


Finding Me Again by Carla Alderman

"There is a new version of myself that has been created, since becoming a parent carer to a disabled child, I feel new and improved, but there are still parts of me that feel lost and wayward. Certain parts are broken and I am unsure how to glue the pieces back together again; or if they need to be disposed of completely.

"Then I remember that the pieces I contemplate throwing away forever are important chunks of my identity, that separate me from being a 'Mum', a 'Carer' or an 'Advocate'. It's so hard to find who I am underneath all of the new layers that have helped shape me into this better person – So why am I trying to find her? I am far more passionate, understanding and fierce. But underneath all of those new wonderful qualities which shape me into my role, is still a girl that deserves to be recognised and loved away from her caring, mothering role. She deserves to be nurtured and loved to prevent her from burning out. She is more than somebody's carer. She has her own wants and needs, her own goals, ambitions and happiness, which often get lost among the storm clouds.

"It's difficult to navigate it all when the fog is so dense, you cannot see before you. But yet, this journey continues to show me the importance of finding myself again and why I need her to still be there, alongside all of the new layers, I seem to grow each year."

We were delighted to hear from Carla again. You might know her as Cameron's mum and remember reading about Cameron's Smile in a previous issue or on social media. At just 8 weeks old Carla's son Cameron was diagnosed with a rare genetic condition called Norrie Disease. This disease usually only affects males and causes blindness and progressive hearing loss. Cameron is completely blind with no light perception what so ever. He started to lose his hearing at the age of 3. He is non verbal, has global delays, autism, adhd, profound learning disabilities and a feeding tube. But his personaility shines through all of that, and the most important thing you will remember about Cameron is his smile.



Carla's first book 'Cameron's Smile: Raising a deafblind child' talks about what is is like to raise a disabled child and the challenges that are faced in order to raise awareness and acceptance.

Carla's latest book 'Finding Me Again' talks about the sensitive, and possibly taboo subject, of how caring for a disabled child impacts your mental health and finding the resilience to overcome that.

Plastics: Just a Load of Rubbish?

Local Bradley Stoke resident Dr Alicia Chrysostomou has recently had her third book published. This latest book entitled 'Plastics: Just a Load of Rubbish?', and published by Hero Press, aims to set the record straight when it comes to the subject of plastics.

With a background in academia, having lectured for many years on the subject of plastics and rubber, and with a PhD in the subject, Alicia is well placed to write authoritatively on this theme. Alicia freely admits this is a topic that is met with increasing distain and one which unfortunately is surrounded by a great deal of misinformation. Add to that a fair sprinkling of greenwashing and Alicia decided to take action the best way she knew how, and that was to write an informative and entertaining book on the subject. And so 'Plastics: Just a Load of Rubbish?' came into being.

So what is this book about? Alicia says she really wanted to write with the general public in mind. As so much conflicting information is put into the public domain it naturally leads to a great deal of confusion. For instance do we really know what plastics can be recycled and why are so many not taken? Bradley Stoke residents for instance can't all add soft plastics to their green box and black plastics are a no-no. What do we know about bioplastics and are these really any better environmentally? Can they even biodegrade (the answer by the way is mostly no, they can't biodegrade.)? Why have 'bamboo' cups and lunchboxes slipped silently from our

shelves? And what would happen if we were to remove all plastics from our lives, would this be better for the planet?

All these questions and more are answered in 'Plastics: Just a Load of Rubbish?' Alicia doesn't shy away from the big question either. Why does so much plastic appear to turn up on the ocean and just how harmful are microplastics? And the big question: what can we do about it?

No punches are pulled in the telling of the story of plastics. Where they are useful it is made clear, as are the incidences where they just don't work as well as alternative materials. Alicia says, 'I hope 'Plastics: Just a Load of Rubbish?' dispels some of the myths surrounding plastics and that it can show where in fact they might even be a valuable secret weapon in finding our way through the environmental quagmire we find ourselves in right now'.

So maybe if we want to hear the real truth about plastics' place environmentally; it's no bad thing to hear the other side of the story!

Alicia has lived in Bradley Stoke for the last 16 years and now lectures around the country but is also involved in community groups and has given talks to the local WI groups. 

We chose not to mate any of our females in 2023 as their births had slipped to late summer. Instead we are waiting for the Spring of 2024 so we can "reset" our birthing window. Alpacas are pregnant for 11.5 months so our next cria will be due in Spring 2025. This gives them the whole of the summer to grow and develop in the best of our British climate (!), helping to ensure they are as healthy as possible. We aim to start selling some of our breeding females in 2024, so if you are interested in owning or breeding alpacas, please get in touch.

how we might like things to be different in 2024. Every year hundreds of us make New Year's resolutions. Do you?

New Year can be a great time to reflect on what went well last year, what didn't go so well, what we want to do more of, less of, do differently or maybe even stop doing altogether!

As a family, we love to do this over New Year's Eve dinner and decide what our focus will be for the year ahead. I also spend a lot of time in the wellbeing clinic exploring these options with clients, but one thing is always true. If we are allowed to. we will stop. Yep, it's a hard truth but it is true. How many times have you started something and then ground to a halt when the going gets tough? We all do it at one time or another. This is where accountability makes

the difference. It really is the thing that stops us from sabotaging ourselves and guitting.

Human beings are hardwired to conserve energy and take the path of least resistance. It's not laziness, flakiness, lack of focus or resilience, but a deepseated, evolutionary need to conserve energy to preserve our genes. But we're not really talking about preserving genes here are we? We're talking about fitting in our jeans, getting to the gym, giving up smoking, eating less sugar, drinking less, going for a run, tackling the messy house, getting on top of finances, asking for support with your mental health, ending that difficult relationship. 



Deferred Consideration in SME Corporate Transactions

When advising a purchaser on a share or asset purchase, a key consideration is what the purchase price should look like, how it should be paid and whether it is contingent on certain events after completion. For a seller, the best position would be for the whole purchase price to be paid on completion with no part being contingent on future performance.

Deferred consideration is an umbrella term for any payments that are scheduled to be made after completion (when the assets or shares of a business are sold). This can be (a) a fixed amount payable by instalments or (b) an uncertain amount subject to an earn-out formula based on future performance.

How the purchase price is structured is a matter for negotiation and the party with the better bargaining strength will likely control the terms.

Benefits for a Buyer

The key benefits of utilising deferred consideration for a buver include:

- Cash flow. If the purchase price can be structured over multiple instalments and years, the buyer can manage cash flow. If the deferred payments are subject to performance criteria such as a turnover target, client retention or personnel retention, the buyer may not have to pay the full agreed price.
- Risk management. Deferring part of the purchase price offers some protection against the sellers being unable to pay any warranty or indemnity claims arising under the acquisition agreement. The buyer's position can be further strengthened by including an express right to set off claims against the balance of deferred consideration.

Risks for a Seller

The main risk of deferred consideration for sellers is that the buyer may not have the funds to pay the instalments when they become due. This could be a devastating position for sellers of SMEs, particularly as the sale of a business is usually a retirement strategy.

Sellers of a business can try to negotiate contractual protections against the risk of non-payment of any deferred consideration. These can include:

• Guarantees. If the buyer is a company, the sellers could seek a guarantee from its parent company,



directors or beneficial owner(s). If a guarantee is provided and the buyer fails to pay the deferred consideration, the sellers will then have a remedy to seek recovery from a guarantor.

Security over assets. Sellers may wish to seek security over certain assets of the buyer and/ or target company. This could be a charge over property, shares or a key item of equipment. On enforcement, a charge entitles the holder to be paid from the sale proceeds of the charged assets ahead of unsecured creditors of the same debtor.

Although there are inherent risks for a seller, it is a common for the sale of an SME business to include deferred consideration, particularly with a service business where the main asset is the client bank who are not tied into long term contracts.

Meet your PCC – Mark Shelford

Avon & Somerset Police and Crime Commissioner (PCC), Mark Shelford was elected as Conservative PCC in 2021.

I hope everyone had a wonderful time over the festive period.

I would like to start the New Year by thanking all the officers and emergency services staff who have worked tirelessly to keep our communities safe over the past few weeks.

The Police Funding Survey is now live online. I encourage every resident to give their thoughts on my proposal to increase the policing part of the council tax, known as the precept, by £10 a year (that's the equivalent of 83 pence per month) for the average band D household. The survey will close on 22 January.

Local policing is funded by a combination of people's council tax (the precept), Home Office funding, and other grants. The precept makes up 41% of police funding and I, as your PCC, am responsible for setting the amount of money residents contribute to local policing through the precept. You can access the link to the precept survey on the OPCC website.

Last month, my office launched a new volunteer recruitment campaign looking for members of the public from all backgrounds and walks of life to visit people in one of three custody centres we have in Avon and Somerset based in Kevnsham, Patchway and Bridgwater.

These volunteer roles are called Independent Custody Visitors and they perform a vital role in ensuring people who are detained in custody following arrest are aware of their rights and are receiving what they are entitled to.

If you can spare two hours per month, at a time to suit you, to partner with another custody volunteer and undertake a visit please apply before 18 January. No experience is necessary, just a commitment to seeing fair, efficient and effective policing in our communities. Visit our website and go to the 'Get Involved' section.

I urge people to be extra careful when shopping online at any time, but particularly this time of vear as we see online shopping increase in the annual January sales.

Many people are looking for bargains after the Christmas period and I warn shoppers: if it looks too good to be true. it probably is!

Our area is making a significant contribution to the war effort in Ukraine with our fantastic defence and aerospace industries which are globally renowned, in addition to the great team at DE&S Abbey Wood. Indeed, while I was in Washington DC, I visited the Smithsonian National Air and Space Museum in which I saw exhibits like British-built Rolls-Royce aerospace engines.

I recently welcomed members of the Ghana Community Bristol to Parliament and my team showed them around. Many thanks to my colleague and friend Cllr. Franklin Owusu-Antwi for his help in organising this fantastic event.

I met with Peter Brown from Estrans Limited in my Bradley Stoke office and heard about the great plans for new homes being built in Swanmoor Stoke, with fantastic infrastructure investment including a by-pass for Easter Compton and the upgrading of Pilning Station. Building new homes, especially social and affordable housing, is the only way of solving the housing crisis and increasing equality of opportunity, especially for our young people.

Finally, I it was lovely to have attended so many wonderful Christmas events locally, such as the turning on of the Christmas lights at the Willow Brook Centre, the BRACE Alzheimer's Research charity Christmas Fair at St. Andrew's Methodist Church in Filton, and Carols at the Winterbourne
