

The three sessions are: Hope, Peace & Purpose. There is both a daytime and evening opportunity to discover more:



### **Local Warm Spaces**

With a cost of living and climate crisis, many of us are facing tough decisions. Some of us have moved to working from home following the pandemic and are facing a winter with increased energy bills. Others are facing even harder decisions about whether to heat or eat.

Despite the Government's energy announcement, millions of households will still be in fuel poverty this winter, with people with disabilities, elderly people, children, people from ethnic minorities, and low-income households amongst the most affected groups.

There is an estimated £800 gap between the overall cost-of-living and package for families on means-tested benefits, meaning many will have to look to their local community and churches for support.

- Double the number of households will be in fuel poverty compared to 2020
- 11,400 deaths are caused by cold homes
- 1 in 10 excess Winter deaths are attributable to fuel poverty
- £3.6 million is the estimated cost of fuel poverty to the NHS every day
- More people die from cold homes than they do alcohol, Parkinson's Disease or traffic accidents

Warm Spaces is designed to signpost ANYONE in need of warmth and community, to a warm space to share with others.

Alongside and over the next two pages Warm Spaces across our community are listed. There is somewhere to go locally every day from Monday to Friday.

Don't be alone and don't be cold. You will be made very welcome at any of these venues listed

Look out for each other.

### **Lasting Powers of Attorney –** The appointment of attorneys

A Lasting Power of Attorney (LPA) is a legal form that gives authority to those appointed as Attorneys to make decisions on behalf of the donor (the person who has created the LPA). There are separate LPAs for Property and Financial Affairs and for Health and Welfare.

Attorneys appointed under an LPA are able to make decisions that the donor could make if they still had the ability to do so themselves. You can therefore appreciate the power that these documents have and the importance of appointing an attorney or attorneys who you trust to look after your best interests.

Some people think that the decision over who to appoint to is a simple one. Perhaps they have a spouse who they trust to look after their best interests and they know would be willing to make decisions for them, a child or children who are financially knowledgeable and manage their own finances well, or siblings who they think would get along and act well together. However, there is more to the consideration of who to appoint than meets the eve. For example:-

- Sole attorneys If a solely appointed attorney is unable to act (perhaps they have died before the donor or lost capacity themselves), their appointment would fail and the donor would be left with no attorney to make decisions and the LPA will be invalid. You should then consider someone else who could act alongside your attorney or, who could step in as a replacement.
- Multiple attorneys: how should they make decisions - You can appoint attorneys to make decisions jointly and severally (they can make decisions either together or separately, jointly (they must make decisions together), or they can make some decisions jointly and separately, and some jointly. Each option requires very careful consideration. For example, appointing attorneys to make decisions

jointly could mean that if one of them dies before you, the remaining attorney cannot make those decisions that they had to make jointly with the other attorney.

Bankruptcy or Debt Relief Orders – An attorney cannot be appointed if they are currently bankrupt or an undischarged bankrupt or are subject to a debt relief order. If this happens after they are appointed, they can no longer act. If an attorney has previously been bankrupt etc, are they a suitable choice of attorney?

These are just some of the issues to consider when thinking of who to appoint as your attorney and it is best to seek professional advice to ensure the best possible decision is made.

# New Year, New Walk and Talks in Bristol and South Gloucestershire with the Carers Support Centre

Carers Support Centre for Bristol and South Gloucestershire is happy to announce new Walk and Talks for unpaid carers and the people they care for. Walk and Talks are popular, easy walks around local green areas launched last September centre by the Fishponds based charity.

On a Walk and Talk carers get a chance to enjoy a break from their caring responsibilities by being outdoors in the company of other carers.

One of the charity's friendly support workers leads the walk, offering a



listening ear and providing information to support walkers in their caring role. The overall aim of Walk and Talk is to improve the health and wellbeing of carers and those they care for.

The groups take place once a week over six weeks, and there are a mixture of groups:

- for carers on their own
- · for carers and those they care for
- age-specific, for example, young adult carers

It is free to take part and all carers are welcome, the Carers Support Centre aim is to make the walks as inclusive as possible. So, whatever your background, whatever your walking ability, Carers Support Centre want you to come and join them and your fellow carers on a Walk and Talk.

The new Walk and Talks are scheduled to take place in the new year in Bradley Stoke, Horfield and Winterbourne, with more planned for later in the year.

### Street Life ...

A streetside ministry to feed and clothe the homeless and vulnerable on the streets of inner Bristol

Bradley Stoke & Little Stoke Gifford Matters is pleased to have supported and publicised the remarkable group that is Street Life over the many years it has been running. Led by Stokes resident Richard Townsend, within the City Church and aided by a number of wonderful volunteers across the Stokes from both within and outside of the church, Street Life provides food and clothing for the homeless of Bristol every Saturday evening throughout the year.

It being a while since we have given coverage to Street Life, the current cold spell (as we go to print on this edition mid-December) particularly brings those less fortunate than ourselves to the fore front of our minds. I have spoken a lot about local Warm Spaces in this edition, and encouraging residents to take advantage of these rather than being cold and on your own at home, but can you imagine not having a roof over your head *at all* in these conditions?

The work that Richard and all the amazing volunteers do week in, week out to help the homeless is fantastic, but more help is always appreciated.

On a Saturday evening at the end of November, a group from the 1st Bradley Stoke Scouts accompanied the Street Life volunteers and helped to distribute food and clothing to the homeless. This was an opportunity for the young people to see first-hand the impact of homelessness and to help make a difference. The Scouts were a credit to the Group, with many of them helping to serve the meals or having

talks with the Street Life leaders to learn more about the issues that those on the streets face. They showed great maturity, understanding and empathy.



For Christmas the Scout Group collected small packets of wet wipes, pocket tissues and chocolate oranges that could easily be parcelled up as gifts to be delivered to the homeless by the Street Life volunteers.

Richard from Street Life visited the Scout Group in early December to collect the donations personally, which were then used to create Christmas boxes for the homeless. Thank you to everyone who supported this.

Whilst visiting, Richard was pleased to hand out the Community Impact Badge to some of the Scouts who were helping on the Street over the previous weeks.

**Toiletries:** shower gel, shampoo, soap, tooth brushes, deodorants (male and female), twin bladed razors, shaving gel, sanitary pads and wet wipes. We do not need tooth paste.

**Clothing:** we need men's warm winter clothing, shoes, underwear and socks. We do not need any women's clothing.

#### We operate every Saturday.

Street Life is made up from a team of volunteers across the Stokes from all walks of life, you don't have to be involved with the church to get involved with Street Life. It is run and organised by City Church.

Oscar, aged 5 said: "It was really exciting! I liked going under the big bridge the best."





### BRADLEY STOKE JUDO CLUB TAKES ON THE 2022 BRITISH CHAMPIONSHIPS.

After a crazy 2022, it would be tempting to sit back and take it easy to have a merry Christmas. But not for Bradley Stoke Judo Club! A selection of our athletes took on this year's British Pre-cadet (u15) and Cadet (u18s) Championships on the 3rd & 4th December and the British Junior (u21s) and Senior (Over 21s) Championships on the 10th & 11th of December 2022.

At the British u15s and u18s Championships, BSJC had a team of 5 make the trip up to Sheffield along with head coach Nick Brace. The team was Oriol, Luke, Jack, Freddie and Dylan.

Dylan kicked the day off. Dylan fought in 3 fights, losing two and winning one with a beautiful throw. He showed a great display of judo as he performed excellently at a higher weight category as a first-year cadet.

Luke was next to fight; having recently been selected to be part of England's Talent development program, he was determined to show why as he fought in four tough fights, winning three and losing one to earn his place in the Bronze medal fight. In this fight, Luke again showed off his excellent judo ability

in a tough scrap but was unlucky to get caught for an ippon. Luke earned a great 5th!

Jack was up next as he had two wins (including one against an opponent he had fought before), and two losses. Jack had earned a fantastic 7th place with three wins in a very tough category.

Oriol has been having the best year in his judo by working incredibly hard with the full-time BSJC Athletes, showing us all that hard work pays off as he had the stand-out performance of the weekend as he fought in a tough under-73kg category, managing to work his way into the final with three excellent wins. Oriol won a brilliant silver medal in only his second year as a cadet, a huge achievement! At just 15 years of age, it is highly unusual for a player to medal so young against much more experienced opponents. All this proves why the British Judo Association named him Britain's number one on the u18 under 73kg ranking list!





The following day Freddie was the sole BSJC Judoka to compete. Struggling with a chest infection, Fred showed his warrior mentality as he battled through three contests, winning 2 of them and taking home the bronze medal. A great Bronze for Freddie, who has been showing his brilliant judo ability this year.

The following weekend BSJC took on the British u21 and 21+ Senior Championships 2022!

The weekend team comprised Jack, Phoebe, Maddie, Millie, Ben, Alex, Tatum, and Amelia. Head coach Nick Brace was again in the coaching chair and was joined by Jason Allen.

The first to fight was Jack, who at age 15, chose to participate in the u21 competition, having fought in the u18s the weekend before. He showed

excellent judo as he fought three fights, winning one and losing two against older and stronger opponents. Jack misses out on a place but can be proud of his 7th the weekend before! Jack dared to push himself and it will only benefit him!

Next up was Ben in a tough under 73 kg category. Ben has had a great 2022 as he won a Bronze medal in Spain and was selected for the u18 European championships for GB but missed out due to injury. Most recently, Ben claimed the Under-18 Welsh championship! Ben showed that even after a shoulder injury, he is a huge threat to any opponent as he fought in four fights, winning two with dominant performances and losing two to higher-seeded opponents. Ben is unlucky to miss out on a place, but he will be back in 2023, stronger than ever, as he turns his attention to European competitions!

Phoebe and Millie were up next, having recently fought at the Romania Junior cup (where Phoebe








took a great 5th place, just missing out on a podium place.) This weekend they were in the under 63kg women category. Millie and Phoebe were on fire as they both dominantly won their first two fights. We had the unfortunate position of having a BSJC Semifinal as Millie and Phoebe faced each other. After a great battle, Millie edged it out! In a tight battle for Bronze, Phoebe was unlucky to pick up three harsh penalties losing the fight, but she earned a terrific 5th place! In the Final, Millie came up against a strong opponent and was unlucky to miss out on gold, nonetheless winning an excellent silver medal

along with her black belt!

Next up was Amelia, who was looking to add another championship to her belt as she won the C2 London International title a couple of months ago. She fought in three



Finally, Maddie was looking to book her place on the podium. Maddie has been doing well this year as she won her Black belt and travelled out to the Romanian u18 cup with BSJC. She was on top form this weekend, having four tough fights, including three wins and one loss to a higher-seeded judoka. She earned her place in the bronze medal fight, where Maddie threw BIG to win the bronze medal!

On the last day, we had the Seniors fighting (18+), where we had Alex, Phoebe and Tatum competing.

First up was Alexander, who looked to see what he could do in a solid under-66 Kg Category. Alex had four fights, winning two and losing two. He missed out on a place but produced some great judo.

Phoebe was back after fighting the day before, showing determination to get her place on the

podium this time. Phoebe had two fights taking one win and one loss working her way into the bronze medal fight where she bounced back to win in an excellent fashion, throwing for Ippon. Her first over 18 medal! Not only did she medal and be awesome all weekend, but she showed great mental strength coming back from narrowly missing out on a podium the day before to fight in a tougher category against much older and experienced opponents to win!

Tatum Keen is one of the GB Superstar judokas this year and winner of the British Female Judo Athlete of the Year. In 2022 alone, she has won three European medals. She was selected with two other BSJC athletes to represent GB at the u21 World and European Championships as well as the u23 European Championship at just age 20!

She was up next as she fought in a strong under 52kg category, beating the 2021 British Champion to earn her place in the final. In a very close and entraining final, she crowned herself a SIX-time British Champion!



As we go to print in mid-December, 2022 is STILL not over for BSJC as Lele Nairne is fighting in the Jerusalem Masters event on the 22nd December; this is where only the top 36 in the WORLD compete!

2023 is already looking exciting as we look forward to seeing how BSJC will achieve even more and have another record-breaking year.


