



BSTC 30th Anniversary

On Saturday 25th February 2023, Bradley Stoke Town Council held a free Mosaic Bird Making Workshop for the local community to design a bird, with the aim of forming a mosaic mural to celebrate the Town Council's 30th anniversary in March.

Many different groups and individuals from across Bradley Stoke came and made a bird, representing both the individuality and collectivity of our community. They have now been grouped together to create a flock of birds that are flying across the wall of the main Town Council office building.

Bradley Stoke Matters was very pleased to pop along to the local history drop-in event held at the Jubilee Centre on Friday 10th March in celebration of the Town Council's 30th anniversary, where the mosaic was officially unveiled by Deputy Mayor Franklin Owusu-Antwi. The Council was also represented by Tom Aditva

and Angela Morey during the unveiling. Former, long serving councillor and previous Mayor, Jon Williams, also spoke passionately about the origins of Bradley Stoke Town Council, and artist, Katie, who supported the 30 groups who took part in making the birds, also spoke about her involvement in producing the mural.



It was wonderful to hear so many local people relive early stories of moving into their new homes in Bradley Stoke and how many original families remain in the town to this day. The local history group offered a rich and interesting delve into materials from the archives, including the original brochures showcasing how the new homes would look, to original drawings and plans of the area revealing how things have changed through time. The Williams family also shared with visitors a comprehensive collection of scrap books filled with fascinating press clippings of newsworthy events and issues centred on the town over the years, a wonderful opportunity to reflect on local matters.



We were also delighted to receive a copy of 'Landscape of the Past: The Hidden Heritage of Bradley Stoke' a brilliant book by local historian Sharon Ubank with a series of charming photographs by Kim Baldock and illustrations by Susan Baker, a book which was generously financed by Bradley Stoke Town Council. Sharon continues to be remembered for her 'Stokes Standards' series of booklets about local history, and it is a testament to the spirit of the community that the late historian has a new road Sharon Ubank Close named after her in Little Stoke.

What a wonderful trip down memory lane! We have been involved in a couple of these events over the 18 years since starting Bradley Stoke Matters (including a back to the 80s event held at Bradley Stoke Library for Bradley Stoke's 21st birthday!) and have previously published articles on local history in past editions, including a lengthy interview with the first and former Town Clerk David Chandler who I recall telling me how he first set up office in his own home before the first premises were found. Look how we've all grown!

I recently started leading City Church Bradley Stoke. I'm also involved in housing and a goal of mine is eliminating rough sleeping. I recently started leading the Bristol Homelessness Forum which gathers many across the city who are doing so much to help people in need.

It really matters where you live and how you live - community really matters.

We all want life to be better – but preferably without cost and definitely without pain! But you don't need to have been homeless to know that life can be really tough. Things happen that don't make sense to us.

Easter is the centrepiece of the year for Christians. On the Friday Jesus was killed by the Romans – he was most definitely dead. It looked to those who had followed him that it was the end of the road – why has this happened? Yet 3 days later, on Sunday morning they were amazed to find that the tomb where Jesus' body had been placed was empty. Jesus had risen from the dead! He was alive again – he had overcome death. His death was not the end, rather it was the beginning!

Those who spent time with Jesus had gone through horror of hope fading only to find that the remarkable was possible. Suddenly it gave them a reason to live life differently – there was a new purpose and joy to be found in being a Jesus follower.

And the story of Jesus continues to be a remarkable message a couple of thousand years later. It means we have hope during pain and loss. Just think for a moment that 2000 years after Jesus lived on earth, millions of people worldwide choose to make Jesus the centre of their lives.

The community where we live can be different because God offers us hope. And this Easter there is hope that there is light after darkness, joy after despair and it can be found in the community of God's people. Come along to any of the following services to find out more.



ANDY'S MAN CLUB #IT'S OK TO TALK

Andy's Man Club was set up in Halifax in June 2016 following the tragic death of Andy Roberts, who died by suicide. Andy's mother Elaine and brother-in-law Luke Ambler decided to start a club to reduce the stigma around male mental health issues, and give men the opportunity to talk with their peers about whatever storms they're going through.

The group now has 117 clubs across the UK, as well as an online option for anyone who can't get to one. All meet at 7pm every Monday except Bank Holidays.

There are two Andy's Man Clubs in Bristol. Bristol North meets in the Jessop Suite at the Seat Unique Stadium aka the County Cricket Ground, Bristol South meets at the Knowle West Media Centre. The clubs are run by a team of volunteer facilitators, all of whom originally joined the club to get support for themselves.

Below we are honoured to share with you the experience of a local man, who found the support he needed from Andy's Man Club.



#ITSOKAYTOTALK



Mv Name is Andv. AKA Barts.

I'm 42 years old and I started attending Andy's Man Club at the beginning of June 2022. I can honestly say it has changed my life for the better in such a short time.

I have always been

the happy-go-lucky guy. I've spent most of my life brushing things under the carpet or saying "I'm fine" when I wasn't. This would lead to me having meltdowns or kicking off for no apparent reason.

I first walked through the door at the County Cricket Ground in Bristol for Andy's Man Club after the above had become apparent. My whole life I'd been living with anxiety, and then in June I was diagnosed with depression.

The anxiety was so strong that I didn't want to upset people, or I wouldn't speak up as I didn't want the confrontation - the only way to describe it is walking on eggshells my whole life!

Attending Andy's Man Club has made me less anxious by nature. Everyone listens and I get to talk and no judgement is passed. Also you realise you are not alone, others are going through a storm themselves.

No person is the same at Andy's Man Club. However we can all relate to each other, and that's because we all had a reason to walk through that door on our first evening. Even the facilitators!

In November 2022 I became a facilitator and have really enjoyed leading groups. It really is as simple as having a chat over a brew and a biscuit - all provided free of charge.

Andy's Man Club has given me that different outlook I needed. I now use the word "perspective" more than I ever have in my life. I recently did a radio interview on BBC Radio Bristol to talk about what made me join Andy's Man Club and also what Andy's Man Club has done for me!

I'm not here to sell Andv's Man Club to anvone. All I can say is it has changed me for the better, and if you are going through a storm yourself or know somebody who is, Andy's Man Club's doors are open 7-9pm every Monday and it might help lighten that load

ANDY'S MAN CLUB is a free-to-attend talking group that runs every Monday night at 7pm, excluding bank holidays.

For over a year, the group has operated at a venue in Bishopston - the Seat Unique Stadium, BS7 9EJ.

There is now a Bristol South group that meet at the Knowle West Media Centre, BS4 1NL. Any man over the age of 18 is free to attend either of these groups, with no registration, referral or booking process.

Challenging a Will if it does not reflect the Testator's True Intentions

Sarah Burgess, Solicitor at AMD Solicitors, discusses challenging a Will if it does not reflect the testator's true intentions.

In recent years, there has been a sharp rise in the number of Will disputes. Most cases are settled using mediation but around 180 cases are taken to the High Court each year. This number is expected to rise because:-

- People are living longer. More people are changing their Wills later in life perhaps as their family dynamics change.
- Adult children are facing greater financial struggles and they depend upon an inheritance to get by.
- High property prices means that people's estates are worth more and so it can be worthwhile to make a claim against an estate.
- During the Covid pandemic new measures were introduced to enable people to witness Wills by video. It is harder to assess whether someone has testamentary capacity remotely and this could result in more Will disputes.

If you find that a relatives' Will leaves their estate in an unexpected way, it may cause you to question whether they knew and approved the contents of their Will.

Example of where a Will failed for lack of knowledge and approval

Mr Reeves was a successful businessman who created a £100 million fortune during his lifetime. When he passed away, he was 71 years old. He had four children; Mark, Bill, Lisa and Louise. Mr Reeve's last Will was made in 2014 and highly favoured his daughter Louise. She was left 80% of his residuary estate, the remaining 20% passed to Lisa. Their brother Bill opposed the application for the 2014 Will being admitted to probate. He argued that their father did not know and approve the contents of the Will and was unduly influenced. Bill asked the court to uphold an earlier Will made in 2012, which left the estate 26.67% to Bill, Lisa and Louise and the remaining 20% equally to Ryan and Ria (Mark's two children).



In deciding whether the 2014 Will was valid, the court considered the following:

- Its terms were a dramatic departure from 2012
 Will with Bill, Ryan and Ria being almost entirely excluded as beneficiaries:
- Evidence whether the 2014 Will reflected Mr Reeves' true wishes:
- Evidence whether Mr Reeves was illiterate.

The Judge found the 2014 was invalid, despite being signed and witnessed correctly, because Louise had been unable to prove that her father had knowledge and approved the terms of distribution.

How do I challenge a Will?

If you believe that a Will is invalid then you should seek legal advice immediately. It is better to investigate the validity of a Will before probate has been applied for. These cases can be very emotional and appointing a solicitor to represent your interests will help to minimise the stress and time involved in dealing with a dispute.

As Prince of Wales, Charles has been preparing for this moment for most of his life, under the tutelage and guidance of his late mother, Elizabeth II. He will be recorded in history as the longest ever heir apparent, and the oldest to ever accede to the British throne at the age of 73.

Charles Philip Arthur George was born on 14th November 1948, during the reign of his grandfather King George VI. After the death of the King in 1952, his mother Elizabeth became Queen and Charles became heir to the throne at just three years old.

Charles was educated at Cheam and Gordonstoun schools, in the footsteps of his father Philip. He was the first heir apparent to attend school rather than receive private tuition. His time at Gordonstoun was hard, he referred to it as "Colditz in kilts" but later reflected, "...it taught me to accept challenges and take the initiative." He left in 1967 with six O levels and two A levels in French and History.

Charles went on to read Archaeology and Anthropology, then switched to History at Trinity College, Cambridge. He gained a 2:2 Bachelor of Arts in 1970. As Prince of Wales, he also spent a term at the University College in Aberystwyth, in order to study the Welsh language and history. In 1975, Cambridge University awarded him a Master of Arts.

Charles joined the Royal Air Force and trained as a jet pilot, then the Royal Navy, where he qualified as a helicopter pilot. The Prince's Trust was founded in 1976 with the £7,500 severance pay from the Navy. Since then, Charles has established sixteen more charities which raise over £100 million annually.

In 1981, he married Lady Diana Spencer. They had two sons, William born in 1982 and Harry in 1984. The couple divorced in 1996, and Diana was tragically killed in a car accident a year later.

In 2005, Charles married Camilla Parker-Bowles. The official title of Princess of Wales was never publicly acknowledged, instead Camilla became known as the Duchess of Cornwall.

The Duchy of Cornwall Estate was established by Edward III in 1337 for the heir to the throne. As Duke of Cornwall, the 53,000 hectare estate provided Charles with a private income to fund public, charitable and private activities, effectively making him financially independent. The estate passed to Prince William when he became heir apparent.

On 8th September 2022, Queen Elizabeth passed away peacefully and King Charles III became the new monarch. Coronation plans have been laid out for many years, under the codename 'Operation Golden Orb'. It's thought that the service will be smaller than the last coronation in 1953, and include different faiths and communities to reflect the change in British society. The Church of England ceremony will be broadcast internationally, and requires an oath and anointment, delivery of the orb and enthronement.

The coronation of King Charles III and Camilla takes place in Westminster Abbey on 6th May 2023.

Long live the King!

ISI Stamp of Approval for **Tockington Manor School**

Tockington Manor School has successfully met the standards required by the Independent Schools Inspectorate following its recent Regulatory Compliance Inspection. The ISI visited the independent co-educational day school in South Gloucestershire in January 2023.

The ISI Inspectors report on the school's compliance with the Independent School Standards Regulations and, in TMS's case, the Early Years Foundation Stage. All schools are required to meet the standards applicable to them. Its findings give Tockington Manor

School and Nursery the stamp of approval on the quality of education provided, the health, safety and welfare of pupils, and the quality of leadership and management of the school, among other criteria. "The teaching enables pupils to make good progress, encompasses effective behaviour management and is supported by suitable resources," it said.

The team of inspectors spent two days observing lessons, talking to pupils and examining their work. They also held discussions with staff and governors, observed extra-curricular activities in the school's 28-acre grounds and attended assemblies. Questionnaires completed by staff, parents and pupils from both the school and nursery were also taken into consideration.

This latest report builds on the positive outcomes of a more comprehensive inspection at the school and nursery in 2018. The ISI's Educational Quality Inspection Report found that Tockington Manor







Bradley Stoke Surgery has introduced a new patient enquiry system that aims to improve access. The surgery, which has 18,350 patients on its books, is planning to launch the new Klinik online consultation system on 28th March 2023.

Klinik is a highly sophisticated online tool using Artificial Intelligence (AI) and allows patients to contact the surgery quickly and easily. It is one of the leading online consultation tools in the UK, already being used by over 500 heath care centres and helping over 2.4 million patients. Over 87% of patients surveyed by Klinik would rate their experience as 'excellent' or 'good' (March 2022).

Appointments and queries about medical issues or requests can be made online through the surgery's website by clicking on the Klinik 'banner', and then by completing and submitting an online form. For those patients without internet access, they can still telephone the surgery, where a Patient Co-ordinator will complete the Klinik online form with them and then submit it for action. The surgery will then contact the patient via email, text message or telephone with the outcome of your request or enquiry.

The Klinik system's software or AI can clinically prioritise work for clinicians to ensure a timely response to all medical issues or queries. The surgery hopes that this new Access system will help to eliminate any frustration with its current phone system.

Dr Siddiqui, a GP Partner at the surgery, said: "We hope that this new system will help improve access at a time when the NHS is under immense pressure. The software is really simple to use and helps focus care on those who need it first."

Cameron's Smile

The race against silent darkness.

A ticking time bomb in the corner of a room, but yet the countdown is hidden from sight. Anxiously waiting for it to explode at any given time.

Will it be today or even tomorrow? I spend everyday holding my breath, wondering if we will ever see that bomb explode, leaving all of the broken pieces to fall around us - never being able to place them back together again, just like the pieces of my broken heart that throbs so desperately inside my aching chest.

But yet this time bomb isn't part of a fictional story. Its my son's progressive hearing loss, slowly tick, ticking away, leading us closer each day to the immense risk of him slipping into an unimaginable world of silent darkness - isolated from those around him.

Cameron was born in December 2012 and it wasn't until he was 8 weeks old that parents Carla and Adam realised that something was different about their baby boy. He was diagnosed as blind at first and then about 3 months later he was officially diagnosed, through genetic testing, as having Norrie Disease. Norrie disease is a very rare genetic condition, that predominantly affects males, where newborns are born without sight. People with Norrie Disease later develop a secondary symptom of progressive hearing loss, with the risk of slipping into a world of silent darkness.

Cameron is a happy and bubbly 10-year old child who despite his challenges, smiles through it all. He is a thrill-seeker who loves to experience life through his other vital senses, so please help us to save one of them.

We are raising desperate funds for the Norrie Disease Foundation (NDF) who are leading the research into saving the progressive hearing loss for individuals with Norrie Disease.

The challenge, named 'The Race Against Silent Darkness', is to get Cameron to the top of Ben Nevis on May 27th 2023 (the highest mountain in the UK at 1344m) and

Cam will be carried up by dad Adam and 100-Strong founder Matt, and back down the mountain. Once the team reach the bottom of the mountain, team 100-Strong will then cycle the nearly 500 miles home to Bristol over 3 days. With the challenge ending as soon as they get home on May 30th 2023.

All funds raised go directly to the charity and thereafter directly into the research needed. Time is against us to find the answers before Cameron himself slips into a world of silent darkness. 



Meet your PCC – Mark Shelford

Avon & Somerset Police and Crime Commissioner (PCC). Mark Shelford was elected as Conservative PCC in 2021.

Last month, the National Police Chief's Council and the College of Policing published their 'Tackling Violence Against Women and Girls (VAWG)' report. I very much welcome this first national assessment of the policing response to VAWG, particularly as the key area of focus is the national VAWG framework in responding robustly to allegations of police-perpetrated abuse, sexism, and misogyny within policing services.

As PCC, I want to make it clear that misogyny is unacceptable in any sphere, especially within policing. When public confidence in the police is low. Avon and Somerset Police must continue to demonstrate that misconduct will not be tolerated. This national report is important in ensuring transparency and accountability in police performance in tackling VAWG.

Chief Constable Sarah Crew and I agree that officers and staff who think misogyny, sexism and misconduct are acceptable, and ultimately, betray the force's values, will be dealt with swiftly and dynamically.

I will continue to seek assurances from the Chief Constable regarding what is being done to prevent and tackle any misconduct within the force and, where it's found, ensure officers and staff are held accountable.

In our most recent Performance and Accountability Board (PAB), the Chief Constable discussed the importance of increasing the number of women within policing to help restore women's confidence and be part of this muchneeded cultural shift.

I want to thank Chief Constable Sarah Crew and Acting Chief Officer for People and Organisational Development, Louise Hutchison, for joining me for my PAB. I hope those who watched the session found the Chief Constable's answers helpful and might even consider joining the police service to help make a difference.

If you missed this month's meeting, you can now watch it back via the link on the Avon and



Somerset PCC's Facebook page (@AandSPCC) or on our website. The next PAB will take place on 12 April at 4pm and be streamed live on our Facebook page.

Moving on. I know that dog theft is a wide concern for the people of Avon and Somerset. To mark National Dog Theft Awareness Day, my team and I spoke to Avon and Somerset Police's Animal Welfare Legislation Officer PC Natalie Cosgrove.

She told us that the force recorded 16 cases of dog theft in 2021 and only five in 2022. While a reduction and, I'm sure reassuring to many, that is still five cases too many. If you are a dog owner, there are specific security precautions you can take to make dog theft harder, including camera doorbells, keeping doors locked and sensor lighting outside your house.

I would also like to remind those who have a dog to not leave it unattended in your car, in your garden, or tied up outside of shops. Remember. microchipping is not only a legal requirement: it means your dog will be much easier to track down if it is stolen. I also urge dog owners to consider DNA tracking to help identify their dog if it is stolen and then recovered by the police.

More information on DNA tracking can be found on the 'DNA Protected' website. If your dog has been stolen, you should immediately contact the police and report the crime as theft. This way, we can ensure preventative work is carried out to keep our pets safe.


