Bradley Stoke Students first to complete Covid learning programme

The first group of students to complete the Brightside programme of learning about the Covid pandemic have been presented with certificates to celebrate their achievements.

Sixth form students at Bradley Stoke Community School are the first to have learnt from the tailor-made courses that have been entirely designed and delivered by members of South Gloucestershire Council's Local Outbreak Management

A completely new and different programme of learning, Brightside sees students take part in interactive online sessions with public health professionals and officers from across the Council who have come together to respond to the Covid pandemic. As well as learning how different professions have responded and become more visible in society, the sixth formers were presented with detailed information about Covid, how the virus spreads and why certain measures reduce transmission.

The students were given an opportunity to take part in up to three modules, known as Spotlights, and were tasked with reporting on what they had learnt in a format of their choice. Bradley Stoke Community School's pupils decided to produce a podcast which they recorded themselves discussing Covid-19, the impact on their wellbeing and their education, and how we can all help stop the spread. The podcast was released in July at the end of the summer term and can be listened to on all listening platforms, including Spotify, Amazon Music and Apple Podcasts - just search for BSCS Podcast.

Cabinet Member for Education, Skills and Employment Cllr Erica Williams said: "Covid-19 has been a challenge for us all, but it's excellent to see some of the learning from the response to the pandemic used in this innovative education programme. The pupils of Bradley Stoke Community School fully embraced all elements of Brightside and used their creativity to produce a superb piece of communication about staying safe over the summer whilst still enjoying their holidays, that all young people can relate to."



Bradley Stoke Community School's Careers & Employability Champion Celia Arberry said: "It has been a pleasure for our students to be involved with the Brightside programme. It's such a great idea, they really wanted to be part of the scheme. The students were able to learn more about Covid-19 themselves and get a good insight through the training they received. From taking part, they were able to better understand the ways to prevent the spread and what everyone could do to play their part in controlling the infection."

Since launching Brightside to schools, a version of the programme has also been developed for newly qualified staff in early years' settings as well as a brand new Community Brightside project, just launched, focussing on the inequalities highlighted by Covid in our communities and how we can better respond to these in the future

"A Long and Winding Beat" **Brian Allinson**

Bradley Stoke & Little Stoke Gifford Matters was really pleased to hear from local resident and Councillor. Brian Allinson this month, who shared with us a copy of his new published book "The Long and Winding Beat".

The book charts Brian's unusual life from a young age experiencing life "below stairs" in a large country House near Wincanton in Somerset, through his early education by the Nanny of the household, and later at Wincanton Primary School.


His first job in the early 1960's was with a Jaquar Car dealership which led to

a love of performance cars. A career change in the late 60's saw him joining the Police Force in Somerset, and experiencing the strict regime that existed in rural forces in those days. He even required the permission of his Chief Constable to get married!

Early and regular promotion saw him rising through the ranks, between 1975 and 1979 he returned to Wincanton as the Section Sergeant before later promotion to Bath as an Inspector. He retired as a Superintendent in 1998.

The book describes a number of unusual postings and experiences and in particular his first ever flight in an aeroplane in 1976. The flight was in a two seat Hawker Hunter Jet! An incredibly experience that brought about a new direction in his life style, and became the cause of yet another turn in his career.

The development of Police Air support became a passion, eventually leading to a second career as an International Police Air support advisor which saw Brian lecturing on the subject in China, South Australia, New Zealand and throughout Europe.



Finally an interest in local politics saw him elected as a local Councillor in South Gloucestershire in 2001. A role he is still very much active in. He had the honour of Chairing South Gloucestershire Council in 2019 and will soon celebrate a total of 50 years in Public Service. What an achievement.

"Brian Allinson has had a remarkable life. He has been, and remains a dedicated public servant following an outstanding career in the police service.

He began his career at

a time when a beat officer needed all his wits to cope with the challenges they found on the street. Brian shares with us the humour and the camaraderie with fellow officers that helped him through adversity.

In his memoir he reminds us of how policing has been transformed in his lifetime. His vision of how policing and flight could combine to remarkable effect, has been realised.

Retiring for a second time allowed Brian to expand his commitment to public service through his activities as a Councillor culminating in his appointment as Chair of South Gloucestershire Council. Throughout his life he has been a devoted parent and now a grandparent. His memoir will be a treasure for his family and friends and also a wonderful window on policing history for future generations."

DREAMING OF A NEW KITCHEN?







In October Bradley Stoke resident, Chris Orman, spent a week in rural Kenya to initiate several projects.


Chris, who founded the UK international development charity The Bouncing Ball Trust in 2014. met with the community leaders in Bulati. a small rural Maasai community of around 1,600 residents, approximately 109km/68 miles southeast of the capital Nairobi. The main source of income for the community is livestock rearing and sand harvesting.

The meeting established the community's requirements and aspirations for improving educational provision in the area, which include:

- The development of Olkeju Bulati Primary School through completion of the partially built building, providing 2 new classrooms and an office. A replacement toilet block and a new kitchen is also being planned.
- The establishment of a Girls' Health Project. According to UNESCO at least 1 in 10 girls in sub-Saharan Africa miss school during their period.

The Bouncing Ball Trust have started an innovative project in Bulati to provide eligible girls with menstrual education, mentoring and sanitary packs containing underwear and reusable sanitary pads. We would like to thank the charity freedom4girls UK for their partnership in providing an initial supply of sanitary bags and the menstrual educational materials.

Two local female teachers will be delivering the project through two workshops/mentoring sessions being held each month.



desperate need of

support to be able to continue their education.

The Bouncing Ball Trust will be running a child sponsorship programme: for just £25 each month, you will enable a child to continue their education and receive additional support from our Projects Co-ordinator in Kenya.

To thank you for your support:

- At the start of your sponsorship, you will be able to have an introductory video call with your sponsored child, this will be facilitated through our Projects Co-ordinator.
- You will receive a report of their progress at the end of each school term.
- · A quarterly/half yearly video call with your sponsored child, this will be facilitated through our Projects Co-ordinator.

Due to the lack of a feeding programme in place the school can only operate between 0800 and 1240 hours a day. This enables children to go home for their lunch. However, the shortened school hours mean that the children miss around 15 hours of lessons a week.

Enabling a feeding programme at the school would provide the children with warm porridge in the morning and a nourishing cooked lunch. The school will then be able to open for a full school day (0800 to 1530 hours).

Changing Lives with Education

The teachers at Olkeju Baluti Primary School have initiated community education classes to improve the literacy level in the area. The literacy level is just 40% compared with 81% in Kenya and 99% in the UK.

This important project will enable the local adult population (many of whom have never been to school) to be able to read and write in their Maasai language as well as in English and Swahili. The classes currently run twice a week, on Thursday and Saturday for 2 hours each day.

An issue critical to the survival of the school and the community is the local water borehole. Since its establishment in 2011 it has only operated for 3 years. This means that the community has been dependent on either fetching water from a little pool of water nearby or walking many kilometres to the next working water borehole.

Although outside of the scope of The Bouncing Ball Trust, its importance means that we are a stakeholder in ensuring that the water borehole is delivering much needed water to the community and school. We are contacting charities and NGO's that have the expertise in this area for their assistance. If you can help or provide advice on this please contact us (see right).

We are delighted to be working in partnership with Holy Trinity Primary School in working on some of these projects, including establishing an educational



partnership between the two primary schools. We are also keen to hear from anyone, companies and organisations who would be interested in getting involved in the fundraising.

Education is something that we take for granted here in the UK. Unfortunately, in Kenya many children do not have the same opportunity to receive free and compulsory basic education. Although children have the right enshrined in the Kenyan constitution, they simply do not have the opportunity.

This is truly a fantastic opportunity for the community of Bradley Stoke to support the community of Bulati.

Probate Applications and Delays

Sophie Haskins of AMD Solicitors discusses the latest news about delays and probate applications.

Often when a loved one passes away, a Grant of Probate is needed to deal with their assets. A Grant of Probate is legal document, which provides Executors appointed under a Will the authority to deal with a person's estate. collect in assets and distribute them as guided by the Will. Once an Executor has collected in details of assets and labilities, the next step is to apply for the Grant of Probate. This includes the preparation of Inheritance Tax forms, which may need to be sent to HMRC, and a Probate application form which is sent to the Probate Registry who will then issue a Grant of Probate.

Before the Covid-19 pandemic, the average application issue time for a Grant of Probate was around two to three weeks. However, over the past 18 months, Probate Registries have been affected by the pandemic by way of staff shortages and increased numbers of applications, which has resulted in a backlog of Probate applications. Add to this a change in the Probate application process to an online system which has experienced a number of issues and the timescales for the issuing of a Grant of Probate have increased substantially.

A November 2021 Probate Application update put forward by the Law Society refers to an average application issue time, once the Probate Registry have received the application, of nine weeks but this could be longer if an application is stopped, perhaps because of an error or a lack of evidence supplied with an application.

Where Inheritance Tax needs to be paid, the Probate Registry ask that the Probate application is submitted to them 20 working days after the submission of Inheritance Tax forms to HMRC. which means the overall timescale is further extended. If an application is submitted sooner, this could cause further delay as the Probate Registry may not be able to match up the application with anything received from HMRC.



We understand that HM Courts and Tribunal Service (HMCTS) have been taking and continue to take steps to reduce delays and get back to their pre-Covid workload by taking on more staff and making improvements to the online system. However, they are of course mindful of the winter period and what this may bring.

The whole project is completely student led, with Emma hosting every episode and carrying out research to formulate questions for those being interviewed.

Emma is grateful for the amazing support that she receives from the Student Leadership Team. One of the members Samuel Kitson, has amazing technical skills and has been instrumental in making the Podcasts available on all listening platforms. Emma is also extremely grateful to her teachers and the Senior Leadership Team of the school for embracing the idea and for their enthusiasm towards the Podcast.

Emma's inspiration for the Podcast, came through her own experience during Lockdown of benefitting from listening to podcasts on a wide range of topics from BBC news to the Berlin Wall and faith related podcasts. Podcasts have the benefit of being easily accessible on any device with an internet access. They are short and perfect for listening to whilst relaxing or multi-tasking. They can be enjoyed on a daily walk or, as Emma says, to help overcome the mundaneness of tidying your bedroom! Despite some of Emma's peers thinking this idea was too ambitious it has now become a reality and Emma believes that the BSCS Podcast is a real asset to the school that is unheard of in most other schools.






Authors visit Meadowbrook Primary with a message from Santa



What is Myopia?

Myopia (short-sightedness) is the eye condition where near objects are clear, but objects farther away are blurred. It is caused by the eye ball growing slightly too long. The traditional answer was glasses, but at Lynne Fernandes Optometrists there's more we can do.

A whole year of Scouting at 1st Bradley Stoke Scouts

We started this year with everyone locked down so delivered virtual Scouting via Zoom across each of the sections. With young people having school lessons the same way, the challenge was to make it different, interesting and above all else, fun. So we did guizzes, treasure hunts. challenges (e.g. how many t-shirts can you put on - answer, lots!), held online cooking classes from everyone's kitchens and - the best bit - eating what we made.

Slowly we returned to face to face sessions, albeit starting with outdoor activities first on a socially distanced basis. Rockets were launched and wide games played. A popular choice was hiking with a variation being manhunt and learning how to use the What Three Words app. And they got wet in activities like stream walks!

When we were able to get indoors and closer to one another, we moved to archery, kayaking and then visits to a local dairy farm. We learnt about owls, how to pitch tents and our Scouts went to camp at Woodhouse Park. Open fires were used for backwoods cooking and dens were built. Skills were developed in bicycle maintenance and first aid. As we approached the end of the year, we held Christmas craft activities and games nights.



Throughout our young people have been supported by our adult volunteers and young leaders. We were lucky enough to recruit enough Beaver leaders to reopen a third colony and, with some careful management, manged to have the same number of Beavers overall in three colonies rather than the four before the pandemic.

We have the same number of young people (just over 250) across the whole Group and have made a serious dent on the waiting list. That said our Cubs sections are very fragile and are a leader or two away from not being able to operate.

We are yet to recruit a new Group Scout leader, which is an awesome opportunity to develop and extend leadership skills.

1st Little Stoke celebrate 70 years of Scouting

In 2022 1st Little Stoke Scout group will be 70 years old and will be holding events to celebrate this huge milestone.

On 6th February 1952, a meeting was called to see if there was interest in forming a Scout Troop in Little Stoke and the surrounding area. There was sufficient interest and the Scout Group was registered with the Boy Scouts Association on 19th May 1952.

The Cubs and Scouts met at Little Stoke School before an ex Civil Defence Hut was erected at the back of what is now 100 Bush Avenue and close to the Parish Council allotments. The Hut was then moved to the present site, near the children's park in Little Stoke prior to a larger building being erected.

It was clear that the old Civil Defence hut needed to be replaced and the search for a suitable building started in 1962 and on 15th May 1963 a wooden Drawing Office building from the Berkeley Nuclear Power Station site was purchased. It was opened on 30 January 1965

By 1983 the condition of the wooden building was causing some concern and plans were drawn up to replace it with a permanent structure. After all the effort of fund raising, it was difficult to see how we would ever be able to build the new Headquarters. Then we had a stroke of luck, Chris Bradley the father of one of the Beavers worked for Ridecolt.

a firm of Civil Engineers who were involved with the installation of the infrastructure of the Bradley Stoke development. He looked over the plans and asked how much we had - about £20,000. "I'll do it for £18,932.18" was the reply!

As we have little information about the years 1952-1976, if anyone has any photographs that we can copy it would be wonderful.

1st Little Stoke has three sections for children from 5.9 years to 14.5 years and currently has over 70 young people enjoying scouting. The sections are Beavers 5.9 to 8 years, Cubs 8 to 10 years and Scouts 10 to 14.5 years. We will in the near future have a new section for children 4 and 5 years provided we can recruit leaders from the parents of children who wish to join.

The programme we offer young people has a backbone of outdoor activities, camping and earning badges from subjects from Animal Carer to Swimmer.

We currently at Little Stoke have a waiting list of over 50 young people who wish to join. If your child wants to join and you are willing to help us with the running of the sections your child will not have to join the waiting list and can start immediately.

Will you be our next Scouting volunteer?

Volunteering's not just about giving back - the benefits go both ways. All of our activities are run by amazing volunteers. Volunteering lets you try new things, meet new people, and make a difference. We know that volunteering is #GoodForYou because when you volunteer, you'll

The Wildlife On Our Doorsteps

For many of us, increased home-working or 'hybrid' working has resulted in us spending much more time in our local area. We are so fortunate to have The Three Brooks Nature Reserve on our doorstep, and we are so grateful for all the time and care that the Three Brooks Nature Conservation Group put into looking after our local areas.

I love starting the day walking beneath trees, listening to the great array of birdsong all around. It's really rewarding and therapeutic to try and pick out individual songs and then find their composer. Wrens have a very distinctive song when you listen out for trills of repeated notes in the middle of fast and varied phrases. Song thrushes are another to listen out for, clear and loud, with each phrase repeated two or three times. Great spotted woodpeckers too can often be heard in the nature reserve, drumming away in treetops.

We've only recently noticed the amount of local birds of prey. Alongside buzzards, which can be heard calling from the tops of trees, we've seen sparrowhawks diving in-between and around the houses on our street. Kestrels are my personal favourite and are unmistakable when you see them hovering in mid-air.

The brooks and duck ponds are teaming with life. We enjoy seeing kingfishers regularly now, darting along the brook, even if they are only momentary glances of blue and orange. Little egrets often accompany the resident heron, and we have even seen a water rail enjoying the reedbeds.

Even in your own garden you can enjoy watching wildlife come to you. Our garden is as small as they come. But with a little encouragement from a couple of bird feeders, we love watching long tailed tits, coal tits, great tits, dunnocks and robins to name a few. Earlier in the year we took to eating lunch in our garden each day, and were often joined by a friendly and very cute field mouse who'd made his home amongst the plant pots!

You really don't have to travel far to see a great variety of wildlife, and you can get even closer by making your back garden a haven for nature. Whether it's hanging bird feeders, building insect hotels, leaving holes in your fences for hedgehogs, letting grass and wildflowers grow or even creating a small pond – we would encourage everyone to take simple steps to entice wildlife into your back garden. It really can be so rewarding!

I greatly enjoy spending time painting the wildlife I see and producing greetings cards, calendars and even mugs out of my paintings. Last year Jaci very kindly published an article of mine in Bradley Stoke & Little Stoke Gifford Matters about the benefits of getting creative in lockdown. I made readers aware of the wildlife calendars I had produced. It was so lovely to receive local orders as a result of the article, and my wife and I took great pleasure in delivering cards and calendars locally to people in our community.







OvenGleamers Top Tips for Loving Your Cooker This New Year

- 1. Invest in a non-stick oven liner. They help to catch all of those annoying drips that stick to the bottom of your cooker, which later can become a burnt-on mess. Easy to wash or pop in the dishwasher.
- 2. Do not use harsh chemicals inside your cooker. Instead, try a safer homemade option using items found around your household. For an all-purpose cleaner and deodorizer, mix together 4 tablespoons baking soda with 1 litre warm water.
- 3. Get the wiping habit! Wipe away any spillages immediately with a damp cloth. Don't give the mess a chance to stay.
