



Stoke Gifford Repair Café

Jane Watkivs tells us about the Stoke Gifford Repair Café.

It all started when our daughter went to the open day at Winterbourne Barn and came back to tell us that Winterbourne Down had a repair café. My husband Mike and I had vaguely heard of repair cafes, but this prompted us to find out more. We learned repair cafes are groups of people with skills in mending things who volunteer their time and skills to repair items so that they get a longer

life, and we can reduce what goes to landfill. An eco-church group was started by the operations manager of St Michael's Stoke Gifford, we joined the other interested people in the church, and the group agreed that we should try to set up a repair café.

We visited Brislington and St Anne's repair café and Winterborne Down repair café to see how they worked and had a meeting with people in the church who were interested in fixing things. One thing which did become clear was that it was essential to make sure that the people bringing items to repair know that the repairers were volunteers, not experts, and that we could not make any guarantees about fixing the item.

We held our first repair café on a Saturday in May 2022. At first the Coffee Shop wasn't operating, so we served simple refreshments. One of the earliest things that was fixed was an old Kenwood mixer and the owner was so pleased that she made us a cake to serve. We only advertised in the church to start with so we could get some practice!

After a few months we advertised the café more widely and welcomed volunteers who are not connected to the church, but who wish to prevent so many things being thrown away, to add to

We now fix a variety of items including bikes, small electrical goods, clothes and toys. Sometimes people have to buy parts for the repair and return with them the next month, sometimes we advise people to seek professional advice and sometimes things just can't be fixed. At other times people know what to do, but don't have the tools to achieve the job so they come along to us.

The repair café is on the second Saturday of the month in the Coffee Shop on the green, from 10am to 12pm. We recommend that you come as early as possible, because we can get quite busy. It is also a good chance to have refreshments while you wait. We always welcome new volunteers to fix items, so do come along for a chat to see if you would like to join us.

St Michael's eco-church group have also run clothes swaps, plant swaps and litter picks and we are always on the look out for other ways to encourage the community to care for our world.






Bradley Stoke Town Council Community Festival 2025

This year's festival is taking place on Saturday 7 and Sunday 8 June 2025 around the grounds of the Jubilee Centre, Savages Wood, Bradley Stoke, BS32 8HL and Bradley Stoke Skatepark, BS32 9BS.

Natalie Field, Mayor of Bradley Stoke said: "We are delighted that a full Bradley Stoke Festival is taking place again this year leading on from the successful events which happened last year and the extremely positive feedback that we received about the festival."




The festival is being funded by Bradley Stoke Town Council who have once again commissioned the company Re-energize to organise the event.

Saturday 7th June

The main community festival day is on Saturday 7 June 11.30 am - 18.00 pm.

This year, the music is provided by a mix of local bands including; Longshots, Limited Edition, Sonic Sunrise, The Layers, V-Dubz, Zoom Club and the Saturday Night Bee Gees tribute band.



Local dance groups performing in between the bands are: Stoke Gifford School of Dance, Baby Ballet, 5678 Dance, Danceworks, Street Cred and Emma Kate Dance Academy.

Fun rides for the children include bungee trampolines, giant slides, football games, giant inflatables, plus a Wrecking Ball inflatable, Mash the Mole and Gladiator Duel in the "free to ride" Community Zone. Alongside will be the popular, young children's, Go-Karts.

A tall mobile Climbing Wall will be set up alongside the local BS Scouts stalls which also features tomahawk throwing and junior archery plus a lot of other fun activities.

Over 40 stalls will feature a wide range of arts and crafts, from hair styling and colouring, face painting, to jewellery and accessories plus local services and associations, alongside sideshows and community stalls offering a wide range of local products and novelties.

Town Council youth workers and young people are once again organising 2 days of Skatepark skills and creative art activities. A skatepark half-pipe returns (courtesy of Kings Ramps) and offers exceptional demos, by top riders and skaters, plus, regular 'have-a-go' sessions. Also, the ever-popular street art 'paint a board' sessions supported by youth workers and young volunteers.



Bradley Stoke Youth Football Club will be running their Football Festival as normal, which will include many different age groups starting from Reception and upwards. This will involve small sided matches throughout the day with trophies being awarded to the winning teams and will take place on the top field football pitches starting from 12 noon.

The 10K race organised by Sole Sisters starts at 09.30 am and finishes at the Jubilee Centre.

New Walking football club for people living with longterm conditions and impairment

Walking football is an evidence-based activity for people who have physical or cognitive impairments and longterm health conditions. It is a safe, inclusive and fun activity, that promotes movement, social engagement and is mostly about fun with other people.

Each session provides a warmup that encourages coordination, balance and cognitive processes, this is ideal for those with cognitive and neurological conditions.

The football sessions are tailored to the members, the sport is non-contact, walking pace, with an emphasis on keeping the ball below shoulder height. People with all forms of physical limitations and impairments can get involved.

We recognise that people might want to bring their carer or support workers, even a friend or family member, and all are welcome to come along and take part if they wish. Members have to be over 18 and everyone needs to register with the Walking football association to receive full injury insurance. There are no other restrictions. The sessions will be run by a Graduate Sport Rehabilitator, and they will be supported by students from the Sport Rehabilitation programme at UWE Bristol, as part of their placement experience.

An update from Clare Moody -

Police & Crime Commissioner

Listening to the Public and Keeping People Informed about Policing

As your local Police and Crime Commissioner for Avon and Somerset, my role is to be the bridge between the community and Avon and Somerset Police. This means listening to you, understanding your concerns, and ensuring these concerns help drive the long-term strategy for police and commissioning services in our

Policing matters to every corner of our communities, from bustling town centres to rural communities to our coastal towns. To ensure I hear all your voices, I make it a priority to meet local communities, whether that's at public forums, visiting local businesses, or engaging with community organisations. These conversations give me the insights I need to hold the police to account and further drive improvements.

My role is not just about holding the police to account but also about working with partners to drive change, including local authorities, criminal justice and third sector organisations. Through my visits, I've seen the incredible work being undertaken across the Avon and Somerset force area: innovative projects tackling crime, organisations supporting victims, working with young people to build their futures and partnership working to make neighbourhoods safer. These successes show what's possible when we collaborate.

I recently had the pleasure to visit the Wheels Project where I saw young people in action learning motor vehicle studies. The project supports young people between 14-18 years of age, struggling in education or with specialist educational needs from Bath, Bristol and South Gloucestershire.

They run small groups of four, providing young people with practical functional skills, teamwork, communication skills and understanding of safety and risk issues. Reducing serious youth violence is a priority in my Police and Crime Plan. The Wheels Project has been working with the South Gloucestershire Violence Reduction Partnership (VRP) for several years.

Understandably, many individuals have questions relating to day-to-day policing. It's important to know that I am not responsible for operational policing, this falls under the remit of Chief Constable Sarah Crew.

If you need to:

- · Report a non-urgent crime or incident
- Share feedback about policing services you or

- someone else has received
- Make a complaint against an officer (below the rank of Chief Constable)



These must be reported directly to Avon and Somerset Police, who will be able to assist you as appropriate.

However, my office can help in other ways. If you have gone through the police complaints process but are unhappy with the outcome you have received, you can submit a complaint review request, through the following website: https://www.avonandsomerset. police.uk/forms/rrc

Should you wish to share concerns over broader safety issues within your local area, or a lack of police action against incidents, I am also here to listen. I would encourage you to join one of the upcoming public forums that will be published on my website:

Family Wins Battle to Secure the Right School for their Son

UK parents recently received their local authority's decision on school placements. While many are satisfied, some families now face the difficult decision of whether to challenge their child's allocation. Their son now has a one-to-one support worker, tailored teaching, and access to therapy. His progress has been remarkable—advancing in phonics and maths, thriving in a smaller classroom, and growing in confidence.

The family is overjoyed, describing the school's support as exceptional. They urge other parents facing similar battles to seek expert legal guidance, as specialist support can make all the difference in securing the right educational placement.



In memory of Nicholas: a sister's tribute and a hospice's milestone

On 11 April 2025. Nicholas would have turned 30. For his younger sister, Adela, this milestone birthday carries an emotional significance - not only because of what it represents for Nicholas, but because 2025 also marks 30 years since Children's Hospice South West's (CHSW) Little Bridge House in Devon first opened its doors to families like theirs.

Nicholas was born in April 1995 with a rare, life-limiting condition which required continuous monitoring, intense medical attention and frequent, often urgent, hospital visits.

Growing up, Nicholas, his sister Adela, and their mum and dad lived in Bristol. Adela shares, "I remember I would tell other children, that he couldn't walk, talk, sit or stand. This was the simplistic, child-like way in which I would articulate my brother's condition. While this was my normal, it wasn't what most would imagine childhood to be."

By the time she was 3, Adela was able to help feed Nicholas via a gastrostomy tube, and by 8, could read his oxygen saturation monitor.

"When I was little, my family frequently visited Little Bridge House for respite care. This was care for the entire family, with a dedicated Sibling Support Team

who spent time with children like me doing arts and crafts. going on day trips

to local places in Devon and spending time in the infamous soft playroom. This



created an opportunity to meet other brothers and sisters in my situation, and I was able to talk freely about Nicholas without having to explain the backstory. Everyone already understood."

Nicholas & Adele

Nicholas passed away on 26 March 2010, aged 14.

To honour the sibling Adela so dearly loved and the 30th anniversary of Little Bridge House, the family hosted an event at home raising over £1,600 for the charity that has, and continues to, support them all.



Life Cycle Calls for Bike Donations for their Recycling Scheme at HMP Bristol

This year, locally-based cycling charity, Life Cycle, is on a mission to help even more prisoners and local people through its Bikes Beyond Bars scheme. They are calling on the public and local businesses to give their unwanted bikes a new life!

Life Cycle's Bikes Beyond Bars project operates within prisons to provide learners with hands-on training in bike mechanics and the opportunity to earn an industry-recognised qualification. Last year, Life Cycle taught 217 prisoners life-changing skills, helping to prepare them for life upon release.

Each year, Life Cycle refurbishes hundreds of donated bikes in prisons and its community Hub. In 2023–24 alone, the charity restored 860 bicycles, preventing an estimated 294,120 kg of CO2-equivalent emissions, and reusing 12,900 kg of metal.

News from Westminster

Cleaning up our rivers and seas

The Water (Special Measures) Act that I was proud to work on in Parliament has come into force to clean up our rivers and seas. This new legislation, introduced as one of the first actions of the Labour government, will clean up our waterways. I spoke about the positive impact this will have on our area in the House of Commons.

Getting our NHS back on its feet

I'm pleased that our Labour government's Plan for Change has started to fix our NHS – with the new NHS app making it easier to book appointments, prescription charges frozen for the first time in years, along with recruiting 1500 new GPs and delivering 3 million extra appointments. Jointly owned property and **Declarations of Trust**

Laura Wilkinson Solicitor from AMD Solicitors offers some advice on options available to you as a joint owner of a property.

If you are buying a new place together, or moving into a home your partner already owns, then you should think carefully about how you will own it between you. You should be aware that if you split up you may have no right to an interest in the property if it is in your partner's name.

Legally there are two types of joint ownership. You can either own the property as Joint Tenants or Tenants in Common.

Owning as Joint Tenants will mean that the joint owners together own the whole property and do not have a particular share in it. If one of the owners dies the other automatically becomes the sole owner.

Ownership as Tenants in Common however will mean that each owner will have a defined share in the property. The property could be owned in equal shares, or in different sized shares which can be set out in a legally binding written agreement called a "Declaration of Trust" which will contain details of the financial arrangement between the joint owners. People wanting to own a property in separate predetermined shares as set out in a Declaration of Trust, would need to own the property as Tenants in Common.

Under this form of ownership if one of the owners dies, their share of the property will pass on to whoever they specify in a Will, or if a Will is not made, in accordance with the rules of intestacy.

It may be that one party provides the deposit or a substantial share of the purchase price and the other has no or less funds to

contribute. In these circumstances a Declaration of Trust can help you protect your financial



contribution and specify how you wish to be repaid in the event that the property is sold. It can also set out how you wish to contribute to mortgage payments and how you wish to be repaid for your contribution should you come to sell the property.

The Declaration of Trust can specify the terms for buying out your joint owner's share in the property and can also help to avoid prolonged legal disputes over the finances in the event that your relationship with your co-owner breaks down.

Declarations of Trust can be as simple, or as complex, as the couple require. Each partner should ideally have separate legal advice. As circumstances change, the deed can be rewritten. It can be challenged in court only on grounds of fraud and misrepresentation.

Summer at Winterbourne Medieval Barn

Winterbourne Medieval Barn is an extraordinary survivor from our medieval past. It was built in 1342 for Sir Thomas de Bradeston, who was Lord of the Manor of Winterbourne from 1328 until his death in 1360.

In 1393 King Richard II granted Blanche Bradeston the right to hold a weekly market in Winterbourne and a June fair. June was the time in the medieval calendar to celebrate Midsummer, and what a celebration it was!

So, volunteers at the Barn are delighted to be upholding that tradition over 600 years later with a Winterbourne Medieval Day on Sunday 8th June. This will be the Barn's main community event of 2025. Come along and enjoy some recreated medieval festivities suitable for all ages on a genuine medieval site!

There will be a varied programme of activities throughout the day from 11am to 4pm. Watch medieval combat displays from the Warwick Warriors, and demonstrations of aspects of daily life in the 1300s from living history group, The Company of Chivalry. There will be wandering jesters and live medieval music. You can have a go at Archery and traditional games, and there are competitions and activities for young children.


