



Bradley Stoke Hedgehog HeroesReport by Sara Messenger

Bradley Stoke may be a large town but we are fortunate enough to share our space with so much wildlife, one of which is the children's perennial favourite: Miss Tigglewinkle. When I was a child it seemed that every night you could find them snuffling away in our back gardens and vegetable patches (sadly also many flattened on the road) but now most children have only ever seen pictures of them. (I asked some 16 years olds who had 10 years previously been my Girl Guide Rainbows what were their highlights and the only thing one girl could remember was me bringing in a live hedgehog for them to see!)

These days Hedgehogs are seriously in decline, for several reasons, but the major one is thought to be that they can no longer get into gardens to get food. Their favourite food is slugs, snails, beetles, earwigs, earthworms and caterpillars and they can can roam a mile or so each night looking for enough food and a mate but our modern enclosed gardens, without hedges and open fences, are shutting them out.

Bradley Stoke Town Council's Town Clerk Sharon joined in with the SGC Hedgehog Heroes and, with the help of myself from Bradley Stoke in Bloom & Amy from Bradley Stoke Zero Carbon, we planned a series of events to help our spikey friends. The first was a display in our library of all things hedgehog, the second was a children's colouring competition which was supported by the library and Pets at Home. We had two categories 9 & under and 10 & over and the winners were chosen by public vote.

The third event was a 'Hedgehog Giveaway' not of actual hedgehogs but of fence gauges and signs. Instead of buying the gauges online I approached the Patchway Men in Sheds and they agreed to make them for us for just the cost



of the wood. As no good deed goes unpunished and they have now been asked to make them for South Gloucestershire Council too!

There is a National Campaign run by Hedgehog Street called Hedgehog Highways. All they ask is that you make a hole or gap in your fence that is 13cm x 13cm (the size of a CD case). This is big enough for the hedgehogs but too small for most pets to escape. It can then be registered at https://bighedgehogmap.org/holes-for-hedgehogs-home/map-hedgehog-hole.

You can always go one further and ditch any slug pellets and, to encourage the hogs into your garden, leave out a little wet cat food and a shallow water bowl. And to be a complete Hedgehog Hero, get the children to make a messy leaf and woodpile in a quiet corner of your garden.

We had a very busy morning, with nearly 40 gauges and signs being given away and registered on the town's map and those that had entered the colouring competition all received a certificate from our Mayor Dayley Lawrence. Our 2nd place winners also received from Dayley and Simon from Pets at Home a knitted hedgehog (made for less than cost by local knitter Ann Hyam) and a bag of hedgehog food.

Local Author Celebrates Publication of New Children's Book

First time author Freddie Hillberg, who has lived in Bradley Stoke for the last 25 years with his wife Maureen, is celebrating the publication of his new children's picture book. The new hardback book, 'Brave Cat Millie' is aimed at children aged 4 to 7 and, according to its publisher Carraway, is an endearing and heart-warming tale accompanied by captivating illustrations that will be popular with younger readers but also with parents and grandparents.

Freddie (aka Fred), commented on the experience of becoming an author, "I'm absolutely thrilled with the book and to become a published author is something very special. Brave Cat Millie is a joyful, everyday story about an average, ordinary family and their extraordinary and courageous cat. I got real pleasure in writing it and it feels like a real achievement to have the story in print and be available in bookshops. I'm thoroughly delighted."

Freddie began his writing journey telling stories to his two grand daughters when they were younger. "They always wanted me to read them a bedtime story and

they knew their favourite books word for word. Eventually I got a bit bored telling them the same tales so started making up my own which they really enjoyed." It was just three years ago that Freddie was inspired to write the stories down. The character of Brave Cat Millie is based on his own cat, Millie (pictured).

Bradley Stoke Cricket Club: Update on the 2023 Season

Bradley Stoke Cricket Club is based at Baileys Court Activity Centre with a mission to promote cricket throughout the community. It is home to seven senior teams, a Women's Softball team, nine youth teams across six age group squads, All Stars cricket and Inclusion Table cricket. The youth section is supported by 13 ECB qualified coaches, six at Level 1/Foundation and seven at Level 2/Core.

Senior section

The Senior section fielded five Saturday teams in the Bristol and District Cricket Association (B&D) league and two Sunday teams in the North Somerset Cricket League (NSCL).



The Saturday 1st XI (pictured above) had an unprecedented season, winning the Senior (top) Division for the first time, with a game to spare, winning 10 out of 13 completed games (5 lost to the weather, 4 without a ball bowled). They have been promoted back into the West of England Premier League (WEPL) structure after relegation in 2022, and now look to consolidate there, using 2022's experience. Not content with league success, they did the B&D double by winning the 20 over knockout cup for the third time in a row they have been able to participate, emulating 2019 and 2021.

The 2nd XI consolidated after promotion last year, finishing 7th from 11 in Division 3. Their season felt particularly stop/start with not only the weather impacting but the odd number of teams resulting in a further two less games.



The 3rd XI had a similar season of consolidation following promotion last season, finishing 7th from 10 in Division 9. 15 players from the youth section represented this team, which bodes well for the future. For the first time they played home games on a grass pitch, at Oldbury-on-Severn CC, to whom the club are very grateful for accommodating them, also allowing a 5th XI to enter the league for the first time (see below).

The 4th XI were runners-up in Division 13, earning promotion into what will likely be the new 2nd regionalised tier (old divisions 10, 11 & 12), as part of a restructure of divisions 7 and below

A crucial win was achieved in the penultimate game against Barrow Gurney who finished just two points behind in 3rd. The 4th XI fielded 17 different youth players through the season, largely from the Under 15 and Under 13 age group, once again showing that the club's investment in youth is paying off.

The 5th XI made their league debut, able to take the 3rd XI's home slot at Bradley Stoke Community School, sporting a newly installed artificial pitch. They finished a respectable 7th in Division 15 with focus on development of players.

The two Sunday teams are also primarily focussed on player development for Saturday cricket, each team at their relative levels (1st XI - NSCL Division 1 (top), 2nd XI - Division 3 (bottom)). Less results focussed, but for the record the 1st XI finished 5th from 9 and the 2nd XI 12th from 14.

Women's Softball

This team was relaunched in 2023 and attracted a good number of players, many of whom were trying cricket for the first time. Thursday night training was fun focussed, whilst developing skills.



They entered the league which included a number of established sides, as such they didn't pick up a win but the key metric of enjoyment was met with room to spare - roll on 2024!

Inclusion table cricket

The club were delighted to launch table cricket sessions for 2023, taking place in the Orchard Room at Baileys Court Activity Centre on Friday evenings, alongside youth training.



Free and open to literally anyone, it was particularly great to see those who couldn't access our other cricket offerings taking part, but also coaches and players joining in during and after youth training. This culminated in a team being sent to Bradley Stoke Community School for a match against the hosts.

All Stars



50 children aged 5 to 8 signed up for Saturday morning introductory sessions at Baileys Court, supported by plenty of club members. The programme ended with a surprise visit from Twinkle, the All Stars mascot! We hope that many of the participants transition to our Under 9s group once they reach the requisite age.

Youth section

With a membership of over 100 reasonably spread across the age groups, two teams at

Under 11s, 13s & 15s could again be fielded in Bristol Youth Cricket League (BYCL) league and cup competitions, as well as one each of Under 9s, Under 11s girls and Under 17s. Notably:

The Under 11s girls team (below) was officially formed and entered into a softball league after the success of attracting girls to the game and club via Dynamos cricket, and impressed the coaches with their improvement through the season, some of whom were playing against players 2 or more years their senior.



 The Under 17s reached the final of their competition for the 2nd year in a row, Bristol CC running out winners on the night.

So, another busy season has concluded!

As ever the club are indebted to all its volunteers (eg committee, senior captains, coaches, groundstaff, bar helpers), sponsors, league officials and our landlords (Bradley Stoke Town Council and Bradley Stoke Community School).


End of season presentations are on the horizon as we write, and thoughts then turn to preparing for and making 2024 a success.

Wellbeing Matters!

Well, we find ourselves at that time of year again. Heading into autumn ... the end of school holidays and the start of a new school year. In the health and wellness industry this is often viewed as a second New Year but what does that actually mean? Well Christmas is coming I suppose!

We seem to live in a social media-fuelled dependence on a dopamine-rich, instant reward hunt: the guick fix; the easy win. Ironically, this also taps into a basic human tendency to take the path of least resistance - a deep-seated

evolutionary pattern of animal behaviour!

This can make us tunnel-visioned, whether focusing on diet, exercise or just fitting into the new jeans, the little black dress or party outfit! If we don't get a win now, we lose motivation, we lose the will to carry on, and who really cares if we eat well or bother to exercise?

Sometimes we need to lift our head and zoom out. We need to be prepared to commit for longer, to look at the bigger picture, and this can be where engaging the help of somebody else comes in, be that clubs, talk therapy groups or working with clinics like us and our social media support group. The camaraderie and sense of belonging to something 'bigger than vou' helps us feel someone else cares whether vou stay on track or not.

Working as a Wellbeing Coach, whether in the nutrition practice or the mental/emotional wellbeing clinic, with individuals, families or organisations within their work culture, accountability (helping you to achieve what you want to achieve beyond the point where you stopped if you were doing it by yourself) is often the key to success, but so is patience!

When I think back to some of the biggest changes I've made with my own health, the success came in the endeavour - the long game. If I wanted a guick win. I became so head-down focused on the minutiae of what was going on right in front of me, I actually became unhealthily obsessed! I couldn't be flexible, I worried

all the time, put unreasonable pressure on myself and if I didn't get instant results, had "failed...again".





The key to making long-term changes with our health comes from patience. consistence, accountability and support somebody helping to champion us through the darker days. Zooming out and focusing on a longer-term goal is much more realistic for lifelong change, but it pushes against our desire for instant gratification.

It is important to have signposts along the way, keeping us on track, which is one of the key things we do with our clients in the wellness space. But it's also important to keep the bigger picture in mind, to release the obsessive focus. We maximise our flexibility, develop more self-compassion and patience but don't let ourselves off making consistent effort. Leaning into support if motivation is waning really helps.

Take time to zoom out and see the bigger picture!



For more than 30 years, The Children's Hospice South West (CHSW) has been dedicated to helping local families make the most of short and precious lives.

The charity has three hospices across the south west, supporting more than 500 families; Charlton Farm near Bristol supports more than 200 local children and young people with life-limiting conditions and their families with a range of free services, all available 24 hours-a-day, 365 daysa-vear.

Support for the whole family includes short breaks; specialist medical, palliative, emergency and end-of-life care; play and music therapy; activities for siblings; and bereavement support. During the Covid pandemic, the charity adapted its care model to extend support to families' own homes.

When Noa died at Charlton Farm in November 2018, aged three months old, the care, compassion and support the family received from the hospice helped give them the time and space they needed to say goodbye. Here mum, Jo explains why the family will be forever grateful to Charlton Farm for the vital help and support during Noa's life and after she had died.

"Me and my husband, Jim and our daughters Nellie, aged 3 and Ada aged 1 love coming together to visit Charlton Farm and reflect on the memories that we had with Noa. One thing that we love about the support at Charlton Farm is that, despite our girls not being born when Noa was here, members of staff have built lovely relationships with them to help them process and understand grief, having lost their sister they never met. It's incredible how they intentionally want to help support your grief for a long time after, even though our time there was so brief. We visit Charlton Farm every year on Noa's anniversary which is really special for us. It's really great getting to take them somewhere specific where they get attention and we get to mark Noa's anniversary and somewhere she actually



was. Our favourite place is the trees in the garden where we take photos, because that was the first place Noa was properly outside in her life."

CHSW needs around £11m a year to run its three children's hospices, and around 85 per cent is raised through voluntary donations. Their promise is to 'make the most of short and precious lives across the South West. 

Meet your PCC – Mark Shelford

Avon & Somerset Police and Crime Commissioner (PCC), Mark Shelford was elected as Conservative PCC in 2021.

This month I would like to take the opportunity to highlight the partnership between Avon and Somerset Police and defibrillator provider HeartSafe. Together, the partnership has funded over 130 bleed kits to be installed on the side of existing defibrillator cabinets across the county.

Emergency bleed kits are specifically designed to handle 'catastrophic bleeding'. They include items like dressings and a tourniquet allowing bystanders and/ or the injured person to provide immediate aid whilst waiting for an ambulance service to arrive at the scene.

Extra minutes can save lives. Visit HeartSafe's website to find out where bleed kits are located in your community.

Saturday 9th September marked Emergency Services Day. Also known as 999 Day, it promotes the work of the emergency services and emphasises the responsible public use of emergency services.

I want to say a big thank you to all the staff and volunteers who work tirelessly for keeping us safe and making a difference in our communities.

To mark the occasion, I attended a flag raising at City Hall in Bristol hosted by the Deputy Lord Mayor, Councillor Paula O'Rourke.

Also in September I hosted the first event of our Autumn Councillor Forums for the Bath and North East Somerset (BANES) constituency. The session was a chance for councillors to gain an overview of my Police and Crime Plan.

The Plan outlines specific areas of focus for improvement, by the Chief Constable, and their officers and staff.

My four police and crime priorities are:

- 1. Preventing and fighting crime
- Engaging, supporting and working with communities, victims and partner organisations
- 3. Leading the police to be efficient and effective

4. Increasing the legitimacy of, and public confidence in, the police and criminal justice system



Councillors regularly speak to local residents and hear first-hand their thoughts about policing and crime in their area. Since being PCC, it has been of utmost importance to work with councillors to ensure we are delivering effective and efficient policing across communities.

I will be hosting a forum for South Gloucestershire councillors later this month and Bristol councillors in November.

On Monday 11th September I attended an anti-social behaviour (ASB) conference with hundreds of partners and the police all working together to deal with ASB.

It was great to see such involvement from all agencies, working alongside each other to tackle ASB in Bristol and the surrounding areas.

One of the topics discussed was the use of the StreetSafe tool. It is a free tool where members of the public can pinpoint on a map the location where they feel unsafe. The information provided will be considered alongside the extensive evidence base already gathered by police forces and used to inform the police and partner agencies such as local authorities.

No crime needs to have been committed in order to indicate where local people feel unsafe.

I would like to thank those for reporting crime, particularly burglaries, which have taken place recently in the area. The police rely on information from the public to build a picture of intelligence.

There are a number of ways you can report crimes. You can fill out a form, report it online or call 101 in a non-emergency.





Update from Jack Lopresti, MP

This past month, I had the pleasure of making many visits in the local area, one of which included the Patchway Men's Shed. Here we discussed how they help the local community including schools and community groups (as mentioned in our Hedgehog article on page 6), as well as their future plans for the development of their site and how I could help by connecting them with businesses and organisations who could help.

I also had a great visit to the Bristol Academy of the Military Preparation College for Training where I met some inspiring learners hoping to become armed forces recruits and had a good discussion with them hearing how they are supported as young people to join the military.

Additionally, due to many issues raised by constituents, I held a meeting with our Police and Crime Commissioner Mark Shelford and Councillors Neel Das Gupta and Keith Cranney to discuss anti-social behaviour, e-scooters, and the Meade Park fire. We also discussed neighbourhood policing and how the council can do more to tackle graffiti (see article page 10).

In addition, I had the opportunity to attend some great community events this month including the South Gloucestershire Show where I met with Jackie & Anna from the Staple Hill branch of the Royal British Legion and got to see some of the products of our agricultural industry in South Gloucestershire. I also visited the 60th Winterbourne Down and District Horticultural Society 60th Annual Show which had some fantastic displays.

I have also recently been on another visit to Ukraine. This time I met with a number of influential organisations and officials in Ukraine's defence industry and in government. This included productive meetings with Herman Smetanin, Head of Ukroboronprom; Sergii Boyev, Deputy Minister for Strategic Industries responsible for European Integration; Alexander Kamyshin, Minister for Strategic Industries of Ukraine; and Oleksandr Zavitnevych, Chair of the Parliamentary Committee on National Security, Defence and Intelligence. We discussed closer collaboration between British and Ukrainian defence companies to support



the war effort. I also had the opportunity to discuss defence procurement cooperation with the Ukrainian Defence Minister Oleksii Reznikov, and the continuing support our nation will provide for Ukraine on their path to victory.

On this visit I was also able to go to the Ukrainian frontline (photo below) and was honoured be able to speak to some of the troops and see such high morale among soldiers. Many of them were trained in the UK and it was great to see British kit and equipment in action such as the AS-90 self-propelled artillery from my son's army unit.



Back in the UK, I also had the opportunity to show my support for Ukraine on National Flag Day and Ukrainian Independence Day on which my office hung the Ukrainian flag in solidarity with the gallant Ukrainian people. I also went to a BBQ at the Ukrainian Refugee Hub at St. Andrew's Church in Avonmouth organised by the Bristol Rapid Relief Team who did a fantastic job delivering a great event for the Ukrainian refugees in our area.
