

New Mayor and Deputy Mayor of Bradley Stoke 2022-23 elected

At the Annual Town Council meeting in May, Councillor Tony Griffiths was elected to the position of Mayor and Chair of the Council for the civic year 2022-23, with Councillor Franklin Owusu-Antwi being elected as the new Vice-Chair of the Council and the Deputy Mayor of Bradley Stoke.

The new Mayor was welcomed to the role by the outgoing Mayor, Councillor Tom Aditya.

Councillor Tony Griffith has been a sitting councillor in Bradley Stoke since 2011 (currently representing the Bradley Stoke, North ward). For the Mayor's Charities for this year, Tony has chosen the Great Western Air Ambulance and St Peter's Hospice.

Cllr Tony Griffiths in his message said: "Firstly, I would like to thank the people of Bradley Stoke for re-electing me as a councillor for the third term. I have lived in Bradley Stoke for 17 years and I am delighted that the members of the Council have chosen me to be the mayor for a second term. Due to the pandemic, all events were cancelled during my first term and council didn't think it was fair that I had a non-event year!

I come from an Architectural Technician background, and had a period in the military, followed by successful roles in business and hospitality. Five days before being appointed mayor, I was delighted to receive a civic honour of the Order of St George, for my 37 years of charity work, 11 years of military service and 11 years as an unpaid councillor.

I am looking forward and will continue to act for and help the people of Bradley Stoke in this role. I would particularly like to support any local initiatives and organisations and would welcome invitations to attend any functions or events you have planned.

Should you see me around the Town please stop and say 'hi', I will be pleased to offer my assistance wherever possible. I shall be listening to the wishes of the constituents and will apply their wishes wherever practical and economically possible.

We are so lucky to have such a lovely town of Bradley Stoke, however there are always room for improvement. The Conservative party administration of the council brought many good community projects and development programmes to the town, whilst keeping tax precepts low. And I am eager to continue that and progress further with the support of our councillor colleagues and staff."

All Councillors and the BSTC staff are united in the continuation of making Bradley Stoke a great place to live, providing public committees for finance, planning and environment, and leisure, youth and amenities. Public wellbeing is catered for through the Town Council grant aid scheme, remember to apply for consideration if you have a good cause needing support.

Also at the meeting and on behalf of the past Mayor, Councillor Michael Hill (who sadly passed away suddenly during his term of office), Councillor Tom Aditya presented the two Mayor's Charities, Dogs for Good and St Peter's Hospice, with presentation cheques, totalling £2,503 each, resulting from fundraising activities during 2021/22.

BSCS Head of PE Enters Iron Man Triathlon in Memory of Former Pupil Luke Wheaton



"Do you want to join me in making a difference? I'm raising money in aid of The Luke Wheaton Legacy Trust and every donation will help. Thank you in advance for your contribution to this cause that means so much to me."

Andy Young has worked as Head of the PE department since joining Bradley Stoke Community School in 2010. This month he is undertaking his first attempt at completing an ironman distance triathlon. The IRONBOURNE triathlon is in Eastbourne on Sunday 10th July and he has been training for 30 weeks in preparation for the gruelling endurance event:

2.4 mile (4km) sea swim; 112 mile (180km) bike ride; 26.2 mile (42km) run.

His motivation is to honour the memory of Luke
- a much loved son, inspirational friend and
passionate sportsman. Luke had recently started an
apprenticeship at Wessex Water and sadly lost his
life in the tragic Avonmouth accident in 2020 at the
age of 16.

His legacy will live on via the Luke Wheaton Legacy Trust as it continues to support and encourage underprivileged young people on their journey through life, helping them to further their education outside of the class room, gain new skills, and stay active through exercise and local sports clubs, allowing them to achieve their full potential.

Andy taught Luke throughout his 5 years at the school, where he was a dedicated sportsman plahying in the football, rugby and athletic teams, often being voted player of the match! Andy decided to dedicate this, his first ironman distance triathlon to Luke's memory as he knows Luke would have been interested to follow the journey, recognising the difficulty of such a task. Andy says "Luke would never give up and that is what is inspiring me in this challenge".

Friends and family of Luke have been really supportive in helping Andy with gym membership, chiropractic treatment and bike maintenance. Andy would like to publically give thanks to Everlast Gym Filton, Willow Brook Chiropratic and Mike Lewis for bike maintenance.

On 20th June, 20 students from BSCS were selected to attempt the 'ironman in a school day' challenge in support of the LWLT ironman distance triathlon.

Collectively the students aimed to swim 152 lengths at Winterbourne swimming pool, cycle 112 miles at Bradley Stoke Leisure Centre and finally run 104 laps around the athletic track at school. In reality the targets were reached very quickly by the group so they carried on and smashed them all-swimming 923 lengths, along with 240 laps and a 5km run each. Well done team!!

Jubilee Celebrations -Special service to mark the Queen's Platinum Jubilee

As the celebrations of the weekend were drawing to a close, the churches of Bradley Stoke and Little Stoke gathered together in the Willowbrook Centre for a special service to mark the Queen's Platinum Jubilee.

Revd. Dr. Rod Symmons, interim minister in the Parish of Bradley Stoke welcomed over a hundred people from the town and the local churches, as they gathered together in the atrium of the Willowbrook Centre.

Rev. Rod started the service by showing the recording watched by nearly 12 million people in the UK of the Queen having tea with Paddington and reflected on how the Queen never ceases to surprise us! Rev Rod shared part of the Queen's Christmas Speech from 2015 when Her Majesty explained that "despite being displaced and persecuted throughout his short life, Christ's unchanging message was not one of revenge or violence but simply that we should love one another" as she went on to encourage us "to be thankful for the people who bring love and happiness into our own lives and to look for ways of spreading that love to others, whenever and wherever we can."

Further footage was broadcast of the Queen speaking on her 21st birthday from Cape Town, South Africa, as Her Majesty made the following act of dedication with the whole empire listening: "I declare before you all that my whole life whether it be long or short, shall be devoted to your service and to the service of our great imperial family, to which we all belong."

The congregation sang the hymn 'Great is they faithfulness', followed by a Bible reading taken from John's Gospel chapter 13 verses 3-18 read by Emma Mitchell. Rev. Tania Vaughan, minister at Little Stoke Baptist Church, talked about how the Queen has faithfully served us, as she reflected on the passage from John's Gospel in which Jesus washed the disciples' feet.

Following the hymn, Amazing Grace, Pastor Tim Sunderland, Bradley Stoke Evangelical Church, led a time of prayer. The final hymn 'Be thou my vision' was followed by an enthusiastic rendering of the National Anthem.

The churches of Bradlev Stoke and Little Stoke would like to convey their sincere thanks to Cllr Tom Aditya, and Deputy Mayor and Cllr Franklin Owusu-Antwi who kindly attended the service. Thanks is due to the management team at the Willowbrook Centre and volunteers from Bradley Stoke Radio who ensured that an excellent sound system was in place to provide amplification.

In Rev. Tania's reflections in the service, she shared how the Queen shares her Christian faith as she speaks to the nation each Christmas. Last year she said, "For me, the life of Jesus Christ, the prince of peace, whose birth we celebrate today, is an inspiration and an anchor in my life." In 2012 she said: "This is the time of year when we remember that God sent his only son 'to serve, not to be served'. He restored love and service to the centre of our lives in the person of Jesus Christ." The previous year the Queen said: "God sent into the world a unique person – neither a philosopher nor a general But a Saviour, with the power to forgive." Forgiveness, she said, "lies at the heart of the Christian faith. It can heal broken families, it can restore friendships and it can reconcile divided communities. It is in forgiveness that we feel the power of God's love."

It was a privilege at the end of the Platinum Jubilee weekend to have a joint service in the town of Bradley Stoke, to give thanks for Her Majesty the Queen, who has been unwavering in her faith and steadfast in her service to our nation and all the nations of the Commonwealth.

Jubilee Trees Planted to Honour the Queen's 70 years of Service

The Queen's Green Canopy (QGC) is a unique treeplanting initiative which invites people and organisations across the United Kingdom to 'plant a tree for the jubilee' as a special gift for the Queen.

Two oak tree saplings were donated to Bradlev Stoke Council by the Honourable Company of Gloucestershire, linked to the Queen's Green Canopy.

On Friday, 6th of May 2022, those two oak trees were planted by Councillor Tom Aditya (then Mayor) in a modest ceremony at Brook Way on the grassed area adjacent to the car park.

In addition, the Council bought seven maple trees representing the seven decades of the Queen's reign.

The Council appointed a grounds team from Brandon Trust to help planting these trees. Brandon Trust is a charity that supports people with learning disabilities and autism in order to live life in their chosen way, and the Council is glad to support their social enterprise.

A workday was arranged on Friday, the 27th of May to prepare the land between Brook Way Activity Centre and Patchway Common Greenfields, by removing weeds and deadwood, in order to plant the seven maple trees.

Cllr Tom Aditya was joined at these tree planting ceremonies by Town Clerk Sharon Petela, Activity Centres Manager Philip Francis, Mrs Liny Aditya, council staff members as well as the grounds team from Brandon

After planting the jubilee trees, Cllr Tom Aditya said: "It was an incredible experience to work alongside friends from Brandon Trust to prepare the ground and to plant the Jubilee trees to create a legacy for our future generations. I appreciate Brandon Trust supervisor Ben's patience and endurance as well as his teammates' efforts in helping me and the council. I also acknowledge Sharon's support and coordination in this project.

Trees are amazing for the environment and are home to thousands of species of nature. They take carbon out of the atmosphere and help to tackle global warming and other pollutants.

I would wish to have a newly planted tree for each and every resident of this town and to transform our neighbourhood with the highest level of tree coverage and flower beds in the region".

Cllr Tom Aditva added: "Celebratina Her Maiesty's Platinum Jubilee is a once in a lifetime opportunity. By joining the Queen's Green Canopy initiative, we have a unique opportunity to uplift our neighbourhoods. The delightful new Jubilee tree saplings we planted will enhance the greenery and nature of Bradley Stoke. More trees will be planted in the near future as the Council is committed to looking after and conserving our green areas. I invite all residents, businesses, landowners, schools, churches, charities, community groups, scout groups and students to join the QGC mission to 'plant a tree for the jubilee".

The Queen's Green canopy has actually been a campaign of Her Majesty for decades, Cllr Tom Aditya explained "What we're doing is a celebration of Queen's life and the work she's been doing. I think it's a fabulous inspiration that all councils and organisations throughout the country are taking part in it and looking forward to its next stage. We've known for some time about climate change and we've hosted the 2021 UN Climate Change World Summit in the UK, so we have to practice what we preach and this is a very demonstrable way of showing that the whole country cares.

It's also part of our objective to go net-carbon zero by 2030. These things are really important because it empowers individuals in communities to take ownership of tackling the climate emergency. The fact that our whole planet is deteriorating at a very rapid rate is a massive problem. It is a global issue.

Tackling climate change is a colossal task. What we do as individuals might seem like a pinprick but if a thousand and then a million, then a billion or trillion pinpricks are put together it starts to make a difference and that's what we're doing here with this tree planting under the auspices of the QGC project.

Call for Everyone to plant a Tree!

Get Involved! Even if you have no backyard to plant a tree you could volunteer to be part of a community aroup to do tree planting or help out at the local woodlands. We all need to work away to do what we can. As ancient Chinese philosopher Lao Tzu once said, a journey of a thousand miles starts with a single step", Cllr Tom Aditya concluded.

The Queen's Green Canopy initiative is in partnership with the UK Government and the Woodland Trust and is steered by Cool Earth, which is an international nongovernmental organisation that protects endangered rainforests in order to combat global warming, protect ecosystems and provide employment for local people.

Whilst supporting the QGC initiative, Prime Minister Boris Johnson said: "Trees have the potential to transform our communities, connect us with nature and provide homes for precious wildlife. They also have a huge role to play in tackling climate change as we build back greener from the pandemic. As we celebrate Her Majesty's incredible 70 years of service, I encourage everyone to get behind this scheme, and go 'Plant a Tree for the Jubilee'." A network of 70 ancient woodlands and 70 ancient trees across the United Kinadom were dedicated to the Queen as part of the Queen's Green Canopy, in addition to the planting of new trees. With a focus on planting sustainably, the QGC encourages increasing and protecting the native tree cover that will thrive, enhancing our environment and landscape and creating a legacy in honour of the Queen's reign, which will benefit the environment, communities and future generations."

You can also support the Queen's Green Canopy by planting a tree in your garden. Planting a tree is easy. However, it's important to choose the right tree for the right location. Once they start growing in the ground, they need very little attention.





Hi, I am Kelly; I am emailing to get in touch and to tell the story of a remarkable and really special seven year old little girl, Bella, who has recently been diagnosed with a very rare soft tissue sarcoma.

Both mum and dad, as well as Bella's five year old brother Charlie, have had their worlds tipped upside down! Bella has gone through two surgeries and one round of chemotherapy thus far, and there are further surgeries planned for Bella coinciding with multiple chemos and radiotherapy treatments. Doctors have estimated 4 - 6 months of treatments. Bella has had to stop going to school; she is in year 2 at St Michael's in Stoke Gifford and has already missed nearly two months of schooling, seeing her friends, and missing fun extracurriculars.

I have set up a mum's group to support the Schermuly family. We have been providing food boxes to help with those unpredictable overnight to weekly stays at the hospital. We have given Bella and Charlie a craft box to keep some family activities together. We have set up a post box in Bella's class to send her some letters, pictures or anything that would brighten up her day.

The Schermuly family, who live in Little Stoke, would never ask for any of this, they are overwhelmed by the support they have received so far. We would love to do more for them to help take the burden off them financially. Both Bella's parents are having to stop working as the appointments and hospital visits are so unpredictable. Each day changes, and so many things are thrown their way.

It would be lovely to use some funds for Bella to enjoy some days out with her family when she is not having chemo and is well enough to do this. We plan to do various activities to raise funds, from climbing Pen Y Fan (26th June 2022) to Brecon Beacons (September/

Baby Joy for Lizzie and Emma

When Lizzi and Emma Watkins wed in February 2020 after living together for two years, they had already decided they wanted a baby and taken the first steps towards achieving their dream.

The recent arrival of their daughter Margo on 14 May, has inspired them to share their story because, according to Emma: "there is a need to spread awareness that people of our sexuality can have a family, and with the end result we're celebrating it's honestly all so worth it: just the best thing ever."

Emma said she had not necessarily envisaged being a parent, but Lizzi always had, and their fertility journey began in January 2020 with one of the free consultations which are routinely offered during Open Evenings at Bristol Centre for Reproductive Medicine (BCRM), where Lizzi's aunt Corinna Gibbons happens to work as manager of the embryology laboratory.

"The open evening was very informative, providing us with everything we needed to know about the investigations and treatment available, plus pricing plans and details about procedures. And everyone was so welcoming, with a really nice atmosphere – just lovely really," said Emma.

Initially the pair had hoped that Lizzi, 33, a para planner for a firm of financial advisors, would carry an embryo created using one of Emma's eggs, but investigations revealed that Emma's ovarian reserve was low, so they opted instead for Lizzi to try intrauterine insemination (IUI) - a fertility treatment that involves directly inserting sperm into a woman's womb

"We had two unsuccessful goes with IUI – it doesn't work for everyone – and then decided to go for a two-cycle package of IVF treatment," said Emma, 37, who is a business sales and marketing manager.

"Lizzi had 10 eggs removed which resulted in six embryos being created, of which four were considered suitable for freezing and using.

"Sadly, the first cycle ended in a miscarriage at six weeks, but one month later Lizzi was pregnant with Margo, and we were thrilled.

"Our baby was delivered nearly four weeks early because Lizzi developed pre-eclampsia, which



"We are loving being mums, and since we

have two more frozen embryos, we are hoping to produce a little brother or sister for Margo in due course.

"To any other same-sex couples currently considering their options regarding starting a family, we would say: do your research and choose a fertility clinic which clearly demonstrates a commitment to helping families like ours and has a good track record.

"There are many problems in today's world, but 20 years ago what we've just done would not have been possible for a same-sex couple, so we're feeling very grateful to be living in 2022 and to be able to become a family in the way we've done."

Made a Mark Charity: Making memories for bereaved children

Bradley Stoke Matters is honoured to be able to support and include details of this wonderful charity, which provides bereavement support for children as they face losing a parent. Keri is the daughter of one of our lovely advertisers who has been with us for most of the 17 years we have been producing your Bradley Stoke Matters magazine. We are pleased to include their story.

Who made a Mark?

In 2018 Mark was an apparently healthy husband to Keri, and dad to a daughter 4, and a son 2.

He was the eldest son of an Almondsbury farming family and worked in a local supermarket as a butcher, he was a people person through and through. Mark and Keri met when Keri was still at school in 2002. Keri went on to become a specialist palliative care nurse at Southmead Hospital and she is still in this role today. Mark and Keri married in 2008 and had 10 wonderful years. In Feb 2018 Mark became unwell with flu like symptoms and jaw pain and went to ED at Southmead. They were not too concerned about his symptoms, but he was admitted to Southmead Hospital for observation.

The following bitter cold February morning Keri took the children to see their dad and, while sitting at his bedside, Mark suffered a cardiac arrest caused by an aortic dissection. He was just 34.

The care at the hospital had been top class and no one could have suspected this at such a young age.

Standing in the hospital when Mark had died was like living in someone's else's nightmare, Keri was a widow at 32.

The walk down through the atrium watching Keri with one child holding each hand I was in a state of shock and disbelief.

Though the staff at the hospital were kind, there was literally no support for Keri or the children that had just witnessed this tragedy. No memory making opportunities, no advice, no one saw the children on that day, or they felt so awkward they didn't know what to say.

The first weeks passed so slowly with many questions from the children such as: Where is daddy? But where is he really? Why is he dead? While dealing with her own grief Keri struggled to answer the heart wrenching questions as honestly as possible.



We eventually contacted Winston's Wish and were supplied with a helpful book; we buy resources from Winston's Wish now to help others faced with this situation if it happens to them.

On Keri's return to work the support from her colleagues was exceptional and she has continued in her palliative care role with new insight. During the months that followed it became apparent that this acute lack of support was not confined to Southmead. Having spoken to other hospitals and hospice teams, only a handful of them provided any literature or other support. In an effort to make this terrible devastating experience better for others Made a Mark was born. It was registered with the charities commission in June 2018.

Made a Mark supplies memory boxes to professionals in acute health care settings to enable them to better support families at this time. Each box contains a pair of soft toys (one for the deceased person and one for the child or sibling to take home as a lasting link). These are supplied to us at cost, and we have had over 4000 to date from our supporting supplier Jellycat, a journal for the child to record how they feel by writing or pictures.

Each box has a kit to take handprints as a memory, a satin bag to take a hair lock or treasure a special small item in, a book to help the adult through the bereavement journey with the child and an honest age appropriate book about death. The boxes are in three different age ranges 0-4 5-12 and 13+, they are now in our own design and are large enough for items to be added by the children to create lasting memories. Each box costs us £40.00 to supply. There is a photo frame formed on the lid of the box for a photograph to be added.

An aspect of the boxes we had not anticipated is that they are also used during the palliative care phase to give the children and understanding of what is happening and enable prompt explanation and discussion at this difficult time.

Demand for the boxes has grown! We have supplied 65 organisations so far, these include neonatal units, organ donation teams and undertakers all of whom apply through a form on our web site. We have supplied 2145 to date and over 500 already this year. Until this happened to our family, we never gave it a thought, the amount of demand sadly shows that it happens daily. Around 100 children a day in the UK are bereaved of a parent.

Can you Help? Due to the growing demand, we are having to constantly think of ways to raise funds to make more memories.

One of our biggest expenses is courier delivery to the boxes destinations. We would love to form a link with a company that would work with us on this, we are happy to pay from our funding but ideally cut it down a little and spend the savings on more boxes.

We are also looking to hold a promise auction in October 2022 if anyone has an experience or item, we could enter into our auction please get in touch.

Ways to support us are to sponsor a box at a cost of £40. We will tell you what age group your box has supported and which healthcare setting it has been sent to.

We encourage our clients to make an early offer to settle. An early offer can help you minimise the costs involved with progressing your claim. Making the offer a 'Part 36 offer' puts further pressure on your opponent to settle, as the cost consequences can be significant.

What is a Part 36 offer?

Part 36 is a provision of the Civil Procedure Rules that is aimed to encourage parties to settle their claims and to penalise parties that do not accept an offer that they do not beat at trial.

Offers can be made by both parties, and will be deemed either a claimant's offer or a defendant's offer

Requirements of a Part 36 offer:

- The offer must be in writing;
- It must be clear that it is pursuant to Part 36;
- It must specify a period of not less than 21 days (which is known as 'the relevant period') within which the offer can be accepted;
- It must also state that the defendant will be liable for the claimant's costs if accepted;
- It must state whether it applies to whole or part of the claim;
- It must state whether it takes into account any counterclaim.

What happens if the offer is accepted?

If the offer is accepted, the claim is stayed. The defendant will have to pay the sum within the offer and the claimant's legal costs. The legal costs will be assessed (by a court) if they cannot be agreed between the parties.

What happens if the offer is rejected?

If the offer is rejected, and the matter proceeds to trial, the judge will not be aware of the offers until after the claim has been decided. Once the claim has been decided the judge will then consider the costs. If the judgment is equal to or better than the offer, the judge will penalise the person that has rejected this offer.

Example: at the hearing, the judge awards the claimant a sum of £35.000.00.

Scenario 1: the claimant made a part 36 offer of £30,000.00. As the

claimant has done better than their offer, the defendant will be penalised with the following cost consequences:

- Interest on the judgment at 10% above base rate from the date on which the relevant period expired:
- Costs on the 'indemnity basis' from the date that the relevant period expired. This means that the court would only deduct any costs it considered unreasonable (whereas on the 'standard basis' would also deduct any costs it considered disproportionate);
- Interest on those costs at 10% above base rate;
- An additional sum of 10% of the amount awarded (up to a maximum of £50,000) and 5% of any amounts awarded above £500,000 (up to a maximum total of £75,000).

Scenario 2: the defendant made a part 36 offer of £40,000.00. As the defendant has done better than their offer, the claimant will be penalised with the cost consequences below:

- Costs on the 'indemnity basis;
- Interest on those costs at 10% above base rate.




