

Finding Me Again by Carla Alderman

"There is a new version of myself that has been created, since becoming a parent carer to a disabled child, I feel new and improved, but there are still parts of me that feel lost and wayward. Certain parts are broken and I am unsure how to glue the pieces back together again; or if they need to be disposed of completely.

"Then I remember that the pieces I contemplate throwing away forever are important chunks of my identity, that separate me from being a 'Mum', a 'Carer' or an 'Advocate'. It's so hard to find who I am underneath all of the new layers that have helped shape me into this better person - So why am I trying to find her? I am far more passionate, understanding and fierce. But underneath all of those new wonderful qualities which shape me into my role, is still a girl that deserves to be recognised and loved away from her caring, mothering role. She deserves to be nurtured and loved to prevent her from burning out. She is more than somebody's carer. She has her own wants and needs, her own goals, ambitions and happiness, which often get lost among the storm clouds.

"It's difficult to navigate it all when the fog is so dense, you cannot see before you. But yet, this journey continues to show me the importance of finding myself again and why I need her to still be there, alongside all of the new layers, I seem to grow each year."

We were delighted to hear from Carla again. You might know her as Cameron's mum and remember reading about Cameron's Smile in a previous issue or on social media. At just 8 weeks old Carla's son Cameron was diagnosed with a rare genetic condition called Norrie Disease. This disease usually only affects males and causes blindness and progressive hearing loss. Cameron is completely blind with no light perception what so ever. He started to lose his hearing at the age of 3. He is non verbal, has global delays, autism, adhd, profound learning disabilities and a feeding tube. But his personaility shines through all of that, and the most important thing you will remember about Cameron is his smile.



Carla's first book 'Cameron's Smile: Raising a deafblind child' talks about what is is like to raise a disabled child and the challenges that are faced in order to raise awareness and acceptance.

Carla's latest book 'Finding Me Again' talks about the sensitive, and possibly taboo subject, of how caring for a disabled child impacts your mental health and finding the resilience to overcome that.

Bradley Stoke Town Council is committed to eradicating graffiti in Bradley Stoke by offering a free to use service for residents of the Town. The new scheme in place now has South Gloucestershire Council remove graffiti on our behalf at a cost to Bradley Stoke Town Council and we have set aside a yearly budget of £1000 to make sure we can offer this all year to all residents. It is worth noting that offensive graffiti that displays rude words, racist or derogatory terminology, homophobic comments and offensive images can be removed by the South Gloucestershire team free of charge by contacting South Gloucestershire Council directly. The service we offer is for any graffiti that does not fit into these categories on private properties. Severn Counties Foreign & British Bird Society -Show Report

On Saturday 4th November SCF&BBS held its annual show of cage and aviary birds, which was a great success. The Society has been in existence for over 50 years, and caters to hobbyists who keep, breed, and exhibit a variety of domesticated birds, including various finches, canaries, members of the parrot family, and others. The venue was the Methodist Hall in Down Rd, Winterbourne, where the club meets on the third Thursday of the month at 8pm for talks, slide shows, and other activities. In addition to the regular meetings we have various other events, including displays at various locations including Hawkesbury Upton Flower Show and of course the May Fair at Winterbourne.



Putting on even a small show involves a great deal of work, inlouding preparation of the schedule, venue,

iudges (qualified judges for bird shows are a rare resource), refreshments, staging and awards to be presented. On the day we take care of all the relevant animal welfare and biosecurity issues.

For a show, all birds in a class have to be shown in special show cages, all designed to a matching format. This ensures that decisions are not made because of differences in how the birds are housed. The quality of the bird is judged on such matters as the birds' appearance, quality of feathers, behaviour and age. For canaries for example there are many breeds, each with its own special breed standard. Finches come in various colour patterns, some the same as the wild bird with other varieties produced in domestication.



Local Author Celebrates Publication of Children's Book



The RPII qualification enables the Parish to carry out in-depth regular routine checks on all the play equipment owned by the Parish Council. We are very lucky to have such lovely recreational facilities and we take great pride in keeping the grass cut, hedges tidy, bins clear and play area equipment in good safe working order.

To also get the lads on the small tree and chainsaw course has been a real positive. Several dead trees around the recreational areas have been removed already in-house by Andy and Martyn, saving the Council additional on-costs having to hire external contractors and it allows this work to be carried out far more efficiently too.

Meade Park Car Park Extension

The car park at Meade Park has been extended, which is a welcome alteration to this very popular recreational space.

Meade Park Play Equipment

Following the devastating fire to the tower multi play equipment at Meade Park in June this year we hope to be able to reinstate the large slide and also add a zip wire (Aerial runway) to the site before the end of the calendar year.

The Parish Council will also be adding CCTV coverage to cover the facilities within Meade Park.



What's going on in the 40 Acres River? River Restoration Works Carried Out in the Forty Acres Field

A team of river specialists from the Bristol Avon River Trust (BART) are installing improvements in the Stoke Brook. Along with a team of volunteers they are pinning small brushwood bundles, known as berms, into the river (see photo right). These add small bends into the river which was straightened and 'tidied up' by humans back in the past before we better understood the implications of a tidy river for water flow and wildlife.



In high flow the water rushes through and all plant life, insects and fish eggs get washed away. The berms will allow wildlife to flourish again and will add lots of nooks and cranies for fish and the water insects they feed on to hide away and thrive. The berms will also catch a lot of soil, gravel and small particles that wash in from roads, drains, rooves etc. which can smother a river. The natural woody berms will take about 2 weeks to install and should last forever. The berms in the brook further upstream in Bradley Stoke have been very successful. Advice for landowners north of the motorway have also reduced sediment, chemicals and slurry entering the watercourse. Residents can get involved by volunteering for BART www.bristolavonriverstrust.org

We can also all play our part by ensuring we never put anything down the toilet other than paper, poo and pee. We must also never put anything down the drain. Old paint, oil, white spirits etc can all be taken to the nearest recycling centre.

Homeowners can reduce the amount of rainwater entering the drains by installing water butts, avoiding tarmacing driveways and gardens and installing bog gardens and rain troughs in their own gardens. The clocks have changed, the weather has turned and it's getting darker earlier. Not everyone finds this time of year a snuggly, cosy time, so I hope the following tips help you through and out of the other side feeling well, positive and connected.

melatonin for a balanced wake-sleep cycle.

Sleep Health

Winter brings short days, long nights and lower temperatures. Our bodies naturally need more sleep. Sleep deprivation causes significant immune system compromise and susceptibility to infections. Begin your wind-down routine and head to bed 30 minutes earlier to improve your winter health. Tryptophan-rich foods such as turkey, fish, wholegrains and spinach, support out body's ability to produce mood-lifting serotonin and sleep-enhancing

Exercise

Wrap up and get outside - even if it's just for 10-20 minutes. Outdoor exercise wakes up our body and metabolism to manage the colder temperatures. Dress in layers to manage your body temperature more effectively. The endorphin buzz you get helps energy levels and mood. Be Sociable

Aim to do something with someone else at least once a week. Long nights and cold evenings when we draw the curtains at 4pm may feel lovely and cosy, but the chances of feeling isolated in winter significantly increases. Try to balance your cosy rest and self-care evenings with a little socialising.

Balanced Meals

Add satisfying proteins into your winter cooking, not just carbohydrate-laden, stoday tummy fillers. Think chilli-con-carne, hearty stews and casseroles, curries, bolognese, roasted meat or fish traybakes. Including rich sources of protein keeps us fuller for longer, balances our blood sugars and releases nutrients slowly, topping up our mood as well as our eneray levels.

Increase Fruit and Vegetables

Make a significant effort to pack the fruit and vegetables into those meals. This is harder in winter when we don't





have farmers markets or garden produce to hand. Buy seasonal autumnal fruits or use frozen berries. Use vegetables to roast, like root vegetables and winter squashes, and enhance those dishes with fresh greens to add more colour. More colours mean a greater breadth of


vitamins and minerals!

Stav Hydrated

We lose a pint of water every day just through breathing in the winter! Cold weather also alters our thirst triggers, so we don't recognise when we need to drink. Sweating under lots of lavers also dehydrates us more easily, never mind having the heating on full blast! Aim for 6-8 glasses of water each day to help with hydration and temperature regulation and keep your skin looking young, fresh and healthy.

Seasonal Supplementation

Vitamin D deficiency is the primary cause of seasonal depression (decreased exposure to sunlight hours). 400IU daily support a robust immune system and healthy mood.



Let the Air Move

Allow the air to circulate around your home or workspace at least once a day to clear out

stale air and germs. Open the windows in the evening if you have your heating on and keep your thermostat at a temperature that allows you to feel cosy but doesn't make your home or work environment the perfect incubator for infection!



News from Abbeywood Community School -

Abbeywood celebrated the best ever GCSE results this year and have broadened the curriculum offer to include a specialist Engineering provision for Y10-Y13 students. The pathway linking our two buildings has now been completed, ensuring that movement between Post-16, Engineering and other subjects is much simpler.

We are now looking forward to the expansion plans becoming a reality as we continue to cater for the increased popularity, having taken an addition 60 students in Years 7-10. Building is due to take place from 2024.

Y9 Airbus Foundation Youth Programme 2023-2024

Our cohort of 20 students have taken part in the first 5 weeks of the Airbus Youth Programme this academic year and they have accomplished so much! The weekly three hour workshops take place every Wednesday at the Airbus AIRTeC (Aerospace Integrated Research & Test Centre) buildings in Filton (look out for the Airbus wing on Gloucester Road North)

So far, they have been fully inducted into the programme by being introduced to all the apprentice volunteers (there are over 20 who have been supporting the programme so far) and have learnt the health and safety measures and systems through briefinas.

Each week, the students complete their portfolios which track their progress throughout the whole programme and ensure that they wear their personal protective clothing during each of their visits.

Early in the programme, they investigated the theory of flight through understanding the characteristics of wing designs leading to designing their own wing to be fitted to their model aircrafts.

Most recently the group have flown their own aircrafts to fully understand why they perform in the way they do and the process included the evaluation and improvement of their model designs before presenting to the apprentices.


Amongst all the project work, they all took the tour of AIRTeC site to learn what the whole site is used for. This also included tours of other sites to see how the wind tunnel is used and the importance of testing.

Coming up before the Christmas holidays, they will be building a hydraulic model of a crane/arm using syringes, continuing their work in understanding the importance of working as a team in the engineering profession and preparing to get messy whilst they learn about different material properties that are used for aircraft manufacture.

Congratulations to them all for their successes and hard work so far this year.

Abbeywood 'Makes A Noise' Against Bullying

Abbeywood Community School's Anti-Bullying Campaign marked Anti-Bullying Week in November with a variety of events to demonstrate and reinforce our zero-tolerance approach to bullying in our school community.

On Monday 13th, we encouraged all of our 1,220 pupils and staff to wear

odd socks in to school along with 5 million children up and down the country, as a national message against hurtful behaviour. This was massively successful, with us having adorned the school in our colour of purple against bullying. Our ABC ambassadors' visibility

in purple shirts has cast us as people to talk to, a peer-led service to confront bullying and every day we drew our trademark purple circle in a new location around the school, to show that we are always here for support and to increase the anticipation across the week. Our anti-bullving ambassadors wore purple the whole week, all helping to flood the school in a sea of purple resistance to bullying nationwide.

The campaign message this year was to "make a noise" to spread the message against bullying and what better way, we thought, than to address the whole school at lunch on Wednesday in a flash mob. It got the whole school talking, and the message was out. Alongside a week of anti-bullying assemblies, the pupils were aware of our supportive strategy. Across the week, we also set up a stand in our main Atrium for students to draw odd sock designs, as well as writing notes to inform us of their bullying concerns.

Across Thursday and Friday, our students took the time after school to bake some delicious treats and then sell them at break to raise money for the Anti-Bullying Alliance. It also gave us a great opportunity to reinforce the letterbox in the atrium so that bullying reports can go directly to the ABC. Students can also access our anti-bullying report system within a few clicks of opening a school computer thanks to our portal button, as well as coming to our ABC Ambassadors, who have received nationally recognised training around countering bullying, as we push on to complete the Diana Award and then the BIG Award next year.





Deferred Consideration in SME Corporate Transactions

When advising a purchaser on a share or asset purchase, a key consideration is what the purchase price should look like, how it should be paid and whether it is contingent on certain events after completion. For a seller, the best position would be for the whole purchase price to be paid on completion with no part being contingent on future performance.

Deferred consideration is an umbrella term for any payments that are scheduled to be made after completion (when the assets or shares of a business are sold). This can be (a) a fixed amount payable by instalments or (b) an uncertain amount subject to an earn-out formula based on future performance.

How the purchase price is structured is a matter for negotiation and the party with the better bargaining strength will likely control the terms.

Benefits for a Buver

The key benefits of utilising deferred consideration for a buver include:

- Cash flow. If the purchase price can be structured over multiple instalments and years, the buyer can manage cash flow. If the deferred payments are subject to performance criteria such as a turnover target, client retention or personnel retention, the buyer may not have to pay the full agreed price.
- Risk management. Deferring part of the purchase price offers some protection against the sellers being unable to pay any warranty or indemnity claims arising under the acquisition agreement. The buyer's position can be further strengthened by including an express right to set off claims against the balance of deferred consideration.

Risks for a Seller

The main risk of deferred consideration for sellers is that the buyer may not have the funds to pay the instalments when they become due. This could be a devastating position for sellers of SMEs, particularly as the sale of a business is usually a retirement strategy.

Sellers of a business can try to negotiate contractual protections against the risk of non-payment of any deferred consideration. These can include:

• Guarantees. If the buyer is a company, the sellers could seek a guarantee from its parent company,



directors or beneficial owner(s). If a guarantee is provided and the buyer fails to pay the deferred consideration, the sellers will then have a remedy to seek recovery from a guarantor.

• Security over assets. Sellers may wish to seek security over certain assets of the buyer and/ or target company. This could be a charge over property, shares or a key item of equipment. On enforcement, a charge entitles the holder to be paid from the sale proceeds of the charged assets ahead of unsecured creditors of the same debtor.

Although there are inherent risks for a seller, it is a common for the sale of an SME business to include deferred consideration, particularly with a service business where the main asset is the client bank who are not tied into long term contracts.

Meet your PCC – Mark Shelford

Avon & Somerset Police and Crime Commissioner (PCC). Mark Shelford was elected as Conservative PCC in 2021.

As I write, this weekend (12th November) marks Remembrance Sunday. Before my political career. I was in the armed forces for 30 years. Remembrance Day is a poignant day and I will be paying my respects on Sunday in Bristol to our Armed Forces community.

I want to take the opportunity to highlight Priority One of my Police and Crime Plan; Preventing and Fighting Crime and talk specifically about road safety, which is a key area of focus.

If you are a road user, I urge you to be careful when using pathways and pavements. It is important to remember that pavements are solely for the use of pedestrians.

If you are a cyclist or e-scooter user and need to use the pavement to park, please do so with care, especially as the evenings become darker. This ensures accessibility and safety for all road users and pedestrians in Avon and Somerset.

With the early nights drawing in, I would like to remind everyone to be vigilant with their home safety and security.

Burglary is known to increase during the winter months, I recommend you take a few simple measures to help reduce the chances of becoming a victim.

Double check that all your windows and doors are locked, especially before going out, set a light timer to come on whilst you are out to not only deter burglars but help you get into your home safely. If you have an outside space, set up an outdoor sensor light to alert you of anyone arriving at your property and, if it is possible, invest in a burglar alarm and/or CCTV (with signage) for extra peace of mind.

It is also vital that you report any suspicious activity to the police, using 101 or the online reporting form in a non-emergency and 999 where there is a risk to life.



Jack Lopresti, MP - Working for You

This month in Westminster, I met with Roads and Local Transport Minister Richard Holden MP to discuss how we can bring about a solution to the reduction of local bus services, which many children rely on to get to school in our local area. Bus services such as the 458 and 936 have been cut completely by Mayor of the West of England Dan Norris. Funds have been funnelled into other areas such as £8 million on new offices for the West of England Combined Authority (WECA), and have not

I also recently visited The Wave in Easter Compton. They have had a successful year. In addition to providing an excellent facility for locals and tourists alike, they are passionate about giving back to the community and are more than self-sufficient with green energy. Indeed, they are selling energy created at their site back to the National Grid. They are aiming to be open and operating all through the winter this year – fantastic!


