

Knitted Soldier created for Remembrance Sunday by talented residents at local retirement Village

The knitting group from the local Stoke Gifford retirement village has created an incredible 6-foot-tall Knitted Solider to honour Remembrance Sunday.

Bradley Stoke & Little Stoke Gifford Matters was delighted to be invited down to meet the 'unknown hero' in the flesh so to speak as well as the lovely ladies who created him.

ExtraCare's Stoke Gifford Retirement Village's Knit & Natter group spent three months collectively creating the Knitted Soldier. The soldier is the work of 12 residents ranging in age from 63 to 93 years old. Supporting one another in their group, the residents created an inclusive environment for all to enjoy, especially those with a past love for knitting who are now faced with challenges such as blindness, loss of dexterity or memory loss.

The soldier follows the group's Knitted Queen (photo below right) which they created in honour of Queen Elizabeth II's Platinum Jubilee in June and which earned a written response from the Queen before her death.

Activities Coordinator, Natasheya Archer commented: "I'm so impressed with how our residents took on the huge challenge of knitting a full-size statue for Remembrance especially so soon after completing the jubilee project. It was touching to hear residents' stories of their loved ones who fought in WW1 and WW2 recounting memories of what the uniform looked like to make sure our soldier was accurate".

The soldier stood proud for all to see in the ExtraCare retirement village until Remembrance Sunday.

We can't wait to see what the group creates for the King's Coronation next May!

Stoke Gifford Scouts: Remembrance Day Parade in Stoke Gifford 2022

Sunday 13th November saw the Remembrance Day parade in Stoke Gifford where uniformed groups from Stoke Gifford, Little Stoke and Wallscourt Farm all joined together at the Trust Hall car park on North Road and paraded down to The Green to the memorial, and a large crowd of residents and wreath bearers.

Paul Smith GSL laid the 1st Stoke Gifford wreath and Amy Hancock carried the OSR scout troops flag. There were wreath bearers representing scouting, guiding, local councillors, police officers and cadets the RBL and other organisations.

Weather wise the morning was very glorious and the sun was shining down on us all. The Royal British Legion conducted the memorial to the fallen and Simon Jones performed the service.

This is probably the largest gathering for Remembrance Day on the Green ever and that was with over half the OSR scout troop having other commitments.

"For the Fallen" a poem written by Laurence Binyon was read by John Moloney and during the 2 minute silence you could have heard a pin drop. The respect shown by all that attended was amazing. Let's hope we have the same or higher numbers in 2023.

The Wolfridge Alpaca Barn opened in February this year. It is part of the family-run Wolfridge Alpaca Stud farm, based just off the A38 in Alveston, less than 5 miles from Bradlev Stoke.

The Barn has been developed by Craig and Katriona who moved into their farmhouse in 2013. The land had previously been farmed by Craig's grandad.

The couple chose the name Wolfridge in memory of his grandad's pedigree Charolais cattle herd -Wolfridge Charolais. "You need a strong name in pedigree circles and when we were deciding what to call the alpaca herd we chose Wolfridge – it has a local connection as it was the name of a wood next to our farm, and it's also nice to follow on from something my grandad did."

The Alpaca Barn offers free entrance and parking and free access to the lovely Café, which serves delicious homemade cakes, as well as a range of breakfast and lunch options trying to cater for all dietary requirements. Coffee is supplied by Bristol company Cawardines and has had excellent reviews from visitors to date. The café has seating indoors and outside with views of the surrounding alpaca paddocks.

The Barn also offers Alpaca Experiences and fun Craft Workshops for all ages from parents/toddlers to adults/carers. Tues-Fridays mid-morning sessions, no need to book, check website for more information.

Visitors are free to take a wander around the paddocks. There are also information trail/challenge sheets (available from the Café for just £1) called the Wolfridge Wander for the younger generation, or people who are particularly keen to learn about alpacas!

Wolfridge Alpaca is a very friendly place which aims to provide excellent levels of service to ensure all visitors feel welcome. There are accessible facilities. disabled car parking and baby changing facilities.

Open Tuesdays - Saturdays 9.30am to 4pm and Sundays from 10am to 4pm. Wolfridge Alpaca is closed on Mondays.

'Beyond Foam' Eco Coup for Local Flower Club

Floral foam is much loved by florists and flower arrangers for its convenience, but have you ever considered its environmental impact? Ro York from Bradley Stoke says, "floral foam uses microplastics - one block is equal to 10 plastic shopping bags, is non-biodegradable, non-recyclable and toxic for both humans and animals". So, with her flower club in Henleaze and in partnership with All Saints Church Clifton, she secured Michael Bowyer MBE (photo), one of the country's leading foam-free floral designers, to run an inspiring demonstration and workshop showcasing sustainable floral mechanics and methods.

Over 70 flower arrangers from across the West country gathered in Bristol on Tuesday 8th November to explore the skills needed to go 'Beyond Foam' with eco-friendly alternatives to traditional flower arranging practice. It was great to see such a variety of designs and brilliant that Bristol's The Wild Zinnia were able to supply some fantastic, sustainable chrysanthemum blooms – locally grown in Tockington.

This all came about from a chance conversation Fr Charles the Vicar at All Saints had with Ro York, who took up the idea and got Michael Bowyer



involved at an early stage and then suddenly Bristol's Henleaze Flower Club was organising this day in partnership with All Saints Clifton and supported by NAFAS (National Association of Flower Arrangement Societies). Huge thanks to Fr Charles and his team at All Saints Church, Michael Bowyer, and the team of volunteers from the Flower Club. All gave their services for free to ensure that this day was accessible and affordable to as many as possible. What's great to know is that other areas of NAFAS have heard about what we did here in Bristol and are planning similar events. The power of social media!

Scouting in the UK is based on a curriculum which aims at each section achieving their Chief Scouts Award, in the Scout section it is their Gold Award. To obtain this the scouts need to complete 9 Challenge Awards and one of these is the Creative Challenge, getting creative and learning, developing and showing their talents in any number of creative areas.

The OSR scouts have spent the term learning different skills and this last week we were lucky to have our very own graphic designer George Phelps (assistant scout leader) take the scouts through the history of street art, legal points and getting the scouts working on their own piece of work. The presentation went into the knowledge of artists and their work plus how to improve the scouts techniques. The scouts really enjoyed getting creative and George went around the tables giving individual advice and tweaks helping them get the most out of the session.

Following on with the theme of street art, the scouts visited Bedminster where the director of Upfest, Stephen Hayles, took them on a personal walk and talk of this year's art work. The organisers get permission from home owners and black out the walls so the 400 artists from all across the world can turn up and show off their talents. Some massive pieces which take days to complete as well as smaller pieces with hidden inner pieces made the scouts wow and ask so many questions. It was a great activity and we are hoping to make a further visit during the week that the artists are completing their works of art.

The scouts left Upfest and walked through Bedminster and under Temple Meads train station in a tunnel on Cattle Market Road where the length of the tunnel and much further are panel after panel of street art.

The scouts and leaders had a great time witnessing the skill and talents of local artists who's work can remain for a few hours before being painted over or months. It definitely invokes a reaction, for it or against but, if done with permission at legal locations it really brightens up the areas.





















We have been busy welcoming back children who have been off for the summer, focussing on rebuilding strong bonds which are crucial. We also have new children to welcome to our setting and have been busy with visits / over the last few weeks. We extend a warm welcome to each and everyone of our families.

The summer saw us saying a sad goodbye to our school leavers of 2022. Parents came to join in the celebrations and we had photos taken wearing caps and gowns to commemorate the graduation to 'big school', as well as party games, which was all good fun.

We also held a very successful summer BBQ with over 150 guests coming along. We had a great time getting to know each other, eating lovely food, playing traditional fairground games, face painting, live music and not forgetting a special visit from Peter Rabbit.

We had a Defibrillator installed at the building for the start of September. Sadly, each year 270 children pass away from sudden cardiac arrest (SCR). Completing recent first aid training, we realised the closest AED is a 9 minute walk away. We knew we had to act on this. While our initial idea was to fundraise at our summer BBQ, during a management meeting with our Commercial Director, Amrat offered to purchase a defib on behalf of the Directors and our wider company 3abcare in support of our team/ family at Ambourne House. We feel the provision of a Defibrillator was another part of Ambourne House's commitment to the safeguarding of our children, staff, parents and the community. Whilst we hope that we never have to use it, it means that in the worst-case scenario we can increase the chances of someone's survival.

At the start of the autumn term we hosted a Montessori evening for parents and we look forward











to hosting other events throughout the year, such as a Mother's day breakfast with scones and jam and for Father's day sausage and bacon sandwiches! We love to include the whole family at our nursery and our recent parent's board games night was a feature in the National Nursery Magazine!

We love getting the children in our care out and about whatever the weather (taking relevant precautions of course!). We have our own Ambourne House minibus to transport us to regular forest and beach sessions, and have also introduced inter-generational visits to local care homes, which has included participating in singing and dance sessions with the likes of Jo Jingles. At one visit we also got to meet and hold some chicks! We recently took the babies to Lawrence Weston Community farm to feed the goats and the chickens. It was lovely to explore the farm and see all the different animals and all the sounds that they make! We saw pigs, goats, chickens and ducks and also explored the forest area!

Seeing how children change in our beautiful outdoor settings is such a wonderful sight and joy to be a part of. Running free in the

open air, feeling the sand beneath their feet encourages their confidence to grow, not to mention their language development. These different environments not only offers the children an opportunity to grow and develop, it gives us the practitioners another insight into their development. To this end we are thrilled to say the BBQ raffle raised over £550 which will be used towards a yearly community entrance pass so that the staff and children at Ambourne can enjoy lots of trips to the brilliant Wildplace, as well as additional resources for our own garden.

The History of the FIFA World Cup

By the time this edition comes through your door the FIFA World Cup QatarTM will have already kicked off. We thought this would be a great opportunity to look back at how the tournament began and how it has changed over the years.

Football officially began in 1862 when J.C. Thring, an Englishman, published the first set of rules for what he called "The Simplest Game." As the British travelled the world, so did the game of soccer.

How did the World Cup begin?

By the end of World War I, football had already become a world sport, but it was two Frenchman, Jules Rimet and Henri Delaunay, who proposed the idea of a World Cup to be held every four years. According to footballhistory.org, there were unofficial pre-FIFA World Cups held in the late 1800s, at a time when only a few national teams existed. Another unofficial "world cup" was the Sir Thomas Lipton Trophy held in 1909 and 1911.

Before the FIFA World Cup the international tournament that everyone wanted to play in was actually part of the Summer Olympics. But during the 1920s the game was transitioning to professionalism which was inconsistent with the Olympic spirit, so in 1928 FIFA started to make plans to organise their own World Cup.

Uruguay, who had won Gold in the 1928 Olympics, were selected as the host nation for the inaugural World Cup finals in 1930 with 12 other teams accepting FIFA's open invitation to take part (qualification rounds didn't start until the 1934 tournament).

The tournament has been held every four years since then, except in 1942 and 1946 when it was suspended due to World War II. A total of 17 countries have played host over the years with 79 national teams having competed as of the last World Cup in 2018, although the trophy has only been won by eight of them.

Brazil have won five times, and they are the only team to have played in every tournament. The other winners are Germany and Italy with four titles each, Argentina, France, and Uruquay with

two titles each, and England and Spain, with one title each.

This is the year that every English soccer fan references at any opportunity – the one time that a team from the birthplace of the game has ever won – and which arguably produced one of the best tournaments to date. Geoff Hurst scored the first and only "hat trick" in a championship game as England defeated West Germany 4-2 in the final. One of Hurst's goals was also one of the most controversial in World Cup Final history: a powerful drive that hit the underside of the crossbar and bounced on the goal-line – according to the Germans – or just over it – according to the English and, more crucially, the Soviet linesman.

This year's tournament will be different for several reasons: the first to be held in Winter (for Northern Hemisphere teams), a controversial choice of host country, concerns over transport infrastructure and support for travelling fans, and threats of boycotts. But love it or loathe it, there'll be no escaping the World Cup between now and the final on 18th December.





If you're a man in need of a beard, **Decembeard** will be right up your street. It's all about raising bowel-cancer awareness and funds for research and treatment, and the rules are simple — have your final shave on November30, then let your facial hair flourish throughout the month. Just think of all that time you'll free up every morning... And if you're already bearded-up, you can still join in. The organisers suggest clean shaving and starting over, or decorating or dying your existing beard, depending on how brave you're feeling!

Former England cricketer and Nottinghamshire captain Chris Read is right behind the campaign in his role as a patron of Bowel Cancer UK, which he started supporting in 2007 when his first coach Trevor Ward died of the disease. "He was a wonderful man who, along with his family, became great friends," says Chris, "and that's why I'm encouraging sons, dads, brothers, uncles, nephews and granddads to join together this Decembeard and show their support for the charity."

Bowel cancer is the third most common cancer in men in the UK, with one in 14 diagnosed during their lifetime. Yet men are less likely to participate in the national bowel cancer screening programme when eligible, or to recognise any of the main symptoms:

- Blood in pooh.
- A persistent change in bowel habits.
- Or abdominal pain, discomfort or bloating that's always triggered by eating.

Even if men do think something is amiss, they are less likely to see their GP about it. So there's a real need to get the message out to men that if they are diagnosed early, bowel cancer is highly treatable – and curable. Now that's worth a bit of facial-hair fun, for sure. The King who came to serve.


The King who would take on death, and win.







Lasting Powers of Attorney – The appointment of attorneys

A Lasting Power of Attorney (LPA) is a legal form that gives authority to those appointed as Attorneys to make decisions on behalf of the donor (the person who has created the LPA). There are separate LPAs for Property and Financial Affairs and for Health and Welfare.

Attorneys appointed under an LPA are able to make decisions that the donor could make if they still had the ability to do so themselves. You can therefore appreciate the power that these documents have and the importance of appointing an attorney or attorneys who you trust to look after vour best interests.

Some people think that the decision over who to appoint to is a simple one. Perhaps they have a spouse who they trust to look after their best interests and they know would be willing to make decisions for them, a child or children who are financially knowledgeable and manage their own finances well, or siblings who they think would get along and act well together. However, there is more to the consideration of who to appoint than meets the eye. For example:-

- Sole attorneys If a solely appointed attorney is unable to act (perhaps they have died before the donor or lost capacity themselves), their appointment would fail and the donor would be left with no attorney to make decisions and the LPA will be invalid. You should then consider someone else who could act alongside your attorney or, who could step in as a replacement.
- Multiple attorneys: how should they make decisions - You can appoint attorneys to make decisions jointly and severally (they can make decisions either together or separately, jointly (they must make decisions together), or they can make some decisions iointly and separately, and some jointly. Each option requires very careful consideration. For example, appointing attorneys to make decisions jointly could



mean that if one of them dies before you. the remaining attorney cannot make those decisions that they had to make jointly with the other attornev.

Bankruptcv or Debt Relief Orders – An attorney cannot be appointed if they are currently bankrupt or an undischarged bankrupt or are subject to a debt relief order. If this happens after they are appointed, they can no longer act. If an attorney has previously been bankrupt etc, are they a suitable choice of attorney?

These are just some of the issues to consider when thinking of who to appoint as your attorney and it is best to seek professional advice to ensure the best possible decision is made.


