Four OSR Scouts in Stoke Gifford receive their Gold Chief Scouts Awards plus several other awards during an evening of celebration

During the old school rooms scout troop in Stoke Gifford's last evening of the Autumn term, scouts from the troop having completed all nine challenge awards, activity badges and nights away had a celebration evening where the District Commissioner attended to present their Gold Chief Scouts Award badges and certificates. Only 2 of the scouts could attend in person due to these times of isolation, Nathan and Mia (photo below) having worked incredibly hard especially during the last 2 years where we've been scouting at home and on zoom sessions still managed to achieve their awards. Jamal and Maya the absent scouts will receive theirs in the post.





Clive Mason (DC) talked to the troop about the commitment needed to achieve this the top award in the scout section. He also mentioned that the OSR troop have been very successful at managing the curriculum over the years with leaders planning well and being very busy, but it is of course the young people that have to put in the hard work.

Scouts join at the age of 10 years and leave at the age of 14 years of age when they can move up into Explorer scouts to continue their scouting. Two previous OSR Scouts who did just that and returned to the troop as members of the Young Leader Scheme were also awarded their YL Belts and Certificates after 3 years of module training and practical face to face missions and tasks.

The scheme trains the young people with many of the same skills provided for adult leaders and many of the YP go on to continue in scouting into adulthood. Jack and Josh (photo right) were both presented their awards by the District Explorer Scout Commissioner Steve Daniels who said that during the last 2 years the YL's had shown a great amount of commitment with lots of the modules held on zoom. The support that these young people give during troop evenings and camps is invaluable with practical leadership to complete the mission requirements.





Clive then turned his attention to two adult awards and presented Steve with his Order of Merit for exemplary commitment to scouting with all his roles within the Brunel District and his work with the young leader scheme. Then 1st Stoke Gifford's very own Group Scout Leader Paul Smith who was awarded the Silver Acorn for his outstanding commitment to scouting getting the group back during the pandemic and his roles within the Brunel District appointments team as Chairman.

Perserverance and Determination see a great comeback in Brazil for local Karting Champion

We were pleased to hear from the family of local karting champion Pedro Oliveiri who recently returned home from the Brazilian National Kart Championships. We were really interested in Pedro's story and his determination and perseverance to fight back after a traumatic injury.

Pedro has lived in Bradley Stoke his entire life, attending Holy Trinity Primary School and also BSCS before embarking on a Level 3 BTEC Advanced Engineering at Weston College in September.

With dad being a keen motorsport enthusiast, Pedro started go karting at just 6 years old (photos right) when he was taken to Teams sports (indoor karting) just for fun. Pedro loved it and wanted to go again and again. He was doing really well and showed potential, so the family decided to broaden his experience and started going to outdoor tracks. From then on, Pedro became very competitive and fell in love with the sport. He got

his own kart, has been competing in various club championships and has won a few titles - 2019: National Champion Tyro Junior; Midlands Champion; Fullbeck Club Champion; Rissington Club Champion. 2021: 1st place in South Wales IKR Championship; 4th place in Mansell Raceway (Club) Championship: 3rd place in the Brazilian National Championship.

In December the family went to Brazil for Pedro to take part in the 56th Brazilian National Kart Championship. This is the most important karting event in the country, organized by the Motorsport Local Authority (CBA), which had a record of 545 drivers participating and was widely broadcast.

Pedro had never been to the track before and had never driven in this particular class (kart and

engine). He was set to race against many experienced drivers, many of whom had the benefit of practicing on this specific track for a while. With just 1 hour of practice before heading to qualifying. Pedro managed to achieve a qualifying position of 13/29. He started P13 and then for 3 subsequent pre-final races (Heats) he managed to gain positions. The final was tough but Pedro was able to keep his head, pace and performance, finishing in 3rd place for a podium position, bringing home a fabulous trophy (photo right)!











This is such an amazing achievement for Pedro and the team was very impressed with his performance and outcome.

The family are especially proud of him and this particular victory due to the setback and adversity that Pedro had to overcome to achieve

In 2020 Pedro had a very serious accident during a race in the UK (he broke both legs) which left him off the tracks for over a year. It was a tough period. He had to go through 2 surgeries within a year, a lot of physiotherapy and basically had to "learn to walk" again.

As if it wasn't enough, there was the pandemic, and his GCSEs!

He missed racing so much, but knew he needed to work hard on his physical and mental recovery if he wanted to go back to the tracks. There have been the inevitable ups and downs, but Pedro has shown great strength and determination, maintaining a positive attitude and finding motivation everyday to become even better than he was before. He worked hard and. 18 months after his accident, he took on the challenge to race in Brazil. What a fantastic comeback!!

Pedro is now moving up categories (from Juniors to Seniors) and is set to race in a few championships in UK in 2022, and is also planning to transition to a Formula Class to try different driving styles.

As he is progressing so well he will also be looking for partnerships/sponsors.

Community Matters: Could you help out and join

In and around the five Stokes area there is a plethora of groups and organisations that do amazing work with the community, often which run mainly (or even solely) with the help of volunteers. Some groups have managed to run throughout the pandemic, and some are only now opening back up. Unfortunately as people's lives are also getting back to normal and people are going back to work there is now a real shortage of volunteers to help keep these community assets running.

One local charity, the Brightwell Centre, that supports people living with MS (multiple sclerosis) tells us why volunteers are so important to their work:

"We are so lucky to have such dedicated and professional volunteers. Without our volunteers. we simply could not continue to operate.

"We rely on Chamber Operators who volunteer weekly and run all 25 of the weekly Oxygen Therapy Sessions. This is a highly-skilled, responsible but hugely rewarding role where the operators can see first-hand how the therapy they deliver helps people cope with neurological and other chronic conditions. Operators are in good hands under the supervision of our wonderful Oxygen Coordinator Angela and our Chief oxygen operator volunteer Keith. Keith has been volunteering for 36 years and is so

experienced he is also a treasured national oxygen advisor. We are currently seeking people who enjoy a challenge, are confident and detail

Throughout the pandemic many of us volunteered in numerous ways, and found the benefits of keeping busy, feeling useful, helping others and feeling a part of a community. Some of us may have been forced to stay in more, and volunteering now is great way to get back out into the world and meet new people and build confidence at a pace you are happy with. For those who are looking to get back into work, volunteering is a great way to fill a CV as well as teaching valuable work placed skills. And for those who have come out the other side of work into retirement it is a great way to keep utilizing the skills you have to give back to the community and keep involved and active.

Sue, who volunteers at the Memory café in Patchway (photo below) tells us why volunteering has been so useful to her:

"I am the lead volunteer for the Patchway Memory Cafe which meets twice a month for people with dementia and their carers.

"After I retired I did experience a period of loss and lack of purpose so I decided to look for some volunteering work that would interest me and help people in my community.



"Chair aerobics" at the Memory Cafe, which meets on the 1st and 4th Monday of the month at St Chads in Patchway and is for people with Dementia and/or memory loss and their carers.

"I decided to volunteer for the memory cafe as some members of my family had dementia and I know how important it is for those people living with dementia and their carers to get back into their community and socialise. I love my volunteer role it gives me a sense of giving back to my community and a real bonus is I have got to know so many people and work with a lovely team of volunteers to make the cafe a success. We give six hours a month to running the cafe. It's such fun with our cafe members and we all enjoy the sessions and get to know those people so well and we learn by their feed back how important coming to the cafe twice a month is for them. There are so many volunteer roles to choose from and you can give as much or as little as you wish to volunteering but you get so much back."

Jane said "I love meeting all my regulars on a Thursday and checking how they are all doing. It makes me feel as though I'm giving something back, as The Brightwell has been a good friend to

Howard, another of the operator team has thoroughly enjoyed keeping his hand in and sharing his expertise. "I was inspired by an ex-colleague of mine who after retiring became a chamber manager / Centre manager in the North of England. Being an ex-Deep-Sea Diving Supervisor I already had an interest in oxygen therapy and wanted to volunteer when I retired, The Brightwell was a perfect fit. I also feel it's important to volunteer for people less fortunate than mvself.

Lasting Powers of Attorney The Pitfalls of Instructions and Preferences for your Attorneys

AMD's Laura Webber considers the importance of careful consideration surrounding additional guidance to your attorneys.

A Lasting Power of Attorney (LPA) is a legal form that gives authority to those appointed as Attorneys to make decisions on behalf of the donor (the person who has created the LPA). There are separate LPAs for Property/Financial Affairs and Health/Welfare.

A key difference between the two LPAs is that the Property and Financial Affairs LPA can be used even when a Donor still has mental capacity (with their permission). A Health and Welfare LPA can only be used when a Donor has lost mental capacity.

Within the LPAs, it is possible, to include instructions and/or preferences for your attorneys. This can often be very helpful, especially if the donor has not spoken with and does not intend to speak with the attorney(s) to let them know their thoughts on particular financial and health matters. This might be the case where professional attorneys are appointed. It is however important to be aware of the distinction between instructions and preferences. Instructions are things that the attorney must do, whereas preferences are things that the donor would like the attorney to do or consider.

Despite the aim of assisting the attorney with decision making, if not thought through and included in the LPAs with care, instructions and/or preference can sometimes cause problems and conflict with other parts of the LPA. This can lead to the Office of the Public Guardian, the body who review and register the LPAs, raising queries or rejecting the application to register the LPA. For example, you cannot ask your attorneys to do something


that is against this law. This can include wording regarding euthanasia or assisted suicide. Another example is where you appoint a number of attorneys to act on a 'joint and several' basis and then change the way you want them to act in the instruction section. For example, you might ask that certain decisions are made together or that a specific attorney makes a certain decision. This would conflict with your choice that attorneys act jointly and severally and can result in the LPA being unworkable.

In addition, if a donor has managed investments, or wants their attorneys to be able to ask a bank etc to manage their investments, it is very important that specific wording is included in the Property and Financial Affairs LPA to ensure that management can continue, or be considered by the attorney, should the donor lose mental capacity.

"The chief priests and our rulers handed him over to be sentenced to death, and they crucified him; but we had hoped that he was the one who was going to redeem Israel. And what is more, it is the third day since all this took place." Luke 24:20-21

'We had hoped...'



'ESCAPE Pain Courses' Available at local Active Lifestyle Centres

Over 8.75 million people in the UK suffer from chronic joint pain, which can prevent them from being active. However, activity will help improve physical and psychological wellbeing and ensure a healthy social life.

ESCAPE-pain stands for Enabling Self-management and Coping with Arthritic Pain using Exercise. It is an evidence-based, group rehabilitation course for people with chronic joint pain developed by Professor Mike Hurley and approved and commissioned by the Clinical Commissioning Group, NHS (CCG).

The progressive exercise programme will help people learn how to cope with pain, how to exercise safely and pace themselves, manage their symptoms, and be around people who have the same condition.

The Escape Pain courses will be available in the five Active Lifestyle Centres across South Gloucestershire (Bradley Stoke, Kingswood, Longwell Green, Thornbury

and Yate). The courses are aimed at people over 45 years, who have been suffering from chronic knee and hip arthritic pain for three months or more, and need a supervised fitness programme so that they can work toward independent living and mobility. Each session will help participants understand their condition, educate them so that they can go away, and be more independent. Gloria Isaac took part in one of the Escape Pain courses. She said, "Attending the Escape pain cours has benefited me: I was having cortisone injections in my right knee every 6 months, however I have not felt the need for any further treatment. I

have seen improvement in my wellbeing mentally and physically as well as improvement in my muscular strength around my knee and other muscles too. I am now continuing with a follow up class for arthritis at the leisure centre, so I benefited from the course a lot."

Jim Rollo, Head of Lifestyles, said, "Following the success of our GP Healthy Lifestyle Referral Scheme. Active Centres are proud to receive this commission, and deliver this vital service that has the potential to improve the lifestyle of so many people within our local communities who suffer from chronic knee and hip arthritic pain." He adds, "The Escape Pain courses are underway, and participants have already noticed improvements mentally and physically."

The Escape Pain sessions are free and supported by NHS England. The courses will run up to March 2023. If you think you could benefit from taking part in any of the above sessions, please speak with your local GP practice or Health Care Professional about referral.






OSR Scouts return in 2022 to some basic scouting skills

Energy Price CapRise of 54%

The Government has announced a rise to their price cap, which will impact energy prices for most people in the UK from 1st April 2022.

The increase is driven by a record rise in global gas prices over the last six months, with wholesale prices quadrupling in the last year. It will affect default tariff customers who haven't switched to a fixed deal and those who remain with their new supplier after their previous supplier exited the market.

The price cap allows energy companies to pass on all reasonable costs to customers, including increases in the cost of buying gas. Since the price cap was last updated in August, the current level does not reflect the unprecedented record rise in gas prices which has since taken place.

Under the price cap mechanism, energy companies will be allowed to pass on these higher costs from April when the new level takes effect. This is because energy companies cannot afford to supply electricity and gas to their customers for less than they have paid for it.

Help is available

If you are struggling to pay for energy bills, you should contact your energy supplier as soon as possible. Depending on your circumstances, you may be eligible for extra help



with your energy bills or services, such as debt repayment plans, payment breaks, emergency credit for prepayment meters, priority support and schemes like the *Winter Fuel Payment* or *Warm Home Discount* rebate.

Breathing Space Scheme

This is a scheme to give households time to receive debt advice and find a solution to sort out their debt problems. *Breathing Space* will last for 60 days as long as applicants remain eligible, during which time all creditors who have been included will be informed and must stop any collection or enforcement activity. Once the breathing space ends, creditors will be able to collect the debt in the usual way.

In addition to our regular meetings we have a variety of social events planned for the year, and in November we will be finally restarting our bird show which had to be postponed during Covid. After 2 years of Zoom meetings, I am sure many people will be looking for ways to get out of the house and meet people face to face, and any visitors will be sure of a warm welcome. Our experienced members, several of whom have won prizes at national shows for the birds they have raised, are always available for new keepers in need of advice. The club also has a library of guides to bird keeping covering all sorts of species, from canaries to back garden chickens.

Hatting was a lucrative artisan skilled trade, and the Winterbourne area did very well when work boomed from the 1760s. Watleys End was built as a 'greenfield' hatting village. The cottage industry delivered economic and social gain for 100 years, but then mechanisation developed which de-skilled the trades. Local hatters resisted this change for decades, with the result that the industry here stagnated, while mills in the north with a more compliant workforce picked up the advantage. Social, economic, political, agricultural and technological reforms during this period were huge, and the fortunes of the hatting industry illustrate how this affected our local history and the lives of people in this area.
