheila Lally who has lived in the area for nearly 40 years. She is married with three grown up children and four grandchildren, enjoying nothing more than getting together with family and friends for a catch up. She is a frequent user of the excellent leisure facilities in Bradley Stoke and Thornbury with with her grandchildren or attending aquafit classes.

With a background in nursing at both Frenchay and Southmead Hospitals during the course of her career, Sheila found she really enjoyed working on wards caring for older people. Many older people have such interesting stories based on their life experience and she enabled her to

look at aging in a more positive light. This was further consolidated by changing jobs and working as a training officer for South Gloucestershire Council helping social care staff complete vocational qualifications. As many of these worked in care homes across the county and the home care service. Sheila became a frequent visitor to care homes from Cadbury Heath to Thornbury and in between! She then went on to train as health visitor and has worked with vulnerable families including Gypsies and Travellers.

Sheila has recently published a book Who Cares? which contains useful information designed to help those caring for older friends and relatives. Sheila told us:"I was inspired to write the book following my experience of caring for my mother in the last few years of her life. She passed away three years ago. Even though I had experience of caring for older people as a nurse and had worked in social care. I still found it difficult to get help and support for my mother as her condition deteriorated. My aim in writing the book was to provide a practical guide to caring for an older or vulnerable person and what help is available from the government, NHS and charities. It is a positive look at aging and discusses how older people can keep

engaged within their communities and presents steps that can be taken to overcome loneliness and social isolation.

I come from a large Irish family with 7 siblings! Yet even with such a big family to support Mum, we often felt the pressure. So I know first hand how rewarding caring for a relative can be and how it can bring you closer together, but it can also be emotional draining. For this reason I have included a chapter in my book for how carers can take care of themselves and signposts them to available help"

Sheila recently retired from her latest position as a senior lecturer at UWE in community public health nursing ie school nurses and health visitors. She still does occasional work for the university but her time is mostly filled with caring for grandchildren and volunteering where she undertakes roles in a school to help with reading, in a local Rainbow group and as a befriender with AgeUK.

There will be Poppies and collecting tins around the area in many shops, businesses and retail areas as well as the University of the West of England campus.



#### **Bradley Stoke Cricket Club - End of Season Update**

#### Seniors

The 2021 was season has been a historic season from a Senior Men's section point of view with the Club's 1st XI (pictured right) winning promotion to the West of England Premier League for the first time in the Club's history, alongside retaining the Tony Hitch T20 Knockout Cup after only winning it for the 1st time in 2019 when the cup was last held.

The club has four Saturday teams who take part in the Bristol and District Cricket Leagues (B&D) as well as two Sunday teams who are members of the North Somerset Cricket League. Due to such great availability we have even been able to field a fifth XI on occasion on Saturdays, a symbol of how far the club has come in such a short space of time.

The 4th XI is a mix of players beginning their Cricketing journey from our Strong Youth section along with older, wise heads who help guide the youth team in their first steps into adult cricket, the 4th XI play in Division 14 of the B&D and had a great season finishing 3rd in the league.

Top run scorer - Prabhu 303 Runs. Top wicket taker—Shabhaz Hussain 22 Wickets.

**Our 3rd XI** who play in B&D division 10 is a further step up on the 4th XI with slightly older youth players looking to further their adult cricket experience, the team had a great season this year finishing just short of a promotion place in 4th for the 4th consecutive season!

Top run scorer - Paul Peterson 321 Runs. Top wicket taker - Sam Hunter 26 Wickets.

Moving further up the ranks **our 2nd team** play in Division 4 of the B&D and finished the season in a respectable 4th position in what was an extremely challenging league. The team faced strong local clubs such as Golden Hill 2nd XI (Formerly YMCA), Winterbourne 2nd XI and Frenchay 2nd XI

Top run scorer - Anthony Beaven 188 Runs. Top wicket taker - Wayne Passmore 23 Wickets.

As previously alluded to, **the 1st XI** had a memorable season retaining the Tony Hitch Knockout Cup after victory against Backwell Flax Bourton and Winning promotion to the West of



England Premier League, for the 1st time in the Club's short history. The side competed in the B&D Senior Division, the top division of B&D cricket against top sides such as Frenchay, Bedminster and Timsbury and finished 2nd behind Bedminster to earn promotion. Interest in the team even reached such a point that Captain Ash Baber appeared on BBC Radio Bristol with Geoff Twentyman to discuss the team's successes. 75% of the team have come through the club's youth system and through the ranks to play important roles in the season within the 1st team.

#### Youth

After a shortened and unique season in 2020, the youth section were looking hopefully forward to a full season, with the green light given for recreational outdoor sport to resume.

With a membership of just over 100, plus All Stars and Dynamos (see below), across the whole section 95 matches were played.

All Stars Cricket returned for a 3rd year at BSCC after cancellation in 2020, with 29 5-8 year olds signed up to enjoy the 10 Friday evening sessions that were delivered.

**Dynamos Cricket** was launched, the natural progression from All Stars for 8 to 11 year olds. BSCC took part but chose to invite girls only, as was an option, to encourage more girls to get involved in cricket, as we already have thriving Under 9s and Under 11s sections. This saw 17 girls take part, alongside the All Stars sessions.

Our Under 9s entered a new U9s league set up by the local league, the Bristol Youth Cricket League (BYCL), essentially a league of friendly games to make setting up such games easier. A squad full of potential won all 5 such games they played, and played a further 10 friendly games away from the league structure.

Our Under 11s again fielded 2 teams in the hardball league competitions, one playing an 8-a-side pairs format, the other an 11-a-side 'traditional' format. The 8-a-side team picked up a couple of league wins, and the 11-a-side team got past one round of the cup and finished in mid table in their division.

For the first time we fielded two **Under 13s** teams, as the large squad size of nearly 30 required. The BYCL introduced 3 league tiers (Performance, Participation, Foundation) in this age group that could be entered, designed to reflect the level of the teams and so that all games were more competitive.



**Our new team, U13As,** (above photo) entered the Foundation division and finished runners up, a creditable performance from a developing side.

We had high hopes for our U13s and accordingly entered them into the Performance division. They had a particularly strong season by winning the league stage unbeaten, only to lose in the Final in the 4 team play-offs. Prior to that they finished runners-up in the BYCL Cup, and won the Stroud and South Gloucestershire group of the National Cup, their run ending in the Gloucestershire County finals day in the Semi-Finals. They ended

the season unbeaten at home and won 13 of their first 14 games.

**Our Under 15s** entered the Participation tier and won their division with 6 wins from the 6 games played. They lost close games in both cups to Performance tier Thornbury both times, but not before reaching the South Gloucestershire group Semi-Finals in the National Cup.

**Our Under 17s** entered the BYCL Participation tier, as well as the Development tier of a Countywide Under 16s competition organised by the Gloucestershire Cricket Board (GCB). All of our Under 17s players were eligible to play Under 16s competitions.

In their BYCL league division, they finished joint 2nd, and reached the Semi-Finals of the cup.

In the Under 16s competition, they won the South group, and so travelled to Cirencester CC for finals day which included the North Group qualifiers, winning their Semi Final vs Hatherley & Reddings, only to find the hosts too strong in the final.

All in all, a busy and successful season, particularly so for a number of our players also playing representative age group matches for Zonal, Gloucestershire County Development and Gloucestershire Full County teams across the season, not forgetting the club senior and women's matches that a good number also played in.

As ever none of this could run smoothly without the support of the parents/carers, all of our coaches and assistants, our Safeguarding Officer, groundsman, committee, our landlords Bradley Stoke Town Council, and the competition organisers. A massive thanks goes out to all.

#### **Bradley Stoke Judo Club:** The Community Club on the Global Stage

Did you know Bradley Stoke Judo Club has been part of and serving the community since 1999?

In the 22 years we have seen many local residents pass through our doors and we have taken many of them to national medallists. However the competitive path is not for everyone and we are equally as proud of the number of members who have continued their judo journey for fitness and the social

Since the end of the lockdowns and the lifting of restrictions we have seen great interest from a whole new generation of local residents wanting to take up judo. On the Saturday novices class for the under 12s we have had great numbers with us, regularly getting up to 30 on the mat. We are also getting great interest from the 30 years plus age groups wanting to start judo for the first time. The usual question is "Am I too old to start?" and the simple response is No.

On the competitive front judoka continue to make up for lost time and have been training hard preparing for the competition circuit. In August we took a group of about 20 fighters to Scotland to train with the Scottish national u15,18 and 21 squads at a weekend camp. Then the following week we took our u18, u21 and senior players to Croatia for a week's training camp with squads from Croatia, Slovenia, Bosnia, Hungary, Czech Republic and Kosovo. It was great experience for everyone to train against top international fighters with Olympic and World Cup experience. The coach of Kosovo, one of the world's up and coming Judo powerhouses, was so impressed with us that he asked if he could have one of the club's training tops. He has also invited us to train in Kosovo. The coach was recently filmed in a new documentary by Eurosport and European Judo and the name of Bradley Stoke can proudly be seen being worn by the coach (photo right)!





A successful performance by Tatum Keen at a recent European Cup competition has seen Tatum being selected by Great Britain to fight at the European and World Championships this year (photo left).

We used videos of other people's warm-ups, had slide shows about looking after your voice and how to sing better. To keep morale high, we always had a post-rehearsal drink and a quiz afterwards. Some of us also honed our editing skills to make music videos of ourselves singing. On Youtube you can find a beautiful version of Silent Night or our latest show opener - The Muppet Show theme. Now that's what I call range!

We're now back to face-to-face rehearsals (with some COVID precautions to keep



everyone safe) - rehearsing on Wednesday evenings at the St Michael's Centre in Stoke Gifford from 19:30. If you're a seasoned singer or only have a warble in the shower, why not come along and check us out? We're looking for new members on all singing parts. Our members come from all corners of life; our eldest is 93 and our youngest is 20. Whilst our roots are in barbershop singing we have a varied repertoire - as long as it's A Cappella.


