

Local Bowls Club Invites New Members

Stoke Gifford Trust Short Mat Bowls Club is a friendly, local, indoor bowls club which is encouraging more local people to give the game a try.

Members of the Stoke Gifford club meet to play bowls three times a week (on Monday, Tuesday and Friday afternoons) in the Trust Hall on North Road. The club has been running for over 30 years.

Short Mat Bowls is a highly enjoyable, indoor version of full length flat green bowls, which is played – as the name suggests – over a shorter distance.

In 1991 the club became one of the first regular activities to be held in the newly opened Trust Hall. Because the game is weatherproof, members gather to play all year round. New players, experienced or beginners, are warmly welcomed and

club regulars are always happy to explain the rules and techniques to newcomers. There is a minimal cost per session, which includes refreshments half way through the afternoon.

Over 50 Years in Public Service - Cllr Brian Allinson

This month I was delighted to meet with Cllr Brian Allinson in the lovely surroundings of the Old School Rooms Coffee Shop on the green in Stoke Gifford.

Brian, now 78, has spent over 50 years in public service and feels that the time may have come for him to finally 'hang up his hat' at this year's May elections.

Brian moved to Stoke Gifford from Longwell Green in 1984 and immediately loved the green open spaces and friendly, inclusive community feel. At the time he was a senior police officer where he spent 30 years of his career, eventually retiring as Superintendent in 1998.

With a love of Filton airfield and an early experience of flying, the development of a Police Air Support unit became a passion for Brian, eventually leading to a second career for him as an International Police Air Support advisor resulting in much international travel.

At home in Stoke Gifford Brian says he and his wife Paula have been busy populating the area! With two daughters, Julie and Esme and his son Jeremy, he now has 7 grandchildren, both daughters with 5 of his grandchildren still living locally in the village. Jeremy is in the RAF having carried on his father's love of helicopters.

In 2001, through the Royal British Legion and encouraged by his friend, the late Brian Hewitt, Brian was elected as a local Councillor, a role he is still active in and has now held for over 20 years - in fact he is the longest serving Parish Councillor. One thing he loves about the local parish council is that it is apolitical with a lovely positive community spirit and focus on getting the jobs done around the area. Brian's focus has always been on the maintenance of the parks and local roads - keeping the infrastructure going as it should be. His latest quest is the lack of visible white paint on the local road markings.

He also took on the role of South Glos District Councillor in 2003 which saw him participating as a cabinet member for Planning and Transport which regularly took him up to London. "There is rarely a day when I am not doing something on behalf of the Council and community" Brian told me.

At the forthcoming local elections in May he has decided to stand down from his role in the District Council and also in the Parish Council (although there has been some attempt to persuade him to at least stay on in the latter). He does wonder whatever he will do with himself if he gives up both roles! He tells me he has no regrets and has really enjoyed his time to date. He would encourage anybody thinking of standing for the local council to do so - "It is a really interesting role and one that you can feel you are doing something positive for your community. It's a caretaking role, party politics are irrelevant at this level, it is about the people and the community."

Brian has so many fascinating tales to tell about his life experiences through the forces and his later travels with the police air support unit. He recently documented them in his book "A Long and Winding Beat" which was initially intended as just a memoir for his family and friends but external demand has initiated a further print run. New Team Members

Following a turbulent year in 2022 where we lost two members of the grounds team in relatively short succession, we went through a period of time with reduced staff. This meant the overall workload was obviously cut back slightly and we weren't able to get to as many hedgerows as we'd like during the seasons. All credit to the Head Groundsman who has ensured that all the parks and recreational spaces have remained in a very good condition, ensuring local residents are able to visit the parks and able to enjoy the excellent green spaces we have within the parish.

We now have two excellent recruits in Andy Slade and Martyn Rendell (pictured right) who have been working together since the end of 2022 and into the start of this current year. They have both obtained the small tree fell cutting qualification which is an intense 5-day course in the Mendips, and this has already been of benefit with both lads cutting down many dead trees and some more major hedgerow cutbacks. This reduces the amount of work we need to outsource to external contractors saving the parish some much needed pennies.

Both Andy and Martyn are local lads who also use the play facilities with their own families, so they have invested interests to keep the parks and play spaces to a high spec!



ANDY'S MAN CLUB #IT'S OK TO TALK

Andy's Man Club was set up in Halifax in June 2016 following the tragic death of Andy Roberts, who died by suicide. Andy's mother Elaine and brother-in-law Luke Ambler decided to start a club to reduce the stigma around male mental health issues, and give men the opportunity to talk with their peers about whatever storms they're going through.

The group now has 117 clubs across the UK, as well as an online option for anyone who can't get to one. All meet at 7pm every Monday except Bank Holidays.

There are two Andy's Man Clubs in Bristol. Bristol North meets in the Jessop Suite at the Seat Unique Stadium aka the County Cricket Ground, Bristol South meets at the Knowle West Media Centre. The clubs are run by a team of volunteer facilitators, all of whom originally joined the club to get support for themselves.

Below we are honoured to share with you the experience of a local man, who found the support he needed from Andy's Man Club.







Mv Name is Andv. AKA Barts.

I'm 42 years old and I started attending Andy's Man Club at the beainning of June 2022. I can honestly say it has changed my life for the better in such a short time.

I have always been

the happy-go-lucky guy. I've spent most of my life brushing things under the carpet or saying "I'm fine" when I wasn't. This would lead to me having meltdowns or kicking off for no apparent reason.

I first walked through the door at the County Cricket Ground in Bristol for Andy's Man Club after the above had become apparent. My whole life I'd been living with anxiety, and then in June I was diagnosed with depression.

The anxiety was so strong that I didn't want to upset people, or I wouldn't speak up as I didn't want the confrontation - the only way to describe it is walking on eaashells mv whole life!

Attending Andy's Man Club has made me less anxious by nature. Everyone listens and I get to talk and no judgement is passed. Also you realise you are not alone, others are going through a storm themselves.

No person is the same at Andy's Man Club. However we can all relate to each other, and that's because we all had a reason to walk through that door on our first evening. Even the facilitators!

In November 2022 I became a facilitator and have really enjoyed leading groups. It really is as simple as having a chat over a brew and a biscuit - all provided free of charge.

Andy's Man Club has given me that different outlook I needed. I now use the word "perspective" more than I ever have in my life. I recently did a radio interview on BBC Radio Bristol to talk about what made me join Andy's Man Club and also what Andy's Man Club has done for me!

I'm not here to sell Andv's Man Club to anvone. All I can say is it has changed me for the better, and if you are going through a storm yourself or know somebody who is, Andy's Man Club's doors are open 7-9pm every Monday and it might help lighten that load

ANDY'S MAN CLUB is a free-to-attend talking group that runs every Monday night at 7pm, excluding bank holidays.

For over a year, the group has operated at a venue in Bishopston - the Seat Unique Stadium, BS7 9EJ.

There is now a Bristol South group that meet at the Knowle West Media Centre, BS4 1NL. Any man over the age of 18 is free to attend either of these groups, with no registration, referral or booking process.

Bristol Clean Air Zone

Helen Brewer of AMD Solicitors considers the impact of the introduction of the Bristol Clean Air Zone ("the Zone") on Monday 28 November 2022, and considers whether landlords and tenants alike should be worried about whether this could have a negative impact on property prices in and around the Zone

In 2020 emission levels across the UK were at record highs due to increased traffic volumes and in particular diesel vehicles on our roads. In an attempt to tackle this issue, the government introduced a new Environment Act 2021 which gave the Secretary of State the power to set legally binding, longer-term, environmental targets lasting at least 15 years, across a variety of areas relating to the environment.

Due to Bristol's poor air quality, it was included as one of the cities that would be required to meet these targets. In order to ensure compliance with these new regulations, Bristol City Council developed the Zone which came into effect on 28 November 2022. The Zone will cover most of the city centre including Park Street, Brandon Hill and St Andrews Road. The Zone's boundary is available on Bristol City Councils website here:



Now the big question many landlords and tenants may have is whether this will have an impact on property values and market rents where properties are located within the Zone. There is a concern amongst tenants located in Bristol City Centre that the introduction of the Zone coupled with the pedestrianisation of roads such as Princess Victoria Street in Clifton Village will have a negative impact on footfall and drive people away from these areas.

Following COVID-19 and the effect this has had on the high street tenants, there has been a move towards agreeing turnover rents in new leases, so if there are any future periods of

closure, tenants are paying rent based on money coming in rather than a fixed sum. However.



The good news is that the consensus amongst industry experts seems be a no. Looking at property prices when the LEZ came into effect in London in 2008 a comparison to prices inside the area to outside did not show a major difference in valuation.

Meet your PCC – Mark Shelford

Avon & Somerset Police and Crime Commissioner (PCC), Mark Shelford was elected as Conservative PCC in 2021.

As the Police and Crime Commissioner (PCC) for Avon and Somerset, I am the voice of local people in policing. My role is to hold the Chief Constable to account for delivering policing that is efficient and effective.

I spent over 30 years as an Army Officer, so I understand service life, and the pressures those protecting communities and people face.

One of my responsibilities includes setting the police and crime objectives for the area through the Police and Crime Plan. The Plan is the blueprint for local policing and outlines specific areas to be improved and delivered by the force.

I published my Police and Crime Plan last year and my objectives are: preventing and fighting crime; engaging, supporting and working with communities, victims and partner organisations: leading the police to be efficient and effective; and increasing the legitimacy of, and public confidence in, the police and criminal justice system.

As part of my role, I'm also responsible for setting the force budget and determining the policing part of the council tax, known as the precept.

I would like to thank those who have recently completed my precept survey and shared their thoughts about my proposal to increase the policing part of the council tax by £15 for the average band D household.

At the start of February, the Police and Crime Panel supported my proposal to increase the precept.

This funding will help reduce the impact of Avon and Somerset Police's funding gap but will still leave a projected deficit of £3.4 million in the vear 2023/24.

Inflationary increases combined with limited additional funding from central Government have left a funding gap that, without the precept



increase, would have resulted in significant cuts to police staff and services.

I know that many households are facing difficult financial circumstances. However, as your PCC. it would have been irresponsible for me not to address this issue and help reduce this deficit while I had the opportunity. We will be using the £3.4 million reserve funding to address the shortfall so that the Chief Constable has capacity to develop a sensible savings programme while still delivering an effective, efficient and legitimate service.

I always try to make myself available to those who need to speak with me. Over the past 18 months as PCC, I have regularly engaged with local people, communities, MPs, and councillors.

I have been holding a series of Councillor Forums over the past few months around the Avon and Somerset region and when these come to an end in March, we will be restarting our community engagement days.

He's been globetrotting, having lived in several different countries including south and central America, the Caribbean, Papua New Guinea as well as the UK, but he's also spent years on long-haul flights around the world in several previous careers including furniture retail. Children's Scrapstore Benefits from Clinic Waste

Staff at Bristol's longest-established fertility clinic are pooling their waste resources to create a valuable regular contribution to Bristol Children's Scrapstore - and avoiding excess items going to landfill at the same time.

The new green initiative at the Bristol Centre for Reproductive Medicine (BCRM) reflects the shared desire of the team to reduce some of the negative impacts that the healthcare sector has on the planet. Senior andrologist Karla Turner who is spearheading the 'Go Green' campaign said: "Colleagues at the clinic have begun to normalise a more sustainable way of thinking, and the whole team is reviewing day-to-day processes to see where it's possible to prevent, reduce or reuse items.

"We appreciate that recycling is not the greenest way ahead: the very best option is waste reduction – simple things like using our own coffee mugs at the dispenser, instead of recyclable cups.

"Although we are obliged to dispose of most of the clinic's scrap

items as clinical waste, we have identified several areas where

we can reduce our contribution to landfill. We started off by collecting 10 days' worth of non-recyclable items that would all have ended up in landfill - polystyrene delivery boxes and cold packs, pipette tip boxes, laboratory needle packaging and the metal rods that form part of the devices used to freeze embryos – and were astonished by how much there was.

"So a very important move has been to forge links with the amazing team at Bristol Children's Scrapstore who have said they can find a good creative use for the items we are discarding. We're also going to be sending the Scrapstore the fairly large cardboard tubes that the paper we use to line our exam couches are wrapped around – I'm sure they'll be much in demand for modelling of various sorts!"

Two of Karla's colleagues, Jen Nisbett and Corrina Gibbons, have themselves created a piece of craft-work (pictured right) entitled 'Blastocyst', featuring rubber bungs and the tubes in which needles for laboratory work are delivered. A blastocyst is the cluster of dividing cells formed about five to six days after a sperm fertilizes an egg.

The BCRM team is also investigating other ways to lessen their impact on the environment: for example, using items with less packaging where choices are available, turning off pieces of equipment when not in use, and being more mindful of waste management.



"We're also planning a change to lab processes for 2023 that will prevent the use of around 2,000 plastic pipettes annually," said Karla Turner. "But there are some areas of our work, especially in the embryology lab, where delicate items arrive packaged in single-use plastics or polystyrene boxes, so generating a certain amount of waste packaging material seems to be unavoidable and it's great to see it put to good use through the Scrapstore."






The Well-Being Hub at Abbeywood Community School

Little Stoke Gifford Matters was delighted to be invited to visit the new Wellbeing Hub at Abbeywood Community School during Children's Mental Health Week which took place 6-12 February.

I was met and shown around the new facility by Sam Milkins (above right), Lead SEMH Teaching Assistant, who is proud to have developed the Hub which has been open since the start of the school year in September. The suite of rooms provide a Safe Space for those students who may be struggling or just need some peace and quiet, either during lesson time to complete their work or in the hectic break and lunchtime periods. The positioning of the space at the end of the corridor means it really is a quiet, undisturbed place for referred pupils to relax and refocus should they feel the need. It is also a great place to sit and chill with the specially trained therapy dog Murphy (above photo).



The provision of this space alongside qualified SEMH staff such as Sam and Claire Northam (shown left above) who both work with the pupils, is so beneficial and can help diffuse situations which may otherwise elevate as more of our young people are being diagnosed with mental health challenges.

Each young person has different needs and Sam and Claire have the ability to understand and work with them in order achieve a more helpful outcome. The facility also has a room where other professionals can come in and see pupils for appointments, such as a speech therapist or occupational therapist, which is also helps pupils who otherwise would have to leave school for such appointments.

Additional support for referred students may include access to the newly developed Wellbeing Huh







Walk and Talks in Bristol and South Gloucestershire with the Carers Support Centre

Back in the time of Jesus, there was a little phrase that people used.

Whenever a rabbi was attracting followers, they would say to potential followers, "are you willing to walk in my dust?" For us, it seems like a strange invitation! However, in Jesus's day, it reflected the dusty path that they walked on and the invitation to stay close to a potential teacher and instructor.



To walk in the dust of a rabbi meant that you were close enough to hear them, close enough to follow them and close enough to follow their example. The process of following in such a way, also reminded the follower that the journey was more often than not dusty.

As we approach this Easter season, our theme at St Michaels is Dust and Glory. In following the rabbi, Jesus, we experience a dusty journey. We are often aware of our own shortcomings and the fragility of life. Discipleship is a dusty business. But the journey does lead somewhere. The dusty journey of Jesus's ministry led to the cross, where he carried all the wrongdoings of the world on his shoulders.

The dusty and rough cross was, three days later, replaced by the glory of His resurrection.

Jesus is still the rabbi to follow. But he is the friend who experienced the dust of life for himself, and replaced it with the hope of glory. Where life might feel dusty for us at the moment, know that Jesus can lead us through the dust to a place of glory.

Dust and glory are often close together, one follows the other and can be as little as three days apart.

May you walk in the dust of Jesus and know him leading you to glory.

Voices Project at Paul's Place helps 21 Disabled adults share their stories and highlight the challenges disabled people face on a daily basis

The voices project raises awareness of the issues that matter to disabled people. Communications Officer Alex is managing the project, sharing, "We believe our members (service users) have a voice, something important to say, At Paul's Place, we are all about providing new experiences and giving disabled people the opportunity to try something new, learn new skills and build their confidence. This project has helped our members find new ways to express themselves creatively."

The charity worked with freelance journalist, Debra Hearne to interview people about the things that matter to them.

Service user Rebecca shares why she is part of the project, "It would help me to know that others are aware of my condition, it will help them understand me better."

Another participant Paul Kendall shares, "I want to help other people know what it's like to have a stroke. It's up to the individual to be positive otherwise you'll just spiral down. I do feel a little upset thinking about it all but I want people to know they're not the only one going through this. If you can talk about these things - it becomes easier."

They have also been working with a freelance poet. For many of



the people the charity supports, this is the first time they have had a chance to write their own poetry. Andy wrote about his experiences of becoming blind and learning to run with Paul's Place at the Athletics track in Yate. "I wanted to show what blind people can do. Most people think you can't do this, can't do that. I'm glad I took part, it just explains what it's like for me and how I cope. Putting people in my shoes."

"The stories are powerful and hope to educate the public on disability matters, as well as connect with those who have experienced similar things", Alex shares. The poems and interviews will be shared on the Paul's Place website for you to read and listen to, as well as their social media.






