

Bradley Stoke Green Gym // Three Brooks Nature Conservation Group Update by Sara Messenger Bradley Stoke's Green Gym have been reverting to their very distant youth and have been making leaky dams in Patchway Brook. Having checked the water

levels to find that in some places the brook was down to barely a trickle less than 2 inches wide, we felt that something had to be done immediately to save the fish and other creatures that depend on the brooks. The dams are made from stone and leaves already in the brook and are all less than a foot high, they may be small but they have been 'dam' effective and hold back just enough water to create pools deep enough for the fish to survive as well as providing drinking water to our other parched wildlife. Plans are also

being made to put in more berms in Stoke Brook (which flows from Sherbourne's Brake to the lake). these slow the flow of the water as well as helping create shelter and habitat.

Our first Bat Walk of the year went

off without a hitch thanks to Jacky Wyatt our new events organizer and to Andy Selman of Avon Bat Group. Although less than a minute into the walk we lost our Police 'escort' as just inside Savages Wood we all walked through a dense and aromatic cloud, so they went off to investigate while we, a little more 'chilled' than before, went on with the walk. As well as owls and pussy cats we also found lots of bats, mostly we thought, different types of Pipistrelle. The insect corridors have been working well and several bats were found swooping through them and we were very pleased to see that after the lake desilting the bats have now returned to feed there. We have several bat boxes

on the reserve but as I pointed out none of the group hold bat licences so we are unable to check them. Andy at this point mentioned that his licence does allow him to check boxes. We swooped faster than any Brazilian free-tailed bat could have and, whether it was an offer to do ours or not, we took him up on

If you were unable to make any of our organized bat walks we do have at the library 10 bat detector packs, each with a detector and a guide, all free to borrow if you have a library card.

Our first nature walk of the year rather suffered from

the weather as it was in the middle of the heat wave so, after us all wishing Neil a Happy Birthday, we set off towards the cooler woodlands instead of the baking meadows. Rupert Higgins is engaging and hugely knowledgeable but at least we knew one thing he didn't, that the depressions in Savages Wood are actually bomb craters! There used to be 5 or 6 but the Leisure Centre was built over them leaving just the 3. We also found King Alfred cakes, Hairy Willow Herb, bees and Burdock which Rupert reminded us all how bitter it was when we had it as children. The younger generations in the group didn't understand our childhood hardships

so we nipped over to the supermarket and bought some Dandelion & Burdock for them to try, which was a lot nicer than we recalled it being or maybe it was sweetened by the ice lollies that had also fallen into my basket.

However, it is still a big problem as people became disconnected during lockdown and struggled to find the space and even the courage to connect with others again.

Little Stoke Baptist Church (LSBC) has always been and remains a safe place for people to come for a coffee and a chat, bring a hobby, do a jigsaw and just chill out.





The Wolfridge Alpaca Barn opened in February this year. It is part of the family-run Wolfridge Alpaca Stud farm, based just off the A38 in Alveston. less than 5 miles from Bradley Stoke.

The Barn has been developed by Craig and Katriona who moved into their farmhouse in 2013. The land had previously been farmed by Craig's grandad.

The couple chose the name Wolfridge in memory of his grandad's pedigree Charolais cattle herd - Wolfridge Charolais. "You need a strong name in pedigree circles and when we were deciding what to call the alpaca herd we chose Wolfridge – it has a local connection as it was the name of a wood next to our farm, and it's also nice to follow on from something my grandad did."

The Alpaca Barn offers free entrance and parking and free access to the lovely Café, which serves delicious homemade cakes, as well as a range of breakfast and lunch options trying to cater for all dietary requirements. Coffee is supplied by Bristol company Cawardines and has had excellent reviews from visitors to date. The café has seating indoors and outside with views of the surrounding alpaca paddocks.

The Barn also offers Alpaca Experiences and fun Craft Workshops for all ages from parents/toddlers to adults/carers. Tues-Fridays mid-morning sessions, no need to book, check website for more information.

Visitors are free to take a wander around the paddocks. There are also information trail/challenge sheets (available from the Café for just £1) called the Wolfridge Wander for the younger generation, or people who are particularly keen to learn about alpacas!

Wolfridge Alpaca is a very friendly place which aims to provide excellent levels of service to ensure all visitors feel welcome. There are accessible facilities, disabled car parking and baby changing facilities.

Open Tuesdays - Saturdays 9.30am to 5pm (closes at 4pm from 1st November) and Sundays from 10am to 4pm.
Wolfridge Alpaca is closed on Mondays.

### **Shareholders' Agreements & Avoiding Shareholder Disputes**

When advising private limited companies, one of the first documents to discuss is an agreement between the shareholders. This is because in most private limited companies we work with, the directors and shareholders are one and the same. The same tends to apply in family run businesses.

The relationship between the shareholders of a business is vitally important if a company is going to succeed. A shareholders' agreement allows you to define the relationship between shareholders. set out the rights and responsibilities of each shareholder and provide for how the shareholders must act in certain given situations, for example on death or long term illness of a shareholder who also works in the business.

#### **Drafting shareholders' agreements**

Shareholders' agreements should be carefully drafted and tailored to meet the bespoke requirements for the Company. This will ensure everyone's rights and obligations are clear, allow the company to operate effectively and minimise the potential for disputes.

Typically, an agreement will cover at least the following:

- Shareholders' duties and entitlements
- How the company will be managed
- How directors will be appointed
- How board and shareholders meetings will operate and how often
- How decisions will be made between shareholders
- What will happen if a shareholder wants to leave the business
- The existing shareholders having a first right to purchase a leaving shareholder's shares
- Shareholders' rights to information

#### Reviewing and amending shareholders' agreements

When a company starts out, as long as it has 2 or more shareholders, an agreement should be considered. Over time, new shareholders may join the business or the roles of the shareholders may evolve. These are just 2 examples of when a need may arise for reviewing and updating an existing agreement.

It was lovely to explore the farm and see all the different animals and all the sounds that they make! We saw pigs, goats, chickens and ducks and also explored the forest area!

Seeing how children change in our beautiful outdoor settings is such a wonderful sight and joy to be a part of. Running free in the open air, feeling the sand beneath their feet encourages their confidence to grow, not to mention their language development. These different environments not only offers the children an opportunity to grow and develop, it gives us the practitioners another insight into their development. To this end we are thrilled to say the BBQ raffle raised over £550 which will be used towards a yearly community entrance pass so that the staff and children at Ambourne can enjoy lots of trips to the brilliant Wildplace, as well as additional resources for our own garden.

#### News from a local woodland

The Splatts Abbey Wood Conservation Group is planning new projects and developing existing partnerships and plans in the historic woodland based beside the MoD and Cheswick Village. There are three Bradley Stoke residents on the Group's committee - Jenny James, Andy Ward and Fred Hillberg.

There are plans to build a Pond at the site as an exciting new feature and to encourage biodiversity and also to provide greater diversity within the woodland site. Splatts Group Chairman David Bell emphasised the importance of the project saying that in the twentieth century two thirds of the ponds in the country disappeared, so developing new ponds is vital nationally and for the Splatts Woodland in particular.

Long term Splatts Committee members Fred Hillberg and Andy Ward, excited by the project said: -

"The pond is a project that has been on the radar at Splatts Woodland for quite some time, the area of woodland where the pond is to be created has always remained wet and boggy whatever the time of year so it is an ideal spot to create this new feature. It is hoped that given time the new pond will become naturally populated by plant life as well as species native to this type of environment replacing one of the many naturally occurring ponds that have been lost due to construction projects, road building etc.

A massive thank you to South Glos Council who have agreed to cover the cost associated with installing the pond, also to the team from UWE Greenspace team who are student volunteers kindly supporting the project and without whom we would not of been able to achieve as much as we have done, as we continue to conserve the

woodland for the use of future generations. Many thanks to all involved in the project."

South Gloucestershire Council is strongly supporting the woodland's plans to build the pond and their support has been essential to its development.

Splatts Abbey Conservation Group works in Partnership with South Glos Council and its sister woodland Sims Hill, and student volunteers. This year the UWE Student volunteers were joined by student volunteers from the University of Bristol.

UWE Students John Hoyos and Tom Day said: - "From a student's perspective being able to participate in the project planning and later building the pond shows our commitment to mother nature and to our common goal of tackling the climate emergency. Although it is a small project, what would happen if such small projects were replicated worldwide?

Secondly, students who volunteer come from all walks of life and from a wide variety of degrees yet we all want to take action, create new habits for wildlife, network and gain skills such as how to fell trees, plant trees, and in the near future how to build a pond. These volunteering opportunities are beneficial for our personal wellbeing along with providing skills that can be applied in our day-to-day lives now and upon graduation."

#### A New Head for Holy Trinity Primary School

It was my pleasure to pop in to Holy Trinity Primary School at the start of the autumn term to meet newly appointed Head Teacher, Stuart McClelland. Mr McClelland has been teaching for 24 years in Bristol and this is his fifth role as Head across the area, the previous two roles being as an Executive Head of multiple primary schools.

As with many of us, the circumstances of the last couple of years has driven home the importance of a better work-life-balance and, with a young family himself, Mr McClelland decided that a position within his own home area of Bradley Stoke and even more importantly in a role where he could get back in front of the children directly, was something he would value.

Exuding a dynamic and energetic personality, Mr McClelland extolled the Christian values at the heart of Holy Trinity Primary - Love and Understanding - Thankfulness - Friendship - Resilience - Service/ Humility being just some of these. These are values to be proud of regardless of faith, or even if you come from a background without faith.

Holy Trinity is fortunate to have children from a variety of backgrounds and faiths and this in itself offers many learning opportunities. Mr McClelland told me that "Children learn best from each other. Even as an adult, children educate us all the time, which then enriches our own lives. You can have a conversation with a child and find that their perspective can really lift you. Children are very accepting of each other (adults could learn a lot from this). There is much love and understanding between our children and nothing is better than allowing them to explain to their friends and classmates if they are celebrating a special festival - whether it be Christmas or Diwali - that others may not know about. As a school it is our job to encourage open vocabulary and in-person teaching where questions are welcomed and encouraged. We must offer a range of facilities where each child can flourish and make their own informed opinions based upon the facts they have access to".

When starting in any school the first thing is to look at what is working well from the stakeholders viewpoint, the children, the parents, the governors and the wider community in order to make the school the best it can be for the benefit of all children who attend; children of any faith and children of no faith. One thing Mr McClelland hopes to be able to encourage is the offering of different environments for learning, to be able to get outside more and discover outdoor learning. To encourage more clubs that the children wish to participate in be it sports, drama or something different (this is the subject for a planned pupil vote!). Schools have a lot to do to support children, but the importance of letting children be children, whilst still preparing them for the next level of learning journey, should not be lost from Mr McClelland's viewpoint.

At Holy Trinity there is time for collective worship of some kind every day, whether it be whole school led by the Head Teacher (on a Monday morning) or by an external visitor, or just time in class with the class teacher. This term's theme is one of the core values - Thankfulness. The importance of appreciating what you do have and not regretting what you do not.

This was very appropriate with the news of the Queen's passing late Thursday. Friday morning a whole school prayer service was held for the Queen and her family and the following Monday Mr McClelland headed a full school gathering of Thankfulness for the Queen. He guided the children to look at the Queen's life values, how she often spoke of the importance to her of her own Christian faith and how this has helped her throughout her life, as well as in her Service to our country.

We are pleased to be able to share a sample of some of the children's own work opposite as they reflected their thoughts of the Queen following the Thankfulness discussion.

We very much wanted to acknowledge the passing of Her Majesty the Queen Elizabeth on 8th September and express our gratitude for her inspirational and constant presence in all of our lives.

The sense of loss is enormous. Throughout her long and remarkable life, The Queen gave our country and the Commonwealth untiring service. She represented our country for more than seventy years; ever-present in our lives and a constant reminder of the values of determination, generosity and compassion. 90% of the country has only ever known the Queen as our monarch.

As Queen, she held regular (usually weekly) audiences throughout the terms of 14 British Prime Ministers, from Winston Churchill to Boris Johnson. Just two days before her death, Her Majesty, determined to carry out her duties to the end, appointed Liz Truss as her 15th Prime Minister. She met 7 Popes and her reign also spanned 14 American presidents, from Truman to Joe Biden. She met them all bar one, Lyndon Johnson.

Before she became Queen, she had said, "There is none of my father's subjects from the oldest to the youngest whom I do not wish to greet." During her reign, she visited every realm and every region of the UK, returning to some many times over. Initiating the 'Royal Walkabout', it is stated that nearly a third (31%) of the UK population claim to have met or seen the Queen in person (Our Gran, who is 97, has met her twice!).

In total she visited circa 128 different countries and travelled over a million miles. As Head of State she acted as diplomat and hostess making some 300 State visits, and welcoming over 110 Presidents and Prime Ministers to the UK on official visits.

Her Majesty supported and encouraged achievement in many different ways. The UK honours system enabled her to confer titles such as MBEs, OBEs and CBEs on people from all walks of life in public recognition of their merit, service or bravery. "Some of them are very cleverly discovered," she said. "That's very important, that the system does discover people who do unsung things, that perhaps the local people know about but nobody else does, and that's very satisfactory." During her reign approximately 400,000 such awards have been made and well over 1 million people have attended garden parties at the Palace.

"I declare before you all that my whole life, whether it be long or short, shall be devoted to your service and the service of our great imperial family to which we all belong."

The Queen has sent around 100,000 telegrams to centenarians in the UK and the Commonwealth and more than 280,000 telegrams to couples celebrating their diamond wedding (60 years) anniversary.

Those closest to her often talked about her wicked sense of humour, which became apparent to the rest of us during some big national moments such as the 2012 Olympics opening ceremony featured a skit in which she accompanied Daniel Craig as James Bond from the palace to the Olympic Stadium; her own idea, which she had kept secret from the rest of her family. This year, her Platinum Jubilee celebrations included her playing herself in a short video with a CGI version of Paddington Bear, bonding over a shared love of marmalade sandwiches — finally revealing the secret of what she'd been keeping in her handbag for all those years!

And let us not forget she was also a mother and grandmother, a matriarch as well as a monarch. She was married to Prince Philip for 73 years, had four children, eight grandchildren and 12 great-grandchildren. For them as well as us, she was a symbol of stability, resilience, and wisdom.



# BSJC Continue to Build on Our Previous Success

At the end of each year when the club reflects on the past 12 months and all the successes it has achieved, it can be a daunting prospect to think how we can better it in the year to come. However tough the new targets seem, Bradley Stoke Judo Club always manages to hit them and continues to set the levels for others to follow and achieve new firsts not only for the club but for Judo locally, regionally and nationally. The following article highlights just some of the fantastic achievements so far this year:



Our under 12s beginners/novice class goes from strength to strength and we regularly see up to 40 kids from the age of 4 upwards learning the basics of Judo whilst having great fun and making new friends. We continue to see strong interest from parents wanting to enrol their children in the class.

We have started to see the first cohort of under 12s progress to the more advanced classes and take their first steps on the competition mat achieving some great results (photo bottom right). We are very proud of the progress of younger judoka and the fantastic sense of companionship and respect between all of them.

On the national and international front we have been proud of the number of judoka at the club who competed at the under 18, under 21, Senior and Veteran age groups representing England, Wales and the Great Britain all around the globe. Countries visited so far have included Ecuador, Mongolia, Israel, Italy, Croatia, France, Poland, Romania, Kosovo and Turkey with even more countries still to come this year.

In the under 18 level we have had 4 members compete across Europe with the most notable performances coming from Ben Moore who won a



bronze medal on the European Cup circuit and was selected by GB to compete at the European finals.

In the Junior (under 21) age bracket we have again tasted great success and have had Tatum Keen, Ethan Nairne and Ryan Rijksen-Salman all being selected to fight at the Junior World and European Championships. For the World Championships only 4 judoka were

selected to represent GB with 3 of the team being from our club!

On the senior level which is age 23+ Lele Nairne (photo right) has gone from strength to strength being selected to fight for GB at Grand Prix and Grand Slam levels which are the highest level a judoka can compete at. The next cycle for Olympic qualifying has started and Lele is now in the position to try and earn enough points to qualify for an Olympic place. In another first for the club Lele was selected to represent Team England at the 2022 Commonwealth Games in Birmingham. Lele fought really hard and achieved a great 5th place just narrowly missing out on a medal.

On the Veteran front we recently saw club coaches Nick Brace and Roy Walker fighting at the Veteran World Championships in Poland where they both achieved 5th places in their respective weight groups. Both put in great performances against top quality opposition, and they were unlucky not to come away having been on the medal rostrum.

On the grading front we have seen 10 members of the club achieve their black belts so far this year. This is a great achievement for them as they have had to achieve 100 points through winning competitive fights and passing a tough theory exam

on Judo techniques which includes providing the Japanese names for them.

Head Coach Pete Douglas (centre, top photo) has double cause to celebrate so far this year by achieving his 6th Dan black belt and qualifying to coach at the highest level in World Judo. To achieve his 6th Dan Pete had to go through a very hard theory test and be

nominated and recognised by British Judo for his services to Judo. The International Judo Coaching award took a great deal of study and dedication over the past year and ended with a week long residential exam where he had to undergo multiple practical and theory exams to earn his qualification. Pete becomes only one of 2 such qualified coaches in the whole of the South West.

The club continues to attract new members of all ages and levels but we do not run a waiting list, so we are always open and welcoming to anyone who wants to start or improve their judo. We are proud that we are the premier club in the South West and one of the UK's top performance clubs.


