



The scouts in Stoke Gifford's OSR Troop signed up for South Gloucestershire Big Clean and spent a day walking around Stoke Gifford paying particular attention to the 3 parks.

Equipped with pickers, hoops, gloves and bags the volunteers made their way to the park next to the Trust Hall sweeping through and collecting a lot of small rubbish. All bagged up and left at the car park entrance for the council parks warden to collect.

Then through the village to the shopping area on Ratcliffe drive where they cleared litter before heading onward to Meade Park. The scouts had lots of comments from residents out walking and spending time with families. The scouts collected more litter here and deposited the sealed bags of rubbish near the

small car park bin area before walking across the main road into 40 Acres. There was lots more rubbish here blown into the bushes, collected and returned to the Old School Rooms and put in the centre's bins.

The troop regularly get involved with the local community groups or work alone on environmental projects and so have applied for funding with Tesco.

The community fundraising blue token scheme has accepted their project to buy more equipment for tidying community areas such as shovels, brushes, builders gloves and protective glasses/goggles plus rubble sacks and maybe the occasional skip. Please help support them at all our local Tesco stores where voting takes place until 30th June. We have some lovely areas in Stoke Gifford but as everywhere there are lanes and hedgerows that need a spruce up. The scout troop are willing and able to tackle these and a bonus is it counts towards a scouting challenge award!

from residents has been fantastic, with lots of interactions on Facebook and ever changing stock as new donations arrive each day. I'd like to thank everyone who has used or donated to the Toy Library and everyone who has helped keep it looking good and functioning - it's truly a community

resource and a focal point for the younger members of the village.

The Toy Library changes its decoration every month, with particular highlights being our Poppies and Santa hat donated by the Stoke Gifford Yarn Bombers. The local Girl Guide groups have had so much fun making the decorations which are themed and seasonal.

This year we have made birds for the big bird watch in January, Chinese New Year of the Tiger decorations, Red Nose Day faces and Easter decorations.

Away from the Toy Library, the girls have been working hard on the Guiding programme and interest badges. The 2nd Stoke Gifford Rainbows are learning all about Bee's hence the May Toy Library decorations in honour of World Bee Day and have enjoyed a visit from a local Bee Keeper, planted some bee gardens and played lots of bee themed games.

We are looking forward to taking party in Jubilee Day celebrations, helping at the St Michaels School Summer Fair and are also planning a sleepover at AirHop.



A tall Climbing Wall will be alongside the local BS Scouts stalls which features longbow archery and other fun activities.



Nick Howell of AMD Solicitors discusses how our commercial litigation team can help

We encourage our clients to make an early offer to settle. An early offer can help you minimise the costs involved with progressing your claim. Making the offer a 'Part 36 offer' puts further pressure on your opponent to settle, as the cost consequences can be significant.

What is a Part 36 offer?

Part 36 is a provision of the Civil Procedure Rules that is aimed to encourage parties to settle their claims and to penalise parties that do not accept an offer that they do not beat at trial.

Offers can be made by both parties, and will be deemed either a claimant's offer or a defendant's

Requirements of a Part 36 offer:

- The offer must be in writing:
- It must be clear that it is pursuant to Part 36;
- It must specify a period of not less than 21 days (which is known as 'the relevant period') within which the offer can be accepted:
- It must also state that the defendant will be liable for the claimant's costs if accepted;
- It must state whether it applies to whole or part of the claim:
- It must state whether it takes into account any counterclaim.

What happens if the offer is accepted?

If the offer is accepted, the claim is stayed. The defendant will have to pay the sum within the offer and the claimant's legal costs. The legal costs will be assessed (by a court) if they cannot be agreed between the parties.

What happens if the offer is rejected?

If the offer is rejected, and the matter proceeds to trial, the judge will not be aware of the offers until after the claim has been decided. Once the claim has been decided the judge will then consider the costs. If the judgment is equal to or better than the offer, the judge will penalise the person that has rejected this offer.

Example: at the hearing, the judge awards the claimant a sum of £35.000.00.

Scenario 1: the claimant made a part 36 offer of £30,000.00. As the claimant

has done better than their offer, the defendant will be penalised with the following cost consequences:

- Interest on the judgment at 10% above base rate from the date on which the relevant period expired:
- Costs on the 'indemnity basis' from the date that the relevant period expired. This means that the court would only deduct any costs it considered unreasonable (whereas on the 'standard basis' would also deduct any costs it considered disproportionate);
- Interest on those costs at 10% above base rate:
- An additional sum of 10% of the amount awarded (up to a maximum of £50,000) and 5% of any amounts awarded above £500,000 (up to a maximum total of £75,000).

Scenario 2: the defendant made a part 36 offer of £40,000.00. As the defendant has done better than their offer, the claimant will be penalised with the cost consequences below:

- Costs on the 'indemnity basis;
- Interest on those costs at 10% above base rate.

Years of Service!! The Queen's Platinum Jubilee 1952-2022

This year's celebration of Queen Elizabeth II's 70-year reign is one of the UK's major historic events. 70 years on the throne is just an incredible accomplishment. At 96, Her Majesty is the world's oldest monarch, the previous holder of this title being His Majesty King Abdullah Bin Abdulaziz Al Saud of Saudi Arabia who died in 2015 at the age of 90 (although he was only king for 10 years!).

On 21st April 1926 during the reign of her grandfather King George V, the eldest daughter of the Duke and Duchess of York (later King George VI and Queen Elizabeth) was born in Mayfair and named Princess Elizabeth Alexandra Mary. For the first 10 years of her life, although 3rd in line to the throne, she was never expected to become By Original: Joel Rouse/ Ministry of Defence Queen. Her father was the second son of King George V and, as such, the first son Edward was the natural heir and any children he may go on to have would precede Elizabeth in this respect. When her grandfather died in 1936 Edward ascended to the throne for just short of a year before abdicating to marry Mrs Simpson, causing 'constitutional crisis', and leaving his brother to take on the responsibility becoming George VI thus changing the course of Princess Elizabeth's life.

Princess Elizabeth was 13 years old when WWII started. In 1940 her home in Buckingham Palace was bombed and the 14-year-old Elizabeth made her first radio broadcast during the BBC's Children's Hour, addressing other children who had been evacuated from the cities. She stated: "We are trying to do all we can to help our gallant sailors, soldiers, and airmen, and we are trying, too, to bear our own share of the danger and sadness

of war. We know, every one of us, that in the end all will be well." By the time the war ended, she had become a Junior Commander at the ATS (Auxiliary Territorial Service) and was training to become a mechanic.

As a member of the ATS, she was also the first female of the Royal family to be an active-duty member of the British Armed Forces. On VE Day, 8th May 1945, dressed in that ATS uniform. Princess Flizabeth and her sister Princess Margaret mingled incognito with the celebrating crowds in the streets of London. In 1985, speaking to the BBC about that night, she said, "I think it was one of the most memorable nights of my life." Today, Queen Elizabeth is the last surviving head of state to have served during the Second World War.

Princess Elizabeth went on her first overseas tour in 1947, accompanying her parents through southern Africa. During the tour, in a broadcast to the British Commonwealth on her 21st birthday, she made the following pledge: "I declare before you all that my whole life, whether it be long or short, shall be devoted to your service and the service of our great imperial family to which we all belong." I certainly think she has lived up to this promise.

Two years after the end of WWII, and six years before she would become queen, Princess Elizabeth was betrothed and married to her distant cousin — Lieutenant Philip

father. In 1952 on the death of her father, she became Queen Elizabeth II, the official coronation taking place in 1953. At this point, she had already given birth to two of her four children – Prince Charles (b1948) and Princess Anne (b1950). Ten years later in 1960 Prince Andrew would be born, and Prince Edward in 1964. To date their four children have given the Queen eight grandchildren, and twelve great-grandchildren. Sadly, Prince Philip passed in April 2021, after some 74 years of marriage and just two months before what would have been his 100th birthday. As Queen's consort from her accession as queen on 6 February 1952 until his death in 2021, he is the longest-serving consort in history.

Queen Elizabeth II has lived through many changes in the world around her, especially in terms of technology. She saw the world go from radio and black and white televisions to smartphones and royal social media pages. But, all in all, she has been said to be guite a progressive and embracing monarch as the world changed around her. The Queen's 1957 Christmas Broadcast was an historic event as (on the 25th anniversary of the first Christmas radio broadcast by her grandfather) it was the first to be televised, . She was also early to email, sending off her first one in 1976, and then in 2012 she recorded her Christmas message in 3D. The best way to analyse her approach to change is her own words. "Change is a constant," said the monarch as she addressed Parliament during her Golden Jubilee in 2002, "managing it has become an expanding discipline. The way we embrace it defines our future."

Little Stoke retained the Les James League Cup with a deserved 2-0 win over Ruardean Hill Rangers in the final at Stonehouse Town.

They lifted the silverware in 2018/19 with a penalty shoot-out triumph over AEK Boco

after a goalless draw and the competition has not been completed for the past two seasons due to Covid. Their victory this time around was rather more straightforward than three years ago, with a goal in each half from Jack Burgess and Jaidon Holver enough to see off the challenge of Ruardean.

Rangers, who finished five places below their opponents in the final Gloucestershire County League standings, were close to opening the scoring after eight minutes. We look ahead to a busy season of league, cup and friendly matches, pray for good weather and count our blessings that we are able to enjoy this great game in such an uncertain world.


